DAY ON WHICH A REFERENDUM ON HOTEL
TRADING HOURS SHALL BE HELD.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section three of the *Licensing Act 1955*, No. 5892, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this my Proclamation, fix Saturday, the twenty-fourth day of March, 1956, as the day on which a referendum on hotel trading hours shall be held in accordance with the requirements of the said Act.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this seventh day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-six, and in the fifth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
