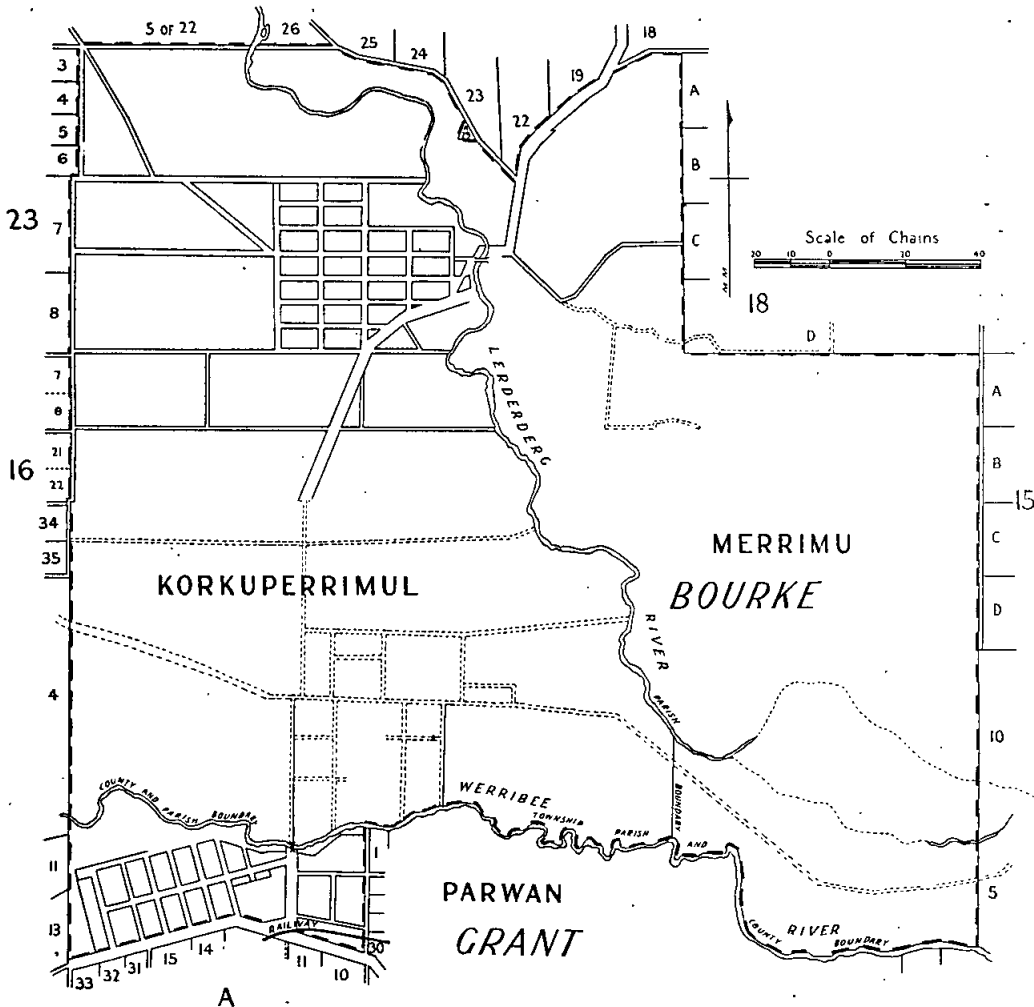

ORDER REVOKED, PROCLAMATIONS RESCINDED AS TO PART (TOWNS OF DARLEY AND MADDINGLEY RESCINDED) AND TOWNSHIP OF BACCHUS MARSH PROCLAIMED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the Land Act 1928 as amended by section 2 of the Land Act 1933 do by this my Proclamation revoke the Order dated 13th August 1853 fixing the site for a Township at Maddingley on the River Werribee, in the Parish of Parwan (see Government Gazette 1853 pages 1205 and 1246) and rescind the Proclamation dated 13th January 1868 rescinding as to part the Proclamation dated 18th February 1861 defining certain areas of land as Towns and defining a certain area of land as the Town of Maddingley in so far as it refers to the definition of the area of land as the Town of Maddingley (see Government Gazette 1868 page 158) and the Proclamation dated 18th February 1861 defining certain areas of land as Towns in so far as it refers to the Town of Darley (see Government Gazette 1861 page 403) and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a Township distinguished by the name of Bacchus Marsh the area of land in the Parishes of Korkuperrimul and Merrimu, County of Bourke and the Parish of Parwan, County of Grant within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(B.792(1) (K.69(3) (M.47(1) (M.109(2) (P.8(3) (C.96092).

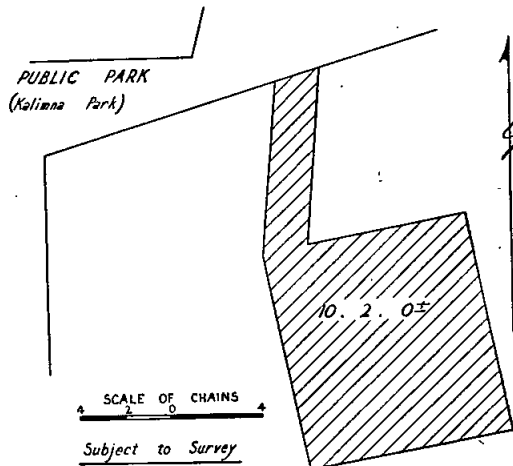

**Country Fire Authority Acts.
VARIATION OF SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 4 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof, and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said sub-section it is further enacted that any Proclamation so published shall remain in force until revoked, amended, or varied by a subsequent Proclamation so published:

And whereas by Proclamations issued on the 9th November, 1954, and 7th December, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th November, 1954, and the 8th December, 1954, respectively, different summer periods expiring on the thirty-first day of March, 1955, were proclaimed in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, including the parts of the said country area specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the aforesaid Proclamations should be varied in the manner hereinafter described:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Acts*, do by this my Proclamation vary the aforesaid Proclamations by proclaiming that the summer period in respect of the parts of the country area of Victoria which are specified in the Schedule hereto shall end on the first day of March, 1955.

