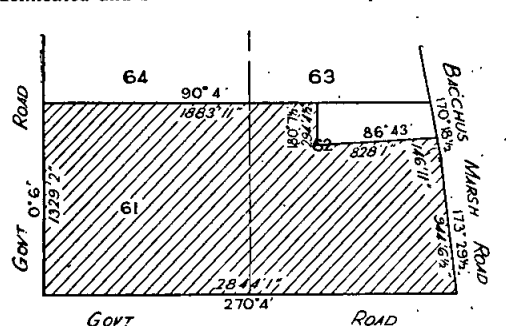

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

By-Law No. 62.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts and pursuant to and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and prescribe the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. This By-law is to be read and construed as one with By-law No. 57 duly made and passed by the Board on the twenty-second day of September, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, and afterwards approved by the Governor in Council on the twenty-ninth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, and gazetted on the seventh day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three (such By-law being hereinafter referred to as "the said By-law"), and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. The said By-law is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) In clause 25 after paragraph (a) there shall be inserted the following new paragraph:—

"(b) No person shall display at the Princes Bridge Landing Stage any sign or notice other than the sign or notice prescribed in paragraph (a) hereof and no person shall add to such sign or notice any written or printed matter whatsoever other than the particulars set forth in the said paragraph."

and for the letters "b" and "c" preceding paragraphs (b) and (c) respectively shall be substituted the letters "c" and "d" respectively.

(b) In paragraph (b) of clause 31 there shall be deleted the words and figures "the gross tonnage of which is in excess of fifteen (15) tons" and there shall be substituted therefor the words and figures "which is licensed to carry more than two hundred (200) passengers or the gross tonnage of which exceeds twenty-five (25) tons."

(c) In paragraph (b) of clause 47 after the words "and all joints must be rolled hook joints and soldered" there shall be inserted the following words:—

"or may with the consent of the Surveyor in the case of a boat which is completely decked consist of sealed metal containers properly painted or otherwise treated to prevent rust and secured in position in such a manner as to be readily removable for periodical inspection and testing."

(d) Clause 48 shall be repealed and there shall be substituted therefor the following clause:—

"48. (a) Subject to paragraph (b) hereof, the number of passengers which may be carried on any motor-boat shall be determined as follows:—

(i) A motor-boat which is open or partially decked and fitted with cockpits shall be permitted to carry persons in the

proportion of one to each eighteen (18) inches of seating accommodation furnished, provided that such seating accommodation shall be clear of all interference with the proper working of the boat and shall not be in closer proximity to the engine therein than in the opinion of the Surveyor may be safe and proper;

- (ii) A motor-boat which is entirely decked shall be permitted to carry persons in the proportion of one for every four (4) square feet of the clear deck area, and one for every nine (9) square feet of the superficial area of the tops of saloon houses or of bridge decks or of any saloon or cabin under the main deck.

(b) The maximum number of persons as determined by this clause shall not be allowed unless the Surveyor be satisfied that the seaworthiness and stability of the motor-boat are such that the vessel can with safety carry such number of persons on the waters on which it is to navigate.

(c) For every one hundred and forty (140) pounds weight of goods carried with passengers in a motor-boat, one passenger shall be deducted from the maximum number of passengers authorised to be carried."

- (e) Paragraph (b) of clause 69 shall be repealed and there shall be substituted therefor the following paragraph:—

"(b) When a motor-boat is used for any purpose for which a licence is required under these Regulations then in addition to the motor-boatman in charge thereof there shall be present on board—

- (i) a motor-boat not exceeding twenty-five (25) tons gross tonnage which is licensed to carry more than fifteen (15) passengers but not more than two hundred (200) passengers, an assistant being a person approved by the River Officer as an assistant to a motor-boatman;
- (ii) a motor-boat whether exceeding twenty-five (25) tons gross tonnage or not which is licensed to carry more than two hundred (200) passengers, a marine motor-driver who shall have charge of the propelling machinery thereof;
- (iii) a motor-boat exceeding twenty-five (25) tons gross tonnage whatever number of passengers such boat shall be licensed to carry, a marine motor-driver who shall have charge of the propelling machinery thereof."

