# PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the areas of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes I, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

# Withdrawal of Nominations.

7. Any candidate may, by written notice addressed to the Returning Officer, withdraw his consent to his nomination at any time not later than Twelve o'clock noon on nomination day, and such candidate shall be considered as not having been nominated. The Returning Officer shall thereupon omit the name of such candidate from the hellot-napage ballot-papers.

# Nominations Advertised.

8. After Twelve o'clock noon on nomination day, the Returning Officer shall at every contested election announce the full name, Department, and Branch of each officer nominated, and shall cause notice thereof to be published in the Government Gazette.

# Uncontested Elections

If at either election one candidate only is nominated, that candidate shall be duly elected, and notice thereof shall forthwith be published by the Minister in the Government Gazette.

# Polling.

If at either election more candidates than one have been nominated, a vote shall be taken to decide the election, and the Returning Officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, and shall, by himself or his substitute or a Poll Clerk, sign or initial each of such ballot-papers, and shall enclose it with an unfastened envelope having his own name and address printed thereon, and shall send by post, or cause to be delivered, to every voter, one of such ballot-papers and envelopes pertaining to the appropriate election.
- 11. After having recorded his vote, the voter shall enclose such ballot-paper in the envelope furnished to him with the printed address of the Returning Officer thereon; shall sign his name in the space provided for the purpose on the face of the envelope; shall state his Department and Branch; and shall stamp and post, or deliver (or cause to be delivered) the same so that it will be received by the Returning Officer not later than Four o'clock in the afternoon of the twenty-eighth day of November, 1955, hereinafter referred to as "the day of the election." Any ballot-paper which is not enclosed in an envelope bearing

the voter's signature and the other particulars required to the voter's signature and the other particulars required to be endorsed thereon, or in respect of which the directions in the Third Schedule hereto have not been complied with, and any ballot-paper forwarded through the post the postage thereon not being fully prepaid, shall not be counted at the election. The decision of the Returning Officer as to the validity or invalidity of a ballot-paper shall be final.

#### Scrutineers

14. Each candidate at any election shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present when the envelopes containing ballot-papers relating to such election are being opened at the commencement of the scrutiny, and to remain during the scrutiny. Every scrutineer shall, before he acts as such, make and sign before the Returning Officer a like declaration to that which the Returning Officer and other officers employed in the conduct of the election are required to make and sign.

# The Scrutiny.

- 15. The scrutiny shall not commence until after Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day of the election.
- 16. The Returning Officer or the Substitute Returning Officer, with the assistance of any Poll Clerk duly appointed, shall—
  - (a) produce unopened all envelopes containing ballot-papers received up to the time of closing the poll;
  - (b) examine each envelope, and if it is properly signed, and if it contains the necessary particulars thereon and otherwise complies with the provisions herein contained, accept the vote for further scrutiny;
  - (c) if an envelope is not properly signed or otherwise does not comply with the provisions herein contained, reject the vote without opening the envelope:
  - (d) place the unrejected envelopes on a table face downwards, so that the signatures of the voters shall not be visible;
  - (e) open each unrejected envelope, withdraw the ballot-paper contained therein, and without inspecting the vote or permitting any other person to do so, deposit the ballot-paper in a ballot-box:
  - (f) when all unrejected envelopes have been opened and the ballot-papers withdrawn therefrom and deposited in the ballot-box, open the ballot-box and count the votes.

# Adjournment of Scrutiny.

17. The Returning Officer may from time to time adjourn the scrutiny to a day and hour fixed by him and notified to the scrutineers.

# Provisions of State Law to Operate.

18. Subject to the provisions contained herein, each election shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the law for the time being regulating elections for the Legislative Assembly, so far as they can be made applicable, mutatis mutandis.

# Recounts.

- 19. At any time before the gazettal of the result of any election, as hereinafter provided, the Returning Officer may, if he thinks fit, on the written request of any candidate setting forth the reasons for the request, or of his own motion, make a recount of the ballot-papers.
- If the Returning Officer refuses on the request of a candidate to make a recount of the ballot-papers, the candidate may, in writing, appeal to the Minister to direct a recount, and the Minister may, as he thinks fit, either direct a recount or refuse to direct a recount.

