EXTENSION OF APPLICATION OF PARKING OF
VEHICLES ACTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 2 of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., intituled the *Parking of Vehicles Act 1955*, as amended by the *Parking of Vehicles (Amendment) Act 1955*, it is enacted that the said Acts shall apply only in respect of parking infringements occurring in any area or circumstances specified for the purpose by proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, and occurring after the date of such proclamation, and that no such proclamation shall be made unless the council of any municipality the municipal district, or any part of the municipal district, of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of the said Acts to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Councils of the Cities of Nunawading, Heidelberg and Brunswick have requested that the provisions of the said Acts be extended to apply to the municipal districts of those municipalities:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do, by this, my Proclamation, specify the areas of the whole of the municipal districts of the Cities of Nunawading, Heidelberg and Brunswick for the purposes of the *Parking of Vehicles Acts*.

PROCLAMATION

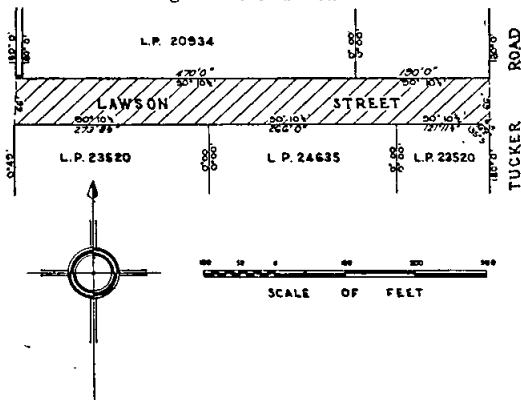
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any

municipality, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And, whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land, reserved for a street, being part of Dendy's Crown Special Survey, Parish of Moorabbin, and being the land indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

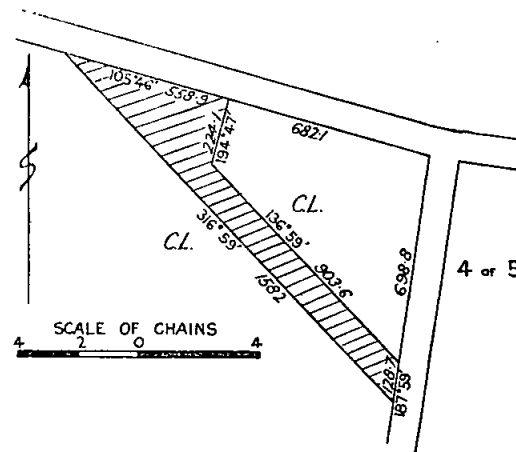

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.
REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928* the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 21st February, 1951, approved by the Governor in Council on the 16th March, 1951, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th May, 1951, and any amendment thereto are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations."

2. Regulation 37 of the Principal Regulations is amended by repealing sub-regulation (2) and substituting therefor the following sub-regulation (2):—

"(2). A mechanically powered vessel having a draft of less than seven feet of water shall not be navigated in the port—

(a) In any manner whatsoever dangerous to any persons swimming or bathing in any waters in the vicinity of the vessel, or,

(b) At a rate of speed such that the vessel shall by its wash endanger the safety of any person boat or structure in the port, or,

(c) At a higher speed than:—

(i) Five nautical miles per hour over the ground in any waters lying within a distance of 300 yards from the low water mark on the nearest foreshore;

(ii) Except with the consent of the Commissioners, ten nautical miles per hour over the ground in any other waters within the port."
