AMENDING DETERMINATION OF THE CLERKS (MEAT WORKS) BOARD.

Notes:—(a) This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(b) On the 25th September, 1951, the Commercial Clerks Board was deprived of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed as clerks, in meat works where killing is done, at work connected directly with the slaughtering of animals for export as meat or with the processing of the carcasses of such animals or the products therefrom, and such power was conferred exclusively on the Clerks (Meat Works)

IN accordance with the provisions of the Labour and Industry Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed as clerks, in meat works where killing is done, at work connected directly with the slaughtering of animals for export as meat or with the processing of the carcasses of such animals or the products therefrom,"—has made the following Determination namely:—

That as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in February, 1956, the Determination made on the 10th February, 1955, and published in Government Gazette No. 155 of the 1st April, 1955, shall be amended by:—

(i) deleting clause 2 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:-
