Poisons Acts.

ADDITIONS TO PARAGRAPH (1) OF THE SIXTH SCHEDULE TO THE POISONS ACT 1928.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section thirty-eight of the *Poisons Act 1928* (No. 3748) as amended by section five of the *Poisons Act 1930* (No. 3918) it is enacted that if it appears to the Governor in Council that any new derivative of morphine or cocaine or of any salts of morphine or cocaine or any other alkaloid of opium or any other substance or preparation of whatever kind is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine, the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria may by Proclamation add the name of that derivative, alkaloid or other substance or preparation to paragraph (1) of the Sixth Schedule to this Act and declare that this Division shall apply to that new derivative or alkaloid or other substance or preparation in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations mentioned in paragraph (1) of the Sixth Schedule to this Act and the provisions of this Division shall apply accordingly:

And whereas the substances or preparations—

Morphinan and derivatives of morphinan such as methorphan, dextrorphan, laevorphan, levorphan, racemorphan, dromoran, 3-methoxy-N-methylmorphinan, dextromethorphan, laevomethorphan, levomethorphan, racemethorphan; and the salts, preparations, admixtures, extracts or other substances containing any proportion of morphinan or such derivatives—

were added to paragraph (1) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* by Proclamation of the Governor in Council dated the seventh of September, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifteenth of September, 1954:

And whereas the Pharmacy Board of Victoria has recommended that the name of the substance—

3-hydroxy-N-phenethylmorphinan—

be added to paragraph (1) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928*, as such substance is productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as, or analogous to, those produced by morphine or cocaine:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation add to paragraph (1) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* after the word "racemethorphan" in the said paragraph (1) the name of—

3-hydroxy-N-phenethylmorphinan—

And declare that Division 2 of Part III. of the *Poisons Act 1928* shall apply to the substance—

3-hydroxy-N-phenethylmorphinan—

in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations included in the said paragraph (1).

AMENDMENT OF FOURTH SCHEDULE TO THE POISONS ACT 1928 (No. 3748).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section twenty-four of the *Poisons Act 1928* (No. 3748) I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria made on the 9th May, 1956, do by this my Proclamation amend the Fourth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* as follows, that is to say:—

1. The following substances or preparations are hereby removed from Part II. of the said Fourth Schedule:—

Diethylparanitrophenylthiophosphate or its isomers, whether known as such or as Parathion, Niram, E605, Phosphone, Paraphos, or by any other trade name and all preparations and admixtures thereof.

Dimethylparanitrophenylthiophosphate or its isomers, whether known as such or by any trade name, and all preparations and admixtures thereof.

Hexaethyltetraphosphate, whether known as such or as H.E.T.F., Hexone, Demite, Hetraphos, or by any other trade name, and all preparations and admixtures thereof.

Tetraethylpyrophosphate, whether known as such or as T.E.P.P., Tephos, or by any other trade name, and all preparations and admixtures thereof.

2. The following substances and preparations are added to Part II. of the said Fourth Schedule:—

Organic phosphate insecticides such as diethylparanitrophenylthiophosphate, Parathion, Niram, E605, Phosfone, Paraphos, dimethylparanitrophenylthiophosphate, hexaethyltetraphosphate, HETP, Hexone, Demite, Hetraphos, Tetraethylpyrophosphate, TEPP, Tephos, Malathion, Diazinon, octamethylpyrophosphoramide, OMPA, diethoxythiophosphoric ester of 2-ethylmercaptoethanol, Systox, EPN, or their isomers whether known as such or by any other name and all preparations and admixtures thereof.

POISONS ACT 1928 (No. 3748).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section thirty-eight of the *Poisons Act 1928* (No. 3748) as amended by the *Poisons Act 1930* (No. 3918), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria made on the 13th June, 1956, do by this my Proclamation add to paragraph (1) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* the names of the following substances or preparations—

Dimethylthiambutene (3-dimethylamino-1, 1-di-(2-thienyl)-1-butene), its salts, and any preparation, admixture, extract, solution or other substance containing any proportion of dimethylthiambutene.

Ethylmethylthiambutene (3-ethylmethylamino-1, 1-di-(2-thienyl)-1-butene) its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract, solution or other substance containing any proportion of ethylmethylthiambutene.

Diethylthiambutene (3-diethylamino-1, 1-di-(2-thienyl)-1-butene), its salts, and any preparation, admixture, extract, solution or other substance containing any proportion of diethylthiambutene.

