Statute Law Revision Committee Act 1948.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING TRAVELLING EXPENSES FOR MEMBERS OF THE STATUTE LAW REVISION COMMITTEE.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Statute Law Revision Committee Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the 16th day of September, 1952, and make the following Regulations:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Statute Law Revision Committee (Travelling Expenses) Regulations.
- 2. In addition to the attendance fees payable under the Statute Law Revision Committee Act 1948 every member of the Statue Law Revision Committee shall be entitled to receive for expenses incurred by him when travelling, whenever such expenses have been necessarily incurred by him in the performance of his duties as a member of such Committee, the following sums:—
 - (i) If he is resident in the metropolitan area and is required to perform such duties within Victoria, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings for each full day and a proportionate sum for each part of a day during which he is absent from the metropolitan area;
 - (ii) if he is not resident in the metropolitan area and is required to perform such duties within Victoria, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings for each full day and a proportionate sum for each part of a day during which he is absent from his place of residence;
 - (iii) if he is required to perform such duties outside Victoria, the sum of Four pounds for each full day and a proportionate sum for each part of a day during which he is absent from his place of residence:

Provided that no member shall be entitled to receive any such sum in respect of any day on which the House of which he is a member is sitting unless such duties are performed outside the metropolitan area; and provided further that no member shall be entitled to receive any such sum in respect of any day in respect of which he receives any other sum by way of travelling expenses out of Consolidated Revenue.

- 3. In these Regulations "metropolitan area" means the area lying within a radius of 20 miles from the post office at the corner of Elizabeth and Bourke streets, Melbourne.
- \cdot 4. These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of June, 1956.

1st year—at the rate of 72s. 0d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 101s. 0d. per week.

5th year—at the rate of 252s. 6d. per week."

AMENDMENT OF FIBROUS PLASTERING TRADE APPRENTICESHIP REGULATIONS.

 - "10. (1) The salary of each member of the Workers Compensation Board (other than the Chairman) shall be the sum of Two thousand two hundred pounds per annum.
 - (2) The remuneration of the deputy of each member of the Workers Compensation Board (other than the Chairman) while acting shall be at the rate of Two thousand two hundred pounds per annum."

REGULATIONS-AMENDMENT No. 13.

IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Police Regulation Acts, doth hereby further amend the Police Regulations 1951 as follows (that is to say):-

- 1. Sub-clause (1) of clause 3 of Chapter 1 of the said Regulations is hereby amended by inserting after the definition of "Chief Commissioner" the following:-
 - "' Junior Police Trainee' means a member of the Force appointed pursuant to section 2 of the Police Regulation (Junior Trainees) Act 1955 and who has not been appointed as a Constable."
- 2. Chapter 2 of the said Regulations is hereby amended as follows:-
 - (a) At the end of clause 1 there shall be added the expression-
 - "Other ranks
 - (i) Junior Police Trainees"

