## PORTS IN VICTORIA—ALTERATION TO PORT RULES.

### PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1928* (19 Geo. V. No. 3723) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharves: And that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed and others substituted in their stead: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act by this Proclamation do hereby repeal the definition of the Port of Lorne published in the *Government Gazette* of the 3rd December, 1913, and do substitute therefor the following definition, that is to say:—

The Port of Lorne shall include all inlets, rivers, bays, harbors, and navigable waters west of and within that part of the circumference of a circle described seaward from shore to shore with the Navigation Light on Lorne Jetty as centre and a radius of one (1) mile.

## Local Government Act.

### PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Wycheproof has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to the municipal district of the Shire of Wycheproof, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned municipal district of the Shire of Wycheproof on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 30th November, 1955, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided, further, that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 30th November, 1955.

## PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF MORWELL.

## PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1946, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Morwell has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a street within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land reserved for a street, being part of Crown allotment 69, Parish of Maryvale, and being the land described hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

*Margaret-street (Eastern Portion).*

Commencing at a point on the northern side of Maryvale-road distant 228 deg. 41 min. 2 ft. 11½ in. from the southern angle of lot 22 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 15159; bounded thence by lines bearing respectively 228 deg. 41 min. 28 ft. 10½ in., 189 deg. 49 min. 27 ft. 6 in., 279 deg. 49 min. 407 ft. 5½ in., 48 deg. 41 min. 64 ft. 3 in. and 99 deg. 49 min. 385 ft. 3½ in. to the point of commencement.

## MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1949.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Milk Pasteurization Act* 1949 (No. 5444) it is provided that a day be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* in relation to a prescribed district and whereas the municipal district of the City of Malvern has been prescribed as a district for the purposes of the said Act. Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Monday, the nineteenth day of September, 1955, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed district of the City of Malvern—

- (a) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises and bottled and sealed as prescribed; or
- (b) in the case where the milk is sold and delivered at a shop for immediate consumption by a customer at the shop) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises.

## CITY OF MELBOURNE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF FLINDERS PARK AND FOR THE PRESERVATION OF GOOD ORDER AND DECENCY THEREIN.

WHEREAS by Crown grant entered in the register book volume 600 folio 119903 all that piece of land therein particularly described was granted to the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Melbourne in order to be maintained and used at all times thereafter as and for a public park known as Flinders Park: And whereas by section 11 of Act No. 4574 the name and style of the Corporation of the City of Melbourne was altered to "Lord Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Melbourne" now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Lord Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Melbourne in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 182 of the *Land Act 1928* and every other Act and power enabling them so to do make the Regulations following for the care protection and management of Flinders Park and for the preservation of good order and decency therein.

1. These Regulations shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construed as one with Regulations for the care protection and management of Yarra, Princes, Flinders and Fawcner Parks published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th day of October, 1885, and any Regulations amending the same.

2. No person shall bring in to Flinders Park any microphone, loudspeaker, amplifier or other public address apparatus of any kind.

3. No person in Flinders Park shall speak in to any microphone connected with any loudspeaker, amplifier or other public address apparatus of any kind located in the said Park or in any street or road adjoining the said Park.

4. No person in Flinders Park shall operate any loudspeaker, amplifier or other public address apparatus of any kind.

5. Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall pursuant to section 182 of the *Land Act 1928* for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds; and every person who so offends, and who after he has been warned by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

"15. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course, he shall—

- (1) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 4s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;
- (2) for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 5s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;
- (3) for the third occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 6s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;
- (4) for the fourth occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 6s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage."

**AMENDMENT OF BRICKLAYING TRADE APPRENTICESHIP REGULATIONS.**

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 13th July, 1955, rescind Regulation 8 of the Bricklaying Trade Apprenticeship Regulations and substitute therefor the following:—

"8. The minimum weekly rates of wages to be paid to apprentices in the said trade shall be the under-mentioned percentages of the aggregate of the adult male basic wage, the margin for skill and the tool allowance determined from time to time by the Bricklayers' Board, calculated to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. to be disregarded.

