MALDON SHIRE COMMON DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: And whereas notice of the intention to diminish the Maldon Shire Common has been duly published in the *Government Gazette* for one month: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the

Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the Maldon Shire Common by deducting therefrom 3 roods 9 perches, more or less, of land comprised within the boundaries as defined by description published in the *Government Gazette* of 1st December, 1954.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF SUNSHINE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be dedicated absolutely to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Sunshine has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land being part of Crown allotment B, section XI, Parish of Maribyrnong, County of Bourke, and being a street shown on plan of subdivision No. 17825 lodged in the Office of Titles, and being the land described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

MERTON-STREET.

Commencing at the south-western angle of the land in plan of subdivision No. 17825, lodged in the Office of Titles, thence bearing 320 deg. 36 min. for 64 ft. 8½ in., thence east for 369 ft. 6 in., thence 178 deg. 50 min. for 50 feet, thence west for 329 ft. 6 in. to the commencing point.

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I. CLIVE PHILLIP STONEHAM, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

By deleting clause 4 (a) thereof and substituting therefor the following clause:—

4. (a) The Chairman of the Board shall, for his services, be entitled to receive a salary at the rate of Eleven hundred pounds (£1,100) per annum, subject to automatic adjustment in accordance with the variations in the cost of living, upon the basis and method of adjustment for adult males prescribed for the time being by regulations under Part II. of the *Public Service Act 1946*.

This Regulation shall take effect as from and including the 19th December, 1954.

FOREST INDUSTRIES FIRE PROTECTION REGULATIONS 1954.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Forests Acts and of all other powers thereto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Forest Industries Fire Protection Regulations 1954" and shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.
2. The Forest Industries Fire Protection Regulations 1950, are hereby repealed.
3. For the purpose of these Regulations—
 - (a) "Sawmill" shall not include those mills used exclusively for the sawing of firewood.
 - (b) "Logging operations" means the felling of trees and the obtaining of poles, piles, and logs, and includes any snigging or hauling operation associated therewith.
 - (c) "Lumbering operations" means the cutting of pulpwood, firewood, posts, and fencing timbers, the hewing of sleepers and beams, the trimming of poles, the splitting of palings and any like operation, and includes the removal of bark in preparation therefor.
 - (d) "Efficient" means capable in operation of performing the work or task for which designed.
 - (e) "District officer" means the forest officer for the time being in charge of the forest district.
 - (f) "Secretary" means Secretary for the time being of the Commission.

DIVISION A—FIRE FIGHTING APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT.

4. Every person conducting sawmilling, logging, lumbering, mining, quarrying, land clearing or eucalytus oil distillation operations in any fire-protected area or other industrial operation in any State forest shall, upon receipt of a notice in writing to that effect from the Secretary, and within the period stated in such notice, provide or cause to be provided such fire-fighting apparatus and equipment as is specified therein.

5. Such person shall—

- (a) keep or cause to be kept such apparatus and equipment at such place or places as the district officer may, in writing, direct;
 - (b) separately store or cause to be stored such apparatus and equipment in such manner as to be immediately available whenever required for fire-fighting purposes;
 - (c) maintain or cause to be maintained such apparatus and equipment in an efficient condition to the satisfaction of the district officer.
6. Such person or any other person for the time being in charge of such sawmilling, logging, lumbering, mining, quarrying, land clearing, eucalytus oil distillation or other industrial operations shall—
- (a) permit any forest officer to inspect such apparatus and equipment at any reasonable time;
 - (b) make such apparatus and equipment available for fire-fighting purposes to any officer or employee of the Commission at any time when not being used or required for a like purpose by any person employed in connexion with such sawmilling, logging, lumbering, mining, quarrying, land clearing, eucalytus oil distillation or other industrial operation.

DIVISION B—TELEPHONIC COMMUNICATION.

7. Every person conducting sawmilling operations within any fire-protected area shall, on receipt of notice in writing to that effect from the Secretary, construct or cause to be constructed an efficient telephone line between his sawmill and such other terminal as is specified in such notice.

8. Such person shall maintain or cause to be maintained in an efficient working condition such telephone line and all instruments and apparatus associated therewith.

9. Such person or any other person for the time being in charge of such sawmilling operations shall make such telephone line and instruments available to any forest officer or any employee authorized by the district officer for the transmission of official communications.

