PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And, whereas the Council of the City of Nunawading has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land, being part of Crown portion 85, Parish of Nunawading, reserved for a street on lodged plan No. 9921 and described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Salisbury-avenue.—(Portion of).

Commencing at a point on the southern alignment of Laburnum-street, distant 332 feet west of the east boundary of the said Crown portion 85, bounded thence by lines bearing respectively 180 deg. 48 min. 252 ft. 9 in., 230 deg. 38 min. 231 ft. 3 in., 271 deg. 4 min. 56 feet, 27 deg. 41 min. 35 ft. 3 in., 50 deg. 38 min. 218 ft. 2 in., 0 deg. 48 min. 229 ft. 1 in., and 90 deg. 16 min. 50 feet along the southern alignment of Laburnum-street to the point of commencement.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section 24 of the *Poisons Act 1928*, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria made on the 9th November, 1955, do by this my Proclamation remove from Part II. of the Fourth Schedule to the said Act the following substances or preparations:

"Chlordane and all substitution and/or addition products of 4:7 Methanoindene, whether described as chlordane, chlordan, velsicol 1068, CD 68, Octa-Klor or by any other name and preparations or admixtures thereof except preparations or admixtures containing less than 2 per cent. of such substances and labelled as follows:—

- (a) with a statement of the percentage of Chlordane and
- (b) with the following warning—
NOT TO BE USED FOR SPRAYING INTO THE AIR AS FOR FLIES NOR FOR GENERAL APPLICATION TO LARGE AREAS NOR FOR SPRAYING BEDDING. WHEN USED INDOORS APPLY DIRECTLY WITH BRUSH OR SWAB. AVOID INHALATION OR CONTACT WITH SKIN OR FOOD-STUFFS."

ADDITION TO THE SOUTHERN WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Weights and Measures Acts*, it is amongst other things enacted that, at the request of the Councils of all the municipalities concerned, the

Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that any municipality specified in such Proclamation shall be added to and form part of a Union:

And whereas the Cities of Chelsea, Moorabbin and Mordialloc, the Borough of Wonthaggi and the Shires of Bass, Berwick, Cranbourne, Fern Tree Gully, Flinders, Frankston and Hastings, Mornington, Mulgrave, Phillip Island and Springvale and Noble Park, do constitute a Union under the title of "Southern Weights and Measures Union" for the purposes of the Weights and Measures Acts:

APPRENTICESHIP COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.—

Lithographic Printing (as carried on in other than daily newspaper offices).

Hairdressers Registration Acts.

HAIRDRESSERS REGISTRATION REGULATIONS 1955.

REGULATIONS 57, 58, 59 AND 60 OF 1937 AND REGULATION (2) 1947 HERETOFORE IN FORCE HAVE BEEN REPEALED AND THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS SUBSTITUTED THEREFOR.

THE Hairdressers Registration Board of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Hairdressers Registration Acts, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1955" and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be read and construed as one with the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1937, and the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1937 (No. 2) and the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1945 and the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1947 and the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1952 and the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1952 (No. 2).

Part VII.—Hygiene, Sanitation and Safety in Hairdressers' Shops and Schools.

Interpreta-
tion.

57. In this Part, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

"Customer" includes any person upon whom hairdressing is being performed, or who is in a hairdresser's shop, or a hairdressing school for the purpose of receiving service from a hairdresser.

"Disinfecting fluid" means—

- (a) Ethyl Alcohol B.P. in a dilution containing 70 per cent. by volume; or
- (b) Isopropyl Alcohol B.P.C. in a dilution containing 50 per cent. by volume; or
- (c) Any quaternary ammonium compound which in a solution containing one part in 500 of water weight to volume has a sterilizing effect at least equal to Ethyl Alcohol B.P. in a dilution containing 70 per cent. by volume; or
- (d) Any non-irritant disinfecting solution which can be shown to have a disinfecting action at least equal to any one of the foregoing.

"Hairdresser" includes barber and any student, apprentice, or improver who is learning the practice of hairdressing, and also a teacher of hairdressing.

58. A hairdressing establishment located in a residence shall be confined to a separate room entirely cut off from the living quarters and complying in all respects with the regulations governing shops.

59. Every compartment to which customers are admitted shall be adequately lighted and ventilated to the satisfaction of the Board. The floor of every compartment in which hairdressing is performed shall be of linoleum, smooth surfaced rubber or similar material capable of being rapidly swept clean.

60. (1) Every room in which customers are attended to shall have a floor area equal to at least 25 square feet for each of the customers who can be attended to simultaneously, plus (if waiting customers are admitted to the same compartment) at least 10 square feet for each customer awaiting attention.

(2) When a separate waiting or reception room is provided it shall have an area of at least 10 square feet per person admitted with a minimum of 50 square feet.

(3) The proprietor shall not permit persons in excess of the number provided for in this Regulation to be in any room at one time.

61. The following provisions shall apply in every hairdresser's shop and in every school:—

(1) The proprietor shall—

- (a) provide in the room where hairdressing is done suitable and sufficient wash-basins with an adequate hot and cold water supply, and all such basins shall have fitted and in good order an efficient waste-pipe suitably trapped and vented and leading to a proper drain;

