THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following amendment to their Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 21st February, 1951, approved by the Governor in Council on 16th March, 1951, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th May, 1951, and any amendment thereto, are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations."

2. After Regulation 310 of the Principal Regulations the following new Regulation is inserted:—

"310A. Where a vessel having visitors to the XVI. Olympiad on board remains within the Port for the sole purpose of providing accommodation for the visitors for a continuous period of seven days or more between 1st day of November, 1956, and the 15th day of December, 1956 (inclusive), the rate payable under Regulation 308 in respect of such vessel for the whole of such period during which such vessel uses directly or indirectly any wharf of

the Commissioners shall be One penny per ton of the gross register tonnage of such vessel for each of the following days, that is to say—the day of arrival of such vessel, the day of departure of such vessel, and each day (other than the days of arrival and departure) on which goods are shipped into or unshipped from such vessel subject to a minimum charge equal to the charge for two days. Provided that the master, owner, or agent of such vessel shall if and whenever required by the Harbor Master during the said period move such vessel from the wharf whereat such vessel may for the time being be moored to some other mooring within the Port."

GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 87.

A By-law for Making and Levying the Rates for the Year Commencing on the First day of July, 1955.

GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the *Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1928*, and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works or any extension of such works.

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area and supplied with water for domestic and/or other purposes:—

- On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £14—Twenty shillings per annum.
- On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £14—One shilling and five pence in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.
- On any land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £7—Ten shillings per annum.
- On any such land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof exceeds £7—One shilling and five pence in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1955, and ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1956, and shall be payable on the tenth day of September, 1955.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Acts by the Council of such municipality on the written application of the Trust as provided for in such case by the Water Acts.

1. Head Teachers shall be appointed to or retained in primary schools in accordance with the following scale:—

- (a) A Head Teacher of the First Class to or in a school—
 - (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 750 pupils; or
 - (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 650 pupils, and is a training school, or a central school, or a school with post-primary classes; or
 - (iii) which has a net enrolment of at least 600 pupils and is recommended by the Director and approved by the Tribunal as an experimental school; or
 - (iv) which has a net enrolment of at least 650 pupils and which is outside the metropolitan area as defined in Clause 3 of Regulation 4 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations.
- (b) A Head Teacher of the Second Class to or in a school—
 - (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 330 pupils; or
 - (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 300 pupils, and is a training school, or a higher elementary school, or a consolidated school, or a central school, or a school with central or post-primary classes.
- (c) A Head Teacher of the Third Class to or in a school—
 - (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 40 pupils; or
 - (ii) which is a rural training school approved by the Tribunal.

Provided that—

- (1) a teacher in the Fourth Class shall not be promoted as head teacher to a school with a net enrolment of more than 140 pupils;
 - (2) a teacher, after five years' service in the Third Class and who is qualified for subdivisional promotion to the fourth subdivision of the Third Class, shall not except with the approval of the Tribunal, be retained as head teacher in a school with a net enrolment of less than 100 pupils;
 - (3) a teacher in the Third Class who is not qualified for subdivisional promotion to the fourth subdivision of the Third Class shall not, except with the approval of the Tribunal, be appointed to or retained as head teacher in a school with a net enrolment of more than 140 pupils.
- (d) A Head Teacher of the Fourth Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of less than 40 pupils: Provided that except in special circumstances approved by the Tribunal, a teacher who has served at least five years as a classified teacher after completing the course for Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate—
- (i) shall not be retained in a school with a net enrolment of less than ten pupils; and
 - (ii) shall not be eligible for transfer to a school having a net enrolment of less than fifteen pupils.

2. Infant Mistresses shall be appointed to or retained in primary schools in accordance with the following scale:—

- (a) An Infant Mistress of the First Class to or in a school—
 (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 800 pupils;
 or
 (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 675 pupils, and is a training school; or
 (iii) which has a net enrolment of at least 600 pupils, and is recommended by the Director and approved by the Tribunal as an experimental school.
- (b) An Infant Mistress of the Second Class to or in a school—
 (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 400 pupils;
 or
 (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 350 pupils, and is a training school.
- (c) An Infant Mistress of the Third Class to or in a school—
 (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 155 pupils;
 or
 (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 110 pupils, and is a training school.

