AREAS OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By the Honorable Sir Charles Lowe as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Lowe as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the area of Crown land comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

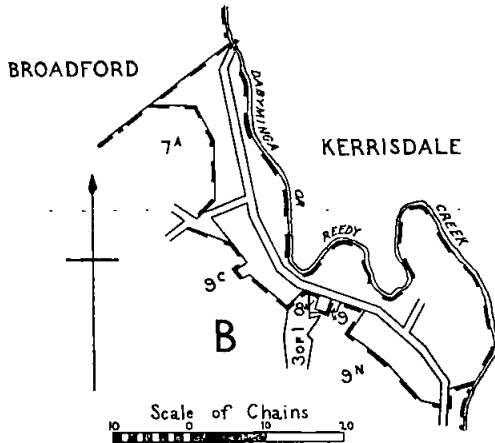

I SIR CHARLES LOWE as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928* do by this my Proclamation rescind the Proclamation dated 11th August 1936 rescinding certain Proclamations and defining a certain area of land as the Township of South Reedy Creek in so far as it refers to the definition of the area of land as the Township of South Reedy Creek (see *Government Gazette* 1936 page 2162) and the Proclamation dated 17th December 1952 altering the designation of the Township of South Reedy Creek to Reedy Creek (see *Government Gazette* 1952 page 7308) and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a township distinguished by the name of Reedy Creek the area of land in the Parish of Clonbinane County of Dalhousie within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(C.444(3) (R.71(D)) (C.94091).

MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1949.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 3 of the *Milk Pasteurization Act 1949* (No. 5444) it is provided that a day be fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* in relation to a prescribed district: And whereas the Municipal District of the City of St. Kilda has been prescribed as a District for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Monday, the seventh day of November, 1955, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed district of the City of St. Kilda—

- (a) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises and bottled and sealed as prescribed; or
- (b) (in the case where the milk is sold and delivered at a shop for immediate consumption by a customer at the shop) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises.

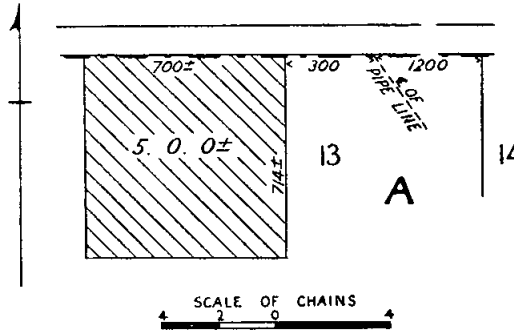

UNDER the powers conferred by the Stock Foods Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations prescribing standards for and fixing the composition of certain Stock Foods (that is to say):—

1. Amending Regulations made under the provisions of the Stock Foods Acts on the 27th September, 1943, and on the 19th October, 1954, are hereby repealed.

2. The Regulations made under the provisions of the Stock Foods Acts on the 9th March, 1937, are hereby amended by adding, after Regulation 4, the following Regulation:—

