EXTENSION OF APPLICATION OF FARKING OF VEHICLES ACTS TO CAMBERWELL MUNICIPAL DISTRICT.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 2 of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., intituled the Parking of Vehicles Act 1953, as amended by the Parking of Vehicles (Amendment) Act 1955, it is enacted that the said Acts shall apply only in respect of parking infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose by Froclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette and occurring after the date of such Proclamation, and that no such Proclamation shall be made unless the Council of any municipallity, the municipal district the Council of any municipality, the municipal district or any part of the municipal district of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of the said Acts to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the said Acts at present apply only to certain specified areas in the City of Melbourne and the City of South Melbourne:

And whereas the Council of the City of Camberwell has requested that the provisions of the said Acts be extended to apply to the municipal district of that City:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation specify for the purpose of the Parking of Vehicles Acts the area of the whole of the municipal district of the City of Camberwell.

# Police Regulation Act 1946. POLICE FORCE OF VICTORIA.

DETERMINATION No. 57 OF THE POLICE CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

THE Police Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Police Regulation Act* 1946, hereby makes the following Determination, that is to say:—

- 1. The Determination No. 1 of the Police Classification Board of the 13th November, 1946, and published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd November, 1946, is hereby amended as follows:—
  - (a) In paragraph 1 of Division I. of the said Determination by inserting in the definition "Member of the Police Force" before the word "Constable" the words "Junior Police Trainee,".
  - (b) In Division II.:-
    - (i) By inserting after paragraph 3 the following new paragraph:—
      - 4. Junior Police Trainees.

- (ii) By renumbering paragraph 4 to read 5, and inserting (a) before the word "The" where first occurring, and inserting after sub-paragraph (a) the following new sub-paragraph:—
  - "(b) The salaries prescribed in paragraph 4 of this Division shall be subject to automatic adjustment upon the basis and method for adjustment applicable to male minors appearing in any Regulation made by the Public Service Board of Victoria by virtue of the provisions of section 39 of the Public Service Act 1946."
- (c) By inserting after paragraph 5 the following new paragraph:—
  - "6. All articles which the Chief Commissioner considers should be provided to Junior Police Trainees shall be supplied as equipment."
- (d) In paragraph 10 of Division III. of the said Determination after the expression "All other Sub-Officers, First Constables, and Constables" there shall be inserted the following expression:—
  - "All Sub-Officers, First Constables, and Constables stationed at the Town Hall, Melbourne, who have qualified at the Traffic Control Training School, while performing active foot duties in the Foot Section of Branch, in addition to any existing allowance under this paragraph ... ... 2s. 6d."
- (e) In Division IV. of the said Determination by inserting after paragraph 2 the following new paragraph:—
  - "3. In each year of service after his first year, all Sub-Officers, First Constables, and Constables stationed at the Town Hall, Melbourne, who have qualified at the Traffic Control Training School, while performing active foot duties in the Foot Section of Traffic Control Branch, upon production of an account duly certified by the Officer or Sub-Officer under whom he is serving, for the purchase by him of an additional uniform and extra pair of trousers—the amount of the cost thereof but not exceeding £26. Such allowance is to be in addition to any other allowance under this Division."
- 2. The Determination No. 55 of the Police Classification Board of the 27th day of October, 1955, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 2nd November, 1955, is hereby amended as follows:—
  - (a) By inserting in paragraph 9 after sub-paragraph (2), the following new sub-paragraph:—
    - "(3) The preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to Junior Police Trainees. If a Junior Police Trainee is required to live away from home and to pay

a weekly amount for board and lodging, in excess of one-third of his weekly rate, computed by reference to his annual salary plus cost of living adjustment, the Chief Commissioner may authorize payment of an allowance equal to one-half of the excess. The allowance shall be taken to the nearest shilling, sixpence being taken to the next higher shilling and shall not be payable if the excess is less than 2s. In no case shall the weekly allowance exceed 20s."

