AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

.3y His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTS.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the Local Government Act 1946 provides—inter alia—that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Councils of the Shires of Dandenong and Stawell have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal districts of such municipalities: And whereas the operation of the said Regulations was extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Portland by Orders in Council published in the Government Gazettes of the 9th November 1949, the 11th August 1954, and the 27th October 1954; and the Council of the Shire of Portland has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to a furtherpart of the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria. by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1946 to the municipal districts of the Shires of Dandenong and Stawell, and to that part of the municipal district of the Shire of Portland described hereunder:—

Commencing at a point on the shore line of Port Phillip Bay in line with the western boundary of Crown allotment 11, Parish of Bolwarra, thence northerly across a road reserve to the south-western angle of that allotment, thence northerly along the western boundary of that allotment to its north-western angle, thence north-westerly across a road reserve to the southern-most angle of a surveyed area of 153 acres 1 rood 8 perches in section 20, thence north-westerly along a road reserve forming the western boundary of the said surveyed area to a point in line with the northern boundary of Crown allotment B section 16, thence westerly across the said road reserve and section 20 to the north-eastern angle of the said Crown allotment B, thence westerly along the northern boundaries of Crown allotments B, A and F section 16, across a main road reserve and along the northern boundary of Crown allotment 3 section 12 to a point distant 2,000 links from the north-eastern angle of the said allotment, thence southerly along a line parallel to the eastern boundary of the said main road reserve across Crown allotments 3 and 3A section 12, a road reserve and Crown allotment 1 section 13, thence southerly across a road reserve to a point on the northern boundary of Crown the north-eastern angle of such allotment, thence westerly

and southerly along the northern and western boundaries of such allotment to the north-western angle of Crown allotment B of the said section, thence southerly along the western boundaries of Crown allotments B and A section 13, across a road reserve southerny atong the western boundaries of Crown allotments B and A section 13, across a road reserve and along the western boundaries of Crown allotments C and B section 14 to the south-western angle of the latter allotment, thence westerly along the southern boundary of Crown allotment D section 2, across a road reserve and along the southern boundaries of Crown allotments B2 and B1 section 3, thence westerly along the southern boundary of Crown allotment 4 section 1 Parish of Gorae, and by the continuation of such boundary across the Portland and Hamilton Railway Reserve to a point on the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 19 section 1, Parish of Gorae, thence northerly along the said eastern boundary to the north-eastern angle of the said allotment, thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the said allotment to its north-eastern boundary of the said allotment to its north-eastern boundary of the State Forest across Crown allotments 11 and 14 of the said section, a road reserve and Crown allotments 15 and 17 of the said section to the north-western angle of Crown allotment 3a section 11, thence southerly along the western boundary of the said allotment, across a road reserve and along the western boundaries of Crown allotment 4 and a Quarry reserve to the south-western angle of such reserve, thence south-easterly to a point on the southern boundary of Crown allotment 7 section 11 distant 1,336 links from the eastern-most angle of the said allotment, thence south-casterly across a main road reserve to a point on the northern boundary of Crown allotment 32 section 9 distant 1,432 links from the northern-most angle of the said allotment, thence by a line bearing 110 deg. 30 min. for 1,435 links to a point on the western boundary of Crown allotment 82 section 1, thence southerly along the western boundaries of Crown allotments 82 and 83 section 1 and Crown allotment 1 section 2 to the south-eystern angle of the latter allotment, thence southerly across a road reserve to the north-western angle of Crown allotment 6 section 2, thence southerly and easterly along the western and of the said allotment to its north-eastern angle, thence southerly and easterly along the western and southern boundaries of Crown allotment 8 section 10 to its south-eastern angle, thence southerly along the western boundary of Crown allotment 3 section 11, across a road reserve and along the western boundaries of Crown allotments 6, 7 and 9 section 11 to the south-western angle of the latter allotment, thence southerly across a road reserve, Crown allotment 2 section 12 and a foreshore reserve to a point on the shore line of the Southern Ocean in line with the western boundary of Crown allotment 9 section 11, thence generally easterly along the shore line of the Southern Ocean in line with the western boundary of Crown allotment 9 section 11, thence generally easterly along the And doth order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned municipal districts of the Shires of Dandenong and Stawell and in the above-described part of the municipal district of the Shire of Portland on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 8th August 1956, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Councils of the said municipalities to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided further that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 8th August 1956.