5. Standards for the Stock Foods hereinafter mentioned shall be as follows:—

- (a) *Blood Meal* shall be the product obtained by drying and grinding blood from freshly slaughtered animals to which product no other matter has been added. Blood Meal shall contain not less than 75 per centum by weight of crude protein.
- (b) *Meat Meal* shall be the sterilized product obtained by cooking, drying and grinding the carcasses or portions thereof (excluding hair, wool, hide, hoof and horn) of freshly slaughtered animals to which sterilized product no other matter has been added. Meat Meal shall contain not less than 55 per centum by weight of crude protein and not more than 7 per centum by weight of phosphoric acid (P_2O_5).
- (c) *Meat and Bone Meal* shall be the sterilized product obtained by cooking, drying and grinding the carcasses or portions thereof (excluding hair, wool, hide, hoof and horn) and bone of freshly slaughtered animals to which sterilized product no other matter has been added. Meat and Bone Meal shall contain not less than 45 per centum by weight of crude protein.
- (d) *Bone and Meat Meal* shall be the sterilized product obtained by cooking, drying and grinding portions of the carcasses (excluding hair, wool, hide, hoof and horn) and bone of freshly slaughtered animals to which sterilized product no other matter has been added. Bone and Meat Meal shall contain not less than 40 per centum by weight of crude protein.
- (e) *Fineness*.—The fineness of Meat Meal, Meat and Bone Meal and Bone and Meat Meal shall be such that:—
 - (i) not more than 5 parts per centum by weight shall be retained on a fine mesh normal test sieve having the nominal mesh number of 10 as specified in Table 1 in the publication of the British Standards Institution entitled "British Standard 410; 1943, Test Sieves"; and
 - (ii) not more than 1 part per centum by weight shall be retained on a medium mesh test sieve having a nominal width of aperture of $\frac{1}{8}$ inch as specified in Table 3 in the said publication.

(ii) the provision of section 281 of the said Part VII. of the *Water Act 1928*, so adapted as if for the expressions "any waterworks trust or local governing body," and "such waterworks trust or local governing body" there were substituted the words "the Latrobe River Improvement Trust."

SECTION 1.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity supplied to him, they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For electricity supplied for lighting purposes—

Two shillings and three pence (2s. 3d.) per unit.

For electricity supplied for purposes other than lighting—

One shilling and three pence (1s. 3d.) per unit.

SECTION 3.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, the undertakers may charge any consumer a minimum charge of 12s. 6d. per month irrespective of whether the supply is used for lighting or other purposes. Such minimum charge shall be exclusive of meter rent.

And the foregoing amendment shall be effective as from the date on which the Governor in Council approves of such amendment.

For any transfer of registration—Two shillings and six pence.

BY-LAW No. 34.

A By-law of the Shire of Metcalfe (herein referred to as the municipality), made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1946* with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 34, for the purposes of carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in the said sections, viz.:

- Regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the erection, construction, use, occupation, conversion and alteration of and any addition to buildings or erections.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Council of the municipality doth order as follows:—

Limits of Operation.

1. This By-law, except where inconsistent with the context, shall apply to and have force and effect throughout all the area of the Shire of Metcalfe other than the whole of the Townships of Harcourt, Taradale and Elphinstone and that portion of the Parishes of Castle-maine and Chewton as set out hereunder, that is to say: Commencing at the intersection of Forest Creek on the eastern boundary of the Town of Castlemaine; thence due south along the said boundary to the south-east corner of the said Town of Castlemaine; thence easterly on a bearing of 89 deg. 57 min. for a distance of 4,191 links to the western boundary of the Parish of Chewton; thence south along the said boundary to the northern boundary of the Shire of Newstead an approximate distance of 73½ chains continuing easterly along the boundary 27 of F2 to the centre of Dinah-road; thence north through allotment 32 of F2 across the railway line following the western boundaries of allotments 34A, 5 and 4 of D to the north-east corner of allotment 3A of D; thence north-easterly through allotment 225H of E and through allotment 3A of E1 to its north-east angle; thence north-easterly along the eastern boundaries of 41, 49, 50, 51 and 52 of E1 to its north-east angle (52); thence due north through allotment 53 to the parish boundary; thence westerly along the parish boundary to Forest Creek; thence southerly and westerly along the course of the said creek to the commencing point.

Commencement of Operations.

3. No person shall erect, build or construct, remove or make any alteration or addition to, or cause to be erected, built or constructed, removed, or make any alteration or additions to any buildings or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

Fees to be Paid Before Building.

4. No person shall commence or cause to be commenced any building or erection, or remove or cause to be removed, any building or erection without having first paid to the Council the necessary fees in accordance with the scale set out in the First Schedule hereto.

Submission of Plans, &c.