- (f) Paragraph (a) of clause 70 shall be repealed and there shall be substituted therefor the following paragraph:—

"(a) A licence as a motor-boatman to take charge of a motor-boat shall be granted only to a person over the age of eighteen years who has satisfied an examining officer appointed by the Board that he knows the rules of the river and that he is capable of taking charge of a motor-boat being of the gross tonnage and having the class of engine in respect of which he is applying. Provided that a licence shall not be granted to any person to take charge of a motor-boat exceeding 25 tons gross tonnage unless the applicant therefor shall have held for not less than three years a licence as a motor-boatman."

- (g) In Schedules 10, 11, 12, 16, and 17 for the words and figures "fifteen (15) tons" wherever occurring there shall be substituted the words and figures "twenty-five (25) tons."

- (h) In Schedule 11 there shall be inserted at the commencement of paragraph (iii) the words "that he has a satisfactory knowledge of the class of engine in respect of which his is applying and".

- (i) At the end of Schedule 16 for paragraph (a) of clause 70 as therein set forth there shall be substituted paragraph (a) of the said clause as in this By-law set forth.

3. The said By-law as hereinbefore amended is hereby ratified and confirmed.

BOORT WATERWORKS-TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 2.

Standing Orders for Regulating and Appointing the Place and Hour of Meetings of the Boort Waterworks Trust, and Providing for the Management and Conduct of Business Thereat.

THE Boort Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for its Waterworks District:—

1. In all cases not provided for by the Acts of Parliament of Victoria relating to authorities, or by this By-law, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. Place and Hour of Meetings.—Meetings of the Trust shall be held periodically on the second Wednesday in the month, at 8 o'clock p.m. at the office of the Trust. Upon notice of motion the time, day, and hour of the meeting may be altered by a majority of the Commissioners. A notice of every regular meeting of the Commissioners shall be, by the Trust Secretary, delivered or sent by post, addressed to the usual address of the Commissioner, three clear days at least prior to the day on which such intended meeting is to be held.

3. Meeting, Resolutions at, Not to be Revoked.—No resolution at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given by the Trust Secretary to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of at least two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting (if the number of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to), or by majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

4. Business, &c., Order of, Minutes.—At every meeting of the Commissioners the first business thereof shall be reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Commissioners at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required by any Commissioner present at such meeting.

5. After the signing of the minutes by the Chairman, the order of the business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the Commissioners at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Commissioners, if called for.
- (2) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4) Receiving deputations from the ratepayers.
- (5) Presentation of reports of committees and officers.
- (6) Payments.
- (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the Chairman may think desirable.
- (8) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (9) Notices of motion and the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

6. Titles, Official.—The Commissioners, in meeting, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Chairman or Commissioner, as the case may require.

7. Who to speak.—If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

8. Chairman to Rise Whilst Addressing Meeting.—The Chairman shall rise in addressing the Commissioners to discuss any question, and shall not leave the Chair on such occasions.

9. Commissioners Not to Speak Twice on the Same Question.—No Commissioner shall speak twice on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in the explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

10. Points of Order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

11. Commissioners Not to Digress or Impute Improper Motives.—No Commissioner shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, nor impute improper motives, and all personal reflections on Commissioners shall be deemed disorderly, and every Commissioner so doing shall, upon being called to order by the Chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw such imputations or reflections, as the case may be.

12. A Commissioner called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

13. Persons Not Commissioners to Leave when Requested.—No person not being a Commissioner who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Commissioners, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when requested by the Chairman to do so.

14. Call of the Commissioners.—No Commissioner shall absent himself from any meeting held in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Commissioners without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.

15. Documents to be Produced.—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

16. Motions, Amendments, and Notice Thereof.—All notices of motion shall be in writing, dated, and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Trust Secretary at the close of meeting of the Commissioners, or if not given at the meeting then seven days prior to the day which the next meeting of the Commissioners is to take place, and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book, in the order in which they may be received.

17. No Motion Without Notice.—No Commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, except in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

18. Motions on Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners after that at which it has been presented.

19. Motions to be Moved in Order.—Except by leave of the Commissioners, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Trust Secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

20. Motions Not to be Proceeded with in the Absence of the Mover.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

21. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.

22. Mover of Motion or Amendment Not to be Interrupted.—Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question or order disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

23. Nature of Motion to be Stated.—Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Commissioners thereon.

24. Leave to be Obtained Before Motion Withdrawn.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Commissioners.

25. Motions to be Seconded Prior to Discussion.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Commissioners unless it be seconded; but a Commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Commissioners by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

26. Mover and Not the Seconder Held to Have Spoken.—A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Commissioner merely seconding shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

27. Motion to be in Writing.—At every meeting of the Commissioners, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced to writing, signed by the mover, and be delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

28. Amendments.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

29. Amendment to Become the Question.—If an amendment be carried, the amendment shall become itself the question, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question may be moved.