- 3. The provisions contained in Divisions III., IV., V., VI., VII., VIII., and VIIIA of Determination No. 1, and the provisions of Determinations Nos. 10, 11, and 52 shall not apply to Junior Police Trainees.
- 4. This Determination shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1956.

#### NURSES REGULATIONS 1955 (No. 6).

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section twenty-nine of the Nurses Act 1928 (No. 3744), as amended by any Act, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Nurses Regulations 1955 (No. 6), and shall be read and construed as one with the Nurses Regulations 1941 and all Regulations amending the same.
- 2. These Regulations shall come into operation upon approval of the Governor in Council and publication in the Government Gazette.
- 3. In Regulation 21 of the Nurses Regulations 1941, as amended by any Regulations, for the words "or at such times as the Board may determine" there shall be substituted the words "on days fixed by the Board for the purpose or at such other times as the Board may determine but for the purpose of these Regulations both the First Professional Examination and the Final Examination shall be deemed to be held on the fifth day of the months named".

#### Marine Act 1928.

# AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Act 1928, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

(1) This Regulation shall form portion of "The Pilot Regulations, 1931", made by the Board on the 6th day of May, 1930, and published in the Government Gazette (No. 252) of 11th November, 1931 (hereafter referred to as the principal Regulations), and shall be read and construed as one therewith, and shall take effect on and from the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(2) 56 (a).—Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations to the contrary, the Board may, whenever it deems fit, direct any harbor pilot to perform, for such occasion or for such period as it directs, the duties of a sea pilot, provided that the Board, prior to directing any harbor pilot to undertake such duties, shall satisfy itself and shall certify accordingly, that such harbor pilot is fully qualified in all respects to perform them.

The foregoing Regulation was passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held on the 7th day of December in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five.

#### RATING BY-LAW No. 2.

The Bendigo Sewerage District.

THE Bendigo Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

The following sewerage rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Sewerage Districts Acts, and shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable sewered properties within the Bendigo Sewerage District:—

- 1. Of any land or tenements situate within the Bendigo Sewerage District, a sewerage rate of One shilling and three pence in the £1 of the net annual value of all rateable "sewered property" within the said district.
- 2. In no case shall the amount of sewerage rate payable annually be less than £4 in respect of any rateable sewered property on which there is a building, and £2 in respect of any rateable sewered property on which there is no building.
- 3. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of October, 1955, and ending with the thirtieth day of September, 1956, and shall be payable on the thirtieth day of April, 1956, at the office of the Authority, situate at the Civic Buildings, Bendigo.
- 4. If any rateable property which is unsewered at the time of the making of the aforesaid rate becomes during the said year a "sewered property," there shall be levied upon such property a proportionate part of the sewerage rate for the portion of the year after it has become a sewered property, and such property shall be deemed to have been lawfully rated accordingly.
- have been lawfully rated accordingly.

  5. For making and levying such rate the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined in the manner provided in the Sewerage Districts Acts.
- 6. Such person or persons as the Bendigo Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The resolution for passing the foregoing By-law was agreed to by the Bendigo Sewerage Authority on the 7th day of November, 1955, and was confirmed by the said Authority on the 5th day of December, 1955.

#### By-LAW No. 6.

THE Tarwin River Improvement Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the River Improvement Act 1948, doth hereby make the By-law following:-

- 1. The following rate, to be called the "Tarwin River Improvement District River Improvement Rate", is hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all properties within the Tarwin River Improvement District which are rateable to any municipality. municipality:-







DECLARATION OF THE NEW LODDON VALLEY HIGHWAY IN THE SHIRE OF KERANG.