SCHEDULE.

Those portions of the Seventeenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the City of Horsham and the Shires of Dimboola, Dunmunkle, Kaniva, Lowan, Warracknabeal and Wimmera;

the Eighteenth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Mildura and the Shires of Birchip, Karkaroc, Mildura, Walpeup and Wycheproof;

and the Twentieth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Swan Hill and the Shires of Cohuna, Kerang and Swan Hill.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

CHAPTER 11—DIVORCE.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the *Supreme Court Act* 1928, and of all other powers thereunto enabling, the following amendments of the Supreme Court, Rules, Chapter 11 (Rules of Procedure in Divorce and Matrimonial Causes) are hereby made and shall take effect from the 1st May, 1955.

1. In Rule 11 (1), as enacted on the 25th August, 1954, after the words "a copy of any affidavit verifying the petition", there shall be inserted the expression "(such copy affidavit having thereon, where the petitioner proceeds by a solicitor, a certificate signed by such solicitor that the said copy affidavit is a true copy of the original)".

2. In Rule 11 (2), as enacted on the 25th August, 1954—

(2) An application for leave to issue a supplemental petition, any affidavit in support of such application, and any order made on such application shall be intitled and numbered as in the suit to which the proposed petition is to be supplemental, and shall be filed in the office of the Prothonotary, with the papers in that suit.

(3) If leave is granted to issue a supplemental petition, the supplemental petition shall receive a new file number, shall become the initial document on a new file in the office of the Prothonotary, and shall be endorsed—

'This petition is supplemental to the petition' (or 'counter-petition' as the case may be) 'No. of 19..'

(4) If an application for leave to issue a supplemental petition is refused, the order refusing it shall be filed in the suit to which the proposed petition was to be supplemental."

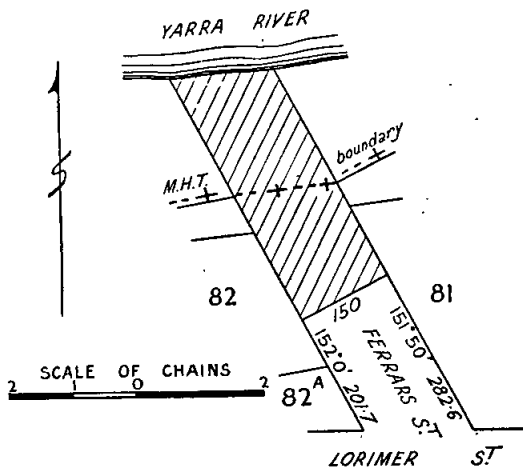

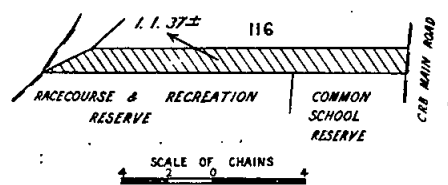

- (3) ‘Premium Grade Board Approved.’ This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which have been grown from seed certified under the certification scheme of the Department of Agriculture of Victoria or the Department of Agriculture of New South Wales and approved by the Board and which are sound, dry and of a good natural colour, free from broken, shrivelled, malformed or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects and capable of germinating 90 per cent. or over.
- (4) ‘Grade 1 Board Approved.’ This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which have been grown from seed certified under the certification scheme of the Department of Agriculture of Victoria or the Department of Agriculture of New South Wales and approved by the Board and which are sound, dry, free from broken, shrivelled, malformed or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects and capable of germinating 85 per cent. or over.

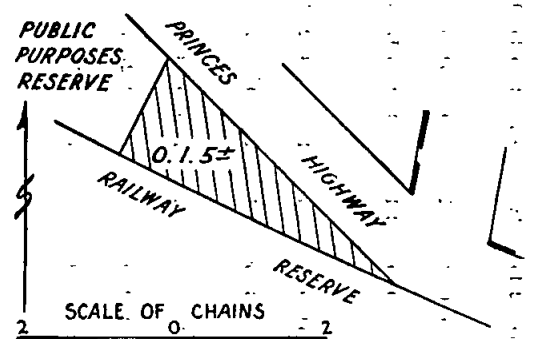

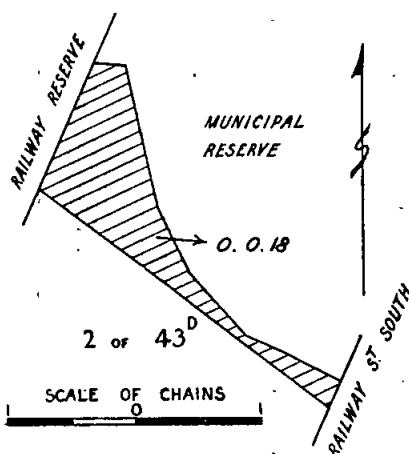