**CARPENTRY AND JOINERY TRADES APPRENTICESHIP REGULATIONS.**

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the Regulations mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, and doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

*Short Title.*

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Carpentry and Joinery Trades Apprenticeship Regulations."

*Interpretation.*

2. In these Regulations—  
"Acts" means the Apprenticeship Acts.  
"Prescribed" means prescribed by an appropriate industrial authority or agreement or by these Regulations, as the case may require.  
"Probationer" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.

*Application of Regulations.*

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, viz.:—

- (1) Carpentry,
- (2) Joinery,
- (3) Carpentry and Joinery—

as carried on in the whole of the State of Victoria—

- (a) in connexion with the erection, remodelling, and repair of buildings;
- (b) in connexion with the making, preparing, fixing, and repair of fittings in or on buildings;
- (c) in workshops, yards, and joinery mills;

but excluding—

- (i) the construction or repair of wharfs, jetties, piers, and bridges;
- (ii) the making of agricultural implements; and
- (iii) the work of ship joiners.

*Educational Qualifications for Entry into Apprenticeship.*

4. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades: Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination—

(1) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—

- (a) The Intermediate Technical Certificate or Junior Technical Certificate of the Education Department of Victoria or the School Intermediate Certificate.
- (b) The completion, in a manner satisfactory to the Commission, of the third year of the course of study of the Junior Technical Schools of the Education Department of Victoria.

(2) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928*, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trades.

*Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.*

5. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or probationers shall be fifteen years.

*Term of Apprenticeship.*

6. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be five years.

*Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.*

7. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in the said trades and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof shall be in the form contained in the Seventh Schedule to the General Apprenticeship Regulations, with the following additions thereto:—

*Additional Covenants, &c., to General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.*

EMPLOYER'S COVENANTS.

(1) After clause (f), the following additional clauses shall be inserted:—

"(g) Not require or allow the apprentice, while under the age of eighteen years, to attend winches, sling timber, or work power-driven machinery.

(h) In the event of the apprentice, while in his service, having his clothes or tools spoilt by acid, sulphur, or other deleterious substances, recompense the apprentice to the value of the loss sustained, unless such loss was occasioned by the carelessness or neglect of the apprentice.

(i) Not keep more than one day's pay in hand."

MUTUAL AGREEMENTS.

(2) After clause 12 the following additional clause shall be inserted:—

"13. That in the event of the employer's premises being destroyed or partly destroyed by fire, preventing for a period the proper tuition of the apprentice in the said trade, he may, with the approval of the Commission, be employed during such period on the performance of such other work for the employer as may be agreed upon between the employer and the Commission."

*Minimum Rates of Wages of Apprentices.*

8. The minimum weekly rates of wages to be paid to apprentices in the said trades as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 9th June, 1955, shall be the under-mentioned percentages of the aggregate of the adult male basic wage, the margin for skill (other than for stock work) and the tool allowance (other than for stock work) as determined by the Carpenters' Board from time to time or prescribed in the Carpenters and Joiners Interim Award 1953, or any variation thereof whichever is applicable, and calculated to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. to be disregarded:—

1st year—	Per cent.
1st six months ..	25
2nd six months ..	30
2nd year ..	35
3rd year ..	50
4th year ..	65
5th year ..	85

*Rates for Overtime and Shift Work.*

9. When an apprentice works under conditions for which, or at any time when, a journeyman employed at the aforesaid trades would be entitled to overtime or special rates for doing work under the same conditions or at the same time, then such apprentice shall be paid by the employer for any such work at a rate or rates of wages which shall bear the same proportion to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such apprentice as the wages of such journeyman for such work would bear to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such journeyman.

*Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen.*

10. (1) Subject to sub-regulation (2) of this Regulation, the number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trades shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed by such employer in such trades.

