PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Box Hill has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land reserved for a street and described hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

Leach-avenue.

Commencing at a point a distance of 350 ft. 1½ in. bearing south 89 deg. 29 min. east from the intersection of the northern boundary of McKean-street with the eastern boundary of Doncaster-road; thence north 0 deg. 31 min. east a distance of 150 feet; thence north 0 deg. 26 min. east a distance of 374 feet; thence north 44 deg. 31½ min. west a distance of 14 ft. 1½ in.; thence south 89 deg. 29 min. east a distance of 70 feet; thence south 45 deg. 28½ min. west a distance of 14 ft. 1½ in.; thence south 0 deg. 26 min. west a distance of 374 feet; thence south 0 deg. 31 min. west a distance of 150 feet; thence north 89 deg. 29 min. west a distance of 50 feet to the point of commencement, the whole of the land within such

boundaries being reserved for a road as shown on plan of subdivision No. 17546, lodged at the Office of Titles, Melbourne.

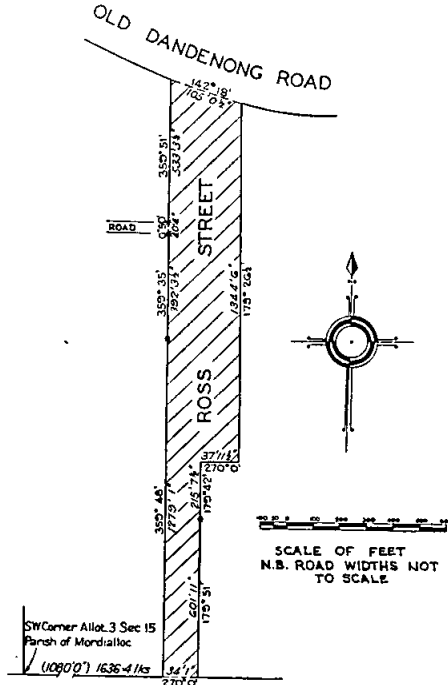

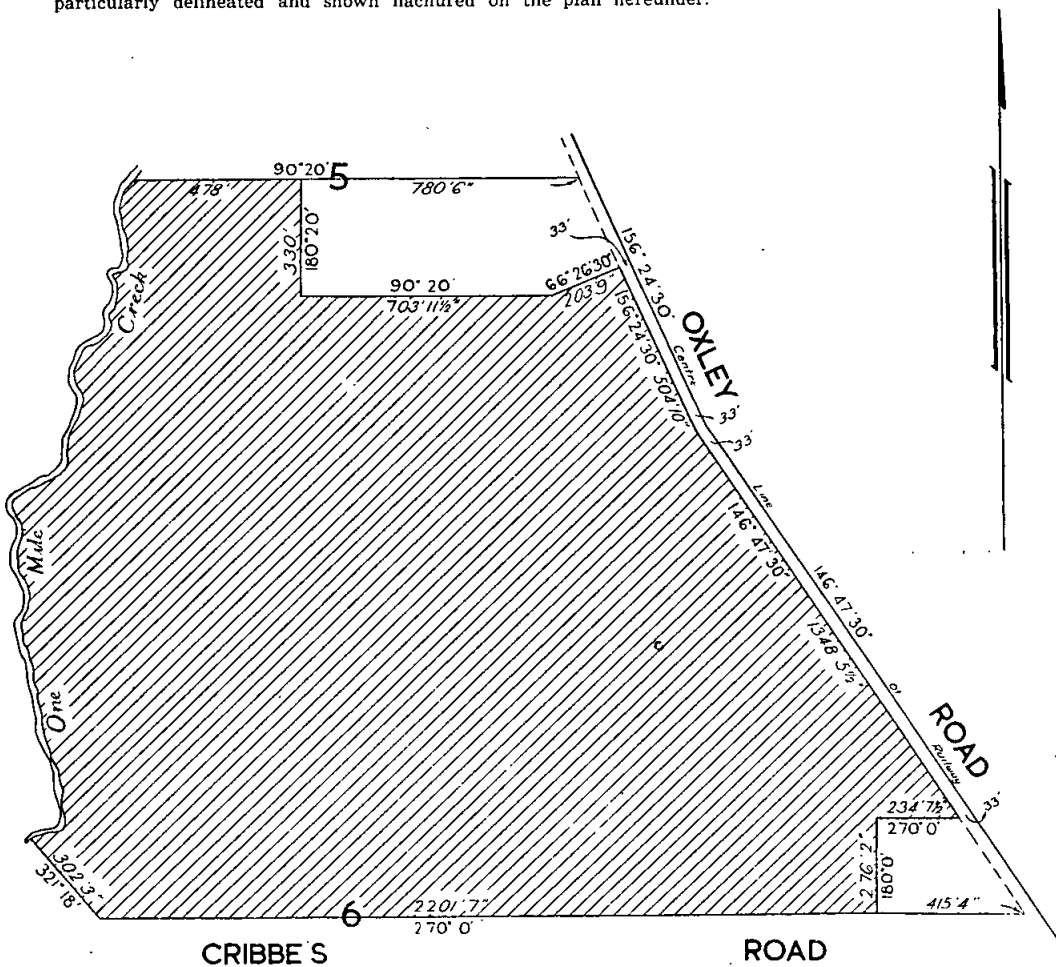

Cemeteries Act 1928.

KANGAROO FLAT PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the *Cemeteries Acts*, the Trustees of the Kangaroo Flat Public Cemetery hereby make the following Rules and Regulations, which shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication every Rule and Regulation heretofore made by the said Trustees shall be and is hereby rescinded:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars in form Schedule B supplied, an order obtained, and a certificate from the Registrar of Deaths, the Coroner, or Justice of the Peace, has been delivered to the Secretary or Sexton.

2. Before any interment shall be permitted all charges must be paid when the order for the Sexton will be given authorizing the grave to be dug and the interment to take place.

3. The order for interment must be given to the Sexton before 12 o'clock noon on the day previous to the interment where a morning interment is required, and before 2 p.m. on the day previous to the interment where an afternoon interment is required.

4. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time of arrival at the cemetery, and such time shall be punctually observed.

5. The usual hours of interment shall be between 10 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. from Monday to Friday and 9.30 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturday, but burials may be permitted outside of these hours on payment of the prescribed fees with the consent of the Chairman or Secretary.

6. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, or any alteration made thereto, it must be constructed under the direction of the Trustees or some person appointed by them. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the burial right must accompany the application.

7. Every coffin placed in a vault or brick grave shall be bricked in, cemented, and made air-tight.

8. No adult shall be buried within 4 feet nor child under the age of twelve years within 3 feet of the ordinary surface level, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. A certificate of ground for a burial place within the cemetery may be granted by the Secretary in the form and to the effect set out in Schedule C, on payment of fees prescribed.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Registrar of Deaths, the Coroner, or Justice of the Peace, and of the licence for disinterment from the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. Before any person commences the erection of any tablet, headstone, monument, tomb, vault, fence, railing, or enclosure, the permission of the Trustees must be obtained, also payment made of fees set out in the scale of charges. Persons desiring to make such erection are required to submit designs, drawings, or descriptions, proposed location, also a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph, and such information as the Trustees may require. The Trustees may withhold permission and prevent the proposed erection of anything which may appear to them as unappropriate, unbecoming, or not sufficiently durable.

12. Every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection shall be maintained in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner or owners. Where any monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection is allowed to fall into a state of disrepair and the owners fail to carry out repairs to the satisfaction of the Trustees within seven days after the serving of written notice so to do by the Trustees to the last registered address of the owners, the Trustees may remove such monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection.

13. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and the Trustees may refuse to allow any vehicle conveying such material to enter the cemetery during wet or unfavourable weather. Stones, refuse, and rubbish or other materials remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the persons employed on the work, and in the event of any such refuse or other material not being removed within seven days after completion of the work the Trustees may have same removed at the expense of the persons or firm carrying out such work.

14. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying or causing to be done any damage to any monument, tombstone or vault, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanour, and on being convicted thereof is liable to the penalties provided by the Cemeteries Act.

15. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

16. These Rules and Regulations may be altered or amended and additions made thereto from time to time by the Trustees with the consent of the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the Cemeteries Acts.

17. No person being the owner of the exclusive right of burial of a grave shall transfer such right without the consent of the Trustees, and no transfer shall be consented to by the Trustees except a transfer to a near relative of the owner, or a transfer to the Trustees.

18. No dogs will be allowed in the cemetery.

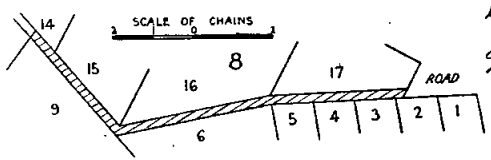

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by section 68 of the *Motor Car Act 1951*, the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Premiums Committee appointed under Division 1 of Part V. of the said Act is empowered to make regulations for or with respect to prescribing the maximum rates of insurance premiums and the rates of penal premiums to be paid in respect of motor cars for the purposes of the said Division 1 of Part V.:

And whereas the said Premiums Committee has recommended to the Governor in Council the maximum rates of insurance premiums and the rates of penal premiums to be prescribed in respect of motor cars for the purposes of the said Division 1 of Part V.:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the said Premiums Committee doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations shall be entitled the Motor Car (Third Party Insurance) Regulations 1955, and shall come into force on the 1st October, 1955.
2. The maximum rates of insurance premiums to be paid in respect of motor cars for the purposes of Division 1 of Part V. of the *Motor Car Act 1951*, shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.
3. The maximum penal premium within the meaning of section 67 of the said Act shall be double the amount of the difference between the premium paid and the appropriate insurance premium.
4. In the case of any motor car (other than a motor car from another State or Territory of the Commonwealth) which is insured for a period of less than twelve months, the maximum rate of insurance premium shall be a sum which bears the same proportion to the appropriate insurance premium as the period for which the motor car is insured bears to twelve months plus Ten per centum of such sum, provided that the minimum premium payable shall be Five shillings.

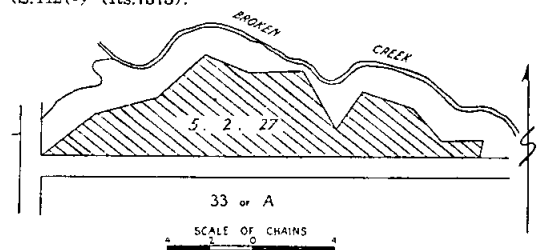

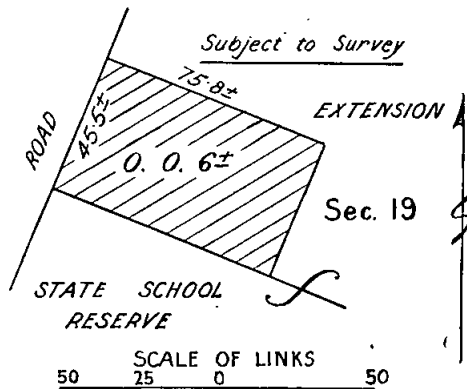

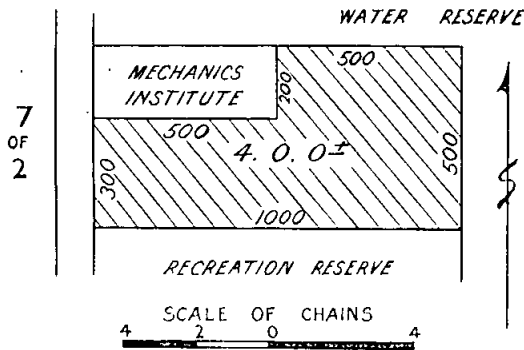