By-LAW No. 1.

Standing Orders for Regulating and Appointing the Place and Hour of Meetings of the Hernes Oak Waterworks Trust, and Providing for the Management and Conduct of Business Thereat.

THE Hernes Oak Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for its Waterworks District:

- 1. In all cases not provided for by the Acts of Parliament of Victoria relating to authorities, or by this By-law, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.
- the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

 2. Place and Hour of Meetings.—Meetings of the Trust shall be held periodically on the first Friday after the third Thursday in January, April, July, and October, commencing at 8 o'clock p.m. at the Town Hall, Morwell. Upon notice of motion the time, day, and hour of the meeting may be altered by a majority of the Commissioners. A notice of every regular meeting of the Commissioners shall be, by the Trust Secretary, delivered or sent by post, addressed to the usual address of the Commissioner, three clear days at least prior to the day on which such intended meeting is to be held.

 3. Meeting Resolutions at Not to be Revoked—No.
- 3. Meeting, Resolutions at, Not to be Revoked.—No resolution at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given by the Trust Secretary to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of at least two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting (if the number of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to), or by majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

 A Business & C. Order of Minutes and the energy meeting.
- 4. Business, &c., Order of Minutes.—At every meeting of the Commissioners the first business thereof shall be reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and nondiscussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Commissioners at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required by any Commissioner present at such meeting.
- 5. After the signing of the minutes by the Chairman, the order of the business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the Commissioners at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—
 - Reading of copies of letters sent by the authorities of the Commissioners, if called for.
 - (2) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
 - (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials. (4) Receiving deputations from the ratepayers.
 - (5) Presentation of reports of committees and officers.
 - (6) Payments.
 - (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the Chairman may think desirable.
 - (8) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
 - (9) Notices of motion and the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.
- 6. Titles, Official.-The Commissioners, in meeting, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Chairman or Commissioner, as the case may require.
- 7. Who to Speak.-If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.
- 8. Chairman to Rise Whilst Addressing Meeting.—The Chairman shall rise in addressing the Commissioners to discuss any question, and shall not leave the Chair on such occasions.
- 9. Commissioners Not to Speak Twice on the Same Question.—No Commissioner shall speak twice on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in the explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
- 10. Points of Order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule or practice which he deems applicable to

the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

- 11. Commissioners Not to Digress or Impute Improper Motives.—No Commissioner shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, nor impute improper motives, and all personal reflections on Commissioners shall be deemed disorderly, and every Commissioner so doing shall, upon being called to order by the Chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw such imputations or reflections, as the case may be.
- 12. A Commissioner called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.
- 13. Persons Not Commissioners to Leave When Requested.—No person not being a Commissioner who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Commissioners, shall be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when requested by the Chairman to do so.
- 14. Call of the Commissioners.—No Commissioner shall absent himself from any meeting held in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Commissioners without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.
- 15. Documents to be Produced.—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.
- of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

 16. Motions, Amendments, and Notice Thereof.—All notices of motion shall be in writing, dated, and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Trust Secretary at the close of the meeting of the Commissioners, or if not given at the meeting then seven days prior to the day which the next meeting of the Commissioners is to take place, and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book, in the order in which they may be received.
- 17. No Motion Without Notice.—No Commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, except in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.
- 18. Motions on Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners after that at which it has been presented.
- 19. Motions to be Moved in Order.—Except by leave of the Commissioners motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Trust Secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.
- 20. Motions Not to be Proceeded with in the Absence of the Mover.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner who gave the notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.
- 21. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.
- 22. Mover of Motion or Amendment Not to be Interrupted.—Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question or order disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.
- 23. Nature of Motion to be Stated.—Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Commissioners thereon.
- 24. Leave to be Obtained Before Motion Withdrawn.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Commissioners.
- 25. Motions to be Seconded Prior to Discussion.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Commissioners unless it be seconded; but a Commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of amy standing order of the Commissioners by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.
- 26. Mover and Not the Seconder Held to Have Spoken.