- (b) At the end of clause 2 there shall be added the following proviso:—
 - "Provided that Junior Police Trainees will be of equal seniority irrespective of date of appointment as a Junior Police Trainee."
- (c) At the end of clause 3 there shall be added the following sub-clause:—
 - "3. (2) The seniority of Constables shall be determined by the date on which they received their register numbers and where two or more constables receive register numbers on the same date, according to the seniority allotted on that date by the Chief Commissioner having regard to general efficiency including the passing of prescribed examinations."
- 3. At the end of clause 57 of Chapter 4 of the said Regulations there shall be added the following heading and clauses:—
 - "Junior Police Trainees.
 - 58. A Junior Police Trainee shall conduct himself in such a manner as to uphold the dignity of the Force.
 - 59. He will be directly under command of the Officer in Charge of the Police Depot. Whilst attending any branch, district, division or station, he will obey all lawful orders given by a senior member of the Force without demur. Where he is in doubt as to the legality of an order he shall first refer it to the Officer in Charge of the Police Depot.
 - 60. The instructions relating to Constables shall, so far as applicable, apply to Junior Police Trainees."
- 4. Chapter 5 of the said Regulations is hereby amended as follows:—
 - (a) In clause 4 after the word "Force" where first occurring there shall be added the following words:—
 - ", other than a candidate for appointment as a Junior Police Trainee,"
 - (b) At the end of clause 4 there shall be added the following
 - "4. (2) Every candidate for appointment as a Junior Police Trainee—
 - (a) shall have attained his sixteenth birthday and at the time of his appointment as a Junior Police Trainee shall not be older than eighteen years and nine months;
 - (b) shall satisfy the Government Medical Officer that he has attained or will attain the physical standards required for a Constable on attaining his nineteenth birthday."
 - (c) In clause 5 after the word "Candidate", there shall be inserted the words—
 - ", other than a candidate for appointment as a Junior Police Trainee."
 - (d) In clause 11 after the word "registered" there shall be inserted the following words:—"for appointment as Constables or Junior Police Trainees".
 - (e) In clause 17 for the words "to the Force" there shall be substituted the words "as a Constable".
- 5. At the end of clause 1 of Chapter 8 of the said Regulations there shall be added the following expression:—
 - "Junior Police Trainees.
 - 1 Police Manual (Regulations, Determinations and Standing Orders)
 - 1 Pocket Directory ".
- 6. In clause 2 of Chapter 9 of the said Regulations for the words "and Constables" there shall be substituted the words "Constables and Junior Police Trainees".

AGRICULTURAL COLLEGES ACT 1944.

REGULATIONS.

N pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Agricultural Colleges Act 1944, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

PART I.—Types of Courses which may be Conducted at State Agricultural Colleges.

1. (1) Diploma of Agriculture Course.—The diploma course will extend over six terms or three years. Each term will extend over a period of about five months, the winter term beginning about the first week of March and ending about the last week of July, and the summer term beginning about the first week of September and ending about the last week of January.

-- Provided that, subject to Regulation 3 hereunder, certain students may be conceded the first two terms of the diploma course.

Provided also that the Principal may vary the normal vacation periods for certain students to enable such students to be rostered for practical farm work during part of the normal vacation periods.

(a) Curriculum of the Diploma of Agriculture Course.

(b) Examinations.

Progress examinations will be held when convenient and an examination will be held at the end of each term in each subject. The results of these examinations may be taken into consideration in connexion with final examinations.

A student fulfilling the conditions laid down for a pass in the subjects of his year may proceed with the work of the next year.

Only in exceptional circumstances will a student be allowed to proceed to the work of the second or third year without passing completely in the previous year.

Practical work marks will be awarded on the ordinary practical work of each student during the term.

Supplementary examinations may be granted at the discretion of the Principal, provided that in any one term a student shall not be permitted to sit for supplementary examinations in more than three subjects.

For the purpose of this regulation, the groups of subjects known respectively as Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Farm Practice and Crafts shall each be considered to be one subject, but at any supplementary examination, the student shall be re-examined only in those parts of the subject in which he obtained less than the required standard.

Practical Farm Work-70 per cent.

Examinations-

Group A.—50 per cent. in each of the three subjects; at least 33 per cent. in each component subject.

Groups B. and C.-

- (i) In each group 50 per cent. in all but one subject in which at least 33 per cent. must be obtained;
- (ii) An average of 50 per cent. in all subjects of both groups.

This standard must be reached both in the aggregate marks of the first and second term examinations, and also in the second term examinations.

(d) Second Year Certificate.

If, for any reason, a student who has passed at the second year standard is unable to complete the third year, he may be awarded a Certificate.

(e) Diploma.

The College Diploma will be awarded to each student who passes the third year examination. Diploma holders from each State Agricultural College are entitled to use the following designations after their names:—

D.D.A. (Dookie Diploma of Agriculture). L.D.A. (Longerenong Diploma of Agriculture).

(f) Honours Standard.

