Meeting, Resolutions at, Not to be Revoked.—No Resolution at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given by the Trust Secretary to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of at least two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting (if the number of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such Resolution was come to), or by majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting. present at such former meeting.
- 4. Business, &c., Order of, Minutes.—At every meeting of the Commissioners the first business thereof shall be reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Commissioners at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required by any Commissioner present at such meeting.
- 5. After the signing of the minutes by the Chairman, the order of the business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the Commissioners at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by Resolution to that effect:—
 - (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Commissioners, if called for.
 - (2) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
 - (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
 - (4) Receiving deputations from the ratepayers.
 - (5) Presentation of reports of committees and officers.
 - (6) Payments.
 - (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the Chairman may think desirable.
 - (8) Other motions of which previous notice has been
 - (9) Notices of motion and the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.
- 6. Titles, Official.—The Commissioners, in meeting, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Chairman or Commissioner, as the case may require.
- Who to Speak.—If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.
- 8. Chairman to Rise Whilst Addressing Meeting.-The Chairman shall rise in addressing the Commissioners to discuss any question, and shall not leave the Chair on such occasions.

- 9. Commissioners Not to Speak twice on the Same Question.—No Commissioner shall speak twice on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in the explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
- 10. Points of Order.-The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case
- 11. Commissioners Not to Digress or Impute Improper Motives.—No Commissioner shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, nor impute improper motives, and all personal reflections on Commissioners shall be deemed disorderly, and every Commissioner so doing shall, upon being called to order by the Chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw such imputations or reflections, as the case may be.
- 12. A Commissioner called to order shall sit down
- unless permitted to explain.

 13. Persons Not Commissioners to Leave when Requested.—No person not being a Commissioner who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Commissioners, shall be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when requested by the Chairman to do so.
- 14. Call of the Commissioners.-No Commissioner shall absent himself from any meeting held in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Commissioners without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.
- 15. Documents to be Produced.—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.
- 16. Motions, Amendments, and Notice Thereof.—All notices of motion shall be in writing, dated, and numbered. and given by the intending mover to the Trust Secretary at the close of meeting of the Commissioners, or if not given at the meeting then seven days prior to the day which the next meeting of the Commissioners is to take place, and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book, in the order in which they may be received.
- 17. No Motion Without Notice.—No Commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, except in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.
- 18. Motions on Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners after that at which it has been presented. presented.
- 19. Motions to be Moved in Order.—Except by leave of the Commissioners, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Trust Secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.
- 20. Motions Not to be Proceeded with in the Absence of the Mover.-No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Com-missioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.
- 21. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.
- 22. Mover of Motion or Amendment Not to be Interrupted.—Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question or order disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.
- 23. Nature of Motion to be Stated.—Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Commissioners thereon.
- 24. Leave to be Obtained Before Motion Withdrawn.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Commissioners.
- 25. Motions to be Seconded Prior to Discussion .any standing order of the Commissioners by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

- 26. Mover and Not the Seconder Held to Have Spoken.—A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Commissioner merely seconding shall not be held to have spoken upon it.
- 27. Motion to be in Writing.—At every meeting of the Commissioners all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced to writing, signed by the mover, and be delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.
- 28. Amendments.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
- 29. Amendment to Become the Question.—If an amendment be carried, the amendment shall become itself the question, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question may be moved.
- 30. Second Amendment may be Moved.—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Commissioners for discussion at a time.
- 31. Right of Mover to Reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which question shall be put from the Chair, but no Commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.
- 32. Adjournment, Motion For.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Commissioners, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other than may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion of adjournment be made.
- 33. Protest, Commissioners May.—Any Commissioner may protest against any Resolution of the Commissioners, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the Resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners by the protesting Commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Trust Secretary's office, and signed by such Commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Commissioners.
- 34. Lapsed Questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.
- 35. Order of the Day to be Restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of numbers as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
- 36. Voting.—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner, the Commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and all those voting in the negative shall then hold up their hands, and result be declared by the Chairman. The Chairman shall have a deliberate vote, and in case of an equal division he shall have a casting vote, and every Commissioner present shall vote except he be disabled by law from doing so.
- 37. Questions to be put.—The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Commissioners, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.
- 38. Contents of Petitions.—It shall be incumbent on every Commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Commissioners, and that the contents do not violate any By-law or any provision thereof.
- 39. Name at Beginning of Petition.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall write his name at the beginning thereof.
- 40. Petition to be in Writing.—Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioner at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every sheet on which it is written.

