LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTS.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF
THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the Council of any municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX., of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Lillydale has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to the municipal district of the Shire of Lillydale, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned municipal district of the Shire of Lillydale on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 31st January, 1956, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make By-laws, pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided, further that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 31st January, 1956.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act, 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Ripon has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a road within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that the land described hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

All that piece of land being part of Crown allotment 22, section 26, Parish of Carngham, County of Grenville, containing 0 acres 1 rood 27 6/10 perches, commencing at a point on the southern boundary of the said Crown allotment being distant 88.1 links on a bearing of 89 deg. 29 min. from its south-western angle, bounded thence by lines bearing respectively 356 deg. 56 min. 160.3 links, 26 deg. 17 min. 390.9 links, 193 deg. 10.5 min. 110.6 links, 176 deg. 56 min. 250.2 links and 269 deg. 29 min. 125.1 links to the point of commencement.

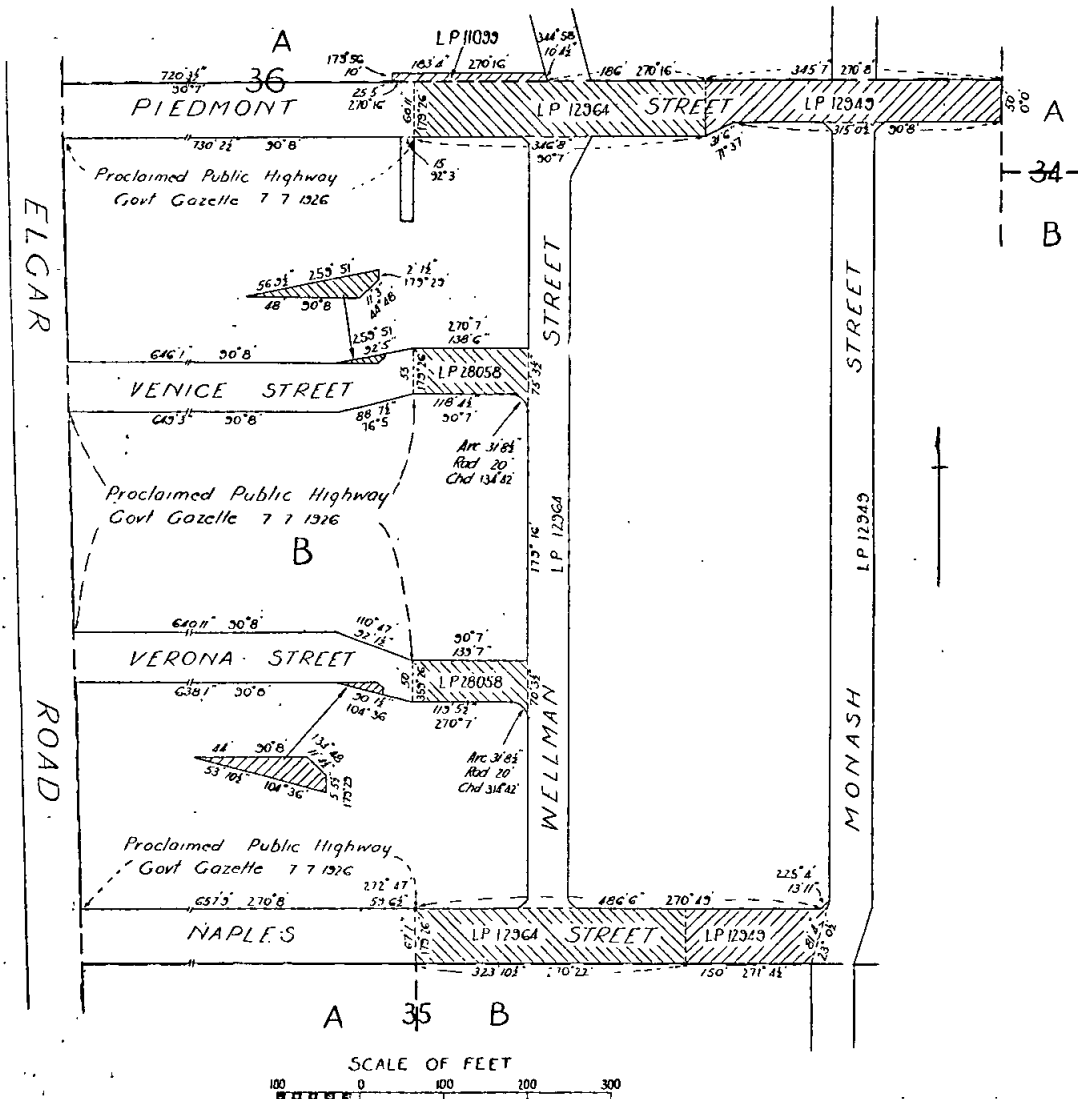

NETTING AT THE MOUTHS OF THE ERSKINE AND GEORGE RIVERS NEAR LORNE.

