#### AMENDING DETERMINATION OF THE LAW CLERKS BOARD.

Note.-This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

I N accordance with the provisions of the Labour and Industry Acts, the Wages Board, which now has the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in his practice, by a barrister and solicitor, but not including:—

- (a) an articled clerk;
- (b) a barrister or solicitor serving not more than one year for the purpose of gaining experience;
- (c) a law student, i.e., a person employed as a clerk (other than an articled clerk) engaged in the course of study prescribed for those intending to qualify for admission as barristers and solicitors;
- (d) a typist or stenographer,"

has made the following Determination, namely:-

That on the 7th November, 1956, the Determination made on the 22nd June, 1955 and published in Government Gazette No. 642 of the 7th October, 1955, shall be amended by adding the following new clause:—

#### OLYMPIC GAMES HOLIDAY.

8A. In connexion with the holding of the Olympic Cames in Victoria during the months of November and December, 1956, where a holiday or half-holiday is preclaimed by Order in Council throughout any Municipality or part thereof, or within any defined area, such holiday or half-holiday shall, so far as such Municipality or part thereof, or such defined area is concerned be deemed to be included in the list of holidays prescribed in clause 8.

Provided that no employee shall be entitled to the conditions prescribed by this clause for more than the equivalent of one working day.

Provided further that an employee who fails to attend for work on the working day before and/or after such holiday or half-holiday without reasonable excuse shall not be entitled to be paid for such holiday or half-holiday.