- 41. How signed.—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.
- 42. No Letters, &c., to be Attached.—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.
- 43. Presentation of Petitions.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.
- 44. Deputations.—Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Commissioners in support of any petition, or otherwise, must send in an application in writing, to the Trust Secretary, at least three clear days before the meeting of the Commissioners at which such petition is intended to be presented.
- 45. Cheques to be Signed.—All cheques shall be signed by two Commissioners, and countersigned by the Secretary.
- 46. Appointment to Permanent Office.—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Commissioners shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Township of Meeniyan, inviting applications from qualified candidates for same.
- 47. Salaries to be Fixed.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Commissioners shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.
- 48. Commissioners, &c., Not to be Surety.—No Commissioner or officer of the Commissioners, and no assessor or auditor shall be received as a surety, for any officer appointed by the Commissioners, or for any work to be done for the Commissioners.
- 49. Contracts.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expenses of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.
- 50. Plans, &c.—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Commissioner during that time, except in cases of emergency.
- 51. Secretary to Expend Moneys.—It shall be lawful for the Secretary from time to time, on the written order of the Chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Commissioners for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between two ordinary meetings of the Commissioners the sum of Ten pounds.
- 52. Addresses to the Governor, &c.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Trust Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners.
- 53. Suspension of Regulations.—Any one or more of the rules and provisions herein contained may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice being given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.
- 54. Penalty.—Every person who shall so offend against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.
- 55. Common Seal.—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept in a locked box, of which the key shall be kept by the Trust Secretary, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Chairman of the Trust and the Secretary, or in the absence of the Chairman, unless two Commissioners and the Secretary be present.

 - (a) shall cease to be a residential area within the meaning of By-law No. 251;
 - (b) shall be deemed to be excised from Residential Area "D" more particularly described in the Second Schedule to By-law No. 251;
 (c) is hereby prescribed as a business area?
 - (d) for the purposes of clause 3 of By-law No.
 324 is hereby declared to be a limited
 - business area; (ii) the provisions of the said By-law No. 324 shall apply to the said part of the City of Melbourne more particularly described in the Schedule hereto save that for the purposes of this By-law there shall be deemed to be added to the list of trades industries manufactures and businesses in clause 3 in the said By-law No. 324 the trade or business of administrative offices.

A By-law of the City of Nunawading, made under the Local Government Act 1946, and numbered 30, for prohibiting the leaving (whether unattended or not) of motor-cars or other vehicles standing in parts of certain streets, appointing in streets and roads standing places for protocolor accounting to the company and proceedings of the protocolors. for motor-cars, regulating traffic and processions and re-pealing By-law No. 8 of the Shire of Blackburn and Mitcham and other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Nunawading order as follows:

- In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires: "Cattle" includes every animal of the horse, ass, mule, ox, sheep, goat, and swine species re
 - mure, ox, sneep, goat, and swine species respectively.

 "Circus animal" includes every animal not included in the meaning of the word "Cattle," as above defined, except fowls, geese, turkeys, ducks, pigeons, and other domestic birds of similar species.

"City" mes

- "City" means the City of Nunawading.
 "Council" means the Council of the City of Nuna-
- "Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle.
 "Footway" includes every footpath, lane thoroughfare, or other public place within the municipality

- habitually used by pedestrians and not generally used for vehicular traffic.

 "Horse" includes mule and donkey.

 "Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation of property lines of two or more streets which join at an angle whether or not
- streets which join at an angle whether of hot such streets cross.

 "Motor-car" means any vehicle propelled by steam, gas, oil, electricity, or any mechanical power, and includes motor-cycles, but does not include a tram car or tram motor.

 "Safety Zone" means a place of refuge for pedestrians established by the Council in any street in accordance with this By-law.

- "Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane thoroughfare, or any other public place within the municipality other than a foot-
- Licensed" means licensed by the Council.
- "Rider" means any person in charge of a horse.

 "Vehicle" includes any cycle and any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, or mechanical process, but does not include a tram car or tram motor.

 "Public Place" includes and applies to every public.

"Public Place" includes and applies to every public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare notwithstanding that such public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare may be formed on private property and also any public park, garden or reserve.
"Writing" includes printing, lithography, or other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form. Words importing the masculine gender include females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include

include the plural, and words in the plural include

the singular.