A student who, in addition to complying with the pass standard, secures in the examinations of the final year an average mark in all subjects of at least 82 per cent. will be awarded the College Diploma with First Class Honours. A student who obtains in the examinations of the final year an average mark in all subjects of at least 70 per cent., but less than 82 per cent. will be awarded the College Diploma with Second Class Honours.

(2) Second Year of the Course for the Degree of Bachelor of Agricultural Science.—This course will extend over two terms of one year. Each term will extend over a period of about five months, the winter term beginning about the first week of March and ending about the last week of July and the summer term beginning about the first week in September and ending about the last week of January.

The curriculum will be as prescribed from time to time by the University of Melbourne for the second year of the course for the degree of Bachelor of Agricultural Science, provided that any amendments to the curriculum which may affect the administration of the State Agricultural Colleges must first be approved by the Minister of Agriculture.

(3) Other Courses.—Such short intensive schools of instruction as are approved from time to time by the Minister of Agriculture.

PART II.—CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION OF STUDENTS TO STATE AGRICULTURAL COLLEGES.

2. Conditions for admission to the College Diploma course described in Regulation 1 (1):

Persons eligible for admission to the College Diploma course are boys who have—

- attained the age of fifteen years on the date of commencement of the College Year in the year in which they are admitted,
- (2) agreed to observe the Regulations and the College rules,
- (3) had the prescribed fees and charges paid on their behalf at the time of admission,
- (4) passed the Intermediate Technical Certificate (Diploma Entrance) of the Victorian Department of Education or the School Intermediate Certificate of the University of Melbourne, including a pass in each of the subjects of General Science and Mathematics,
- (5) had satisfactory testimonials of character submitted to the Superintendent of Agricultural Education by their last teachers or employers,
- (6) produced a certificate from a registered medical practitioner that they are in good health and physically fit for the work of the College, and
- (7) produced a dentist's certificate that they are not likely to require dental treatment for at least six months.

Provided, however, that, before being admitted, applicants for admission to the College Diploma course may be required to submit themselves for examination at the Intermediate Certificate standard.

- 3. Conditions for admission direct to the Second Year of the College Diploma course.—If a boy complies with the conditions for entrance described in sub-regulations (2), (3), (5), (6) and (7) of Regulation 2 of these Regulations he may be admitted direct to the Second Year of the College Diploma course if he has—
 - attained, the age of seventeen years on the date of commencement of the College Year in the year of his admission to the College,
 - (2) passed the School Leaving Examination of the University of Melbourne or its equivalent, and passed the School Leaving Examination in Chemistry and in one of the following subjects:—Physics, Biology, Geology,

(3) satisfied the Superintendent of Agricultural Education that he possesses a knowledge of the rudiments of farm work and that he has worked on a farm for a period of not less than eight weeks, and

(4) has applied to the Superintendent of Agricultural Education for admission direct to the Second Year of the course and has submitted evidence of his practical farm experience not later than 14th February preceding entrance to the College. Provided that permission to proceed direct to the Second Year of the course must be obtained from the Superintendent of Agricultural Education before the applicant enters into residence at the College, and that any applicant otherwise eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of the course but who has not sufficient or satisfactory practical farm experience must, in the first instance, obtain the approval of the Superintendent of Agricultural Education of his plans for gaining the necessary experience.

- 4. Conditions for admission of University students undergoing Second Year of the course for the degree of Bachelor of Agricultural Science.—University students who have been approved by the Faculty of Agriculture of the University of Melbourne to proceed to the Second Year of the course for the degree of Bachelor of Agricultural Science may be admitted to State Agricultural Colleges if they have agreed to observe the Regulations and College rules, had the prescribed fees and charges paid on their behalf at the time of admission, produced certificates from a registered medical practitioner that they are in good health and physically fit for the work of the College, and produced a dentist's certificate that they are not likely to require dental treatment for at least six months.
- 5. Conditions for admission to short intensive courses.—Persons may be admitted to short intensive courses or schools if they agree to oberve these Regulations and College rules and to pay the prescribed fees. Except for the Junior Young Farmers' courses, for which the minimum age for admission will be fourteen years, the minimum age for admission to short intensive courses or schools will be eighteen years.
- 6. Until a registered medical practitioner certifies that the student can do so without endangering the health of other persons, no student will be permitted to go into residence at a State Agricultural College after living in a dwelling in which exists, or has existed recently, any contagious or infectious disease.