 —A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Commissioner merely seconding shall not be held to have spoken upon it.
- 27. Motion to be in Writing.—At every meeting of the Commissioners, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced to writing signed by the mover, and be delivered to the Chalrman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

- 28. Amendments.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
- 29. Amendments to Become the Question.—If an amendment be carried, the amendment shall become itself the question, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question may be moved.
- 30. Second Amendment May be Moved.—If an amendment be negative, then a second may be moved to the question, to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Commissioners for discussion at a time.
- 31. Right of Mover to Reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair, but no Commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.
- 32. Adjournment Motion.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Commissioners, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion of adjournment be made.
- 33. Protest, Commissioners May.—Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Commissioners, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reason for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners by the protesting Commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Trust Secretary's Office, and signed by such Commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Commissioners.
- 34. Lapsed Questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.
- 35. Order of the Day to be Restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of numbers as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such 'ebate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
- 36. Voting.—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner, the Commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and all those voting in the negative shall then hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the Chairman. The Chairman shall have a deliberate vote, and in case of an equal division he shall have a casting vote, and every Commissioner present shall vote except he be disabled by law from doing so.
- 37. Questions to be Put.—The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Commissioners, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.
- 38. Contents of Petitions.—It shall be incumbent on every Commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Commissioners, and that the contents do not violate any By-law or any provision thereof.
- 39. Name at Beginning of Petition.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall write his name at the beginning thereof.
- 40. Petition to be in Writing.—Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioner at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every sheet on which it is written.
- 41. How Signed.—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.
- 42. No Letters, &c., to be Attached.—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

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43. Presentation of Petitions.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

44. Deputations.—Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Commissioners in support of any petition, or otherwise, must send in an application in writing, to the Trust Secretary, at least three clear days before the meeting of the Commissioners at which such petition is intended to be presented.

45. Cheques to be Signed.—All cheques shall be signed by two Commissioners, countersigned by the Secretary.

46. Appointment to Permanent Office.—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Commissioners shall take place until seven clear days' public notices shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the District of the Trust, inviting applications from qualified candidates for same.

47. Salaries to be Fixed.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Commissioners shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.

48. Commissioners, &c., Not to be Surety.—No Commissioner or officer of the Commissioners, and no assessor or auditor, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Commissioners, or for any work to be done for the Commissioners.

49. Contracts.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expenses of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

50. Plans, &c.—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Commissioner during that time, except in cases of emergency.

51. Secretary to Expend Moneys.—It shall be lawful for bl. Secretary to Expend Moneys.—It shall be lawful for the Secretary from time to time, on the written order of the Chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Commissioners for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between two ordinary meetings of the Commissioners the sum of Ten pounds.

52. Addresses to the Governor, &c.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Trust Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners.

53. Suspension of Regulations.—Any one or more of the rules and provisions herein contained may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice being given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

54. Penalty.—Every person who shall so offend against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

55. Common Seal.-The common seal of the Trust shall be kept in a locked box, of which the key shall be kept by the Trust Secretary, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any documents unless the Chairman of the Trust and the Secretary, or in the absence of the Chairman, unless two Commissioners and the Secretary, by present

WHEREAS by Section 151 of the Administration and Probate Act 1928 (No. 3632) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Rules and prescribe forms for carrying into effect the provisions of the Administration and Probate (Estates) Acts; Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Rules, that is to say:—

Rule 1.—These Rules may be cited as the Probate Duties Rules 1956 and shall come into operation upon the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