# Cases of Equal Voting.

20. If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes, the Returning Officer shall decide by lot which candidates shall be declared defeated or (in the case of a final count) which candidate shall be declared

## Publication of Results.

21. The Returning Officer shall announce the result of each election, and transmit a statement of such result to the Minister, who shall notify such result in the Government Gazette.





- C. The Minister has approved of the surety as surety for the purposes of this agreement.

Now this Agreement witnesseth that in consideration of the premises the student and the surety for themselves their executors and administrators do hereby covenant jointly and severally with the Minister and agree and declare as follows:—

1. That the student will a student will be student will a student will be student will a student will be st

- That the student will observe the conditions of tenure of the studentship as provided by any statute regulation or order for the time being in force relating to studentships and that the student's conduct and progress in the said course of training will be satisfactory.
- That the student will not relinquish or discontinue the said course of training without the prior written consent of the Minister.
- 3. That the student will throughout the period of three years commencing immediately after the termination of the said course of training or on such later date as the Minister at the request of the student may approve (which period is hereinafter called "the said period") teach in any school to which the student may be appointed either by the Minister or pursuant to any statute or regulation for the time being in force relating to the appointment or employment of State School teachers provided that in computing the said period any leave of absence granted to the student at any time after the commencement of the said period shall not be reckoned as part thereof.
- 4. That in the event of-
  - (a) the dismissal of the student pursuant to the provisions of the Act or any amendment or re-enactment thereof for the time being in force;
  - (b) the cancellation by the Minister of the studentship on the ground that the student has failed to make satisfactory progress or that the conduct of the student has not been satisfactory;

- (c) the termination by any cause other than death of the services of the student as a teacher after the expiration of the studentship but before the expiration of the said period; or
- (d) any breach by the student of any of the covenants contained in the preceding clauses hereof

the student and the surety or one of them will pay or cause to be paid to the Minister on demand a sum equal to the total of—

- (i) the amount of the allowances paid to the student;
- (ii) the amount of the tuition fees the benefit of which the student has received

during the tenure and by virtue of the studentship less one-half of that portion of the allowances so paid which is attributable to the period of the school year for junior technical schools during the final year of the said course of training.

- (a) In either of the events mentioned in paragraphs (c) and (d)
  of clause 4 hereof the sum payable under that clause shall if the Minister so directs be reduced proportionately in consideration of each period of three months' service as a teacher completed by the student.
  - (b) If the student is a female who (whether before or after the expiration of the studentship or before or after commencing service as a teacher) resigns or retires in order to marry the sum payable under clause 4 hereof shall if the Minister so directs in addition to any reduction under sub-clause (a) hereof be reduced by an amount equal to two-third parts thereof.

- C. The Minister has approved of the surety as surety for the purposes of this agreement.

Now this Agreement witnesseth that in consideration of the premises the student instructor and the surety for themselves their executors and administrators do hereby covenant jointly and severally with the Minister and agree and declare as follows:—

- That the student instructor will observe the conditions of tenure of the studentship as provided by any statute regulation or order for the time being in force relating to studentships and that the student instructor's conduct and progress in the said course of training will be satisfactory.
- That the student instructor will not relinquish or discontinue the said course of training without the prior written consent of the said cour Minister.
- 3. That the student instructor will throughout the period of three years commencing immediately after the termination of the said course of training or on such later date as the Minister at the request of the student instructor may approve (which period is hereinafter called "the said period") teach in any school to which the student instructor may be appointed either by the Minister or

pursuant to any statute or regulation for the time being in force relating to the appointment or employment of teachers or instructors in technical schools provided that in computing the said period any leave of absence granted to the student instructor at any time after the commencement of the said period shall not be reckoned as part thereof.

