

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the Local Government
Act 1946 provides—inter alia—that the Governor in
Council may, by proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of
the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the
municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Yackandandah has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to part of the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1946 to the Township of Yackandandah and the Kiewa Waterworks Trust District, including the and the Klewa waterworks Trust District, including the Townships of Klewa and Tangambalanga in the municipal district of the Shire of Yackandandah, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the abovementioned parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Yackandandah on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 23rd December 1955, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided, further that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 23rd December 1955.

Nurses Acts.

AMENDMENT TO THE NURSES REGULATIONS.

HE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria by virtue of the provisions of section 20 of the Nurses provisions of section 29 of the Nurses Act 1928, as amended by any Act, hereby makes the following amendments to the Nurses Regulations 1941 as amended by any Regulations which amendments shall come into force upon approval by the Governor in Council and publication in the Government Gazette:-

- 1. These Regulations shall be known as the Amending Nurses Regulations 1955 (No. 3) and shall be read and construed as one with the Nurses Regulations 1941 and any Regulations amending the same.
- 2. In these Regulations "registered mental nurse" means a registered mental nurse within the meaning of the Nurses and Midwives Act 1950.
- 3. All or any of the provisions of the Nurses Regulations relating to the election by registered nurses of five registered nurses as members of the Nurses Board shall with such adaptations as are necessary also apply to and in relation to the election by registered mental nurses of a registered mental nurse as a member of the Nurses Board.
- 4. Without affecting the generality of the last preceding Regulation in the extension and application by these Regulations of any provision of the Nurses Regulations to and in relation to such election of a registered mental nurse, any reference to "registered nurse", "representatives of registered nurses", "nurses", "nurses under the Nurses Acts", "Nurses Register", "five", "five votes" or "five candidates" shall be read and construed as "registered mental nurse", "representative of registered mental nurses", "mental nurses", "mental nurses and Midwives Act 1950", "Mental Nurses Register", "one", "one vote" or "candidate" respectively.

Provided that such repeal shall not affect any examination or appointment held or made or any diploma or certificate issued or any matter or thing done or required to be done under the said repealed regulations. These Regulations shall be divided into Parts as follows:—

Part I.-Preliminary.

Part II.-Trainees in Forestry.

Part III.-Diploma of Forestry.

Part IV.—Courses at the University of Melbourne.

Part V.-Discharged Servicemen.

Part VI.-Schedule.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

- 3. In these Regulations "Board" means the Board of Examiners appointed in accordance with the Forests Acts and these Regulations, "Commission" means the Forests Commission, "Secretary" means the Secretary to the Board of Examiners, and words importing the singular shall be deemed to include the plural, and the plural the singular, unless the contrary as to number is expressly provided.
- Unless the contrary intention appears words and expressions in these Regulations shall have the same respective meanings as in the Forests Acts.

PART II .-- TRAINEES IN FORESTRY.

- 5. The Commission upon the recommendation of a Board of Examiners appointed pursuant to and in accordance with the Forests Acts and these Regulations may appoint persons as trainees upon the terms and conditions provided in these Regulations for the purpose of undergoing a course of training in forestry.
- 6. All persons so appointed shall be trained at the School of Forestry, Creswick, and at such other place as is determined by the Commission.
- 7. (a) For the purposes of these Regulations the Minister shall appoint a Board of Examiners consisting of not more than eleven members, and shall appoint one of such members to be the Chairman of such Board, and such members may be paid such fees and allowances as are determined by the Commission with the approval of the Minister.
- (b) The Minister may remove any member from office, and in the case of a vacancy however arising in the office of member or Chairman, may appoint some person to fill such vacancy.
- (c) The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board at which he is present and in his absence the other members present shall elect a member from among their number to preside.