- A By-law of the City of St. Kilda made and passed under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1928, for regulating the keeping of poultry and for other purposes.
- IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and of every other power enabling it in that behalf the Council of the City of St. Kilda, in the name of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, hereby orders as follows:-
- (1) All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

(2) This By-law shall come into force on its publication

in the Victoria Government Gazette,

- (3) This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district but shall not extend to premises (if any) registered with the Council as poultry-killing premises and/or poultry sale-yards and exempted in writing by the Council.
- (4) In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter "person" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of premises whereon poultry is kept and the owner of the poultry; "poultry" means fowls and bantams turkeys ducks and geese of either sex; "fowlhouse" and "fowl run" shall include structures and runs where any type of poultry is kept.
- (5) No person shall keep more than two turkeys or more than two ducks or more than two geese.
- (6) No person shall keep or suffer to be kept any live poultry except in a fowlhouse or similar structure erected in accordance with the provisions of this By-law and of any other By-laws of the City of St. Kilda and of the Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria to which fowlhouse or similar structure may be attached an enclosed fowl run or in multiple-storeyed compartments as permitted by this By-law.
- (7) No person shall erect or adapt any building for use as a fowlhouse or structure for keeping poultry exceeding 100 square feet in area or exceeding 8 feet in height.
- (8) No person shall have utilize or maintain any fowl run having an area (excluding the area of any fowlhouse or similar structure on the same premises) exceeding 100
- (9) No person shall keep or suffer to be kept on any premises more than twenty head of poultry. Notwithstanding the foregoing no person shall keep in any fowl-house or similar structure a number of poultry greater than the number produced by dividing the floor area in inan the number produced by dividing the floor area in square feet of such fowlhouse or similar structure by four and no person shall keep in any fowl run a number of poultry greater than the number produced by dividing the ground area in square feet of such fowl run by five: Provided that in the case of a person both keeping poultry in a fowlhouse or similar structure and maintaining a fowl run such person may keep (subject always to

the limit of twenty imposed by this clause) the aggregate number of poultry permitted in respect of both fowlhouse and fowl run.

- (10) No person shall keep any poultry in any fowl-house or similar structure or in any fowl run or in any multiple-storeyed compartments any part of which shall
  - (a) distant less than 75 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the land on which the same is erected or used has a frontage.
  - (b) distant less than 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet.
  - (c) distant less than 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land.
  - (d) distant not less than 40 feet from any dwelling (including out-buildings except detached laundries lavatories and garages) whether on the same or adjoining land.
- (11) Every fowlhouse or similar structure in which live poultry is kept shall be constructed of galvanized iron or fibro-cement sheets or such other material as might from time to time be approved by the Council with such wire netting as shall be necessary and shall be roofed with galvanized iron sheets or such other material as might from time to time be so approved and shall be paved with concrete and the surface level of the floor shall be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground.
- (12) No person shall keep any poultry in any fowlhouse or similar structure unless the same shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanized iron or jointed brickwork or concrete around the foundations thereof to a depth of at least 18 inches below ground level.
- (13) No person shall construct use or maintain any fowl run unless the same shall be securely enclosed with wire netting to the approval of the Council.
- (14) No person shall keep any poultry on any premises otherwise than in a fowlhouse or similar structure or in an enclosed fowl run erected adapted used and maintained in conformity with the provisions of this By-law or in multiple-storeyed compartments complying with the requirements of this By-law.
- (15) The occupier of any premises on which poultry is kept and the owner of such poultry shall cause the fowi-house and attached enclosed run and multiple-storeyed compartments to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.
- (16) The occupier of any such premises and the owner such poultry shall keep all poultry food therein stored in rat-proof containers.
- in rat-proof containers.

  (17) The owner and the occupier of any premises upon which a fowlhouse or similar structure or multiple-storeyed compartments is or are erected or on which a fowl run is maintained and the owner of any poultry thereon or therein shall at all reasonable times afford free access to every part of such fowlhouse or similar structure or fowl run and part of the premises wherein multiple-storeyed compartments and/or containers for poultry food are kept to officers of the Council and/or to any other person having authority on its behalf for the purpose of inspecting any such fowlhouse or similar structure or fowl run or multiple-storeyed compartments and/or the poultry therein or thereon and containers for poultry food. poultry food
- (18) No person shall keep any poultry which in the opinion of the Council or any such officer thereof or other person as aforesaid has developed diphtheria or tubercle or other contagious or infectious disease injurious to human beings or to poultry and if any such poultry is found by any such officer or other person as aforesaid upon inspection then the same may be destroyed by such officer or other person without prejudice to any other procedure against the person keeping such poultry under this By-law or otherwise and without any liability upon such officer or other person or the Council for compens sation.
- (19) Multiple-storeyed compartments may be used to house poultry provided the same shall be constructed of steel-welded arc mesh construction firmly fixed to the site or to the floor or ground to the approval and satisfaction of the Council and provided that the total floor area of all storeys shall not exceed 50 square feet and that the floor or ground area for each head of poultry that he less than 2 square feet. shall not be less than 2 square feet.
- (20) No person shall use any mobile or movable fowl-houses or similar structures or compartments and no person shall have use or maintain any fowl run on any premises where multiple-storeyed fowlhouses or compartments are used.