- (b) cause a sufficient supply of clean towels, nail brushes and soap (or other detergent) to be at all times available in his shop or school for the exclusive personal use of hairdressers. Towels, brushes, &c.
- (2) Every hairdresser shall— Hairdressers to have clean hands.
- (a) at all times when attending to a customer have thoroughly clean hands;
- (b) in every case cleanse his hands immediately before and after attending to each customer and immediately after visiting a sanitary convenience; and
- (c) for the purposes of giving effect to this Regulation use a nail-brush, soap (or other detergent) and water, and a clean towel kept solely for his own use.
- (3) Every hairdresser shall, while attending to a customer or model wear a clean and properly fitting coat or overall of washable white or light coloured material over any other garment. Such coat or overall shall have no external pocket. Hairdressers to wear overalls.
- (4) The proprietor shall cause all shelves, benches, and tables on which tools of trade or instruments are to be placed to be made of, or to be finished with, a durable smooth and impervious material and shall not permit covers to be used on any such shelves, benches or tables unless such covers can be thoroughly and daily cleansed by washing or otherwise effectually disinfected. Furnishings to be of smooth impervious material.
- (5) Clean linen, towels and coats or overalls shall be kept in closed dust-proof containers. Clean linen to be kept in dust-proof containers.
- (6) The proprietor shall cause a sufficient number of suitable receptacles constructed of smooth impervious material with tightly fitting lids to be provided in his shop or school for the reception of— Receptacles for soiled linen and waste.
- (a) soiled linen, soiled towels and other soiled cloths; and
- (b) hair, paper, and other trade wastes.
- Every such receptacle shall have marked thereon in permanent and prominent letters of not less than 1 inch in length the word or words "soiled linen" or "waste" (as the case may be), and such receptacle shall be used only for the purposes for which they are so labelled.
- (7) The proprietor shall cause—
- (a) all hair clippings and other waste, including shaving lather and paper, to be swept up as soon as practicable after each operation of hairdressing and placed in the proper receptacle; and Litter to be collected after each operation.
- (b) all linen, towels and other cloths, immediately they become soiled, to be at once placed in the proper receptacle.
- (8) The proprietor shall cause all walls, ceilings, floors, floor coverings, shelves, fittings and furniture on the premises and in any way connected with the business of his shop or school, to be maintained in good order and in a thoroughly clean condition, and free from any accumulation of hair or other waste. Arms, seats and rests of chairs shall be wiped after serving each customer. Furnishings, &c., to be kept clean.
- (9) No person shall spit on the floor or walls or any part of the premises, and immediately any sputum is noticed in or upon the premises, it shall be cleaned up, and the spot from which such sputum was removed shall be at once swabbed with disinfecting fluid. Prohibition of spitting.
- (10) The proprietor shall cause the floor of his shop or school to be completely swept at least once a day. Floor to be kept clean.
- (11) The proprietor shall cause appliances specified below to be sterilized in the manner described:— Appliances to be sterilized.
- (a) Razor blades, scissors and combs—by immersion for three minutes in steam, boiling water, or disinfecting fluid or by flaming.
- (b) Clippers—by first thoroughly brushing the teeth with a clean brush kept for the purpose, to remove all hair, and then by immersion in boiling water or in any disinfecting fluid for three minutes, or

by flaming. In the case of electric clippers by first thoroughly brushing the teeth with a clean brush kept for the purpose, to remove all hair, and then by wiping the blades with fresh cotton wool or cloth saturated with a disinfecting fluid.

- (c) Hair-brushes and neck-brushes—by immersion for three minutes in a disinfecting fluid or by washing in warm water with soap (or other detergent).
- (d) Shaving brushes—by immersion of the hair or bristle portion in a disinfecting fluid or in boiling water for five minutes.
- (e) New shaving brushes—no new shaving brush may be used unless it or the material of which it is made has been autoclaved at 15 pounds pressure for 30 minutes or immersed in boiling water for at least four hours.
- (f) Towels, wraps, and other washable fabrics—by immersion in a disinfecting fluid, or in boiling water for ten minutes, but plastic wraps may be washed in warm water with soap.
- (g) Strops—by wiping with a cloth or sponge saturated with a disinfecting fluid.
- (h) Clips and other equipment used in permanent waving and which come in contact with the customers' hair—by immersion in a disinfecting fluid or in boiling water for five minutes.
- (i) Electric heating clips—by wiping with a cloth dipped in a disinfecting fluid.
- (j) All other appliances and instruments—by immersion in a disinfecting fluid or boiling water for five minutes or by wiping with a cloth dipped in a disinfecting fluid.

Any article dropped on the floor or otherwise contaminated shall be sterilized in the manner prescribed in these Regulations before being used.

Appliances
to be kept
clean.

(12) All hairdressing appliances shall be kept clean, and shall be sterilized before use each day and immediately after use on each customer or model. When not in use, all razors, scissors, clippers and combs shall be kept in containers provided for the purpose, which containers shall be wiped out daily with a cloth dipped in a disinfecting fluid.

Portable bowls, basins, cups and other containers shall be thoroughly cleaned with soap (or other detergent) and water after using, and then rinsed, dried and kept clean and free from dust.

Hairdressers shall not carry combs or other tools or instruments in pockets of their clothing.

Protection of
head-rest.

(13) Before any customer is permitted to recline in a chair, the head rest of such chair shall be covered with a clean towel or clean sheet of paper not previously used for any other purpose. Paper so used shall immediately be put in the receptacle for "Waste"; its further use for any purpose whatsoever is prohibited.

Provision of
clean towels
and
neck-cloths.

(14) A fresh, clean towel, neck protector, or neck-cloth, and every similar article which comes in contact with the skin of a customer or model on whom hairdressing is being performed shall be provided for each customer or model, and no wrap of any sort in general use shall be used without a neck protector.

A hairdresser shall place a paper strip or clean towel not previously used completely around the neck of each customer before any wrap or other protective device is fastened around the neck.

Plastic wraps shall be sterilized in the manner prescribed in these Regulations after use on any customer.

Towels, when laundered, shall be washed in water of a temperature of at least 200°F. Provided, however, that this latter requirement shall not apply to towels which are subjected, on the premises where they are washed, to a temperature of at least 200°F. in the process of drying or ironing. The performance of laundry work in any compartment where hairdressing is done or drying towels on lines, radiators or driers is prohibited.

