DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33 OF THE LABOUR AND INDUSTRY ACT 1953.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force, provided that to the weekly earnings of each pieceworker the sum of 21s. shall be added, provided that where less than 40 hours are worked in any week a proportionate amount shall be added in lieu of such sum.