Rule 2.—The Probate Duties Rules 1952 published in the Government Gazette on the 5th March, 1952, and as amended in the Government Gazette on the 2nd April, 1952, and as further amended in the Government Gazette on the 25th June, 1952, are hereby repealed provided that notwithstanding such repeal such Rules with the exception of Rule 10 shall continue to apply and have full force and effect with respect of persons dying before the 30th day of November, 1955, and the provisions of the Probate Duties Rules 1956 other than this Rule and Rule 9 of these Rules shall not apply with respect of such estates, and provided further that the Rules made under the Administration and Probate Act 1928 and published in the Government Gazette of 22nd day of July, 1931, with the exception of Rule 16 of such Rules shall apply in respect of estates of persons who died before the 1st day of November, 1951.

FILING OF STATEMENTS.

Rule 3.—The time referred to in Section 152 of the Administration and Probate Act 1928 as "the prescribed time", shall be three months from date of death of the deceased.

Rule 4.—The statement required by Section 152 of the said Act shall be in the form contained in the First Schedule hereto, and every such statement, with attested copy of will annexed, shall be verified by the affidavit or statutory declaration of the person by the said section required to file the same, and if there shall be more than one such person, then of every such person. Such affidavit or statutory declaration shall be in the form in First Schedule hereto, and shall contain the particulars set out therein.

Rule 5.—Every such statement shall specify some address or place in Victoria to which notices, addressed to the person by whom or on whose behalf the same is filed, may be posted, and every such address or place shall be deemed to be the last-known place of abode or business of such person.

Rule 6.—The Commissioner on determining the duty payable on the final balance of an estate under the Administration and Probate (Estates) Acts shall send a notice in the form of the Second Schedule hereto and addressed to the person liable to pay such duty or to his proctor or agent named in the statement filed and the duty thereby shown to be payable shall be paid within 30 days of the receipt of such notice.

Rule 7.—Every such notice may be served either personally on the person to whom the same is addressed or by sending it through the post addressed to him at the address for the service of notices shown in the statement filed. If there be more than one person liable to pay the duty then the notice may be served on or addressed to any one of such persons or his proctor or agent.

GENERAL.

Rule 8.—No notice mentioned or referred to in any of these Rules shall be held to be a substitute for or to dispense with the necessity of any notice of motion required by the said Acts, or by the ordinary practice of the Supreme Court.

FEES.

Rule 9.—The fees payable under the provisions of Section 156 of the said Act shall be as follows:—

- (a) For every inspection of (including the taking of copies or extracts from) a filed statement—for each hour or part of an hour occupied—2s. 6d.
- (b) For every certificate of the final balance and of the duty payable and of assets and debts and for every certificate that a copy of or an extract from a statement is a true copy or extract— 10s.
- (c) For preparing any such certificate, copy of statement or extract referred to in (b)—10s. plus 2s. per folio in addition to the fee provided in (b).
- (d) For production of each statement in Court, or before persons judicially-£1.







REGULATIONS.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Weights and Measures Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

The Weights and Measures Regulations 1952 as amended are hereby further amended as follows:—

- 1. In Regulation 2, the expression-
- "(v) Farm Milk Tanks 68A"
- is hereby inserted after the expression-

.. 66-68 ''.

- "(iv) Dry Measures
- 2. In paragraph (a) of Regulation 3, the following expression is hereby inserted between the definitions of "Fabric-measuring instrument" and "Firewood":—
 - "'Farm milk tank' means a measure having a capacity of not less than fifty gallons, for measuring milk or other liquid milk product, provided with a suitable graduated scale by reference to which the quantity of liquid in such tank can be determined."
- 3. In paragraph (a) of Regulation 3, the expression "a farm milk tank or" is hereby inserted in the definition of "Liquid measure" between the expressions "include" and "an apothecaries measure".
- 4. The expression "farm milk tanks and" is hereby inserted in sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (a) of Regulation 14, between the expressions "Provided that" and "apothecaries glass measures".
- 5. The following expression is hereby inserted between Regulation 68 and the expression "Part VIII.—FABRIC-MEASURING INSTRUMENTS":—

"(v) Farm Milk Tanks.