Dipping used towels in a hot-water receptacle and then using them on customers is prohibited.

(15) The proprietor shall cause all lathering and soaping to be done by wetting the shaving-brush with boiling water and sprinkling it with soap, powder, cream or fluid before applying it to the face or neck of a customer or model. The brush shall not be rubbed on or dipped in soap or soap preparation, nor shall soap be applied direct to the face, head or neck of a customer or model except by means of a sterile applicator.

Method of lathering.

(16) No sponge, rotary hair-brush, shaving stick, lathering bowl, powder puff, neck duster, alum stick, bloc hyaline, or other article or substance liable to convey infection shall be used in hairdressing. Individual service paper dusters or the clean towel served to the customer may be used for removing hair from the neck and face.

Prohibition of use of articles liable to convey infection.

(17) Bleeding shall be stopped only by some suitable styptic, in powder or liquid form, on a fresh clean pad, which shall be destroyed or placed in the receptacle provided for trade waste immediately after use.

Remedies for bleeding.

(18) Blood-stained towels or linen shall immediately on completion of the service be disinfected in the manner prescribed by these Regulations.

Disposal of blood-stained linen.

(19) Powder, rouge and similar cosmetics shall be applied only by means of a mechanical blower, or a fresh clean pad.

Application of powder.

(20) Petroleum jelly, ointment, or any similar substance, shall not be taken for use from any container other than a collapsible tube. It shall be delivered only on to a fresh clean pad or sterile applicator.

Petroleum jelly and ointments—application of.

(21) Fluids and solutions used in permanent waving shall be used from a type of container that will prevent contamination of the unused solution, and fluid used on one person shall not be used again. Creams used in face massage shall be dipped from the container (if not supplied in a collapsible tube) with a sterile applicator. Removing such with the fingers is prohibited.

Fluids, solutions and creams not to be dipped with fingers.

(22) Before using a hair dye the hairdresser shall perform a patch test. This should be made on a skin area either behind the ear, or on the forearm. If no swelling, itching, redness or other reaction occurs after twenty-four hours the operator may proceed with the dyeing process. If there is any such reaction the said dye shall not be used.

Patch tests.

(23) The proprietor of every hairdressing school and of every hairdresser's shop shall not, after the coming into operation of the Regulation—

Electrical equipment.

(1) Suffer or permit to be installed in such school or shop any electrical equipment which has not been approved by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria.

Electrical equipment to be approved.

(2) Suffer or permit to be used in such school or shop in any of the operations of hairdressing any electrical equipment after he has been advised in writing by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria that such equipment is deemed to be a source of danger or has been installed or connected in a wrongful or dangerous manner.

Use of dangerous electrical equipment prohibited.

For the purpose of this Regulation the term "approved" shall be deemed to mean—

"Approved" defined.

(a) In respect of articles prescribed by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria under section 7 of the *State Electricity Commission Act 1934*—approved pursuant to application for approval being made under the *Electrical Approval Regulations—Approval of Equipment—1935*.

(b) In respect of articles not so prescribed—of a kind in respect of which the Commission has stated in writing over the signature of its Chief Electrical Inspector that it raises no objection to the connexion of such articles to electricity supply mains.

(24) In any situation in a hairdressing school or hairdresser's shop where contact is possible between the user of an electrical appliance and earth or an earthed conducting medium—

Metallic frames to be connected to earth.

(1) The metallic frames and covers of all such electrical apparatus must be effectively connected to earth by means of suitable conductors in compliance with the Regulations of the State Electricity Commission.

Portable electrical appliances to be earthed.

(2) Every portable electrical appliance must be connected in compliance with the regulations of the State Electricity Commission to the electrical installation by means of a flexible cord which includes an earthing conductor properly connected at the ends of the cord to earthing terminals, clips or devices which will ensure, at all times during the operation of the appliance, the connexion of all exposed metal parts of the appliance, to the earthing system of the installation.

Exemption of doubly-insulated appliances.

Notwithstanding the provisions of this Regulation, however, it shall not be necessary to connect to earth the exposed metal frame or cover of any electrical appliance which the State Electricity Commission has, in writing, classified as an appliance provided with double insulation.

Penalty.

The proprietor of any hairdressing school or hairdresser's shop wherein any electrical appliance is connected otherwise than in accordance with the requirements of this Regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

Prohibition of use of class-room, &c., or shop as a sleeping room.

(25) No person shall use or suffer or permit to be used for domestic or residential purposes or as a sleeping place any part of—

- (a) a lecture room or class-room of a school; or
- (b) a hairdresser's shop.

For the purpose of this sub-clause all space on the same floor shall be deemed to form part of a lecture room or class-room or hairdresser's shop unless it is separated therefrom by a permanent substantial wall or partition extending from floor to ceiling.

Smoking.

(26) A hairdresser shall not smoke while attending to a customer.

Dangerous substances.

(27) Every hairdresser using substances or solutions which may cause chemical burns or other injury to the customer, the model or the operator shall have the container of such substances or solutions marked with the word "Dangerous" and shall keep exhibited in the workroom and/or storeroom where such substances or solutions are supplied a notice printed in easily read characters setting out the safe manner of using such substances or solutions and the remedies to be adopted for first aid in case of injury arising from their use.

62. The following provisions shall apply only in hairdresser's shops:—

Procedure where customer is suffering from infectious disease, &c. Hairdresser's duty on noticing infectious disease.

(1) Every customer suffering from infectious or contagious disease (including venereal disease) or infectious skin rash shall notify the hairdresser of the existence of such disease or rash before taking or attempting to take his seat in the operating chair.