1, 3-dimethyl-4-phenyl-4-propionoxyhexamethylenimine, its salts, and any preparation, admixture, extract, solution or other substance containing any proportion thereof.

4-morpholino-2, 2-diphenyl ethyl butyrate, its salts, and any preparation, admixture, extract, solution or other substance containing any preparation thereof.

And declare that Division 2 of Part III. of the *Poisons Act 1928*, shall apply to each of such substances or preparations so added in the same manner as it applies to the substances or preparations included in the said paragraph (1) of the Sixth Schedule.

POISONS ACT 1928 (No. 3748).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section four of the *Poisons Act 1928* (No. 3748), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria made on the 9th May, 1956, do by this my Proclamation amend the Second Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* as follows, that is to say:—

SECOND SCHEDULE.

LIST OF POISONS.

1st Part.

1. The article—

"Codeine and its salts, and all preparations and admixtures thereof containing 1.0 per centum or more of Codeine"

is hereby removed from such part of the said Schedule.

2. The following articles are hereby added to the 1st Part of the Second Schedule:

"Codeine and other morphine ethers such as benzylmorphine, ethylmorphine and pholcodine; and the salts, preparations, admixtures, extracts, solutions or other substances containing one part per centum or more of Codeine or such morphine ether.

Rauwolfia and its active principles and all preparations, admixtures and solutions of Rauwolfia or its active principles."

LIST OF POISONS.

2nd Part.

3. The article—

"Codeine. All preparations or admixtures of Codeine or its salts containing less than 1 per centum of Codeine."

is hereby removed from such part of the said Schedule.

4. The following articles are hereby added to the 2nd Part of the Second Schedule—

"Codeine and other morphine ethers such as benzylmorphine, ethylmorphine and pholcodine; and the salts, preparations, admixtures, extracts, solutions or other substances containing less than one part per centum of Codeine or such morphine ether."

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF FRANKSTON AND HASTINGS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And, whereas the Council of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a road within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land shown reserved for a road on lodged plan of subdivision, No. 6723, and being part of Crown allotment 19A, Parish of Bittern, and being more particularly described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:

Godings-road.

Commencing at a point distant 1,518.6 links on a bearing south 36 deg. 16½ min. east from the north-western angle of the said Crown allotment, bounded thence by lines bearing respectively south 89 deg. 59 min. east 7,293 links, south 0 deg. 3 min. west 75.8 links, north 89 deg. 59 min. west 7,237.3 links, and north 36 deg. 16½ min. west 94 links to the point of commencement.

BY-LAW RELATING TO RATES AND CHARGES FOR THE YEAR 1956.

Cemeteries Acts.

