Labour and Industry Act, 1953.

AMENDING DETERMINATION OF THE BRUSHMAKERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Labour and Industry Act 1953*, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a brushmaker" has made the following Determination, namely:—

That, as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1955, the Determination made on the 1st March, 1955, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 320 of the 26th May, 1955, shall be amended by:—
