**SHOPS BOARD No. 15 (GROCERS).**

Clause 2 of the Determination made on 26th March, 1956, and in force from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after 10th April, 1956, shall be replaced by the following clause:—

Provided that any apprentice or improver without previous experience entering the trade at 16, 17, or 18 years of age may be paid for his first and second years' service 20 per cent. less than the rates fixed above.

Provided further that any apprentice or improver who acts as a manager as defined elsewhere in this clause shall be paid the rate prescribed for such manager.

The Board has prescribed a form of indenture which must be used.

PROPORTION (in any shop or place).

*Apprentices.*

One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than £15 0s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

*Improvers.*

One improver to every three workers receiving not less than £15 0s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

"Worker" includes an owner or partner acting as working manager.

\* The ordinary hours of employees classified as (d), (e), (f), (g), and (h) include time occupied in attending to horses or motor vehicles. Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force.

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