DAHVEDARRE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them under the Cemeteries Acts, the Trustees of the Dahvedarre Public Cemetery hereby rescind the Rules and Regulations previously published in the *Government Gazette* and make the following:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- (1) No interment shall be permitted to take place in the cemetery until application has been made, the particulars supplied in form Schedule A, an order obtained and a certificate from the Registrar of Deaths, the Coroner or a Justice of the Peace has been delivered to the Secretary, Sexton or Gatekeeper.
- (2) Any two Trustees of the cemetery may, by written order addressed to the Secretary, direct the burial of any poor person in the cemetery free of any charges whatsoever, provided, after due inquiry, they are satisfied that such person, his relatives or friends are unable to pay such charges. If such person shall be known or believed to have belonged to any particular religious denomination he shall be buried in the part (if any) of the cemetery set apart for such denominations. All orders for free burial given under these Regulations or by Justices under the Justices Acts shall be recorded by the Secretary.
- (3) Before any interment shall be permitted all fees and charges must be paid and thereupon an order in accordance with the Trustees' requirements will be given to the Sexton for the grave to be dug and the interment to take place.
- (4) The permission for interment must be given to the Sexton before Twelve o'clock noon on the day previous to the interment when a morning interment is required, and before Two p.m. on the day previous to the interment where an afternoon interment is required.
- (5) The usual hours of interment shall be between Ten a.m. and half-past Four p.m. Monday to Friday, and between half-past Nine a.m. and Twelve noon on Saturday, but burials may be permitted outside of these hours with the consent of the Chairman or Secretary on payment of the prescribed fees.
- (6) The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick vault is required or any alteration made thereto it must be constructed under the direction of the Trustees or some person appointed by them. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the burial right must accompany the application.
- (7) Any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the directions of the Sexton on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented and covered by a slab of stone slate or iron and be air-tight.
- (8) Every coffin placed in a vault or brick grave shall be bricked in, cemented and made air-tight.
- (9) Every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep for one interment and at least 7 feet for two interments, and no coffin shall be interred within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in such grave, and in the case of a tomb or vault a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left above and around the uppermost coffin.
- (10) A certificate of ground for a burial place within the cemetery may be granted by the Secretary in the form and to the effect set out in Schedule B on payment of fees prescribed.
- (11) No person being the owner of the exclusive right of burial of a grave shall transfer such right without the consent of the Trustees, and no transfer shall be consented to by the Trustees except a transfer to a near relative of the owner or a transfer to the Trustees.
- (12) No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Registrar of Deaths, the Coroner or Justice of the Peace and of the licence for disinterment from the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- (13) Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the cemetery or to stand opposite the entrance gates except by the authority of the Trustees first had and obtained.
- (14) Before the erection of any tablet, headstone, monument, tomb, vault, fence, railing or enclosure is commenced, the permission of the Trustees must be obtained and payment made by the contractor (if any) or otherwise by the owner of the fees set out in the scale thereof. Persons desiring to make such erections are required to submit designs, drawings or descriptions proposed location and a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph and such information as the Trustees may require. The Trustees may withhold permission and prevent the proposed erection of anything which may appear to them as unappropriate, unbecoming or not sufficiently durable.
- (15) Every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence or other erection shall be retained in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner or owners. Where any monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence or other erection is allowed to fall into a state of disrepair and the owners fail to carry out repairs to the satisfaction of the Trustees within 21 days after the service of a written notice by the Trustees so to do by posting the same by registered post to the last registered address of the owners, the Trustees may remove such monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence or other erection, or alternatively to carry out such repair work as they shall deem reasonably necessary and to recover the expense so incurred from the owner or owners as a debt owing by them to the Trustees for work and labour done.
- (16) All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery and the Trustees may refuse to allow any vehicle conveying such material to enter the cemetery during wet or unfavorable weather. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations. Stones, refuse or rubbish or other materials remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the persons employed on the work, and in the event of any such refuse or other material not being removed within seven days after the completion of the work, the Trustees may cause the same to be removed at the expense of the person or firm carrying out such work.
- (17) Any workmen not employed by the Trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the Trustees or persons authorized by them, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour to see that his work is completed with despatch and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.
- (18) The shifting of any stone, slab, monument, kerb or railing necessary to effect a burial or exhumation shall be arranged by and done at the expense and responsibility of the person placing the order for interment, but in the absence of any such arrangement the Trustees will then carry out such work at the full risk, responsibility and expense of the person afore-mentioned.
- (19) Any person prior to placing any inscription, epitaph or other writing or drawing in any part of the cemetery shall apply, in writing, to the Trustees and submit a copy thereof to the Trustees, and shall obtain their written permission for the same.
- (20) No child under ten years of age shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.
- (21) No dogs will be allowed in the cemetery, the Trustees having full power to destroy the same.
- (22) The Secretary shall, subject to the direction of the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery and carry out and enforce these Rules. Subject to the provisions of the Cemeteries Acts, the direction of the Secretary shall in all such matters and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.
- (23) Any person committing any breach of any of these Rules or Regulations or any other Rules, Regulations or By-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the cemetery by the Trustees, Secretary or Sexton and shall be treated as a trespasser and may be proceeded against accordingly, in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.
- (24) Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying or causing to be done any damage to any monument, tombstone or vault, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanour, and on being convicted thereof is liable to the penalties provided by the Cemeteries Acts.
- (25) A plan of the ground and a register, also a register of all certificates of rights of burial which are issued, will be kept by the Secretary and may be inspected at his office upon payment of the charges fixed.

(26) These Rules and Regulations may be altered or amended and additions made thereto from time to time by the Trustees with the consent of the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the Cemeteries Acts.