(2) In the case of joinery mills or joinery workshops the number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the trade of Joinery shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to the first journeyman, and one apprentice to each two journeymen thereafter, employed by such employer in such trade.

(3) For the purposes of this Regulation—

(a) an employer working at the trades shall be deemed to be a journeyman;

(b) the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trades by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time;

(c) "apprentices" means apprentices or probationers.

*Trade Experience to be Given to an Apprentice.*

11. The employer shall, by the best means in his power, and to the extent to which his facilities permit, give or cause to be given to the apprentice gradual and complete instruction, to the satisfaction of the Commission, in the following processes (as the case may be):—

(1) *Carpentry*—

All phases of the trade, including the correct methods of using all tools commonly used in connexion with the carpentry trade.

The construction, erection, alteration, and repair of the timber framework and timber coverings of buildings; form building, framing, and timber construction work in connexion with concrete, brickwork, plaster, and other commonly used building materials; the erection of interior woodwork of buildings; and the making of such woodwork where made on the job.

The fixing of floors, doors, window frames and sashes, skirtings, mouldings, panelling, stairs, mantels, cases, and built-in fixtures, and the fixing of building hardware and fittings as generally carried out by the carpenter.

(2) *Joinery*—

All phases of the trade, including the correct methods of using all tools commonly used in the joinery trade.

The preparation of timber, and the making and repair of timber fittings used in connexion with buildings, including doors, door frames, window sashes and frames, cupboards, stairs, panelling, metal shop fronts, and fittings.

(3) *Carpentry and Joinery*—

All phases of Carpentry and of Joinery, as prescribed above.

*Classes for Instruction.*

12. The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trades shall be as set out in the Second Schedule hereto, but any apprentice or probationer who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

*Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.*

13. The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice—

(1) in the subjects of the first, second, or third year of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year; and

(2) in the subjects of the final year of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the "final certificate" of the Commission—

shall not be less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course or such average percentage of marks in all of the said subjects as is deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

*Standard of Proficiency.*

14. Should the apprentice in any year pass at the first attempt in each of the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 70 per cent. of the possible marks allotted to such subjects at the annual examinations approved by the Commission, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year.

*Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.*

15. (1) When an apprentice attains in the first year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course he shall be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 5s. per week in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage.

(2) When an apprentice attains in any year other than the first year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course he shall be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 2s. 6d. per week in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage.

(3) From the 1st January, 1956, when an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course he shall—

(a) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 4s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;

(b) for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 5s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;

(c) for the third occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 6s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;

(d) for the fourth occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 6s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage.

*Payment of School Fees.*

16. (1) The school fees of apprentices for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices, but on receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice has secured during the period covered by the report a record of 100 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day classes and not less than 80 per cent. of the prescribed evening classes, the employer shall refund to the apprentice the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period, the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(2) In cases where the apprentice is prevented from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, or for other reasons accepted by the Commission, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentages; provided that the employer may require the apprentice to produce a medical certificate as proof of such illness or accident, and in that case, if the apprentice fails to produce such certificate, such occasions shall be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentages.

(3) In the case of an apprentice undertaking a correspondence course, the school fees for the correspondence course shall be paid by the apprentice, but on receipt by

the employer of a report from the Commission that the apprentice has completed not less than 80 per cent. of the test papers set for the period of instruction covered by the report, and returned the same to the correspondence school, the employer shall refund to the apprentice the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction.

(4) For the purposes of this Regulation, "apprentices" means apprentices or probationers.

CO-OPERATIVE HOUSING SOCIETIES (GENERAL)  
REGULATIONS No. 9.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Co-operative Housing Societies Acts and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

*Citation.*

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Co-operative Housing Societies (General) Regulations No. 9.