30. Second Amendment may be Moved.—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Commissioners for discussion at a time.

31. Right of Mover to Reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which question shall be put from the Chair, but no Commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.

32. Adjournment Motion for.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Commissioners, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion of adjournment be made.

33. Protest, Commissioners May.—Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Commissioners, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners by the protesting Commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Trust Secretary's office, and signed by such Commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Commissioners.

34. Lapsed Questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

35. Order of the Day to be Restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of numbers as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

36. Voting.—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner, the Commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and all those voting in the negative shall then hold up their hands, and result be declared by the Chairman. The Chairman shall have a deliberate vote, and in case of an equal division he shall have a casting vote, and every Commissioner present shall vote except he be disabled by law from doing so.

37. Questions to be Put.—The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Commissioners, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

38. Contents of Petitions.—It shall be incumbent on every Commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Commissioners, and that the contents do not violate any By-law or any provision thereof.

39. Name at Beginning of Petition.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

40. Petition to be in Writing.—Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioner at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every sheet on which it is written.

41. How Signed.—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

42. No Letters, &c., to be Attached.—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

43. Presentation of Petitions.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

44. Deputations.—Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Commissioners in support of any petition, or otherwise, must send in an application in writing, to the Trust Secretary, at least three clear days before the meeting of the Commissioners at which such petition is intended to be presented.

45. Cheques to be Signed.—All cheques shall be signed by two Commissioners, and countersigned by the Secretary.

46. Appointment to Permanent Office.—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Commissioners shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the district of Boort, inviting applications from qualified candidates for same.

47. Salaries to be Fixed.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Commissioners shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.

48. Commissioners, &c., Not to be Surety.—No Commissioner or officer of the Commissioners, and no assessor or auditor shall be received as a surety, for any officer appointed by the Commissioners, or for any work to be done for the Commissioners.

49. Contracts.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expenses of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

50. Plans, &c.—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Commissioner during that time, except in cases of emergency.

51. Secretary to Expend Moneys.—It shall be lawful for the Secretary from time to time, on the written order of the Chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Commissioners for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between two ordinary meetings of the Commissioners the sum of Ten pounds.

52. Addresses to the Governor, &c.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Trust Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners.

53. Suspension of Regulations.—Any one or more of the rules and provisions herein contained may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice being given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

54. Penalty.—Every person who shall so offend against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

55. Common Seal.—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept in a locked box, of which the key shall be kept by the Trust Secretary, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Chairman of the Trust and the Secretary, or in the absence of the Chairman, unless two Commissioners and the Secretary be present.

Compensatory Allowances for Obligation to Perform Shift Work, Work on Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays and for Recall from Recreational Leave.

(1) Subject to the provisions of this Division, every member of the Police Force not above the rank of Sergeant, shall be paid in addition to his ordinary salary, an allowance by way of compensation for his obligation to perform duty—

(a) between 9 p.m. and 7 a.m. in the period commencing midnight on Sunday and ending at midnight on Friday;

(b) between midnight on Friday and midnight on Saturday, or on Easter Monday, Anzac Day, or the holidays observed in accordance with the provisions of section 67 of the *Public Service Act* 1946, so far as they relate to Australia Day, Labour Day, Queen's Birthday, Boxing Day, New Year holidays, and any holiday proclaimed by the Governor in Council as a Public Holiday for the whole of Victoria and published in the *Government Gazette*;

(c) between midnight on Saturday and midnight on Sunday, and on Good Friday and Christmas Day (when such day does not occur on a Sunday).

(2) Such allowance shall be at the following rates:—

(3) Where any such member performs duty in excess of 80 hours during any period or on any day specified in paragraph 1 hereof, subject to the exigencies of the service, he shall be granted time off in respect of such duty on the corresponding day or days of the week thereafter.

(4) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions, a member of the Force not above the rank of Sergeant who is required to perform the duties of an Officer, and in doing so has qualified to receive higher duty pay in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 1 of Division VI. of Determination No. 1, shall not be paid the allowance under paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, during the period for which he receives the salary of the higher rank. The amount of the annual allowance otherwise payable to him under this Division shall be reduced by an amount proportionate to the said period.