- 68A. (a) No farm milk tank which is not of an approved pattern shall be verified.
- (b) Every farm milk tank shall have the maker's name and serial number legibly and prominently stamped on it.
- . (c) The graduated scale provided for use with any farm milk tank shall be legibly stamped on—
 - (i) a metal dip-stick having a dull finish, designed to be read at the point where the surface of the liquid intersects such dip-stick;
 - (ii) a metal surface gauge rod, designed to be read by reference to a fixed indicator when the end of such gauge rod is brought into contact with the surface of the liquid from above.
- (d) Every such dip-stick or surface gauge rod shall be legibly stamped with the maker's name and with the serial number corresponding with the serial number of the farm milk tank with which such dip-stick or surface gauge rod is to be used.
- (e) Suitable means shall be provided on every farm milk tank to ensure that—
 - (i) every such dip-stick or surface gauge rod when in use is suitably supported or otherwise held in position, so that a definite reading is readily obtained; and
 - (ii) it can readily be ascertained whether such farm milk tank is in a level position, in relation to a suitable indicating device permanently attached thereto.
- (f) Suitable means shall be provided to enable an inspector readily to stamp with a mark of verification every farm milk tank and the dip-stick or surface gauge rod to be used therewith.

- (g) Every farm milk tank shall be-
 - (i) of such strength and construction as not to be liable to become distorted during transport, erection, or use;
 - (ii) provided with a discharge valve through which such tank may be effectively emptied when such tank is level; and
 - (iii) permanently fixed in the position of use unless-
 - (1) of symmetrical form, approved for such purpose, when viewed in plan; and
 - (2) having the dip-stick or surface gauge rod mounted centrally in such farm milk tank, when in the position in which readings are to be taken.

Provided that a farm milk tank need not be permanently fixed in the position of use if provided with approved means of adjustment of level.

- (h) The dip-stick or surface gauge rod of any farm milk tank may be graduated in terms of either—
 - (i) gallons; or
 - (ii) if such instrument is prominently stamped 'FOR USE IN MEASURING COWS' MILK ONLY', pounds, in which case one gallon of milk shall be deemed to weigh 10.32 pounds.
- (i) The interval between any two adjacent graduations on any dip-stick or surface gauge rod shall not be less than one-sixteenth of one inch and shall correspond with maximum quantities of liquid in accordance with the following Table:—

 - (ii) such tank shall-
 - (1) have its interior surfaces thoroughly wetted with water; and
 - (2) have such water removed through the discharge valve of such tank, followed by drainage of the tank for thirty seconds after the continuous flow of water has ceased, before testing of such tank by transferring water into it is commenced.

Printed forms of tender and the conditions of contract may, in all cases, be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the service may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is satisfactory and the prices tendered are considered reasonable.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted. In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the tender will be declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope; and having the words "Tender for at " (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Office, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, or if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best conditions, and in conformity with the Health Acts, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
- 2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the Schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor any of the articles specified in the Schedule in the event of emergency due to the war.

- 3. Supplies for country districts for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

 4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of 10 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; the Mont Park District will include the Mental Hospitals, Janefield Colony, the Sanatorium, Gresswell, and Pleasant View, Preston; the Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Geelong and Sunbury Districts will include Mental Hospitals, Penal Institutions and Teachers' Hostels at any of those places. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the Schedules, or as directed by the officer ordering the supply.
- 5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the rate tendered, except butter boxes and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for; the empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.
- 6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

- 7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him, and shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
- 8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, who shall render his account as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.
- 9. Where railway facilities are available, the contractor shall use the Railways for the transport of the goods. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, except for Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in the triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignees and the quintuplicate retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.
- 10. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered at the time mentioned in the order or within such other time as the officer ordering the supply may specify for delivery, it will be competent for such officer, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions
- 12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.
- 13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.
- 14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations or stores are due or by the contractor in waiting for a Board to survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are, obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.
- 15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.
- 16. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will