(2) (a) Every hairdresser, upon being so notified or without notification if he observes or suspects the presence of any infectious skin rash in any customer, shall place all appliances intended to be used and while in use in the service of that customer on a towel moistened with a disinfecting fluid or on a stout piece of paper.

Treatment of appliances, &c., used upon customers suffering from infectious disease, &c. Hairdresser to cleanse his hands.

(b) All paper pads, towels, linen and appliances used in the service of such customer, as well as the coat or overall worn by the operator, shall, immediately on completion of the service, be destroyed or disinfected in the manner prescribed in these Regulations.

(c) Such hairdresser shall then cleanse his hands by scrubbing with a nail brush, soap (or other detergent) and water, and immersing them in disinfecting fluid for at least three minutes before drying.

Infected hairdresser not to attend a customer.

(3) No hairdresser suffering from any infectious or contagious disease (including venereal disease), or skin rash shall attend to any customer.

63. The following provisions shall apply only in schools:—

- (a) No person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease (including venereal disease), or infectious skin rash, shall act as a model; and
- (b) no teacher or student suffering from an infectious or contagious disease (including venereal disease), or skin rash, shall practice hairdressing on a model.

Hairdressers

Regulation 12 of 1940 is amended by inserting at the beginning of paragraph (1) the words—

REGULATIONS RELATING TO HAIRDRESSERS' SHOPS,
BEAUTY PARLOURS AND OTHER LIKE ESTABLISHMENTS
AND CHIROPODISTS' ESTABLISHMENTS.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Hairdressers' Shops, Beauty Parlours and Chiropodists' Establishments Regulations 1955" and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. The Hairdressers' Shops Regulations 1922 are hereby repealed.

3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:—

"Customer" includes any person receiving or seeking or awaiting service at an establishment.

"Disinfecting fluid" means:—

- (a) Ethyl Alcohol B.P., in a dilution containing 70 per cent. by volume; or
- (b) Isopropyl Alcohol B.P.C., in a dilution containing 50 per cent. by volume; or
- (c) Any quaternary ammonium compound which in a solution containing one part in 500 of water weight to volume has a sterilizing effect at least equal to Ethyl Alcohol B.P. in a dilution containing 70 per cent. by volume; or
- (d) any non-irritant disinfecting solution which can be shown to have a disinfecting action at least equal to any one of the foregoing.

"Operator" means a person attending to a customer.

"Proprietor" includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control of an establishment.

"Establishment" means a hairdresser's shop, beauty parlour or other like establishment, or a chiropodist's establishment.

4. After the expiry of three months from the date of coming into operation of these Regulations every premises in which an establishment is conducted shall be registered with the Council and if any such premises are not registered the proprietor shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

5. Any person proposing to register premises pursuant to these Regulations shall apply to the Council in the prescribed form and shall submit with this application a plan of the premises drawn to a scale of not less than 8 feet to 1 inch, showing the purpose for which it is intended to use each compartment of the premises.

6. (1) Every registration under these Regulations shall expire on the 31st day of December next following the granting thereof and shall be renewed annually on application being made by the proprietor.

(2) Application for renewal of registration shall be in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto and shall be lodged with the Council not later than the 15th day of November in each year.

(3) The fee of One pound shall be paid to the Council for registration and for annual renewal of registration of an establishment, and wherever applicable and not inconsistent with these Regulations the provisions of the Registration (Health Acts) Regulations shall apply to the registration of establishments.

7. The certificate of registration or of renewal of registration of an establishment, and the register of establishments shall respectively be in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

8. The Council may at any time during the currency of any registration of premises under these Regulations transfer the registration to any other person upon application for such transfer being made by or on behalf of the holder of the registration and by the proposed transferee.

9. (1) Before granting application for registration or renewal or transfer of registration of any premises under these Regulations the Council shall cause an inspection to be made of the premises.

(2) The inspector shall keep a record of the date of every such inspection and of the result of the inspection.

10. An application for registration or for renewal or transfer of registration of any premises shall be refused if there is in respect of such premises any contravention of these Regulations: Provided that the Council may grant an application conditionally on specified improvements being effected by a date fixed by the Council.

11. Every compartment to which customers are admitted shall be adequately lighted and ventilated to the satisfaction of the Council. The floor of every compartment in which hairdressing is performed shall be of linoleum, smooth surfaced rubber or similar material capable of being rapidly swept clean.

12. (1) Every room in which customers are attended to shall have a floor area equal to at least 25 square feet for each of the customers who can be attended to simultaneously, plus (if waiting customers are admitted to the same compartment) at least 10 square feet for each customer awaiting attention.

(2) When a separate waiting or reception room is provided it shall have an area of at least 10 square feet per person admitted with a minimum of 50 square feet.

(3) The proprietor shall not permit persons in excess of the number provided for in this Regulation to be in any room at one time.

(4) An establishment located in a residential building shall be confined to a room or rooms entirely separated from the living quarters.

13. The proprietor shall—

(a) provide in the room where customers are attended to suitable and sufficient wash-basins with an adequate hot and cold water supply; and all such basins shall have fitted and in good order an efficient waste-pipe, suitably trapped and vented; and leading to a proper drain.

(b) cause a sufficient supply of clean towels, nail-brushes, and soap or other detergent to be at all times available in the shop for the exclusive personal use of operators.

14. Every operator shall—

(a) at all times when attending to a customer have thoroughly clean hands;

(b) in every case cleanse his hands immediately before and after attending to each customer and immediately after visiting a sanitary convenience;

(c) for the purpose of giving effect to this Regulation use a nail-brush, soap or other detergent and water, and a clean towel kept solely for his own use.

15. Every operator shall, while attending to a customer, wear a clean and properly fitting coat or overall of washable white or light-coloured material over any other garment. Such coat or overall shall have no external pocket.