5. No person shall commence or cause to be commenced the erection, alteration or removal of any buildings or erection without first delivering to the Surveyor notice in writing of his intention so to do, accompanied by the following particulars in writing signed by such person, namely:—

- The situation of the proposed erection or building specifying the number of the allotment and section and parish and giving the dimensions and area of the land in which it is proposed to build.
- A plan with the dimensions marked thereon showing the ground plan of the building or erection.
- A specification giving particulars of all materials proposed to be used in the construction and furnishing of all walls, partitions, verandahs, chimneys and roof.
- An estimate of the cost.

Consideration of Plans, &c.

6. Such plans and specifications and other particulars shall be considered by the Council or its Surveyor at the first available opportunity after lodging thereof with the Surveyor, and the Council shall if—

- such plans and specifications and other particulars are in conformity with the provisions of this By-law, and
- the fee as prescribed by the First Schedule hereto shall have been paid to the Treasurer, and

- (c) the buildings therein referred to (if erected in accordance with such plans, specifications and other particulars) will comply with the provisions of this By-law—

grant or cause to be granted to the person lodging the same a written permit for the commencement of the building referred to in such plans, specifications, and other particulars.

Commencement of Building, &c.

7. No person shall hereafter commence or cause to be commenced the erection of any building without having first obtained from the Council or its Surveyor such written permit for the commencement of the same as aforesaid.

Plans, &c., to be Followed and Copies Left with Council.

8. No person shall hereafter erect any buildings (for which a permit for the commencement thereof has been granted as aforesaid) contrary to or not in conformity with this By-law or the plans, specifications and other particulars in respect of which such permit was so granted.

- (a) A copy of a tracing of the plan submitted shall be left with the Council for its own use.
 (b) The plans and specifications approved by the Council shall be kept at the Shire Hall and shall be available for inspection thereat.

Expiration of Permit for Commencement of Building, &c.

9. A written permit obtained pursuant to these By-laws shall expire after twelve months from its grant unless extended by resolution of the Council.

Removal and Re-erection of Building.

10. No building or erection shall be removed into the municipality or from any part of the municipality to another unless the owner or person carrying out this removal first obtains the written permission from the Council so to do, and shall in applying for such permission give to the Council or its Surveyor not less than ten clear days' notice in writing of his desire to remove or re-erect such building, and shall accompany such notice with the following particulars:—

- (a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.
 (b) The situation and a plan of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building, showing the proposed position thereon, and a tracing or copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.
 (c) A specification giving particulars of the construction of the existing building and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is re-erected.
 (d) Satisfactory evidence that such house has not been condemned and dilapidated, insanitary or unfit for human habitation.

Foundations.

11. The foundations or footings of buildings other than wood shall be not less than 8 inches wider than the wall standing thereon and shall not be less in depth than 12 inches below the natural surface of the ground or other depth as may be specified by the Surveyor.

Bricks.

12. Bricks used in any building shall be good, hard and well burnt.

Timber.

13. All timber in any building shall be of good sound material free from rot, large and loose knots, shakes or other imperfections whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired.

14. No hood over any window or door shall overhang the footpath or any street, road or public right-of-way.

Right of Entry.

15. The Surveyor at all reasonable times during the progress and after the completion of any building, or addition or alteration to any building affected by this By-law may, and is hereby authorized, to enter and inspect such building or additions or alterations.

Removal of Condemned Buildings.

16. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary or unfit for human habitation shall be removed into or re-erected within the municipality.

Penalties.

17. Any persons who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and if such offence is continued after such penalty has been inflicted to a further penalty of not exceeding One pound per day for each day such offence is continued.

Definitions.

18. In this By-law, save where the context is inconsistent therewith—

"Alteration" means any change in the construction or plan of a building or erection or any change in the purpose for which any building or erection or any part thereof shall be used.

"Approved" means approved by the Council or Surveyor.

"Council" means the Council of the municipality.

"New building" includes—