- have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being, such appeal to be made in writing within 24 hours of the rejection; but, pending such appeal, he must at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required, or any like supplies suitable for the Service, may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged as in clause 10.
- 17. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary.
- 18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.
- 19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.
- 20. It will be competent for the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.
- 21. The contract entered into under these conditions is not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.
- 22. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the Customs Act 1901-36, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last known place of business or abode.
- 23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.
- 24. For the purposes of these contracts the word "Government" shall mean the Government of the State of Victoria; and the word "Treasurer" shall mean the Treasurer of the said State.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and of any other power enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Marong, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):

- 1. By-law Nos. 17 and 19 so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
- 2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 3. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the following areas in the Shire of Marong, except to premises registered as a poultry-killing premises and poultry sale-yards when so exempt in writing by the Council:—
 - (a) The whole of the Township of Raywood.
 - (b) That portion of the Township of Bridgewater comprising sections 1 to 20 inclusive and 22.
 - That portion of the Township of Marong comprising sections 1 to 7, Crown allotments A6, 1, 1A, 1c, 3p, 3e, Z, 10, 11, and part 9, and the area bounded by High-street, Adams-street, Bullock Creek, and the railway line.

 - (d) The whole of the Township of Kangaroo Flat.

 (e) That portion of the Farish of Sandhurst comprising Crown allotments 16, 16a, 16a, 16a, 16c, 34a, 34b, 34c, 34b, 34k, 88, 88e, 88a, 88b, 88c, 88d, and 89, all in section 18.
 - (f) All that portion of the Parish of Mandurang bounded on the north by Wesley-street; thence by a line south along the Calder Highway to the south-west corner of allotment 1, section D; thence east along the southern boundary of the said allotment to the Melbourne-Bendigo railway line; thence south along the said railway line to the north-east corner of allotment. railway line; thence south along the said railway line to the north-east corner of allotment 71, section D; thence south-westerly and westerly by a road to its junction with the Calder Highway; thence north to Furness-street; thence west along that street to the south-east corner of allotment 75a, section D; thence north along road to its junction with the Crusoe-road at the north-west corner of allotment 93a, section D; thence north-west along Crusoe-road to the north-east corner of allotment 59, section E; thence west along road to the continuation of Morrison-street; thence north-east along Morrison-street; thence north-east along Morrison-street as far as the south-eastern corner of allotment 37, section E; thence west along Queen-street to the south-west corner of allotment 34c, section E; thence north along the western boundary of the said allotment to Wesley-street.
- 4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, "poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks, and geese; "person" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of such premises; "approved materials" means materials approved by the Council of the Shire of Marong; "adult poultry" means poultry four and a half months old or older.
- 5. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept any adult live poultry except in a fowl-house or similar structure.
- 6. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept in any fowl-6. No person shall keep of shall to be kept in any low-house or similar structure a number of poultry greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such fowl-house or similar structure by four in cases where less than one hundred birds are kept, and by three in cases where one hundred or more birds are

- 7. Every fowl-house or similar structure on any premises shall be—
 - (a) Distant at least 40 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage.
 - (b) Distant at least 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet.
 - (c) Distant at least 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width of 25 feet.
 - (d) Distant at least 5 feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land.
 - (e) Distant at least 40 feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land.
- 8. Every fowl-house or similar structure in which poultry is kept shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved material, and the surface level of the floor shall be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground.
- 9. Every fowl-house or similar structure shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanized iron, jointed brick-work, or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least 18 inches below ground level, or to solid rock, and all walls shall be constructed of approved rat-proof material.
- 10. The occupier of any premises on which poultry is kept shall cause the fowl-house and attached enclosed run to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition. Where chickens are kept on open range, not more than 700 chickens shall be run per acre.
- 11. All poultry food shall be stored in rat-proof containers, sheds, or silos.
- 12. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.