- (d) The Board shall meet when directed so to do either by its Chairman or by the Commission, and four members shall form a quorum.
- (e) Subject to the preceding provisions the Board shall regulate its own procedure.
- (f) The Commission may select an officer of the Public Service in the Department of State Forests to be Secretary to the Board.
- (g) The Secretary shall perform such duties and keep such records as the Board directs, and shall call meetings thereof when so directed either by the Chairman of the Board or by the Commission.
- (h) Any document whatever shall be deemed to be sufficiently signed by the Board if signed by the Chairman and the Secretary to the Board, or by any two members and the Secretary to the Board.
- 8. In the month of January in each year or whenever it appears necessary the Commission after consultation with the Board may cause competitive examinations to be held for the employment of trainees for the purpose of undergoing a course of training in forestry, and the date and place of any such examination shall be notified in at least two daily newspapers circulating throughout Victoria.
- 9. The Board shall direct any such examination and fix the duration thereof and such examination shall be a written examination in the subjects of English, Geography, and General Knowledge up to a standard determined by the Board.
- 10. (a) Every person who desires to undergo a course of training in forestry shall forward an application to the Secretary and shall be prepared to submit himself to such examination as either the Board or the Commission may in pursuance of these Regulations determine.
- (b) Every application shall be in the applicant's handwriting and shall state his full name and address together with the date and place of his birth and shall be accompanied by a certificate of a person approved of by the Board stating that the applicant is of good character, industrious, and a suitable person for employment as a trainee in forestry.
- (c) No person shall be entitled to compete at any such examination unless he is the holder of the Leaving Certificate issued by the University of Melbourne or its equivalent inclusive of the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, and one branch of Mathematics: Provided that a person who is awaiting the results of examinations for such certificate or subjects shall be so entitled to compete, but may not be eligible for selection as hereinafter provided should he fail to pass such examinations for such certificate or subjects.
- (d) No person shall be entitled to compete at any such examination whose age is less than sixteen years or more than twenty-one years on the 31st day of December of the year preceding the year in which the examination concerned is held, or who fails to comply with the requirements of this Regulation.
- 11. The Board shall cause an examiner to allot marks in respect of each subject of the examination. Every examiner shall furnish to the Board a list giving the name of each candidate and the marks allotted to him for each subject in which he was examined.
- 12. (a) As soon as practicable after an examination has been held the Board shall interview each successful candidate for the purpose of determining his suitability or otherwise for appointment as a trainee in forestry and the Board shall thereupon submit to the Commission a return setting forth in order of merit, showing the marks obtained by each such candidate in each subject and the total of his marks, the names of those candidates whom it recommends to the Commission for appointment as trainees in forestry in accordance with the Forests Acts and these Regulations.
- (b) Notwithstanding the foregoing the Board may without prior examination interview and recommend to the Commission for appointment as a trainee any person who fulfils the requirements of paragraphs (b), (c) and (d) of regulation 10.

- 13. The Commission-may thereupon select from such return such candidates as it considers suitable to undergo, as trainees, a course of training in forestry.
- 14. Upon being notified of such selection a candidate shall furnish to the Commission a birth certificate or other evidence satisfactory to the Commission of the date of his birth and shall, upon the Commission arranging the same, present himself for medical examination by the Government Medical Officer.
- 15. The Government Medical Officer shall be requested to furnish to the Commission a certificate showing the date of the medical examination and stating that the candidate is or is not suffering from any disability likely to render him unfitted to enter upon the said course of study1 and at the completion thereof to enter the Public Service of Victoria.
- 16. Any candidate selected as herein provided and certified by the Government Medical Officer as not suffering from any disability as aforesaid shall thereupon be designated a trainee and when required so to do by the Commission shall enter and reside at the School of Forestry, Creswick, or attend such other institution as may be specified for a period of at least three years or such additional period as may be required of him by the Commission.

17. Every trainee shall-

- (a) Conduct himself in a satisfactory manner and at all times comply with the reasonable requirements of the principal of the school or institution;
- (b) Undertake the course of study from time to time prescribed by the Commission;
- (c) Present himself at such examinations as are required of him; and
- '(d)-Engage in practical work and studies in the forests, plantations, nurseries and other places when so required by the principal of the school.
- 18. During such time as a trainee is required by the Commission to be in residence at the said school or other institution he shall without charge receive board lodging tuition and instruction and the Commission may on such terms and conditions as it deems fit pay him an allowance in respect of each week of residence.
- 19. A trainee shall be paid all railway and bus fares incurred by him in proceeding by public transport between the said school or institution and his home within the State of Victoria at the commencement and termination of each academic year and at the recognized vacations and Easter holidays.
- 20. In any case where a trainee proves to the satisfaction of the Board that he has at the University of Melbourne or other approved institution reached an educational standard at least equivalent to the standard of any subject included in the said course of training of forestry such trainee may if the Board so certifles-be deemed to have passed such examination.
- 21. (a) Upon completion by a trainee of the said course of training in forestry and subject to his having passed the required examinations, the Board shall award to him the associate diploma of the School of Forestry, Creswick.
- (b) The associate diploma shall be in such form as is approved by the Board.
- (c) Every recipient of the associate diploma shall be entitled to use after his name the expression "A.Dip. For. (Cres.)",
 - (d) The Board may award the associate diploma in retrospect.
- 22. Every trainee upon completion of the said course of training shall when so required by the Commission apply for and accept an appointment in the Professional Division of the Public Service of Victoria as a Junior Assistant Forester.
- 23. (a) Every person who is selected in accordance with the Forests Acts and these Regulations, for the purpose of undergoing the said course of training in forestry, shall, as a condition precedent to the commencement of such course, with an approved surety for such person, enter into an agreement with the Commission in such form and containing such conditions, not inconsistent with these Regulations as the Commission thinks fit.