- 4. That in the event of-
  - (a) the dismissal of the student instructor pursuant to the Act or any amendment or re-enactment thereof for the time being in force;
  - (b) the cancellation by the Minister of the studentship on the ground that the student instructor has failed to make satisfactory progress or that the conduct of the student
  - satisfactory progress of that the conduct of the student instructor has not been satisfactory;

    (c) the termination by any cause other than death of the services of the student instructor as a teacher after the expiration of the studentship but before the expiration of the said period; or

    (d) any breach by the student of any of the covenants contained in the preceding clauses hereof

- (i) the amount of that portion of the salary paid to the student instructor which is attributable to the time during which the student instructor is required for the purposes of the said course of training to attend the Technical Teachers' College; and

  - (b) If the student instructor is a female who (whether before or after the expiration of the studentship or before or after commencing service as a teacher) resigns or retires in order to marry the sum payable under clause 4 hereof shall if the Minister so directs in addition to any reduction under sub-clause (a) hereof be reduced by an amount equal to two-third parts thereof.

# ELECTRIC FLOOR POLISHERS.

An electric floor polisher being a portable appliance designed for operation at low voltage and which, by the operation of pads, brushes, or other suitable means, may be used for polishing or scrubbing floors, but not including any such appliance having a maximum loading exceeding 500 watts.

  - (b) providing that in the event of failure of any owner or occupier of any property or premises to comply with the requirements of clause 2 of this By-law the Council may cause measures to be taken to destroy such

Argentine Ants at the expense of the owner or occupier and recover the cost thereof as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

- 1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter-
  - "Argentine Ants" means ants of the species known by the etomological name of "Iridomyrmex humilis Mayr."
    "Council" means the Council of the City of Cam-

herwell.

"Health Inspector" means any person appointed by the Council to carry out the duties of a health inspector.

Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine gender, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

- 2. (a) Every owner of property or premises which is or are unoccupied and every occupier of property or premises shall, within fourteen days of becoming aware of the presence of Argentine Ants on such property or premises, destroy all Argentine Ants on such property or
- (b) Every owner of property or premises which is or are unoccupied and every occupier of property or premises shall, within fourteen days of his being notified by the Health Inspector of the presence of Argentine Ants on such property or premises, destroy all Argentine Ants on such property or premises.
- 3. In the event of failure of any such owner or occupier to comply with the requirements of clause 2 hereof, the Council may cause measures to be taken to destroy the Argentine Ants on such property or premises at the expense of such owner or occupier. The cost thereof may be recovered by the Council from such owner or occupier as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
- 4. Every person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds or more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Camberwell.

### SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

By-LAW No. 37.

- A By-law of the Shire of Cranbourne made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts for the purpose of prohibiting, regulating and controlling excavating operations.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Cranbourne, order as follows:—
- 1. No person shall, on any land situate within the municipal district of the Shire of Cranbourne, commence or carry on any excavating operations (other than quarrying or blasting operations, or excavating operations connected with works commenced before the 10th day of November 1938) for the removal of rock, stone, clay, gravel, soil, or sand from such land unless such person is the holder of, and except within the limits of, a current permit so to do issued to him by the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne prescribing:—
  - (a) the area to which the permit relates;
  - (b) the duration of the permit; and
  - (c) the depth above sea level to which excavating operations may be carried on upon the area described in the permit (such depth to be ascertained by reference to and on the basis of the levels shown on contour survey plans).

- 2. Every person to whom any permit may be issued by the Council to commence or carry on excavating operations shall, within three months after the expiration of such permit (unless in the meantime a new permit shall have been issued to him in respect of the same area) fill in the area excavated under such permit with such material and to such level as the Council, by its Shire Secretary or Engineer, may prescribe by notice, in writing, be given to the holder of such permit within one calendar month after the expiration thereof. month after the expiration thereof.
- 3. The Council may, before issuing any permit to commence and carry on excavating operations, other than quarrying or blasting operations, require the person applying for the permit to enter into such bond, or deposit or give such security as it may think sufficient to secure compliance with the requirements of paragraph 2 hereof.
- compliance with the requirements of paragraph 2 hereof.