All applications for admission to State Agricultural Colleges must be made to the Superintendent of Agricultural Education, Department of Agriculture, Melbourne.

7. (1) Procedure with applications for admission to the College Diploma Course.—The Superintendent of Agricultural Education will obtain from the last teacher or employer of each applicant a report as to the character of the applicant.

After satisfying himself that applicants are of good character and are qualified under Regulation 2 or Regulation 3 of these Regulations as the case requires and, after giving priority to qualified applicants who have been accorded scholarships under these Regulations and to University students who have been admitted by the Faculty of Agriculture of Melbourne University to the Second Year of the course for the degree of Bachelor of Agricultural Science and to such other categories of applicants as the Minister determines, shall admit them to State Agricultural Colleges in chronological order of the lodgment of their applications.

- (2) Procedure with applications for admission to short intensive courses.—Having satisfied himself that applicants are eligible for admission to the respective short intensive courses and having regard to the number of vacancies available the Superintendent of Agricultural Education will enrol the applicants for each course in chronological order of the lodgment of their applications. Eligible applicants unable to obtain admission to the particular course for which they have applied will be given first opportunity to enrol in a subsequent short intensive course of the same type.
- 8. Applicants for the College Diploma course whose parents or guardians do not reside in Victoria but reside in other States of the Commonwealth of Australia in which there are State Agricultural Colleges will not be admitted to State Agricultural Colleges in Victoria unless vacancies are available after all qualified applicants whose parents or guardians reside in Victoria have been admitted.

PART III.—STUDENTS' FEES, ETC.

9. All College Diploma students' and Second Year University degree students' fees, deposits and contributions are payable in advance to the Department of Agriculture, Melbourne, and must be paid by the date notified, otherwise the vacancy may be filled by another applicant.

Provided that students admitted as trainees under the provisions of a training scheme approved by the Commonwealth of Australia and the State of Victoria may be permitted to pay the fees charged for maintenance of resident students by regular instalments.

10. The fee to be paid in respect of the maintenance of each College Diploma or University degree resident student is £27 10s. per term. In addition, there shall be payable in respect of each College. Diploma and University degree student a contribution of 15s. per term for medical attention and a contribution of £2 per term for sports and social activities.

Contributions and charges, except such portion of the charges as is appropriately payable to the Consolidated Revenue, shall be paid into "Trust Fund--Agricultural College Account" in the books of the Treasury.

With the first payment of fees a deposit of £5 shall be paid in respect of each College Diploma student to meet charges for stationery, text books, College badge, magazine and other goods or materials supplied, and services rendered.

Stationery, text books, College badge and other goods or materials supplied and services rendered to a College Diploma or University student shall be charged to the student's account at the end of each term and shall be paid within one calendar month, provided that in the final year of the College Diploma course all charges shall be debited against the deposit, and, at the conclusion of the College Diploma student's course of training the balance, if any, may be refunded from the Trust Fund.

Fines and such moneys as are paid into "Trust Fund—Agricultural Colleges Account" without specific purpose and any surpluses accruing in such Trust Fund may be disbursed by the Principal in the procurement of goods, services, and amenities for the use, benefit, and enjoyment of students

11. If, to the exclusion of any other applicant, a College Diploma student has failed for reasons other than illness or the undertaking of National Service training to go into residence at the College within one month after the opening day, he may be declared by the Superintendent of Agricultural Education to be disqualified and any fees paid on his behalf may be forfeited.