PROCLAMATION

By the Honorable Sir Charles Lowe, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I SIR CHARLES LOWE, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me thereunto enabling, do by this my Proclamation:—

(a) revoke the Proclamation made the 21st December 1920 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 29th December 1920 respecting the definition of the mouth of the Erskine River Lorne and restrictions on netting in the vicinity;

(b) define the mouths of the George and Erskine Rivers near Lorne as an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side of each of such rivers to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such rivers enter the ocean;

(c) prohibit during the whole of each year the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines whether fixed or unfixed to be employed in fishing within a radius of a quarter of a mile from any portion or point of the mouth of either the Erskine or George Rivers as defined in paragraph (b) of the Proclamation.

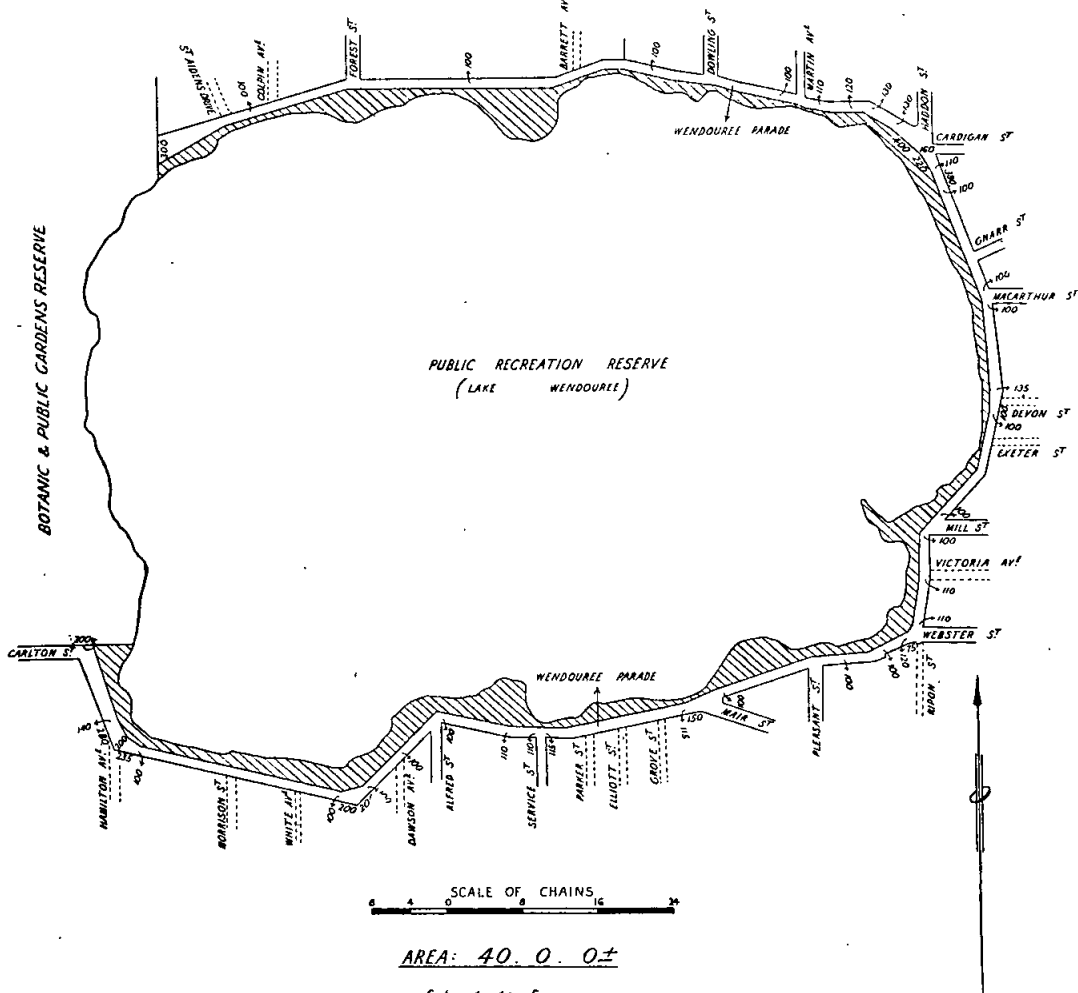

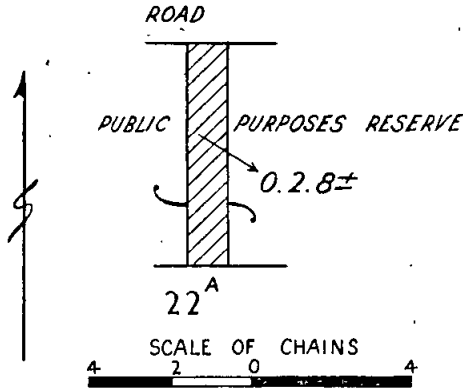

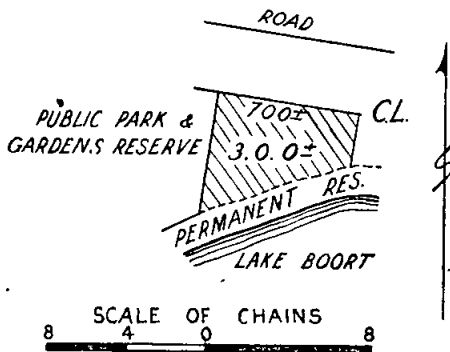

REGULATIONS—AMENDMENT No. 11.

