Furnacemen or furnacemens' assistants attending boilers in addition to their ordinary work shall be paid is. per day above their ordinary rates of pay, but no furnaceman or assistant shall attend any boiler that provides steam for driving machinery.
 Salt cake burners' assistants shall receive an additional 5 per cent. on their weekly wage when employed on afternoon or night shift.

⁽³⁾ Salt cake burners and salt cake burners' assistants shall receive one pint of milk per day.

⁽⁴⁾ Employees engaged in carrying or stacking ash or lime in bags shall be paid an allowance of 3d. per hour whilst so engaged.

Clauses, other than clauses 2 and 3 of the Flint Glass Section and clauses 1 and 2 of the Glass Bottle Section of the said Determination shall remain in force.