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(21) Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

If any such owner or occupier shall, within the time limited by such notice, fail to comply with the requirements thereof, the Council may take such measures as may be reasonably necessary to destroy such rats, ants, vermin, pests, or noxious weeds at the expense of such owner or occupier and may recover the cost thereof from such owner or occupier as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

## Preamble.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1946 and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Orbost order as follows:—

#### Definitions.

- 1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires-
- "Shire" means the Shire of Orbost.
  "Cattle" includes horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, stoets, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs,

- asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats, swine.

  "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Orbost.

  "Driver" includes any person in charge of a vehicle or in charge of a horse.

  "Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare or other place in the Town of Orbost habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicles.

  "Motor-car" means the motor-car within the meaning of section 3 of the Motor Car Act 1928.

  "Parking area" means any standing place for motorcars duly appointed by the Council under this or any other By-law.

  "Parking lines" means the lines painted on the streets or roads to indicate the position to be taken up by

- or roads to indicate the position to be taken up by a motor-car and to define the limit of parking or standing space within which a motor-car shall park
- or stand. "Street" me on stand. reet" means every highway, carriageway, road, lane, thoroughfare, other than footpath or footway.
- "Town" means the Town of Orbost.
  "Vehicle" means any conveyance of own means the rown of Orbost.

  shiele "means any conveyance drawn or propelled
  by human, animal, mechanical, electrical, or other
  power, and includes a bicycle, but not a railway
  locomotive or rail carriage.

#### Repeal.

2. Clause 4 of By-law No. 33 and the whole of By-law No. 36 is hereby repealed.

#### Parking.

- 3. A driver of any motor-car or vehicle shall not park or cause, allow, or permit a motor-car or vehicle to be parked in any of the following streets or roads or portion of streets or roads except for the sole purpose of picking up and/or setting down goods:-
  - (a) In Lind-street between Nicholson-street and Tennyson-street.
    (b) In Lawson-street between Nicholson-street and
  - Tennyson-street.
  - (c) On the north side of Ruskin-street for a distance of 90 feet easterly from the eastern alignment of Nicholson-street.
  - (d) On the east side of Nicholson-street for a distance of 60 feet southerly from the southern alignment
  - of Lawson-street.

    (e) On the east side of Nicholson-street from a point a distance of 60 feet southerly of Salisbury-street to a point a distance of 90 feet southerly from the said Salisbury-street.
  - (f) In any position prohibited as set out in clause 33 of the Road Traffic (Country Regulations) 1955 (copy of clause 33 is set out at the foot of this By-law for the information of persons consulting this By-law)

4. The method of parking in areas other than those parking areas set out in clause 5 and clause 6 hereof shall be "parallel parking" as near as practicable to the gutter or back of channel and in the direction in which a vehicle

or back of channel and in the direction in which a vehicle is proceeding when on its proper side of the road or street.

5. The method of parking in Nicholson-street between Raymond and Salisbury streets and in McLeod-street between Nicholson-street and Forest-road shall be "angle parking" at an angle of not more than 45 degrees and not less than 35 degrees to the line of the kerb or channel and in which a vehicle is proceeding when on its proper side of the road or street and in a manner so that the front left-hand or offside front wheel is within 10 inches of the kerb or back of channel or back of channel.

or back of channel.