3. Assistant Teachers shall be appointed to or retained in primary schools in accordance with the following staffing schedule:—

Provided that—

- (a) A Man Assistant of the Second Class may, with the approval of the Tribunal, be substituted for one additional assistant in a school which is classified in the First Class;
- (b) an additional assistant shall be appointed to a higher elementary school or school with central classes, where the net enrolment of the Primary Section does not exceed 239 pupils.
4. Student Teachers allotted to schools for training purposes shall not be included as members of the staff when the staffing schedule is being computed.
5. In any Primary School where Secondary School work is undertaken, the total net enrolment of both Primary and Secondary Sections shall be reckoned in determining the classification of the Head Teacher, but the classification of all other positions in the Primary School shall be determined on the basis of the net enrolment in the Primary Section of the school.
6. In any Primary School where Secondary School work is undertaken, the Assistant Teachers appointed to undertake the Secondary School work shall be allotted in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations made for or with respect to the allotment of staffs in Secondary Schools.

7. In a school held in buildings situated at a distance apart, and in other special cases approved by the Tribunal on the recommendation of the Director, an additional Assistant (or a Sewing Mistress) may be appointed.

8. A Sewing Mistress may be appointed to or retained in any school with a net enrolment of not less than 30 pupils or to any school which has no woman teacher on the staff thereof, and which has a net enrolment of not less than fifteen girls.

9. A part-time Sewing Mistress may be appointed to two or more schools, each of which is in charge of a man Head Teacher and has a net enrolment of not less than ten girls: Provided that in special circumstances a part-time Sewing Mistress may be appointed to a school when recommended by the Director and approved by the Tribunal.

10. When a new school is opened, teachers shall be allotted in accordance with the estimated net enrolment at the school.

11. In addition to the number of classified teachers provided for, 60 relieving teachers may be appointed to and employed in Primary Schools. Twelve of these positions (six for men and six for women) may be reserved for teachers classified in Class 3.

12. On the recommendation of the Director the Tribunal may approve the appointment of Teachers' Advisors in country Inspectorial districts.

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT No. 134.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946*, hereby rescinds Regulation 15 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations and substitutes therefor the following Regulation:—

REGULATION 15.

STAFFING OF TRAINING SCHOOLS.

1. The classification and number of Assistant Teachers to be allotted to training schools shall be in accordance with the following staffing schedule:—

Provided that a Man Assistant of the Second Class may, with the approval of the Tribunal, be substituted for one additional assistant in a school which is classified in the First Class.

2. Applicants for positions as teachers in training schools shall possess such qualifications, and shall satisfy such requirements as may be prescribed from time to time by the Tribunal after consultation with the Director.

3. (a) Appointments, transfers, or promotions to positions as teachers in training schools shall be made by the Committee of Classifiers for the Primary Schools Division.

(b) In making such appointments, the Classifiers shall take into consideration the special duties and qualifications of the teachers required for the positions, and shall appoint the applicant who in their opinion is best qualified for the position, having regard to the special attainments, record, experience, and training of the applicants and their positions on the Classified Roll.

4. Where there is a special unit in a training school, such as a Rural Training School, a Country Infant Room or an Opportunity Grade, such unit shall be staffed independently. The net enrolment of such unit shall be subtracted from the total net enrolment of the school for the purpose of determining the number of assistants in the main school, but the number of positions in the respective classes of teachers above Class 4 shall be determined on the total net enrolment of the school.

5. As positions for Assistants in charge of Rural Training Schools become vacant, they shall be advertised as vacancies in Class 3 of the Primary Schools Division. The Director may, however, authorize the reclassification and advertisement of any such position at any time if the circumstances warrant it.

6. Where only part of a school is used for training purposes, such modifications in staffing may be made as the Tribunal, after consultation with the Director, shall determine.

CITY OF BRIGHTON.

BY-LAW No. 131.

A By-law of the City of Brighton made under the provisions of section 197 (1) (x) of the Local Government Acts and every other power thereunto it enabling, and numbered 131, for—

(a) Requiring the destruction of rats, ants, or other vermin or pests.

(b) Requiring the destruction of noxious weeds.