16. The proprietor shall cause all shelves, benches and tables on which tools of trade or instruments are to be placed to be made of or to be finished with a durable smooth and impervious material and shall not permit covers to be used on any such shelves, benches or tables unless such covers can be thoroughly cleansed by washing, or otherwise be effectually disinfected.

17. Clean linen, towels and coats or overalls shall be kept in closed dust-proof containers.

18. The proprietor shall cause a sufficient number of suitable receptacles, constructed of smooth and impervious material, with tightly fitting lids to be provided in his shop for the reception of—

- (a) soiled linen, soiled towels and other soiled cloths; and
- (b) hair, paper and other trade wastes.

Every such receptacle shall have marked thereon, in permanent and prominent letters, of not less than one inch in length, the words or word "soiled linen" or "waste" (as the case may be), and such receptacles shall be used only for the purposes for which they are so labelled.

19. The proprietor shall cause—

- (a) all hair clippings and other waste, including shaving lather and paper to be swept up and placed in the proper receptacle as soon as practicable after each customer has been served; and
- (b) all linen, towels and other cloths, immediately they become soiled to be at once placed in the proper receptacle.

20. The proprietor shall cause all walls, ceilings, floors, floor coverings, shelves, fittings and furniture on the premises and in any way connected with the business of his establishment to be maintained in good order and in a thoroughly clean condition and free from any accumulation of hair or other waste. Arms, seats and rests of chairs shall be wiped after serving each customer.

21. No person shall spit on the floor or walls or any other part of the premises and immediately any sputum is noticed in or upon the premises it shall be cleaned up, and the spot from which such sputum was removed shall be at once swabbed with a disinfecting fluid.

22. The proprietor shall cause the floor of his establishment to be completely swept at least once a day.

23. The proprietor of every establishment shall cause the appliances as specified below to be sterilized in the manner described:—

- (a) Razor blades, scissors and combs—by immersion for three minutes in steam, boiling water, or disinfecting fluid or by flaming.
- (b) Clippers—by first thoroughly brushing the teeth with a clean brush kept for the purpose, to remove all hair and then by immersion in boiling water or in any disinfecting fluid for three minutes or by flaming. In the case of electric clippers by first thoroughly brushing the teeth with a clean brush kept for the purpose, to remove all hair, and then by wiping the blades with fresh cotton wool or cloth saturated with a disinfecting fluid.
- (c) Hair-brushes and neck-brushes—by immersion for three minutes in a disinfecting fluid or by washing in warm water with soap or other detergent.
- (d) Shaving brushes—by immersion of the hair or bristle portion in a disinfecting fluid or in boiling water for five minutes.
- (e) New shaving brushes—no new shaving brush may be used unless it or the material of which it is made has been autoclaved at 15 pounds pressure for thirty minutes or immersed in boiling water for at least four hours.
- (f) Towels, wraps and other washable fabrics—by immersion in a disinfecting fluid or in boiling water for ten minutes, but plastic wraps may be washed in warm water with soap.
- (g) Strops—by wiping with a cloth or sponge saturated with a disinfecting fluid.
- (h) Clips and other equipment used in permanent waving and which come in contact with the customer's hair—by immersion in a disinfecting fluid or boiling water for five minutes.
- (i) Electric heating clips—by wiping with a cloth dipped in a disinfecting fluid.
- (j) All other appliances and instruments—by immersion in a disinfecting fluid or boiling water for five minutes or by wiping with a cloth dipped in a disinfecting fluid.

Any article dropped on the floor or otherwise contaminated shall be sterilized in the manner prescribed in these Regulations before being used.

24. (1) All appliances shall be kept clean, and shall be sterilized before use each day and immediately after use on each customer. When not in use, all razors, scissors, clippers and combs and other instruments and appliances shall be kept in containers provided for the purpose, which containers shall be wiped out daily with a cloth dipped in a disinfecting fluid.

(2) All portable bowls, basins, cups and other containers shall be thoroughly cleaned with soap or other detergent and water after use, then rinsed, dried and kept clean and free from dust.

(3) Operators shall not carry combs or other tools or instruments in pockets of their clothing.

25. Before any customer is permitted to recline in a chair, the head-rest of such chair shall be covered with a clean towel or a clean sheet of paper not previously used for any other purpose. Paper so used shall immediately be put in the receptacle for "Waste"; its further use for any purpose whatsoever is prohibited.

26. A fresh clean towel, neck protector, or neck-cloth and every similar article which comes in contact with the skin of a customer on whom hairdressing is being performed shall be provided for each customer, and no wrap of any sort in general use shall be used without a neck protector.

A hairdresser shall place a paper strip or a clean fresh towel completely around the neck of each customer before any wrap or other protective device is fastened around the neck.

Plastic wraps shall be sterilized in the manner prescribed in these Regulations after use on any customer.

Towels, when laundered, shall be washed in water of a temperature of at least 200°F. Provided, however, that this latter requirement shall not apply to towels which are subjected, on the premises where they are washed, to a temperature of at least 200°F. in the process of drying and ironing. The performance of laundry work or the drying of towels on lines, radiators, or dryers in any compartment where customers are attended to is prohibited.

Dipping used towels in a hot-water receptacle and then using them on customers is prohibited.

27. The proprietor shall cause all lathering and soaping to be done by wetting the shaving brush with boiling water, and sprinkling it with soap, powder, cream or fluid before applying it to the skin of a customer. The brush shall not be rubbed on or dipped in soap or soap preparation, nor shall soap be applied direct to the skin of a customer, except by means of a sterile applicator.

28. No sponge, rotary hair-brush, shaving stick, lathering bowl, powder puff, neck duster, alum stick, bloc hyaline, or other article or substance liable to convey infection shall be used in hairdressing or any other operation on a customer. Individual service paper dusters or the clean towel served to the customer may be used for wiping the neck, face or feet.