- 2. No person shall leave a motor-car or other vehicle (whether unattended or not), standing in any of the following places in the City of Nunawading:—

owing places in the City of Nunawading:—

(a) Within 30 feet of an intersection;

(b) within 15 feet of a fire hydrant, horse trough, or any entry by which the public are admitted to a Railway Station;

(c) in front of a private driveway;

(d) alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction or within a distance of 15 feet either side of a postal pillar box or a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street when traffic would be obstructed.

Provided that this By-law shall not apply to a fire brigade vehicle standing at or near a fire hydrant or a postal yehicle standing at or near a postal pillar

or a postal vehicle standing at or near a postal pillar box or to a motor-car whilst being supplied with petrol from a petrol pump erected on the kerb or to a petrol waggon whilst engaged in supplying petrol to a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street.

- to a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street.

 3. No person shall, between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and 5 o'clock in the afternoon on any work day other than a Saturday or Public Holiday, or between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and 12 o'clock noon on any Saturday, leave (whether unattended or not), a motor-car or other vehicle standing in any street or road or part thereof specified in Schedule 1 hereof: Provided or part thereof specified in schedule I hereof: Provided always that any person may for the purpose of loading or unloading goods thereon or therefrom leave a motor-car or other vehicle in any such street or road or part thereof for not more than 30 minutes.
- 4. The portions of the streets set out in Schedule 2 hereof are hereby prescribed as standings of Hackney carriages and municipal Stage carriages.
- 5. The owner or person apparently in control of any motor-car or other vehicle left standing (whether unattended or not) in any street or road shall when requested by an officer of the Council or a member of the Police Force give to such officer or member of the Police Force information with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control) who is or was the driver of such motor-car or vehicle which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such motor-car or other vehicle so standing in contravention of this By-law.
- 6. No person shall stop, stand, or leave a vehicle on any street for the primary purpose of displaying an advertise-
- 7. No person shall leave a vehicle (other than a tram 7. No person shall leave a vehicle (other than a tram car), on any street otherwise that in such a position that the left or near wheels thereof are parallel with and not more than 10 inches from the kerb on the left or near side of such street or at a lesser distance than 3 feet from any other vehicle: Provided further that this Regulation shall not apply to a vehicle standing in a lawfully constituted parking area.
- 8. No driver shall in the following streets make a full "U" turn:—South-parade, Blackburn, between Blackburn-road and Main-street; Mitcham-road, Mitcham, between White Horse-road and the railway; Station-street, Mitcham, between White Horse-road and the rail-
- 9. The driver of a vehicle on any street shall when stopping such vehicle for the purpose of taking up or setting down any goods keep such vehicle as near as practicable to the kerb on the left or near side of such street: Provided that on any street in which there is only one-way traffic the driver may stop such vehicle for such purpose as near as practicable to the kerb on the right or off side.

- 10. Every driver of a motor-car or bicycle upon any street shall within reasonable distance, and before passing any other vehicle, horse, or pedestrian, give audible and warning of his approach by sounding a horn, bell, or other instrument.
- 11. No person shall drive any vehicle upon any street, or permit any vehicle to be driven upon any street unless such vehicle is so constructed as to enable the driver thereof to have a full uninterrupted view of the street traffic in front of him and abreast of him on each side of such vehicle, and no person, while driving any vehicle upon any street shall occupy such a position as will prevent or interfere with his having such full and uninterrupted view as aforesaid.
- 12. No person shall ride or lead any horse or other animal, or drive any horse or cattle, or drive or impel any vehicle upon any footway: Provided, however, that a bicycle or motor-bicycle may be taken across any footway directly to or from any premises abutting thereon.
- 13. Pedestrian Traffic.—Every pedestrian upon a footway shall keep to his left hand side of the footway, and shall, when meeting or overtaking any person, pass on the right hand side of such person.
- 14. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon, whether for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any goods or other-
- wise.

 15. Street Processions.—Before any procession of vehicles, motor-cars, persons, or animals, or of any combination of vehicles, motor-cars, persons, or animals shall, except for military or funeral purposes, pass or proceed through or along any road, street, or highway within the municipality at least 21 days' previous notice, in writing, of intention to hold such procession shall be given to the Town Clerk, who shall submit such notice to the Council at its first meeting held subsequent to the receipt thereof by him. The Council shall thereupon deal with such notice, and may, by Resolution:—

 (a) Appoint the day on which such procession shall be held;

 - (b) appoint the hours of the day between which such procession shall be held;
 - (c) specify the route along which such procession shall proceed; and
 - (d) specify what flags, banners, symbols, signs, or placards (if any) shall be permitted to be carried or exhibited by or in such procession.