THE Honorable Sir Charles Lowe as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Police Regulation Acts, doth hereby further amend the Police Regulations 1951 as follows (that is to say):—

1. Chapter 5 of the said regulations is hereby amended as follows:—

- (a) In sub-clause (a) of Clause 4 for the word "twenty-seventh" there shall be substituted the word "Thirtieth".
- (b) In sub-clause (b) of Clause 4 for the word "thirty-third" there shall be substituted the word "thirty-fifth".
- (c) In sub-clause (c) of Clause 7 for the word "twenty-fifth" there shall be substituted the word "twenty-third".

2. At the end of Chapter 5 of the said regulations there shall be added the following Clause:—

" Re-appointment of Members of the Force.

Re-
appointment. 20. (1) Subject to this Clause the Chief Commissioner may re-appoint to the Force any person who was previously a member thereof and who left the Force voluntarily while of the rank of Constable or First Constable, and this Chapter of the Regulations shall with such adaptations as are necessary apply for the purposes of such re-appointment except Clauses 4 and 7 and paragraphs (a) and (b) of Clause 8 and (except in any case where the Chief Commissioner otherwise directs) Clauses 17 to 19.

Repayment
to Pensions
Fund. (2) No person shall be so re-appointed unless he first repays to the Police Pensions Fund any amount paid to him from that Fund on his so leaving the Force.

(3) Every person re-appointed to the Force pursuant to this Clause—

- (a) shall be appointed to the rank he was holding at the date of his so leaving the Force;
- (b) if so re-appointed as a Constable, shall be placed on the seniority list as though he were being first appointed to the Force;
- (c) if so re-appointed as a First Constable, shall be placed on the seniority list as though he were being first promoted to the rank of First Constable.

service. (4) Except in relation to seniority as aforesaid, nothing in this Clause shall be construed as affecting any computation of approved service."

3. Chapter 6 of the said regulations is hereby amended by inserting at the end of sub-clause (p) of Clause 1 the following paragraph:—

4. Chapter 13 of the said regulations is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) For sub-clause (1) of Clause 3 there shall be substituted the following sub-clause:—

“(3) (1) In every case where a position becomes vacant within the Force and the Chief Commissioner is satisfied that the filling of such vacancy is necessary for the maintenance of the efficiency of the Force, he shall, within twenty-eight days of such vacancy occurring, cause an advertisement of the said vacancy to be published in the *Police Gazette* to afford eligible members of the Force a reasonable opportunity to apply therefor.”

(b) For paragraph (a) of sub-clause (3) of Clause 3 there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(a) his claims and qualifications.”

5. Chapter 20 of the said regulations is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) For the proviso to sub-clause (a) of Clause 3 there shall be substituted the following proviso:—

“Provided that any member of the Force who is the holder of such certificate or its equivalent or higher qualifications approved by the Chief Commissioner, shall be deemed to have passed this subject.”

(b) For Clause 35 there shall be substituted the following Clause:—

“Vacancies
in ranks.

35. (1) For the purposes of this Chapter on the date on which a vacancy in the rank of Sergeant or any higher rank occurs, there shall be deemed to occur also a vacancy in all ranks (other than that of First Constable) lower than that in which the vacancy actually occurs.

(2) Whenever any vacancy occurs in any rank or grade within the Force, the Chief Commissioner shall in accordance with the last preceding Clause consider the claims of duly qualified members of the Force and within 10 days of the occurrence of such vacancy shall publish in the *Police Gazette* the name of the member of the Force selected for promotion to such vacancy or where the promotion is made by the Governor in Council the name of the member he proposes to recommend for such promotion.

(3) Whenever a vacancy is expected to occur because of the impending retirement of a member of the Force or for any other cause, the Chief Commissioner may within 30 days before the date of such expected vacancy consider in accordance with the last preceding Clause the claims of any member of the Force who on the date of the expected vacancy will be duly qualified to fill such vacancy and shall publish in the *Police Gazette* the name of the member of the Force selected for promotion to such vacancy or, where the promotion is made by the Governor in Council, the name of the member he proposes to recommend for such promotion.

(4) The Chief Commissioner shall not make any promotion or submit any recommendation under this Clause until any appeal in accordance with this Chapter has been determined.”