29. Bleeding shall be stopped only by some suitable styptic, in powder or liquid form, on a fresh clean pad, which shall be destroyed or placed in the receptacle provided for trade waste immediately after use.

30. Blood-stained towels or linen shall immediately on completion of the service be disinfected in the manner prescribed by these Regulations.

31. Powder, rouge and similar cosmetics shall be applied only by means of a mechanical blower, or a fresh clean pad.

32. Petroleum jelly, ointment, or any similar substance shall not be taken for use from any container other than a collapsible tube. It shall be delivered only on to a fresh clean pad or sterile applicator.

33. Fluids and solutions used in permanent waving shall be used from a type of container that will prevent contamination of the unused solution, and fluid used on one person shall not be used again. Creams used in massage shall be dipped from the container (if not supplied in a collapsible tube) with a sterile applicator. Removing such cream with the fingers is prohibited.

34. Before using a hair dye the operator shall perform a patch test. This should be made on a skin area, either behind the ear, or on the forearm. If no swelling, itching, redness, or other reaction occurs after twenty-four hours the operator may proceed with the dyeing process. If there is any such reaction the said dye shall not be used.

35. No person shall use or suffer or permit to be used for domestic or residential purposes or as a sleeping place any part of an establishment.

For the purpose of this Regulation all space on the floor on which an establishment is conducted shall be deemed to form part of an establishment unless it is separated therefrom by a permanent substantial wall or partition extending from floor to ceiling.

36. An operator shall not smoke while attending to a customer.

37. (1) Every customer suffering from an infectious or contagious disease (including venereal disease) or infectious skin rash shall notify the operator of the existence of such disease or rash before receiving attention from the operator.

(2) (a) Every operator, upon being so notified or without notification, if he observes or suspects the presence of any infectious skin rash in any customer, shall place all appliances intended to be used and while in use in the service of that customer on a towel moistened with a disinfecting fluid or on a stout piece of paper.

(b) All paper pads, towels, linen and appliances used in the service of such customer, as well as the coat or overall worn by the operator, shall, immediately on completion of the service, be destroyed or disinfected in the manner prescribed in these Regulations.

(c) Such operator shall then cleanse his hands by scrubbing with a nail-brush, soap and water, and immersing them in disinfecting fluid for at least three minutes before drying.

(3) No operator suffering from any infectious or contagious disease (including venereal disease), or skin rash shall attend to any customer.

38. A printed copy of these Regulations shall be conspicuously displayed in every establishment and there constantly maintained clean and legible.

39. The Council of every municipality shall superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations, and at its own cost do and provide all such acts matters and things as are necessary for that purpose.

40. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.



POISONS REGULATIONS 1956.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Poisons Act* 1928 (No. 3748) and all Acts and enactments amending the same, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria made at its meeting on the 9th November, 1955, make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Poisons Regulations 1956 and shall be read and construed as one with the Poisons Regulations 1930, the Poisons Regulations 1931, the Poisons Regulations 1932, the Poisons Regulations 1936, the Poisons Regulations 1940, the Poisons Regulations 1946, the Poisons Regulations 1949, the Poisons Regulations 1952 and the Poisons Regulations 1954, all of which Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as the Poisons Regulations.

2. After Regulation 38 of the Poisons Regulations 1930 as amended by the Poisons Regulations 1946, and the Poisons Regulations 1949 there shall be inserted the following Regulation:—

38. (c) Any person who sells a preparation containing Chlordane shall label the package or container immediately containing the same with—

(a) a statement setting out the percentage of Chlordane in the preparation:

(b) the following warning "not to be used for spraying into the air as for flies nor for spraying bedding. When used indoors apply directly with brush or swab. Avoid inhalation or contact with skin or food stuffs."

Provided that if the Chlordane contains less than 1 per cent. of Hexachlorocyclopentadiene, the package or container shall be labelled "Avoid repeated skin contact. Do not spray the preparation on food or food utensils, wash hands after use."

REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO THE OPERATION OF THE
HOUSE PURCHASERS' DEATH BENEFIT SCHEME.

UNDER the powers conferred by section 21 of *Housing Act* 1943 (No. 4996), and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and on the recommendation of the Housing Commission, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Housing (House Purchasers' Death Benefits) Regulations.

2. "Commission" means the Housing Commission.

"Committee" means the Advisory Committee constituted and appointed under the *Housing Act* 1955.

"Full benefits" means the benefits under an agreement made pursuant to clause 10 of these Regulations.

"Fund" means the House Purchasers' Death Benefit Fund.

"Purchaser" means purchaser under Part III. of the *Housing Act* 1943 or mortgagor under section 15 of the *Housing Act* 1943 and, where there is more than one such purchaser or mortgagor, means such purchaser or mortgagor as is determined by the Commission to be the purchaser for the purposes of the House Purchasers' Death Benefit Scheme.

"Scheme" means the House Purchasers' Death Benefit Scheme operated under the Housing Acts and these Regulations.

3. Any purchaser may apply to the Commission to be admitted to benefits under the scheme.

Every application shall be in writing and the applicant shall supply the following particulars whenever requested:—

- (a) Full name
- (b) Address
- (c) Age
- (d) Place of birth
- (e) Details of total income

4. The Commission may require an applicant to make a personal statement in the form in the First Schedule hereto.

5. The Commission may require any applicant who is required to submit to a medical examination to make a personal statement in the form in the Second Schedule hereto.

6. The particulars contained in such application and statement shall be the basis of the agreement between the purchaser and the Commission.

7. Every such application shall be considered by the Committee.

8. The Committee may require any purchaser to submit to a medical examination and shall require any purchaser who is over the age of fifty years at the date of his application to submit to a medical examination.