DIVISION C—MILL AND LOGGING CAMP CLEARINGS.

10. Every person conducting sawmilling, logging, or lumbering operations in any fire-protected area shall—

- (a) maintain or cause to be maintained in a condition clear of all standing and fallen trees, whether green or dry, live or dead ferns and scrub and any accumulation of inflammable material including sawdust the whole area within two chains (or within such lesser distance as the Secretary may in writing direct) of any portion of the sawmill or of any buildings associated with such sawmill or logging or lumbering operation;
- (b) carry out or cause to be carried out such burning or other protective operations in the vicinity of such sawmill or logging camp as are directed by a forest officer from time to time;
- (c) erect or cause to be erected all huts, residences and other buildings in as close proximity to the sawmill as is practicable, and in any case within such boundaries as are directed in writing by a forest officer;
- (d) adequately and effectively clear or cause to be cleared of all inflammable material the site of any new sawmill or logging camp prior to commencement of construction of any buildings thereon;
- (e) adequately and effectively clear or cause to be cleared of all timber and scrub and maintain in a cleared condition any winch site in accordance with the directions in writing of the district officer.

DIVISION D—WATER SUPPLY.

11. Every person conducting sawmilling operations in any fire-protected area shall—

- (a) unless granted an exemption in writing by the Secretary, provide a supply of water such that—
 - (i) not less than 3,000 gallons shall be held in reserve in overhead tanks or in a reservoir at such elevation in either case that the point of outlet therefrom is not less than 30 feet vertically above the point of delivery at the sawmill;
 - (ii) reticulation shall be by metal pipes, the main from reservoir or tanks being not less than 2 inches internal diameter;
 - (iii) a number of hydrants connected to the aforesaid metal pipes shall be provided together with hose of not less than 1 inch internal diameter so that no part of the sawmill, sawdust burner, waste pits, huts, associated buildings and timber stacks shall be beyond effective reach from at least one such hydrant with a hose not exceeding 100 feet in length;
- (b) if granted an exemption as aforesaid store such quantity of water and provide such means for its distribution as the Secretary may in writing direct.

DIVISION E—DISPOSAL OF EDGINGS, WASTE, SAWDUST, ETC.

12. (a) No person conducting any sawmilling operations within any fire-protected area, nor any person employed in connexion therewith, shall light or maintain any fire in the open air for the purpose of burning edgings, offcuts, hearts, bark, or other waste parts of logs or trees (hereinafter called waste material) or permit any fire which is in fact burning any such waste material to remain alight unless—

- (i) such burning be confined to pits located as approved by a forest officer, and so that no part of the sawmill or buildings in connexion therewith shall be endangered;

- (ii) such pits be of sufficient size and depth to ensure that all such waste material may be confined within and kept at least 1 foot below the level of the banks of such pits.
- (b) During the prohibited period no such person shall light or maintain or permit to remain alight as aforesaid any fire for the purpose of burning such waste material in pits as herein prescribed except between the hours of eight o'clock in the forenoon and half-past four o'clock in the afternoon of the same day on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, provided that—
- (i) no such burning shall take place on a public holiday unless the sawmill whereat such pits are located is in operation on that day;
- (ii) any fire having been lit within the hours prescribed herein may, unless a forest officer directs to the contrary, be permitted to remain alight after the hour of half-past four in the afternoon but no such waste or any inflammable material shall be added to such fire after the said hour; and
- (iii) no such burning shall take place on any day and no such fire shall be permitted to remain alight at any time (whether within the prescribed hours or otherwise) unless at least two men are in attendance and there is readily available a supply of water adequate to extinguish such fire together with such appliances or facilities for the distribution of water as may be prescribed or directed.
- (c) During any acute fire danger period within the meaning of section 7 of the *Forests Act* 1939 or section 41 of the *Country Fire Authority Act* 1944 as the case may be no such person as aforesaid shall light or permit to remain unextinguished any fire whatsoever for the purpose of burning any such waste material as aforesaid.
- (d) Any such person as aforesaid shall completely extinguish any fire in any such pit when requested to do so by a forest officer.

13. (a) Every person who, not being exempted as herein provided, operates any sawmill within any fire protected area shall install and maintain to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Forests for the Division in which the sawmill is located, an efficient sawdust burner capable of disposing of the entire output of sawdust from such sawmill.

