Labour and Industry Acts.

AMENDING DETERMINATION OF THE LAUNDRY WORKERS BOARD.

NOTE.—(a) This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Labour and Industry Acts, the Wages Board appointed to determine the lowest price or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons engaged in the occupation of a person employed at laundry work, but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of—

The Boarding Houses Board ;
The Hospital and Benevolent Asylum Attendants Board ;
The Hotel and Restaurant Board ;
The Shirt Board ; and
The Storemen, Packers, and Sorters Board ”—

has made the following Determination, namely :—

That on the 11th October, 1956, the Determination made on the 2nd March, 1955, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 435 of the 4th July, 1955, shall be amended by adding the following new clause :—

OLYMPIC GAMES HOLIDAY

7A. In connexion with the holding of the Olympic Games in Victoria during the months of November and December, 1956, where a holiday or half-holiday is proclaimed by Order in Council throughout any Municipality or part thereof, or within any defined area, such holiday or half-holiday shall, so far as such Municipality or part thereof, or such defined area is concerned be deemed to be included in the list of holidays prescribed in clauses 6 and 7.

Provided that no employee shall be entitled to the conditions prescribed by this clause for more than the equivalent of one working day.

Provided further that an employee who fails to attend for work on the working day before and/or after such holiday or half-holiday without reasonable excuse shall not be entitled to be paid for such holiday or half-holiday.