6. The method of parking in Nicholson-street between Salisbury and Gladstone streets shall be at right angles to the line of the roadway in the central portion of the road in such a manner as not to cause obstruction to the traffic or whereby no less than 21 feet of clear roadway is left on

or whereby no less than 21 feet of clear roadway is left on both the east and west sides of the prescribed parking area.

7. A driver of a motor-car shall not cause or allow or permit a motor-car to be parked or left standing in such a manner as to extend beyond the painted lines marking the limit of parking in any parking area.

8. A driver shall not cause, allow, or permit a motor-car or a motor-car with an attached trailer caravan or similar attachment of a greater overall length of 20 feet to be parked in any of the parking areas set down in clause 5 hereof or in any parking space defined by lines painted on the roadway of a length of less than 20 feet.

9. A driver of a motor-car of the commercial or utility type used or adopted for the use in the carrying of cattle shall not park or cause, allow, or permit such motor-car to park in Nicholson-street between Raymond and Gladstone streets.

- 10. The Council may from time to time appoint such officers as it thinks proper to supervise such standing places and may remove any such officer or attendant.
- 11. Every person shall, if any motor-car or horse in his that the country of t the said officer or attendant.
- the said officer or attendant.

  12. The owner or any person apparently in control of any motor-car or vehicle left standing (whether unattended or not) in any street or road shall give information to the Shire Secretary, standing place attendant, or other authorized officer of the Council, or member of the Police Force with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control) who is or was the driver of such motor-car or vehicle which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such motor-car or vehicle so standing in contravention to this Rv-law
- 13. Any person who neglects or refuses to immediately comply with or wilfully disobeys any notice, order or request, given or made as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 14. No person not being an officer or employee of the Council or otherwise authorized by the Council shall destroy, remove, or in any other manner interfere with any notice (including any standard) or other erection supporting any such notice which has been fixed or placed by the said Council upon any street, roadway, or bullding, or other public place or upon verandah or other building.

15. No person not being officer or employee of or otherwise authorized by the Council shall fix any notice, sign, or other thing on to or in any street or footpath or erect, drive, or fix any post, spike, peg, erection, or other thing upon or into any street or footway.

16. Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law hall be light or excitation to the street and the light of the light

on the series person gulty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not less than One pound or more than Twenty pounds for the first offence and not less than Two pounds or more than Twenty pounds for the second or subsequent offences. For the information of persons consulting this By-law, clause 33 of the Road Traffic (Country) Regulations 1955 is as follows:

33. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram-car) or horse shall not permit such vehicle to remain stationary in any of the following places:—

(a) within 30 feet of an intersection;

- (a) within 30 feet of an intersection;
   (b) within 30 feet of a place on a tram route or omnibus route indicated by a sign exhibiting legible words in or to the effect of the words "Cars Stop Here," "Hall Car Here," or "Bus Stop" (as the case may be) and on the side thereof which is the nearer to approaching vehicular traffic;
   (c) within 30 feet of a traffic control signal exceed at
- (c) within 30 feet of a traffic control signal erected at a place other than at an intersection;
- (d) within 30 feet of a traffic control signal erected at
- (a) within 30 feet of a traine control signal elected at a place other than at an intersection;
  (e) between a safety zone and the adjacent footway or within 30 feet of points on the kerb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone;
  (f) within 15 feet of a pillar ball, fire hydrant, or a fire plug clearly indicated by a white diamond
- painted on the carriageway around such a fire plug with the addition of the letters F.P., or a postal pillar box erected on the kerb of any street:
- (g) in front of a right-of-way, passage, or private drive:
- (h) alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when traffic would be thereby
- (i) on any footway or street plantation:

Provided that this clause shall not apply to a fire brigade vehicle standing at or near a fire hydrant or a fire plug indicated as prescribed in sub-clause (f) of this clause or to a postal vehicle standing at or near a postal pillar box erected on the footway or kerb of any street or to a horse or horse-drawn vehicle which is standing at or near a trough or other fixed receptacle for the purpose of watering such horse, or to a bicycle standing in a bicycle rack erected by the Council of any Municipality.