(b) The Secretary may grant an exemption in writing from the provisions of the foregoing sub-paragraph (a) but any such person granted such exemption shall provide such alternative means for the disposal of the sawdust as are set out in such exemption and the Commission may at any time withdraw such exemption.

DIVISION F—SPARK ARRESTERS, EXHAUST PIPES, ETC.

14. Every person conducting any sawmilling, logging, lumbering, mining, quarrying, land clearing or eucalyptus oil operations or other industrial operation in any fire-protected area involving the use of any truck, tractor or other machine or device powered by an internal combustion engine or of any boiler or steam engine whether stationary, portable or locomotive shall—

- (a) during the prohibited period or at any time when there is danger of the outbreak and spread of fire and on receipt of a direction in writing from the district officer so to do, within the period specified in such direction—
- (i) attach to the exhaust pipe of any such truck, tractor, machine or device, and
- (ii) attach to the smoke-stack or flue of any such boiler or steam engine an efficient spark arrester and maintain such spark arrester in a condition satisfactory to the district officer.
- (b) install in any portable or locomotive steam engine and maintain in an efficient condition an ash pan so designed that the escape of live coals will be prevented;
- (c) fit the exhaust pipe of any tractor used in any such operations in such a position that the tractor exhausts in a vertically upward direction.

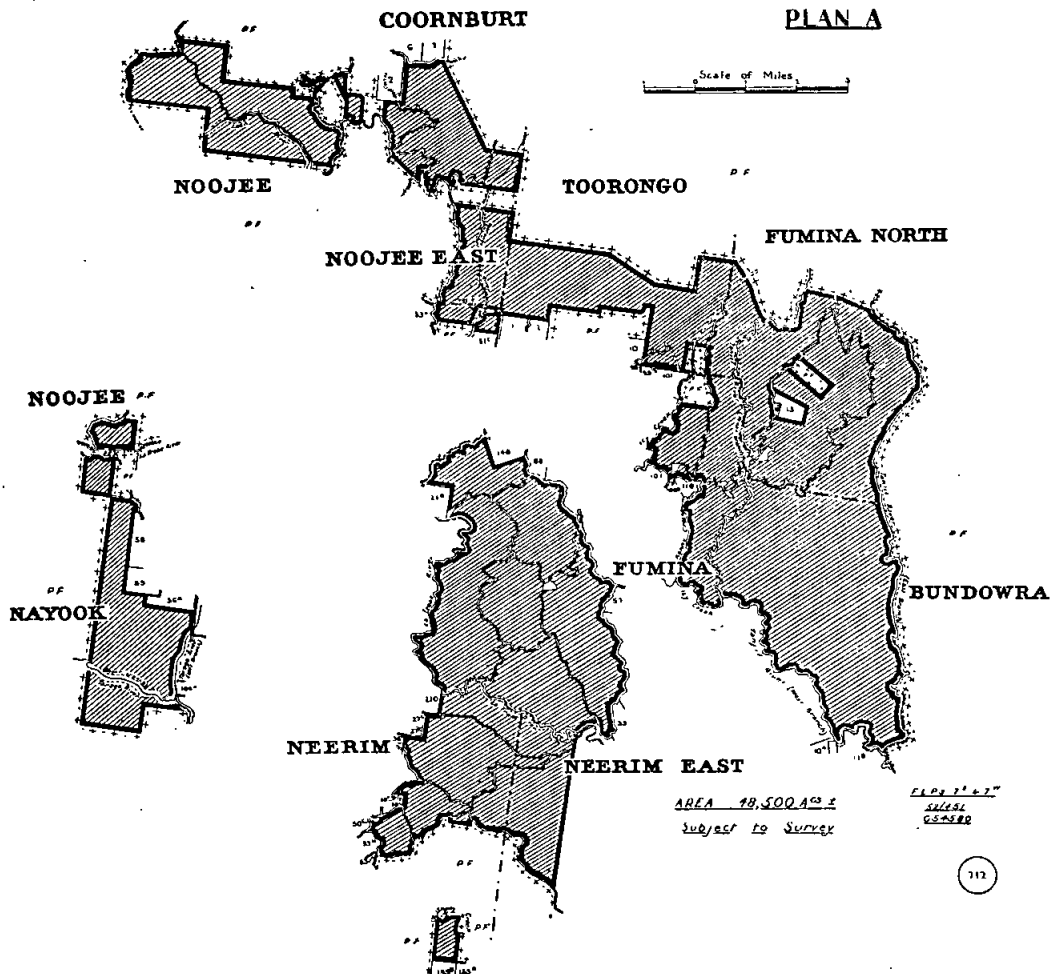

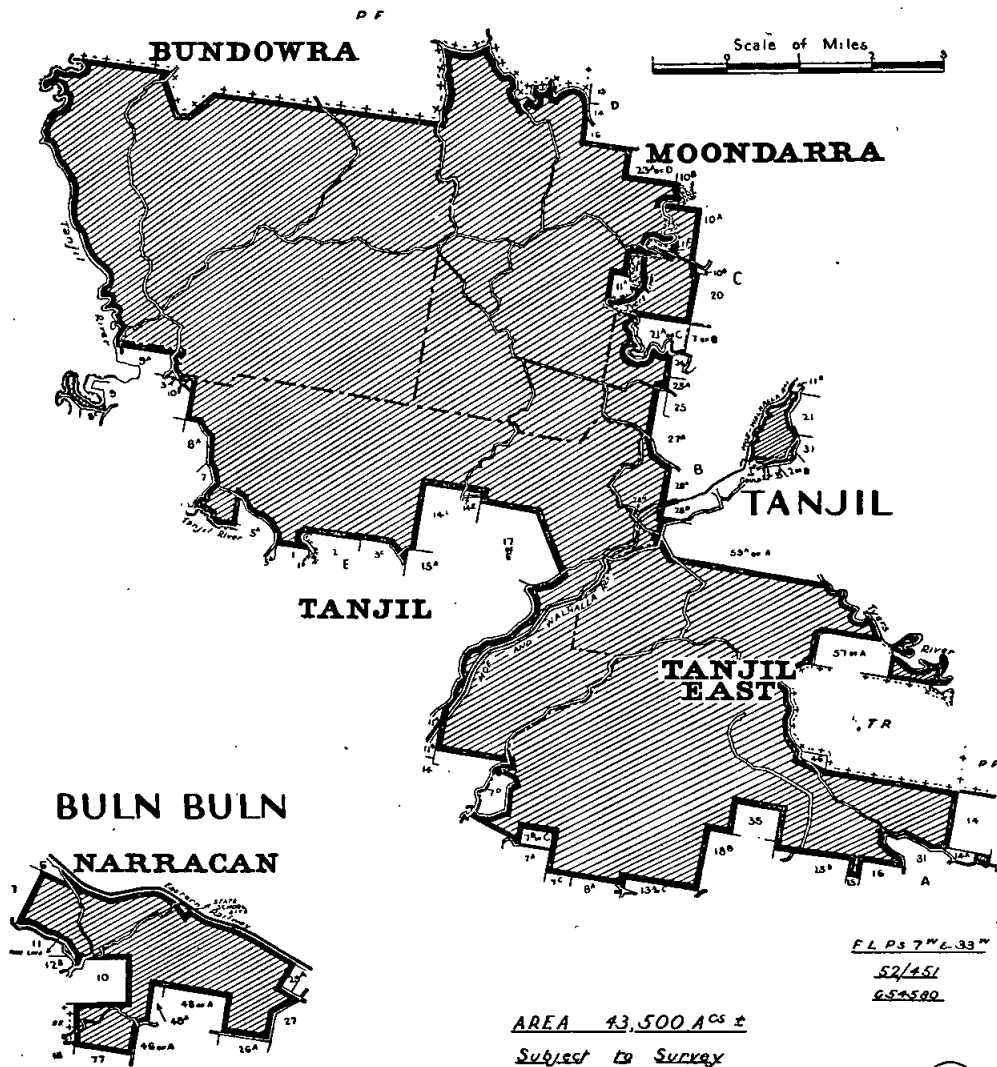

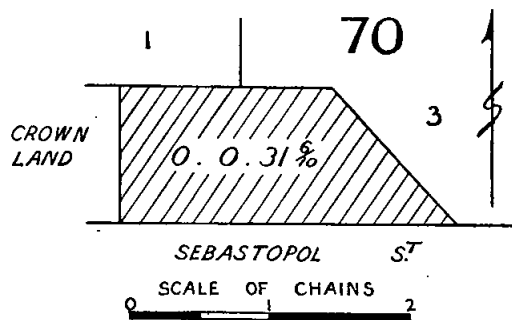