(5) (a) A member of the Police Force not above the rank of Sergeant who is recalled from his recreational leave for the performance of duty at a Court in the State of Victoria, shall be paid an allowance in addition to his ordinary salary for such duty, provided that the place from which he is recalled is distant more than 20 miles from his home or usual residence.

(b) Such allowance shall not be paid for time spent in travelling from or returning to such place; or for duty in excess of eight hours on any day.

(c) Such allowance shall be at the following rate:—

$$\frac{\text{Fortnightly Salary}}{80} \times \frac{1}{2}$$

and fortnightly salary shall exclude all allowances, including any allowance payable under clause 1, Division VI. of Determination No. 1, but shall include the amount of cost of living adjustment.

(d) For the purpose of this paragraph, duty shall include travelling from and returning to a station at the place where such Court is held, but shall not include meal breaks or any period of time off during the performance of such duty.

(e) Such member shall be entitled to be paid a further allowance by way of reimbursement for expenses incurred whilst travelling from or returning to the place from which he is recalled, on the scale set out in paragraph 4, sub-paragraph (4) of Determination No. 38. If in any case the total allowance payable under this sub-paragraph for any period of 24 hours exceeds the full daily rate, he shall

be paid the lesser amount. The provisions of paragraph 17 of Determination No. 38 shall not apply to this sub-paragraph."

- (c) (i) In Division VIIIA, paragraph 1, by deleting the words and figure "the second proviso to paragraph 1" and substituting therefor the word and figure "paragraph 3".
- (ii) In Division VIIIA by deleting paragraph 9 thereof, and renumbering the following paragraphs, "9", "10", and "11", respectively; in place of the numbers "10", "11", and "12".

MIDWIVES REGULATIONS 1955 (No. 1).

THE Nurses Board, by virtue of the powers conferred by section five of the *Midwives Act* 1928 (No. 3734) as amended by any Act, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Midwives Regulations 1955 (No. 1) and shall be read and construed as one with the Midwives Regulations 1951 as amended by the Midwives Regulations 1952, the Midwives Regulations 1952 (No. 2), the Midwives Regulations 1952 (No. 3), and the Midwives Regulations 1954.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation upon approval of the Governor in Council and publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The Midwives Regulations 1951, as amended by any Regulations are hereby amended as follows:—

(a) In Regulation 21—

(i) For the expression "21. Every" there shall be substituted the expression "21. (a) Subject to the following sub-regulation, every";

(ii) At the end of the regulation there shall be added the following sub-regulation:—

"(b) Any candidate who four weeks before the commencement of an examination is unable to make the statutory declaration referred to in paragraph (b) of Regulation 21, may submit such declaration to the Board at any time not less than seven days before the commencement of the examination at which such candidate intends to present herself."

(b) After Regulation 54 there shall be inserted the following Regulation:—

"54. Every midwife who attends a birth at any hospital shall as soon as practicable after such birth ensure that the child is marked or labelled appropriately for identification purposes."

ORDER APPROVING OF A DEVIATION FROM A MAIN ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

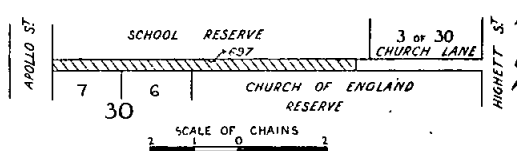

Fifteen shillings if the amount does not exceed Ten pounds;

Thirty shillings if the amount exceeds Ten pounds but does not exceed Thirty pounds;

Forty shillings if the amount exceeds Thirty pounds but does not exceed Fifty pounds;

Sixty shillings if the amount exceeds Fifty pounds but does not exceed Seventy-five pounds; and

Eighty shillings if the amount exceeds Seventy-five pounds—

and the defendant shall forthwith after such payment send to the complainant notice thereof in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto. But when the complainant does not receive notice of such payment having been made before the sitting of the court at which the summons is made returnable, it shall be lawful for the justices to order the defendant to pay such additional costs as the complainant shall have in their opinion properly incurred in preparing for the hearing and in attending the court. Provided that no defendant shall be liable to pay the sums mentioned herein for professional costs unless the name and address of the legal practitioner who has prepared and obtained the summons are written or printed on the summons served on the defendant.