- (b) In any case where the agreement entered into by the person so selected does not provide for payment of the allowance referred to in Regulation 18 hereof, the Commission may require such person and the surety for such person to enter into such further or supplementary agreement as it thinks fit as a condition precedent to his receiving payment of such allowance.
- 24. Every trainee on appointment to the Public Service will when so required by the Commission serve as an officer of the Professional Division of the Public Service throughout the period of five years next after the date of his appointment to that division.
- 25. In the event of a trainee failing to complete satisfactorily any year of the said course of study the Commission may if it thinks fit extend such course of study by one year on the condition that the trainee and the said surety or either of them shall if so required by the Commission pay to the Commission such sum which it estimates as the actual cost incurred in so extending the course of training of the trainee together with the total amount of any allowance paid to the trainee pursuant to Regulation 18 during that year.
- 26. The Commission may after consultation with the Board admit any person possessing the qualifications prescribed in Regulation 10 (c) to the said School of Forestry at Creswick for the purpose of completing a course of training in forestry upon such person paying to the Commission an amount by way of reimbursement of the cost of such course of training as aforesaid. A certificate under the hand of the Accountant in the Department of State Forests shall be final and conclusive as to such amount.
- 27. The provisions of Regulations 17, 20 and 21 shall with such modifications and adaptations as are necessary apply to any person admitted in accordance with Regulation 26 of these Regulations.

PART III.—DIPLOMA OF FORESTRY (VICTORIA).

- 28. The Board may issue a Diploma of Forestry (Victoria) to any candidate who complies with the provisions of this Part of the Regulations. Every diploma shall be in such form as is approved by the Board. Every recipient of a diploma awarded in accordance with the provisions of this Part or of any regulations heretofore made in respect of the award of Diplomas of Forestry shall be entitled to use after his name the expression "Dip.For. (Vic.)".
- The Board may grant diplomas to candidates according to the conditions hereinafter prescribed.
- 30. Any person may be accepted as a candidate for the diploma provided that---
 - (a) he has successfully completed the prescribed course in forestry at the School of Forestry, Creswick, and has subsequently completed at least three years in the practice of an aspect of forestry approved by the Board for the purpose of this Part; or
 - (b) he has obtained a diploma or a degree in forestry approved by the Board at a University, college, or institute approved in a like manner; or
 - (c) he has completed a University course approved by the Board and is considered by the Board a fit person to be accepted as a candidate for the diploma.
- 31. The diploma will be awarded only after examination of a thesis submitted by the candidate on some approved subject bearing directly on forest problems.
- 32. Application for admission as a candidate for the diploma shall be lodged with the secretary to the Board, and shall be accompanied by evidence that the candidate can satisfy the conditions appearing in Regulation 30, and by the title of the subject on which the candidate proposes to submit a thesis in accordance with Regulation 31 above.
- 33. The Board may, after consideration, accept or reject any application for admission as a candidate for the diploma.

- 34. The Board shall constitute an examination committee for the purpose of examining each thesis submitted by a candidate. Such committee shall consist of one person appointed annually by the Board as Chairman and two other persons appointed by him as examiners.
- 35. The Chairman of the Examination Committee may, where it is in his opinion advisable or necessary, appoint any additional person possessing special qualifications in regard to the subject matter of any particular thesis or any section of same to assist in the examination of such thesis or section of same, but such person shall act only in an advisory capacity and shall not be a member of the Committee. Any person so appointed shall receive the fee prescribed for examiners.
- 36. It shall be the duty of the Examination Committee to examine the thesis and to report to the Board in writing its decision and the reasons for same.
- 37. (a) Every such candidate shall, on submission of his thesis, pay to the Commission an examination fee of Two pounds two shillings (£2 2s.).
- (b) The Commission shall pay to each examiner, appointed in accordance with Regulation 34 or Regulation 35, a fee of £2 2s. for each thesis examined.
- 38. The Board on consideration of the report of the Examination Committee and after such additional inquiry as it deems necessary may upon his lodging with the Registrar a fee of Ten shillings and six pence (10s. 6d.) issue to a successful candidate a Diploma in the form referred to in Regulation 28.

