Labour and Industry Acts.

DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33 OF THE LABOUR AND INDUSTRY ACT 1953.

I, Henry Norman Jones, Secretary for Labour and Industry, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Labour and Industry Acts, hereby make and issue the following adjusted Determination of the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in May, 1956.

POTTERY BOARD.

Clause 2 of the Determination made on the 8th August, 1955, and in force from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1955, shall be replaced by the following clause:—

APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

2. Provided that a female doing any work classified for a male in clause 25 hereof shall receive the above-mentioned wages rate plus an amount of 75 per cent. of the appropriate margin prescribed in such clause, calculated to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. in any result to be disregarded.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force, provided that the weekly earnings of a pieceworker shall be increased by 113s. if a full week of 40 hours is worked, and a proportionate amount for a lesser number of hours in any week.