(c) Providing that in the event of failure of any owner or occupier of any property or premises to comply with the requirements of this By-law the Council may cause measures to be taken to destroy the vermin, pests, or weeds at the expense of the owner or occupier and recover the cost thereof as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every power thereunto it enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brighton order as follows:—

1. The Council of the City of Brighton may at any time cause to be served on the owner or occupier of any property or premises a notice, in writing, requiring such owner or occupier within a time limited by such notice to destroy all rats, ants, or other vermin or pests as may be specified in such notice and which are in, on, under, upon, or about such property or premises.

2. The said Council may at any time cause to be served on the owner or occupier of any property or premises a notice, in writing, requiring such owner or occupier within a time limited by such notice to destroy all such noxious weeds as may be specified in such notice and which are upon such property or premises. Any such notice may be signed by the Town Clerk or Health Inspector of the municipality.

3. If any such owner or occupier shall within the time limited by such notice fail to comply with the requirements thereof the Council may take such measures as may be reasonably necessary to destroy such rats, ants, vermin, pests, or noxious weeds at the expense of such owner or occupier and may recover the cost thereof from such owner or occupier as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

4. In this By-law the words "noxious weeds" mean and include the following:—

Scientific Name; Common Name.

Rosa rubiginosa L.; Sweet briar.
Rubus fruticosus L.; Blackberry bramble.
Ulex europaeus L.; Furze.
Watsonia Meriana, Mill; Merian's Bugle Lily.
Lycium Ferocissimum; Boxthorn.
Foeniculum Vulgare; Fennel.
Salpichroa Rhomboidea; Pampas Lily of the Valley.
Asphodelus Fistulosus; Onion weed.

5. Every person guilty of a wilful breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds or more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Brighton.

No street hawker or itinerant trader shall use any street road or public place within those parts of the municipal district described in the schedule hereto for the purpose of selling offering or exposing for sale therein any goods between the hours of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and 12 o'clock midnight on any day not being a Sunday, Christmas Day or Good Friday or at any time on a Sunday or on Christmas Day or Good Friday."

2. The schedule to the said By-law No. 82 shall be altered by adding to the paragraphs contained in such schedule the following paragraphs, that is to say:—

"3. That part of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield which is known as Dandenong-road which lies between the eastern boundary of Orrong-road and the western boundary of Chestnut-street.

4. That part of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield which is known as Koornang-road which lies between the southern boundary of Dandenong-road and the northern boundary of Neerim-road.

5. That part of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield which is known as Hawthorn-road which lies between the southern boundary of Glenhantly-road and the northern boundary of North-road.

6. That part of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield which is known as Glenhantly-road which lies between the eastern boundary of Nepean Highway and the western boundary of Hawthorn-road.

7. That part of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield which is known as Railway-avenue which lies between the eastern boundary of Smith-street and the southern boundary of Dandenong-road.

8. That part of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield which is known as Derby-road which lies between the southern boundary of Dandenong-road and the southern boundary of Railway-avenue.

9. That part of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield which is known as North-road which lies between the eastern boundary of Hawthorn-road and the western boundary of Sussex-road."

6. Clause 16 of the said By-law 106 is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof there shall be inserted the following clause:—

16. If a vehicle shall be left standing (whether unattended or not) in any street or road (including a parking area) in contravention of this By-law or any other By-law of the Council, then the owner and/or any person apparently in control of such vehicle and the custodian of such vehicle shall on request give such information as he may have to a member of the Police Force or to any authorized officer relating to the identity of any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control) who is or was the driver of such vehicle at the time when it was left standing as aforesaid as may lead to the identification of the person who is or was the driver thereof at the time.

7. The provision of clause 16 of the said By-law No. 106 as substituted by clause 6 of this By-law shall apply to any contravention of this By-law.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Warrnambool.

9. The definitions contained in clause 1 of the said By-law No. 106 shall apply to this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires.

(c) Any vehicle which moves wholly or partly on crawler or revolving tracks,

without first obtaining a permit, in writing, so to do from the Council of the Shire of Gisborne or an Officer of the Council authorized to issue such a permit on its behalf and the Shire Secretary and the Shire Engineer for the time being are hereby so authorized.

3. Every such permit granted either by the said Council or by its authorized officer may contain any provisions which may be considered by the Council or its officer to be necessary or desirable.

4. Every person who contravenes any provision of this By-law or who omits or neglects to carry out the conditions of any permit issued under this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20).

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Gisborne.

2. No person shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any swine or pig sty within the area prescribed.