Every such procession shall be conducted in such a quiet, orderly and circumspect manner as to avoid any quiet, orderly and circumspect manner as to avoid any breach of the peace or undue interference with the traffic on the route so specified. Not more than four persons shall march or proceed abreast in such procession, and all the clauses of this By-law relating to the regulation of traffic shall be observed and complied with by such procession and the persons constituting the same. Every person who takes part in any procession held contrary to the provisions of this By-law or in connexion with which the whole of the temporal part rule. Becalities of which the whole of the terms of any such Resolution of the Council as aforesaid regarding such procession shall be guilty of an offence against the By-law and punishable accordingly.

- 16. No person shall wear or carry in any street or footway any pin or other article or any implement in such manner as is likely to inflict injury by coming in contact with any other person.
- 17. No person shall carry in any street upon a vehicle having less than four wheels any material, article, or thing exceeding 25 feet in length.
- 18. No person shall carry in any street upon a vehicle any material, article, or thing which whether forming the whole or part only of the load projects more than 2 feet outside the line of the wheels or sides of the
- 19. No person shall carry in any street upon a vehicle anything in such a manner that any part of the thing carried touches or comes in contact with the surface of the street.
- 20. (1) No person shall, in any street, at one and the same time act as driver, or have the sole charge of more than one vehicle drawn by animal power, or of more than two vehicles fastened together or of two vehicles fastened together by a tow line or connexion exceeding 12 feet in length.
- (2) No person under fifteen years of age shall in any street act as the driver or have the sole charge of any vehicle (other than a push bicycle) driven within the municipality for business or trade purposes.
- 21. No person shall at any time between the hours of Eight o'clock in the morning and Six o'clock in the afternoon of any day cause interruption or annoyance to

passengers upon any street or footway by raising or discharging dust or causing water to flow upon or across such street or footway whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise.

- 22. No person shall litter any street or footway by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.
- 23. No person shall drive along White Horse-road between Doncaster East-road, Mitcham and Middle-borough-road, Blackburn; Mitcham-road between Quarry-road and Canterbury-road, Mitcham; Railway-road road and Canterbury-road, Mitcham; Railway-road between White Horse-road and Station-street; or Blackburn-road between Railway-road and Walsham-road, Blackburn, any horses, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, or sheep between the hours of Eight o'clock in the morning and Seven o'clock in the afternoon: Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to horses in saddle or harness or oxen in the yoke.
- 24. No person shall, except between the hours of Twelve o'clock midnight and Seven o'clock in the morning, drive, draw, or take, or cause to be driven, drawn, or taken any circus animal on or along any street or road.
- 25. Clauses 1, 2, 4 to 10 inclusive, 14, 18 to 26 inclusive and 30 of By-law No. 8 of the Shire of Blackburn and Mitcham are hereby repealed.
- 26. This By-law shall except as herein expressly provided apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Nunawading.

A By-law Relating to the Collection and Removal and Disposal of Refuse.

 $\mathbf{I}^{ ext{N}}$ pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1928 and of all other powers it thereunto enabling,

the Council of the City of St. Kilda, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, orders as follows:—

- 1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matter and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
- 2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Victoria Government Gazette.
- 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of St. Kilda, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, shop, factory, and other building and premises therein.
- 4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter-
 - "Premises" includes land upon which no house or building is erected if the same is occupied and/or used for any purpose in respect of which

- and/or used for any purpose in respect of which refuse is produced or accumulated.

 "Proprietor" means the proprietor of any house, shop, factory, or other building or premises, and includes the owner, occupier, and/or any person having the management or control thereof.

 "Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) and other rubbish and garbage (except garden refuse and material of a mineral nature) produced or accumulated in or about any house, shop, factory, or other building or premises.
- 5. The proprietor of every house, shop, factory, or other building or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises or land upon which such house, shop, factory, or other building is erected a properly-constructed rat-proof and fly-proof receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, shop, factory, or other building or premises.
- 6. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable 6. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle and with a proper handle or other lifting device, and such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered with such lid (except when refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such receptacle and lid and refuse in an inoffensive condition.
- 7. Such receptacle and lid shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other material approved by the Council in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle or lid of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.
- 8. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not less than 1½ cubic foot nor more than 4 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man, and shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly-attached side-lifting handles.
- 9. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle or place or cause or permit to be deposited any moist refuse in such receptacle, unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in paper to the intent that such moist refuse shall remain confined in such wrapping whilst in such receptacle and shall not become loose or spread therein.
- 10. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle and lid to be kept at all times in good order and inoffensive, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle and lid with tar or other suitable substance if required so to do by the Council.

Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding clause the proprietor (at such hours and at such times as may be appointed by the Council) shall cause such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside the entrance to the land upon which such house, shop, factory, or other building is erected from the street, road, lane, or right-of-way on which such land abuts or on and close to the entrance of any other premises affected by this By-law in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

REGULATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33 OF THE LABOUR AND INDUSTRY ACT 1953.

I, Henry Norman Jones, Secretary for Labour and Industry, in pursuance of the powers by the Labour and Industry Act, hereby make and issue the following adjusted Determination the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning the first pay period to commence in May, 1955.

- (c) Contract of Apprenticeship.—Every contract of apprenticeship hereinafter made shall be on the form of prescribed by the Commercial Artists Board.
- (d) Period of Apprenticeship.—(i) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (ii) hereof the periods of apprenticeship as follows:—
- If the apprentice when indentured is under the age of 18 years—5 years. If over the age of 18 years—4 or 5 at the option of the contracting parties.
- (ii) A student who has obtained a qualification or has in whole or in part completed a prescribed course of shall be deemed to have served a period of apprenticeship as hereinafter prescribed, which shall be taken into indentures of apprenticeship are being entered into, and the pay to which he or she shall be entitled shall be to the advanced year of apprenticeship. - (g) Probationary Period.—Minors shall be apprenticed as from the date of commencing work with an intwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in this Determination the first nine months of service shall be deemed probationary period, and the indenture may be terminated by any party thereto during such period of probation any obligation to any other party or parties.
 - (h) Attendance at approved Art Schools-
 - (i) During the currency of the indenture an apprentice shall be permitted by the employer to absent during working hours for the purpose of attending art classes or examinations at a school approved Commercial Artists Board for a period or periods not exceeding in the aggregate four hours in _____
 - (ii) The apprentice shall also attend evening classes at an Art school approved by the said Board on two each week.
 - (iii) An apprentice attending a school or schools as prescribed in sub-clauses (i) and (ii) hereof and reports of satisfactory progress and attendance, to his employer shall be reimbursed all fees paid tuition.
 - (iv) The above provisions shall not apply to a student who has passed the 4th year examination of the of Advertising Art and/or Diploma of Art of the Book.
 - (v) Until further order schools approved by the said Board shall be :-

Melbourne Technical College; Swinburne Technical College, Glenferrie; Gordon Institute of Technology, Geelong; Prahran Technical School; Technical Art School, Ballarat; Caulfield Technical School.

- (i) Cancellation or Suspension of Indenture.—Subject to the approval of the Secretary for Labour and Industry otherwise, an indenture of apprenticeship may be suspended or cancelled—
 - (i) by mutual consent;
 - (ii) if through lack of orders or financial difficulties an employer is unable to find suitable employment apprentice and a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged;
 - (iii) if, in the opinion of the Secretary for Labour and Industry circumstances exist which render such or cancellation necessary or desirable.

Any covenant in an indenture inconsistent with the provisions of this clause shall be null and void and of no 'effect.

(j) Lost Time.—The apprentice at the end of the calendar period of any year in which he has actually given service to the master upon less than the ordinary working days prescribed in this Determination, or on which he has unlawfully absented himself without the master's consent shall, for every day short of the said number of working days, and for every day of such absence, serve one day, and the calendar period of the succeeding year of his service shall not be deemed to begin until the said a tditional day or days shall have been served.

Provided that in calculating the extra time to be so served, the apprentice shall be credited with time which he has worked during the relevant year in excess of his ordinary hours.

- (k) Prohibition of Premiums.—An employer shall not, either directly or indirectly, or by any pretence or device receive from any person or require or permit any person to pay or give any consideration in the nature of a premium or bonus for the taking or binding of any probationer or apprentice.
- (l) Overtime.—An apprentice under the age of eighteen years shall not be required to work overtime unless he so desires.
 - (m) Payment by Results.—An apprentice or improver shall not work under any system of payment by results.

Clauses, other than clauses 2 and 3, of the said Determination, shall remain in force.

DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33 OF THE LABOUR AND INDUSTRY ACT 1953.