A College Diploma or University degree student who enters the College after the expiry of one month from the beginning of any term shall be charged *pro rata* fees, but shall be required to pay the total contribution for medical attention and for sports and social activities

A College Diploma or University degree student who leaves the College before the expiry of any term shall not be entitled to receive any refund of his medical attention and sports and social contributions or any portion thereof.

The fees paid by or on behalf of any College Diploma or University degree student cover only the period for which the College Diploma course or Second Year course for the degree of Bachelor of Agricultural Science is in session. College Diploma and University degree students will be allowed to remain at the College during vacations only with the permission of or at the direction of the Principal and shall engage in any practical work assigned to them.

12. Students admitted to short intensive courses shall pay on arrival at the College an inclusive fee for board, lodging, and tuition at the rate determined by the Minister. For this purpose, a period of four days in any week in residence at the College will constitute one week."

PART IV.—DISCIPLINE.

- 13. (1) The Principal shall be responsible for the maintenance of discipline at the College.
- (2) In the maintenance of discipline the Principal may impose one or more, of the following types of penalty:—
- ... (a) expulsion,
 - (b) suspension for a period not exceeding twelve months,
 - (c) detention,
 - _(d) stoppage of leave,
 - (e) additional tasks,
 - (f) a fine not exceeding Forty shillings, provided that no additional penalty will be imposed to that of expulsion.
- -(3). The introduction into the College or on to the farm of any spirituous or fermented liquors is strictly forbidden, and while students are resident at the College they must refrain from partaking of intoxicants. Any breach of discipline in this connexion may be punished by expulsion.
- (4) All fines imposed for breaches of discipline shall be paid within ten days and shall be paid into "Trust Fund—Agricultural Colleges Account."

(5) If, during any term, a student proves to be unfitted for College life from any cause whatsoever and, in the opinion of the Principal, the student's presence at the College is likely to be unprofitable to the student, injurious to other students, or prejudicial to the discipline or the reputation of the College, the Principal shall report on the student to the Superintendent of Agricultural Education who, if he thinks fit, may refuse to re-admit the student to the College at the commencement of the ensuing term.

PART V.-SCHOLARSHIPS.

- 14. Scholarships—General.—The following general conditions will apply to all holders of scholarships:—
 - (a) A full scholarship shall entitle the holder to free tuition, board and lodging.
 - (b) The holder of any scholarship shall not hold any other scholarship concurrently.
 - (c) The tenure of any scholarship may be terminated if, in the opinion of the Principal, the work or conduct of the holder of the scholarship is unsatisfactory.
 - (d) Should the holder of any scholarship fail to pass the prescribed examinations in any year he may not be permitted to continue under the terms of the scholarship.
- 15. Government Scholarships.—Five full scholarships, tenable for three years at a State Agricultural College, will be made annually to boys attending State and Registered schools in Victoria.

The award of these scholarships will be made by the Minister of Agriculture on the recommendation of a Committee, consisting of the Superintendent of Agricultural Education, the Director of Education, and the Principals of Dookie and Longerenong Agricultural Colleges.

The recommendation of the Committee will be based on educational standard in relation to educational opportunity, physical fitness, general suitability to undertake the course, and the financial circumstances of parents of applicants.

Applications for scholarships must reach the Superintendent of Agricultural Education not later than 21st December in each year.

16. Murray and Allan Bell Memorial Scholarship.—This scholarship, tenable for three years at Longerenong Agricultural College, will be awarded once every three years, provided that, should the income derived from the investment of the capital amount provided for this scholarship permit, an additional scholarship may be awarded in any year.

The award of this scholarship will be made under the same conditions and method as specified in Regulations 14 and 15 of these Regulations.

. 17. Sir Albert Dunstan Memorial Scholarship.—This scholarship, tenable for three years at Longerenong Agricultural College, will be awarded once every three years, provided that, if for any reason a scholarship is not awarded in any specified year, or a scholarship is forfeited or relinquished, a scholarship may be awarded in any subsequent year.