9. The Committee shall classify purchasers as lives class 1, class 2A, class 2B, class 2C, or class 3.

10. Where the last payment to the Commission under the contract of sale or mortgage between the purchaser and the Commission is payable not more than thirty years from the payment of the first instalment under the said contract or mortgage and not after the seventieth birthday of the purchaser the Commission may agree to forgo the whole of the purchase or mortgage money other than instalments in arrears and interest on such instalments owing at the death of the purchaser.

11. Where the purchaser has been classified as a life class 2A, the Commission shall require the payment of a premium at the rate of Six pence in the pound on the amount of instalments payable to the Commission under the contract of sale or mortgage in consideration of admission to full benefits under the scheme.

12. Where the purchaser has been classified as a life class 2B, the Commission shall require the payment of a premium at the rate of One shilling in the pound on the amount of instalments payable to the Commission under the contract of sale or mortgage in consideration of admission to full benefits under the scheme.

13. Where the purchaser has been classified as a life class 2C, the Commission shall require the payment of a premium at the rate of One shilling and six pence in the pound on the amount of instalments payable to the Commission under the contract of sale or mortgage in consideration of admission to full benefits under the scheme.

14. Where a purchaser is classified as a life class 3 or has refused to submit to a medical examination or to agree to pay any premium required the Commission may agree—

(a) to allow on the death of the purchaser against the outstanding balance of purchase or mortgage money a rebate equal to two-ninths of the interest paid by the purchaser from the date of the purchase or mortgage to the date of the death of the purchaser or an amount not exceeding the balance of purchase money, other than instalments in arrears or interest charged on the instalments in arrears, whichever is the less; and also

(b) where the land the subject matter of the purchase or mortgage passes on the death of the purchaser to the widow or to a dependant daughter of the purchaser, to allow quarterly until the death of the said widow or daughter or the completion of the contract or mortgage whichever first happens a rebate of an amount equal to two-ninths of the interest paid by the said widow or daughter other than interest paid on arrears which rebate shall be applied in reduction of the balance owing to the Commission under the said contract or mortgage.

15. The proportion of the interest on purchase money to be paid by the Commission into the Fund under section 7 of the *Housing Act 1955* shall be two-ninths of all interest paid by purchasers other than interest on arrears.

16. There shall be paid out of the Fund into the general fund of the Commission such amounts as are required from time to time by the Commission to meet—

(a) the interest and redemption payments under the Commonwealth and State Housing Agreement or under the Housing Acts on such part of the capital cost as had not at the date of death of the purchaser been repaid to the Commonwealth or otherwise in respect of the houses not financed under the said Agreement or received by the Commission in respect of any land in respect of which the Commission has agreed to forgo the balance of instalments;

(b) any rebate to be credited to the purchaser his widow or dependent daughter:

Provided that the amount to be paid out of the Fund under paragraph (b) shall not exceed the amount that would have been paid out of the Fund under paragraph (a) if that paragraph had applied.

17. An agreement by the Commission to forgo the whole of the balance of purchase or mortgage money owing at the death of the purchaser as provided in clause 10 shall be void and of no effect if—

(a) the purchaser commits suicide within twelve months from the date of the agreement; or

(b) the purchaser's application is false or misleading in any particular.

18. The amount of any payment to be made under these Regulations shall be equally divisible into six pences. Where the calculation of any payment discloses a sum in excess by more than three pence of an exact number of six pences, the next higher six pence shall be included in the amount of the payment.

19. Any premiums required by the Commission pursuant to these Regulations shall be payable by the purchaser to the Commission on each of the dates fixed for payment of instalments under the contract of sale or mortgage.

20. If any such premiums are not paid on the due date the purchaser shall be deemed to be in default under the contract or mortgage and the Commission shall be entitled to exercise any remedies provided by the said contract or mortgage.

21. Any premiums agreed to be paid pursuant to these Regulations shall be a debt due to the Commission.

22. Every agreement for benefits under the scheme requiring the payment of premiums shall continue until the completion or termination of the contract of sale or mortgage.

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT No. 151.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946*, hereby rescinds Regulation 14 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations and substitutes therefor the following Regulation:—

REGULATION 14.

Staffing of Primary Schools.

1. Head Teachers shall be appointed to or retained in primary schools in accordance with the following scale:—

(a) A Head Teacher of the Special Class to or in a school—

- (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 750 pupils; or
- (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 650 pupils, and is a training school, or a higher elementary school, or a consolidated school, or a central school, or a school with central or post-primary classes; or
- (iii) which has a net enrolment of at least 600 pupils, and is recommended by the Director and approved by the Tribunal as an experimental school; or
- (iv) which has a net enrolment of at least 650 pupils and which is outside the metropolitan area as defined in clause 3 of Regulation 4 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations.

(b) A Head Teacher of the First Class to or in a school—

- (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 330 pupils; or
- (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 300 pupils, and is a training school, or a higher elementary school, or a consolidated school, or a central school, or a school with central or post-primary classes.

(c) A Head Teacher of the Second Class to or in a school—

- (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 120 pupils; or
- (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 110 pupils, and is a training school.

- (d) A Head Teacher of the Third Class to or in a school—
 (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 40 pupils; or
 (ii) which is a rural training school approved by the Tribunal.
- (e) A Head Teacher of the Fourth Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of less than 40 pupils:
 Provided that, except in special circumstances approved by the Tribunal, a teacher who has served at least five years as a classified teacher after completing the course for Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate—
 (i) shall not be retained in a school with a net enrolment of less than ten pupils; and
 (ii) shall not be eligible for transfer to a school having a net enrolment of less than fifteen pupils.