MOTOR-RACING ON HIGHWAYS AT LITTLE RIVER.

WHEREAS it is enacted by sub-section (2) of section 80 of the *Motor Car Act 1951* that, if a motor-car is used on a highway for purposes of racing or of trial of speed, the driver or the person in charge thereof shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds, provided that the said sub-section (2) shall not apply to a motor-car used as aforesaid on any highway, or portion thereof, specified by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, and on such days and during such hours as are specified in the Order:

And whereas the Harley Club of Victoria has requested that such an Order be made so as to enable motor-cycle races to be conducted by the said club on certain portions of highways on Saturday and Monday, the twelfth and fourteenth days of March, 1955, respectively:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Car Act 1951*, doth by this Order specify the portions of highways within the municipal district of the Shire of Werribee, which are described in the Schedule hereunder, as portions of highways in respect of which any motor-car may, without being subject to the application of the said sub-section (2) of section 80 of the *Motor Car Act 1951* be used for purposes of racing or of trial of speed under the control and supervision of the said Harley Club of Victoria, on Saturday, the twelfth day of March, 1955, between the hours of One o'clock and Five o'clock in the afternoon, and Monday, the fourteenth day of March, 1955, between the hours of half-past Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Five o'clock in the afternoon, provided that the officer in charge of police in attendance is satisfied that such portions of highways are in a satisfactory condition for racing purposes, and that adequate arrangements have been made for the safety of the public.

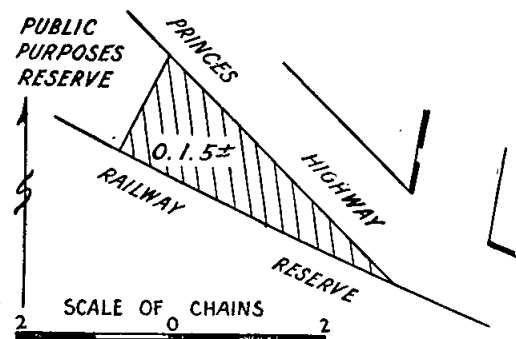

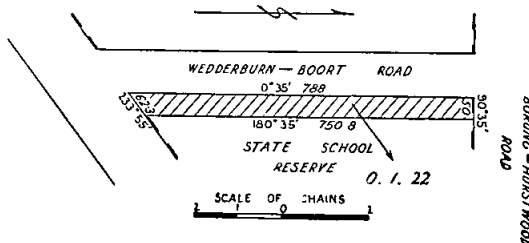

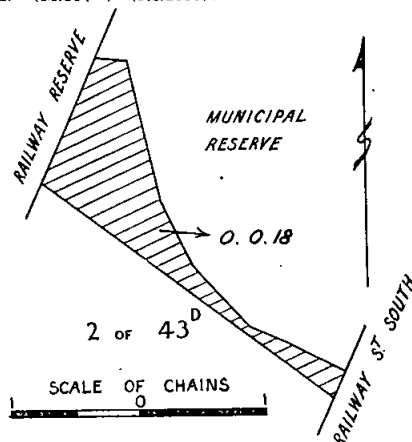

Grant-street.—In Grant-street an area in the centre of the roadway parallel to and a distance of 20 feet from the kerb alignment on either side commencing at a point 30 feet from the prolongation of the west building line of St. Kilda-road and continuing in a westerly direction to a point 30 feet from the prolongation of the east building line of Wells-street and commencing at a point 30 feet west of the prolongation of the west building line of Wells-street and continuing in a westerly direction to a point 30 feet from the prolongation of the east building line of Dodds-street, and on the north side of Grant-street for a distance of 10 feet out from the northern kerb alignment commencing at a point 30 feet from the prolongation of the west building line of Balston-street and continuing in a westerly direction to a point 30 feet from the prolongation of the east building line of Hanna-street.

Ireland-street.—In Ireland-street an area in the centre of the roadway parallel to and a distance of 10 feet from the kerb alignment on either side commencing at a point 30 feet from the prolongation of the east building line of City-road and continuing in an easterly direction to a point 30 feet from the prolongation of the west building line of Kavanagh-street.

Kavanagh-street.—In Kavanagh-street on the west side for a distance of 10 feet out from the western kerb alignment commencing at a point 30 feet from the prolongation of the south building line of Balston-street and continuing in a southerly direction to a point 30 feet from the prolongation of the north building line of Hanna-street.

