DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33 OF THE LABOUR AND INDUSTRY ACT 1953.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination, as amended, shall remain in force, provided that to the weekly carnings of each piece-worker shall be added the sum of 44s. in the case of males and 31s. in the case of females for each full week worked or a pro-rata amount according to the time actually worked if less than a full week is worked.