PART IV.—COURSES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

- 39. The Commission with the approval of the Public Service Board may grant to a forest officer (hereinafter described as "the Candidate") employed in the Public Service of Victoria in the Department of State Forests permission to enter upon a course of study at the University of Melbourne in Forestry, Science, Engineering, or Commerce.
- 40. An application for permission to enter upon a course of study pursuant to this Part of the Regulations shall be in writing, signed by the Candidate, and addressed to the Secretary of the Commission on a form provided for the purpose.
- 41. An application so made must reach the Secretary of the Commission not later than the 15th day of January of the year in which the Candidate desires to commence his proposed course of study.
- 42. No application will be accepted by the Commission unless the Candidate has successfully completed the prescribed course of training in forestry at the School of Forestry, Creswick, has served at least twelve months as a forest officer in the Public Service of Victoria in the Department of State Forests, and (except in special cases determined by the Commission) is not over the age of 25 years on the first day of January of the year in which he intends to commence his course.
- 43. The Commission shall upon behalf of a Candidate to whom permission has been so granted, pay all fees and other reasonable charges incurred by him at the University of Melbourne in relation to the subjects forming a part of his course. Such fees and charges shall include lecture fees, laboratory fees, and examination fees together with all other charges which the Commission determines to be payable by a student pursuing such course.
- 44. Every Candidate granted permission under these Regulations to enter a course of study as aforesaid shall pursuant to the Public Service Acts apply for the necessary leave of absence on full pay to enable him to attend the essential lectures and practical and other work and examinations in the subjects of his course.
- 45. The permission of the Commission granted under and by virtue of these Regulations shall be subject to the following conditions:—
 - (a) The Candidate shall take the necessary steps to enrol himself at the University of Melbourne at such time as will enable him to commence his course at the commencement of the first term subsequent to the granting of his application.

- (b) The Candidate shall throughout the whole of his course of study regularly attend lectures and tutorial classes in the subjects which are necessary to enable the completion of the year of the course he has entered upon; and in addition he shall satisfy all such matters and things required of him by the said University.
- (c) The Candidate must at the end of each academic year of his course obtain a satisfactory report from the Professorial Board of the said University as to his progress and conduct.
- (d) The Commission may in any case cancel its permission if the Candidate fails to complete satisfactorily any year in his course of study or on the ground that his progress or conduct has not been satisfactory. Provided in any case the Commission may in its discretion withhold cancellation of its permission if it is satisfied that upon the extension of the Candidate's course he has reasonable prospects of completing the same.
- 46. Every Candidate to whom permission is so granted shall as a condition to the granting thereof be required to enter into an agreement with the Commission and with an approved surety for such Candidate in the form provided in Part VI.
- 47. Such agreement shall contain a provision that the Candidate to whom permission is granted will observe the requirements of these Regulations or any amendment thereof, that he will not relinquish the course of studies to which he has been admitted without the permission in writing of the Commission being first had and obtained, that he will not discontinue service with the Crown in the Public Service of Victoria for any cause within his control during the period of the said course and that he will remain and continue in the service of the Crown in the said Public Service as aforesaid from the date of the completion by him of the said course or the date of the cancellation by the Commission of the benefit of these Regulations until the expiration of a period of five years next after the said completion or cancellation (as the case may be) and if the Candidate has taken any additional period of time to complete the said course of study.he will if required as aforesaid continue in the said service for a further year.

PART V.-DISCHARGED SERVICEMEN.

- 48. Notwithstanding anything contained in Part II. of these Regulations the Commission may in its discretion appoint any discharged Serviceman who has served outside Australia as a member of any naval military or air force of Her Majesty or the Commonwealth of Australia or any of Her Majesty's Dominions as a trainee for the purpose of undergoing a course of training in forestry at the said School without his passing the competitive examination referred to in the said Part.
- . 49. Provided however that a discharged Serviceman shall not be so appointed unless--
 - (a) he is eligible to undergo training in accordance with the provisions of any Commonwealth Scheme for the training of discharged Servicemen;
 - (b) he has the educational qualifications referred to in Regulations 10 and 20; and
 - (c) his age is not more than 26 years at the date when his application for appointment as a trainee is received.





