AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the areas of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

AMENDMENT OF BUTCHERING TRADES APPRENTICESHIP REGULATIONS

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof. doth hereby rescind Regulation 5 of the Butchering Trades Apprenticeship Regulations, and doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

For Regulation 5 of the said Regulations there shall be substituted the following:-

"Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.

5. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the 5. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or probationers shall be fifteen years, provided that until the 17th day of July, 1956, the minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or probationers shall be fourteen and a bull treat?"

AMENDMENT OF VEHICLE INDUSTRY TRADES APPRENTICESHIP REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the Vehicle Industry Trades Apprenticeship Regulations, that is to say:—

Regulation 4 of the said Regulations shall be rescinded and the following substituted therefor:—

"Educational Qualifications for Entry into Apprenticeship.

4. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades; provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination:-

- (1) In the trades of bodymaking (first class), panel working and panel beating, trimming (development) and trimming (development and repair), if he possess any one of the following educational qualifications, or in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof—
 - (a) The Intermediate Technical Certificate or Junior Technical Certificate of the Education Department of Victoria or the School Intermediate Certificate.
 - (b) The completion, in a manner satisfactory to the Commission, of the third year of the course of study of the Junior Technical Schools of the Education Department of Victoria.

Provided, however, that until 31st Decem-Provided, however, that until 31st December, 1956, the minimum educational standard for entry to these trades shall be the completion, in a manner satisfactory to the Commission, of the second year of the course of study of the Junior Technical Schools of the Education Department of Victoria or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof valent thereof.

- (2) In the trades of painting, trimming (repair), and trimming (production), if he completes, in a manner satisfactory to the Commission, the second year of the course of study of the Junior Technical Schools of the Education Department of Victoria, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof.