2. Infant Mistresses shall be appointed to or retained in primary schools in accordance with the following scale:—

- (a) An Infant Mistress of the Special Class to or in a school—
 (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 800 pupils; or
 (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 675 pupils, and is a consolidated school, or a training school, or a central school, or a school with post-primary classes; or
 (iii) which has a net enrolment of at least 600 pupils, and is recommended by the Director and approved by the Tribunal as an experimental school.
- (b) An Infant Mistress of the First Class to or in a school—
 (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 400 pupils; or
 (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 350 pupils, and is a consolidated school, or a training school.
- (c) An Infant Mistress of the Second Class to or in a school—
 (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 155 pupils; or
 (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 110 pupils, and is a training school.

3. In an experimental school an additional Woman Assistant of the Third Class shall be substituted for an Assistant of the Fourth Class.

4. Assistant Teachers shall be appointed to or retained in primary schools in accordance with the following staffing schedule:—

Provided that—

- (a) a Man Assistant of the First Class may, with the approval of the Tribunal, be substituted for one additional assistant in a school which is classified in the Special Class;
- (b) an additional assistant shall be appointed to a higher elementary school or school with central classes, where the net enrolment of the Primary Section does not exceed 239 pupils;
- (c) a second Woman Assistant of the Second Class shall be substituted for one additional assistant in a school which has an Infant Mistress of the Special Class.

5. Student Teachers allotted to schools for training purposes shall not be included as members of the staff when the staffing schedule is being computed.

6. In any Primary School where Secondary School work is undertaken the total net enrolment of both Primary and Secondary Sections shall be reckoned in determining the classification of the Head Teacher and the Infant Mistress, but the classification of all other positions in the Primary School shall be determined on the basis of the net enrolment in the Primary Section of the school.

7. In any Primary School where Secondary School work is undertaken, the Assistant Teachers appointed to undertake the Secondary School work shall be allotted in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations made for or with respect to the allotment of staffs in Secondary Schools.

8. In a school held in buildings situated at a distance apart, and in other special cases approved by the Tribunal on the recommendation of the Director, an additional Assistant (or a Sewing Mistress) may be appointed.

9. A Sewing Mistress may be appointed to or retained in any school with a net enrolment of not less than twenty-five pupils or to any school which has no woman teacher on the staff thereof, and which has a net enrolment of not less than twelve girls.

10. A part-time Sewing Mistress may be appointed to two or more schools, each of which is in charge of a man Head Teacher and has a net enrolment of not less than ten girls: Provided that in special circumstances, a part-time Sewing Mistress may be appointed to a school when recommended by the Director and approved by the Tribunal.

11. When a new school is opened, teachers shall be allotted in accordance with the estimated net enrolment at the school.

12. In addition to the number of classified teachers provided for, 60 relieving teachers may be appointed to and employed in Primary Schools. Twelve of these positions (six for men and six for women) may be reserved for teachers classified in Class 3.

13. On the recommendation of the Director the Tribunal may approve the appointment of Teachers' Advisors in country inspectorial districts.

1. The classification and number of Assistant Teachers to be allotted to training schools shall be in accordance with the following staffing schedule:—

Provided that—

- (a) A Man Assistant of the First Class may, with the approval of the Tribunal, be substituted for one additional assistant in a school which is classified in the Special Class.
- (b) A Second Woman Assistant of the Second Class shall be substituted for one additional assistant in a school which has an Infant Mistress of the Special Class.

2. Applicants for positions as teachers in training schools shall possess such qualifications, and shall satisfy such requirements as may be prescribed from time to time by the Tribunal after consultation with the Director.

3. (a) Appointments, transfers, or promotions to positions as teachers in training schools shall be made by the Committee of Classifiers for the Primary Schools Division.

(b) In making such appointments, the Classifiers shall take into consideration the special duties and qualifications of the teachers required for the positions, and shall appoint the applicant who in their opinion is best qualified for the position, having regard to the special attainments, record, experience, and training of the applicants and their positions on the Classified Roll.

4. Where there is a special unit in a training school, such as a Rural Training School, a Country Infant Room or an Opportunity Grade, such unit shall be staffed independently. The net enrolment of such unit shall be subtracted from the total net enrolment of the school for the purpose of determining the number of assistants in the main school, but the number of positions in the respective classes of teachers above Class 4 shall be determined on the total net enrolment of the school.

5. As positions for Assistants in charge of Rural Training Schools become vacant, they shall be advertised as vacancies in Class 3 of the Primary Schools Division. The Director may, however, authorize the reclassification and advertisement of any such position at any time if the circumstances warrant it.

6. Where only part of a school is used for training purposes, such modifications in staffing may be made as the Tribunal, after consultation with the Director, shall determine.

CITY OF NUNAWADING.

By-LAW No. 34.

A By-law of the City of Nunawading made under the Local Government Acts and numbered 34 for prescribing residential areas and altering By-law No. 26 of the City of Nunawading, hereinafter called the Principal By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Nunawading order as follows:—

1. The Principal By-law shall be altered by adding immediately after clause 6 thereof the following clauses:—

6 (a) Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 3 hereof any person may in that part of the residential

area set out and described in the Ninth Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of the business of a foundry, provided that—

(a) No building shall be erected or used and no goods shall be stored or stacked within a distance of 100 feet from White Horse-road or within a distance of 150 feet from the northern boundary of the said part of the residential area.

(b) All cupolas used in connexion with any such business shall at all times be provided with the best and most efficient methods and appliances for preventing such business being carried on so as to be or become a nuisance.

6 (b) Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 3 hereof any person may in that part of the residential area set out and described in the Tenth Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of servicing and selling tractors and agricultural machinery.

6 (c) Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 3 hereof any person may in that part of the residential area set out and described in the Eleventh Schedule use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of a motor service station.

2. The following Schedules shall be added immediately after Schedule No. 8 of the Principal By-law:—

NINTH SCHEDULE.