DECLARATION OF THE ARTHURTON BRIDGE-ROAD IN THE CITIES OF BRUNSWICK AND NORTHCOTE.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the fifth day of September One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five the Country Roads Board incorporated under the Country Roads Act 1928 (No. 3662) being of opinion that the highway in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same is of sufficient importance to be a main road and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highway to be a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Government Gazette confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution shall be a

main road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirmed to the President and Adal States. firm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette the road mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the Country Roads Act 1928.

Resolution for Declaration of a Main Road under the Country Roads Act.

The Country Roads Board incorporated under the Country Roads Act 1928 (No. 3662) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the highway within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written is of sufficient importance to be a main road acting under the powers conferred upon it by the said Act doth by this Resolution hereby declare such highway to be a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Country Roads Act 1928.







REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "THOMSON PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE," CITY OF GEELONG.

RECREATION RESERVE." CITY OF GEELONG.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928 as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the City of Geelong temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation by Order in Council dated the 3rd August, 1954, and known as the "Thomson Public Recreation Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee").

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.
 - 2. No person shall—
 - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
 - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
 - (c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
 - (d) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

- 3. The Committee shall have the power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.
- 4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.
- 5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
- 6. No person shall park a motor-car, vehicle, or motor-cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set aside for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.
- 7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game, or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or Anzac Day, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, air gun, or any firearm in or upon the Reserve.
- 11. No persons shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any member of the Police Force, or any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.
- 12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.
- 13. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or any other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.
- 14. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.
- 15. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 16. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 17. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 18. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games, or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

- 19. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor ride or drive amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.
- 20. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 21. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.
- $22.\ No$ person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.
- 23. Any person committing on any part of the Reserve or in any of the rooms, buildings, structures, or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations:—
 - (a) Entering, crossing, being on or trespassing on any playing ground, area, enclosure or course, or building, room, or structure, or any part thereof, whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment, or amusement is being played, conducted, or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee.
 - (b) Interfering with or interrupting any games, sports, competition, entertainment, or amusement or practise thereat.
 - (c) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.

received.

Schedules as above, with full particulars, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also the samples will be shown and any information

afforded to persons tendering.

Should the tenderer be in a position to supply a suitable substitute of Commonwealth production or manufacture in place of any sample exhibited that may be of imported origin, he may tender for such substitute, but must submit with his tender a sample of the article offered.

In all cases the country of origin of the articles tendered must be stated, and the total cost of each item extended in the columns provided.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, preferably by non-negotiable cheque payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board. The amount and designation of the preliminary deposit enclosed must be clearly stated in the tender. Savings Bank deposit book, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within 30 days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, falling which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of one year, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ______" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Offices, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, or if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedules the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

- 2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country or origin of the goods supplied.
- goods supplied.

 3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.
- 4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
- 5. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne District will include a radius of 10 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.
- 6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary, Education Department, or such other officer whom he may appoint.
- 7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in clause 7.
- 9. The official order issued by the Education Department shall be forwarded by the contractor to the officer authorized to accept delivery, who shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach same to his claim for payment.
- 10. All orders, duly receipted, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account in the prescribed form for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time to be allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

 11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to have been made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods, If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.
- 12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing

- which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in clause 7.
- 13. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.
- 14. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with clause 15, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 17 of these conditions. Such mulct may be deducted as in clause 7.

Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted as in clause 7.

Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of clauses 14 and 15 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding. Fifty pounds as the said Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in clause 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of one year from the date of such disqualification.
- 18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

21. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in clause 20, will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

22. - 2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. - 1. No person shall in the municipal district release or discharge or cause or permit to be released or discharged into the air such quantities of dust, grit, ash, smoke, soot, fumes, offensive odours or smells as shall constitute a public nuisance.
- 2. No person shall in the municipal district use or permit to be used any fireplace or furnace under his direction or control or in his ownership unless such fireplace or fur-nace is so designed and constructed or is fitted with such appliances or devices or has attached to it a chimney or flue of such design and construction as will prevent the creation of a public nuisance by the emission or discharge into the air of dust, grit, ash, smoke, soot, fumes, offensive odours or smells arising from the use of such fireplace or furnace.
- 3. No person shall in the municipal district create or permit or cause to be created or permitted upon premises under his direction or control any noise which extends beyond the confines of the said premises in such volume as to constitute a public nuisance.
- 4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district and shall be in aid of and not in substitution for any other powers given to or imposed upon the Council of the municipality by any other Act, Regulation or ordinance.
- 5. Every person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds or more than Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.
- 6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Brunswick.