*Amendment.*

2. The Co-operative Housing Societies (General) Regulations are amended as follows:—

For Regulation 26, as heretofore amended, there shall be substituted the following regulation:—

“26. (1) The maximum amount of the management income which in any one financial year (including the financial year current at the coming into force of this Regulation) may be paid by any society to its officers other than directors (hereinafter called ‘the maximum amount’) shall be as follows:—

(a) Where the management fee of the society does not exceed three pence per share per month the maximum amount shall be four-fifths of the management income received by the society in the financial year in question.

(b) Where the management fee of the society exceeds three pence per share per month the maximum amount shall be two-thirds of the management income of the society in the financial year in question.

Provided that in any financial year during certain months of which the management fee does not exceed three pence per share per month and during the other months of which the management fee exceeds three pence per share per month, the maximum amount for the respective periods shall be calculated in accordance with the appropriate scale as set out in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this sub-regulation.

(2) The maximum amount of the total fees which in respect of any one financial year (including the financial year current at the coming into force of this Regulation) may be paid by any society to its directors shall be the appropriate amount set out in Column B hereunder:—

(3) In this regulation ‘management income’ means the total sums which have been received by the society during the financial year in question on account of management fees transfer fees and insurance commission accrued due in or before the financial year in question, but does not include any entrance fee.”

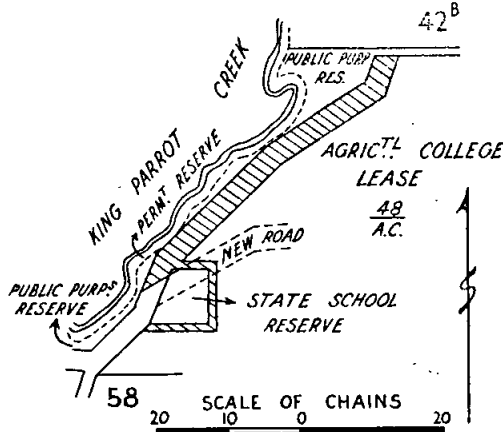

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE SEVILLE PUBLIC PURPOSES (SWIMMING POOL) RESERVE.**

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Seville reserved for Public purposes, as indicated by red and blue colour on plan W over 27.11.47 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.2642, and known as the Seville Public Purposes (Swimming Pool) Reserve (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Pool shall be open each summer during the period from October to April and the opening and closing days shall be determined by the Committee of Manage-

ment. Times of opening and closing as decided upon by the Committee of Management from time to time shall be displayed on the Pool Notice Board. The Committee of Management may, however, close the Pool or any part thereof should it be considered necessary to do so and may also vary the periods or hours during which the Pool shall be open to the public.

2. No person shall bathe in the Pool unless wearing bathing costume, trunks or drawers of a nature approved by the person in charge or by the Committee of Management. Any person within the bounds of the Reserve contravening this Regulation shall be required by the person in charge to at once resume his or her ordinary dress.

3. The person in charge of the Reserve may charge every person entering the Pool the proper fees or dues for the use of receptacles for clothes and for bathing accommodation and requisites, and such fees or dues shall be determined by the Committee of Management from time to time and shall be exhibited in plain figures on the Pool Notice Board.

4. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any part of the Reserve open to the public view.

5. No boy or girl under the age of fourteen years and who is unable to swim shall use the adult pool without the permission of the person in charge.

6. No boy or girl over the age of eight years who is able to swim shall enter the children's pool.

7. No person shall bring into or cause or allow any dog or other animal to enter or remain in the Reserve.

8. No person shall expectorate on the concourse of the Pool or in the entrance to the dressing rooms, compartments, passages, or conveniences on the Reserve.

9. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself or herself or commit a nuisance in the Reserve or bring any rubbish, filth, or other offensive matter into the Reserve or deposit any rubbish therein or leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, orange or other peel, papers, cast-off clothing or other litter.

