One male improver to every three or fraction of three male workers receiving not less than 285s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

#### PROPORTION.

#### Females Improvers.

Two female improvers to every six or fraction of six female workers receiving not less than 199s. Od. per week of 40 hours.

JUVENILE WORKERS.

Two juvenile workers to every six or fraction of six female workers receiving not less than 199s. Od. per week of 40 hours.

Note.—A juvenile worker is a female person under 21 years of age (other than an apprentice or an improver) employed in bagmaking at machining, cutting, turning, folding, breaking-off, or flying.