By-Law No. 87.

- A By-law of the City of Kew, under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and all other powers thereto enabling in that behalf, and numbered 87, for the pur-pose of regulating the keeping of animals and limiting the number of animals kept on any property.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and all other powers enabling in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Kew order as follows:—
- 1. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the Government Gazette of Victoria.
- 2. This By-law shall apply to and operate in the whole of the municipal district of the City of Kew .
- 3. Clause 4 of By-law No. 72 of the City of Kew is hereby repealed.
- 4. For the purpose of this By-law "dog" shall mean a dog which is required to be registered pursuant to the provisions of sub-section 1 of section 4 of the Dog Acts of the State of Victoria, and "premises" shall include any building or any land under separate occupation.
- 5. (i) No person without the consent, in writing, of the Council shall have on any premises or keep on any premises or allow to be or remain on any premises more than two dogs.
- (ii) The occupier of any premises if he permits or suffers any other person to have on the premises or to keep on the premises or to allow to be or remain on the premises any dog shall be deemed to have allowed that dog to remain on the premises.
- dog to remain on the premises.

 6. Any consent given by the Council for the purposes of this By-law may be expressed to be limited so as to remain in effect only for a specified time or only until a notice that it has been withdrawn is served on the person to whom it was given, and any consent, whether expressed to be so limited or not, may be withdrawn by notice in writing served on the person to whom it was given, and after the service of such a notice any person who wilfully does or wilfully allows anything that is prohibited by the clause under which the consent was given shall be deemed to have been guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to that clause as if no consent had ever been given. ever been given.
- 7. (i) Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- (ii) Any person who wilfully continues an offence contrary to the provisions of this By-law after a conviction or order of the court in respect of such offence, shall be liable on conviction to a further penalty of not more than One pound for each day on which the offence is so continued.

CITY OF MOORABBIN.

By-LAW No. 209.

A By-law of the City of Moorabbin, made under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1946, and numbered 209, for amending By-law No. 101 of the City of Moorabbin (Building Regulations).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1946, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 101 of the City of Moorabbin is hereby amended by the addition of the following clause thereto:—

"24. No split paling and no close fence of iron exceeding 4 feet in height above the footpath level shall be erected abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road except that in the case of a corner allotment this clause shall apply only to the fence abutting on one of the streets and the first 30 feet of the other fence measured from the intersection of the building lines of the two streets, providing however that where an allotment of land is not on the corner of two streets a close fence not exceeding 6 feet in height above footpath level may be constructed along the frontage if same is constructed in prick or stone or in accordance with the following specifications:—Posts shall consist of 8 ft. 5 in. x 3 in. redgum or jarrah spaced 9 feet centre to centre and properly fitted with 3 in. x 2 in. jarrah sole plates 2 ft. 9 in. long, and 3 in. x 2 in. jarrah struts, and sunk 2 feet into the ground. Top and bottom rails shall be of 3 in. x 2 in. hardwood, and a centre rail of 3 in. x 1½ in. hardwood. The plinth shall be of 6 in. x 1 in. jarrah. Palings shall be 6 in. x 1 in. and 4 in. x 2 in. sawn and dressed hardwood or jarrah veatherproofed to the approval of the building surveyor. The 6 in. x 1 in. palings shall be spaced 2 inches apart and securely nailed to each rail. The 4 in. x 1 in. paling and covering the spaces between the 6 in. x 1 in. paling and shall be nailed securely to each rail. The tops of all pallings shall be cut to neat lines."

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Moorabbin.

2. Other matter.

- (a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.
- (b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.
- (c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.
- (d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.

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The title (15 Reward, Dissolution of Partnerships, &c.) forms one or more lines as a heading.

On an average, ten words make a line.

Every signature must likewise be counted as a line.

The final words of a paragraph, though only portion of a line, must be counted as one line. \cdot

SIGNATURES (in particular) and proper names must be written very plainly in the text; ONE SIDE ONLY of each slip of paper should be WRITTEN UPON.

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ALL DOCUMENTS illegibly written will be returned unpublished, and, where brands occur unprovided for by the ordinary letters of the alphabet, a worded explanatory description must be furnished.

THE VICTORIA GOVERNMENT GAZETTE is published on WEDNESDAY EVENING in each week, and Notices for insertion will be received by the Government Printer at or before Two p.m. at ordinary rates, and late advertisements between Two p.m. and Five p.m. at double rates on the day preceding the day of publication.

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