  4. No excavating operations (whether connected with works commenced before the 10th day of November, 1938, or not), shall be carried on within a distance of 50 feet from any street or road, or any land set out or reserved as a street or road, on any plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles, or any land which is in fact used as a street, road, lane, or passage, or within a distance of 30 feet from any land the ownership or occupation whereof is in some person other than the owner of the land on which such excavating operations are being carried on.

  5. Every person carrying on exceptings of exceptings of the street of the street of the street person carrying on exceptings.
- 5. Every person carrying on excavating operations (hereinafter called the excavator) (whether such operations are connected with works commenced before the 10th day of November, 1938, or not), shall observe the following rules as to such operations:—
  - (a) If such excavating operations are carried on by manual power, the excavator shall carry on the same, using either one of the following methods:-
    - (i) the wall or face of such excavation may be wall or lace of such excavation may be terraced, but the vertical wall or face of each step in such terrace shall not be more than 6 feet in height, and the horizontal face of every terrace other than the step at the floor of such excavation shall be of not less width than one half of the height of the vertical wall or face immediately above it or it: or
    - (ii) the banks or sides of all such excavations shall be sloped down so that the batter of such banks or sides shall be maintained at a slope ratio of one horizontal to one vertical.
  - (b) If such excavations shall be carried on by means of a hydraulic nozzle or power shovel or similar method, then the excavator may work with a vertical wall or face, subject to the following conditions:
    - '(i) the excavator shall not permit any person, whether employee or otherwise, to be within a distance of 10 feet from such wall or face; and
    - (ii) the excavator shall not allow any over-hang to exist in such wall or face;
    - very excavator working upon a vertical wall or face of a greater depth than 6 feet shall erect a fence of not less than 4 feet in height either upon the boundary line of the land occupied by the excavator or in such position in relation to the brink of such wall or face as will protect persons on ground level from falling into the pit worked by the excavator. Such fence shall be of substantial construction, and may be of posts and rails or of posts not less than 22 feet apart, with two droppers equally spaced between posts, and of not less than three strands of wire (two of (iii) every excavator working upon a vertical less than three strands of wire (two of barb and one of eight-gauge plain). The top wire shall be barbed and shall not be more than 6 inches from the top of be more than 6 inches from the top of each post. The bottom wire shall be not more than 15 inches above ground level, and the intermediate wire shall be equidistant from the top and the bottom wires. The bottom wire may be barbed or plain according to the option of the excavator.
    - (iv) a wall or fence which is not sloped down so that the batter of the banks or sides of the excavations shall be maintained at a slope ratio of one horizontal to one vertical shall be deemed "a vertical wall of face" wall-or face."

6. Every person carrying on excavating operations (whether connected with works commenced before the 10th day of November, 1938, or not), and using any mechanical or hydraulic power for such operations shall, within fourteen days from the publication of this By-law in the Government Guzette, notify the Council of the place where such power is used or intended to be used, and in such notice shall furnish the Council with full information of the type and nature of such power.

7. Every person carrying on excavating operations and

7. Every person carrying on excavating operations, and whether using manual power or mechanical or hydraulic power, and whether working upon a vertical or a sloped or a terraced face, shall work or carry on all such excavations in such a manner that when any part of any excavation made by him is, at ground surface level, 50 feet from a street or road, or 30 feet from land not in the ownership or occupation of such person (which are the limits provided in clause 4 hereof), the banks or sides of such excavations, and of all parts of such excavations, shall be sloped down so that a slope or batter of one horizontal to one vertical is maintained.

8. Any person guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such breach to a penalty of not less than Five pounds, nor more than Twenty pounds, and if such offence be a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds per day for each day of which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

Carrying on excavating operations without a permit or otherwise than in accordance with the limits of a permit (where a permit is required) shall be deemed a continuing offence.

 This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Cranbourne.

10. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately on its publication in the Victoria Government Gazette.