The award of this scholarship will be made under the same conditions and method as specified in Regulations 14 and 15 of these Regulations.

- 18. "Kraft Foods Limited" Scholarship.—This scholarship, tenable for three years at Dookie Agricultural College, will be awarded annually under the same conditions and method as specified in Regulations 14 and 15 of these Regulations, provided that, other things being equal, preference will be given to applicants living in the Allansford and Garvoc (Western District) and Leitchville and Strathmerton (Murray Valley District) Areas.
- 19. H. V. McKay Scholarships.—These scholarships, tenable for three years, will be awarded once in three years, one at Dookie Agricultural College and one at Longerenong Agricultural College, under the same conditions and method as specified in Regulations 14 and 15 of these Regulations, provided that due regard is given to the intention of the H. V. McKay Charitable Trust that the scholarship should be awarded to a student who otherwise would not be able to attend a State Agricultural College.
- 20. A.I.F. Canteens Fund Trust Scholarship.—For those eligible under—
 - (a) Sir Samuel McCaughey Bequest (1914-18 War),
 - (b) 1939 War Children's Education Scheme (1939-45 War),

Fees amounting to £59 10s. per annum are available from the above-mentioned sources to enable the sons of deceased or seriously incapacitated ex-members of the Australian Defence Forces to train at Dookie or Longerenong Agricultural Colleges, provided that applicants are qualified for admission to the College Diploma course.

In addition, as an incentive to proficiency, the Trustees grant beneficiaries rewards of £20 on completion of the College Diploma course within the specified time.

- 21. James Cuming Scholarship.—This scholarship, tenable for one year, will be awarded annually to the student who is dux of the second-year class at Dookie Agricultural College, provided that—
 - (a) No student will be eligible for this scholarship unless he obtains not less than 75 per cent. of the aggregate marks allotted for the final examination of the year, and obtains a pass.
 - (b) The winner of this scholarship will be required to proceed with the course as a third-year student at the beginning of the term following the award.
 - (c) Should the student entitled to this award not accept it, the scholarship will be offered successively to the eligible students in order of merit.
 - (d) If, in any one year, the income derived from the capital amount provided for this scholarship is insufficient to meet the cost of a full scholarship, the student to whom it is awarded will be required to pay the full difference in the first term of the year for which the scholarship is awarded.
 - (e) If for any reason a scholarship is not awarded in any year, an additional scholarship may be offered in any subsequent year.
- 22. Fink Scholarship.—This scholarship, tenable for one year, will be awarded annually to the student who is dux of the second-year class at Longerenong Agricultural College under the same terms and conditions as are applicable in the case of the James Cuming Scholarship described in Regulation 21 of these Regulations.
- 23. Barbour Pastoral Research Scholarship.—This scholarship, tenable for one year, may be awarded annually to a pastoralist's son who is pursuing the diploma course at Dookie Agricultural College, and who desires to further his studies of pasture improvement. In awarding this scholarship an applicant's character, general attitude to College life, qualities of leadership and perseverance will be taken into consideration. The award will be made by the Minister of Agriculture on the recommendation of the Principal and the Superintendent of Agricultural Education. In his scholarship year, the holder will submit a report to the Principal on his pasture investigations.

The annual value of the scholarship will be the net annual income of the endowment remaining after payment of any necessary administrative expenses.

Travelling expenses at the rates and in accordance with the conditions prescribed in the Regulations under the Public Service Act 1946 for personal expenses for officers, other than Permanent Heads, whose standard salaries are more than f728 a year and to the reimbursement of any reasonable amount expended on transport, the amount payable to be calculated in accordance with the Regulations under the Public Service Act 1946 as in force at the commencement of these Regulations; provided that where it is necessary for any member to use his own motor-car on the business of the Committee, he shall be entitled to be paid a mileage allowance in accordance with the scale prescribed in the Regulations under the Public Service Act 1946 as in force at the commencement of these Regulations.