10. No person shall climb or jump over the fence or walls of the Reserve or roll or throw stones into the Pool.

11. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the Pool by any other person. Splashing, ducking, riding on the shoulders, pushing into the water, or throwing into the water of any other person is hereby forbidden and any person so acting or otherwise interfering with the use and enjoyment of the Pool by any other person or behaving in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the Reserve when required to do so by the person in charge of the Reserve.

12. No person using the Reserve shall at any time bring or introduce into the Pool any beach or tennis ball, motor tube or water pistol.

13. No person shall damage or remove any placard or notice board within the Reserve.

14. No person other than the person in charge or any person authorized by the Committee of Management shall hawk, sell, or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods or articles.

15. No person using the Reserve shall at any time bring or introduce into the Reserve, or any part thereof, spirituous or other intoxicating liquors.

16. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.

17. No person shall use the Pool whilst in an unclean condition or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease, and any such person shall retire from the Reserve immediately upon being requested to do so by any of the attendants on duty in the Reserve under authority from the Committee of Management.

18. No person shall improperly foul or pollute the water in the Pool or the shower baths or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel, bathing costume, or any bathroom, dressing room, closet box, or compartment in any part of the Reserve or any furniture or article therein.

19. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap, or fitting in connexion with the Reserve, nor carelessly, negligently, or wilfully damage or injure any furniture or fittings, towel or other article supplied for use in the Reserve or damage or write upon or deface the walls, ceiling, or partitions or any other part of any structure on the Reserve.

20. No person shall at any time while being in or upon the Reserve use indecent or offensive language nor behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

21. Every person shall before entering the Reserve pay to the person in charge thereof the price of payment for entrance and bath as set out aforesaid, and every person shall before being furnished with any towel, bathing costume, or receptacle for clothes or valuables pay to the said person in charge the price of payment for the use thereof and the deposit for the same as set out aforesaid and after use shall return same to the said person in charge who will return the deposit or deposits lodged.

22. Any person hiring any towel, bathing costume, or any article from the person in charge of the Reserve shall return the same on leaving the Reserve.

23. Any person finding any article in the Reserve shall immediately thereafter deliver same to one of the attendants on duty who shall thereupon register a description of same and all particulars relating thereto in the book kept for that purpose, and any owner losing such article shall upon giving satisfactory proof thereof receive such article from an attendant on duty upon entering his or her signature and address and signing a receipt for such article in the book referred to.

24. The Committee of Management or person in charge of the Reserve will not be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the Reserve. Valuables may be handed to the said person in charge for safe keeping.

25. No man or boy over the age of six years shall enter or use any dressing room, shower, or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any woman or girl or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

26. No boy or girl under the age of fourteen years shall use the dressing sheds provided for adults without the permission of the person in charge of the Reserve.

27. No woman or girl above the age of six years shall enter or use any dressing room, shower, or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any man or boy or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

28. No child under the age of six years shall be admitted to the Reserve unless in the opinion of any attendant on duty such child is in the care of a responsible person.

29. For the purpose of maintaining good order the person in charge of the Reserve or an attendant on duty may refuse admission thereto to any person.

30. No person shall obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed at the Reserve or any officer of the Committee of Management in the performance of his or her duty thereat.

31. The Committee of Management shall not be held responsible in any way for any accident or injury sustained by or to any person or persons whilst within the boundaries of the Reserve.

32. The Committee of Management shall have the power from time to time, by Resolution, to give such directions as it may consider necessary for the proper care and management of the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(Rs.2642.)

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Lilydale as a Committee of Management thereof, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

"The Regulations made by the Board on the 5th December, 1950, as notified in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th December, 1950, for the care, protection, and management of the land in the Parish of Yarragon, temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 15th September, 1890, as a site for Public Recreation, known as the "Trafalgar Recreation Reserve," are hereby applied to the land in the Parish of Yarragon temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 8th August, 1955, as a site for Public Recreation, in addition to and adjoining the first-mentioned site."—(Rs.67.)