Brick Area.

3. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any building, the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone, or concrete, upon any land fronting to or abutting on any portion of the streets or roads in the area described in the Schedule to this By-law. These restrictions shall not apply to any out-building in such prescribed area.

Minimum Area, Depth, and Width of Frontage.

4. The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 3 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called "the Regulations") are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed.

Distance from Street Alignment.

5. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building of Class 1 or 2 occupancy from the frontage of any land is hereby specified at 15 feet.
(b) No person shall construct any building of Class 1 or 2 occupancy closer to the street frontage of any land than 15 feet.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, the said Council, upon written application being made to it, may permit any person to—
(a) construct a building of Class 1 occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 5 of Table 803 of the Regulations or in this By-law;
(b) construct a building of Class 3, 5, 7, or 8 occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class 4 occupancy is attached, on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 808 of the Regulations.

Provided in all such cases that on the day of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area, or was shown on a plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

Rear Access.

7. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the Council may, upon written application being made to it, dispense with the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations.

Fees Under Table 401.

8. (a) The deposit for the construction of a temporary crossing under paragraph (g) of Table 401 of the Regulations is hereby fixed at £2.
(b) The fees for road opening under paragraph (h) of the said Table 401 are hereby fixed at—
(i) for opening a bitumenized or concrete street or road or footpath, a sum of 15s.;
(ii) for opening a gravelled street or road or footpath, the sum of 7s. 6d.;
(iii) for opening an unmade street or road or footpath, the sum of 4s.

THE SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

4. For the purposes of this By-law buildings of Classes I., III., and IV. Occupancy shall mean the same buildings as are included in the definitions of buildings Classes I., III., and IV. Occupancy in the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria.

5. Fowlhouses, kennels, &c.—Fowlhouses, kennels, and similar structures may be constructed appurtenant to buildings of Classes I., III., and IV. Occupancy, provided that such structures—

- (a) shall have a height not exceeding 8 feet and a total superficial area not exceeding 100 square feet;
- (b) shall be distant not less than 75 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage;
- (c) shall be distant not less than 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet;
- (d) shall be distant not less than 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
- (e) shall be distant not less than 40 feet from any dwelling, whether on the same or adjoining land;
- (f) shall be covered and roofed with a material approved by the Building Surveyor of the said shire.

6. Any contravention of the foregoing provisions by any act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law, and every person who is guilty of any such offence shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. In any case in which a fowlhouse, kennel, or similar structure has been erected or commenced to be erected contrary to the provisions of this By-law, either in whole or in part—

- (a) The Council may give to the owner or the person who erected such fowlhouse, kennel, or similar structure, or leave upon the site seven days' notice in writing (which notice may be signed by the Municipal Clerk on behalf of the Council), to bring the same into conformity with the said provisions or requiring the pulling down and removal of such fowlhouse, kennel, or similar structure;
- (b) If default is made in complying with such notice and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the Council to pull down or demolish and remove such fowlhouse, kennel, or similar structure erected contrary to the provisions of this By-law, and
- (c) The Council may in its discretion sell the materials which have been pulled down or demolished and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of such pulling down or demolition and removal and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

THE "VICTORIA GOVERNMENT GAZETTE."

ATTENTION is invited to the following procedure in relation to the publication of official matter in the *Government Gazette*:—

1. Matter submitted to the Executive Council.

Matter submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the *Gazette* Officer.

Publication will be facilitated by the submission of carbon copies for the use of the *Gazette* Officer.

2. Other matter.

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the *Gazette* Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the *Gazette* Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.

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On an average, ten words make a line.

Every signature must likewise be counted as a line.

The final words of a paragraph, though only portion of a line, must be counted as one line.

SIGNATURES (in particular) and proper names must be written very plainly in the text; ONE SIDE ONLY of each slip of paper should be WRITTEN UPON.

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ALL DOCUMENTS illegibly written will be returned unpublished, and, where brands occur unprovided for by the ordinary letters of the alphabet, a worded explanatory description must be furnished.

THE VICTORIA GOVERNMENT GAZETTE is published on WEDNESDAY EVENING in each week, and Notices for insertion will be received by the Government Printer at or before Two p.m. at ordinary rates, and late advertisements between Two p.m. and Five p.m. at double rates on the day preceding the day of publication.