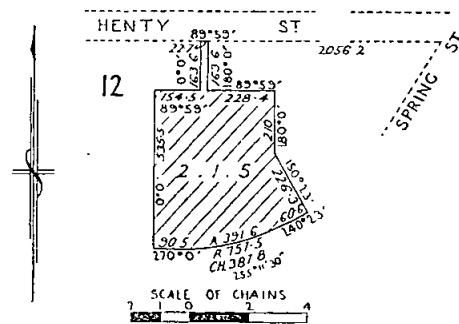

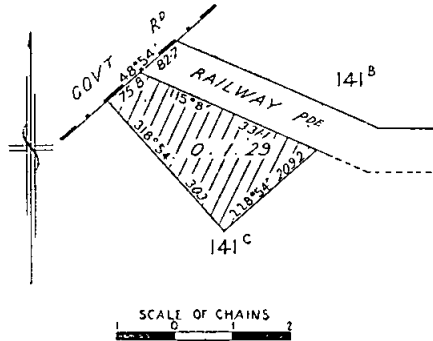

REGULATIONS.—AMENDMENT No. 14.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Police Regulation Acts, doth hereby further amend as follows the Police Regulations 1951 (that is to say):—

1. At the end of clause 20 of Chapter 5 of the said Regulations there shall be added the following sub-clause:—

“(4) Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Chief Commissioner may re-appoint to the Force any person who was previously a member thereof, and who left the Force voluntarily while of the rank of Senior Constable, but such person may be re-appointed only as a First Constable and placed on the Seniority List as though he were being first promoted to the rank of First Constable. In other respects, such re-appointment shall be subject to the provisions of this clause.”

2. Clause 1 of Chapter 6 of the said Regulations is amended as follows:—

(1) Sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph (d) is hereby revoked and the following sub-paragraph substituted therefor:—

“(1) neglects, or without good and sufficient cause omits, promptly and diligently, to attend to or carry out anything which is his duty as a member of the Force, or carelessly carries out such duty; or”

(2) Paragraph (m) is hereby revoked and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

“(m) Unfitness for duty, that is to say, if he is—

(i) unfit for duty through drink; or

(ii) so affected by drink, or for any other cause, that it is undesirable that he should come in contact with members of the public.”

(3) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph (n) the expression “, or brings liquor into barracks” is hereby deleted.

(4) In sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (p) after the word “in” there shall be inserted the words “or in any way takes part in the training or racing of”

3. In the First Schedule to Chapter 6 of the said Regulations, after the paragraph ending with the words “to the Officer in Charge of your District” there shall be inserted the following:—

“The purpose of this form is to draw your attention to the various procedures available for hearing disciplinary charges. Any admission made in this form will not be used at the hearing of the charge. Should you later desire to follow a procedure different from that indicated by you, you should inform the Officer in Charge of your District immediately.”

6. When new articles of equipment are supplied the old articles shall be returned to the Depot Store except in cases of deficiency or where otherwise directed. Return of old articles.

7. Any member of the Force losing an article of his equipment shall immediately report such loss and have such article replaced from the Depot Store. Replacement of the article by private purchase is prohibited. Loss to be reported.

8. Where it has become necessary to deduct from the pay of a member of the Force the price of any article replaced, full particulars shall be sent to the Pay Branch, Chief Commissioner's Office, by the Storekeeper, Depot Store, so that the necessary deductions may be made. 9. (1) Subject to the provisions of clause 10 of this chapter, the equipment issued to members of the Force in accordance with List A of clause 1 of this chapter shall remain in their charge while they remain in the Force. Procedure on transfer from one branch to another.

(2) Any member transferring from one branch to another shall obtain from the Depot Store any additional items of equipment to which he is entitled in accordance with List B of clause 1 of this chapter. Any items to which he is not entitled in the branch to which he has been transferred shall be returned to the Depot Store.

10. (1) When a member of the Force is promoted to the rank of Inspector he shall return to the Depot Store the following items of equipment:— Equipment to be returned on promotion or transfer to C.I.B.

Officers shall ensure that each member is in possession of only that clothing, equipment or bedding authorized in accordance with clauses 1 and 2 of this chapter. Any unauthorized issues are to be returned to the Depot Store.

(2) The Officer in Charge of a station, or of the headquarters of the Branch of the Force, may at his discretion issue a firearm to any member of the Force who is under his control and who is about to commence a tour of duty, and any firearm so issued shall be returned to the said Officer in Charge by the member of the Force upon completion of his tour of duty.

(3) At each police station and at the headquarters of each Branch of the Force a record of the issue and return of firearms shall be kept by the Officer in Charge, who shall, when issuing any firearm, examine it and shall, upon the return of such firearm again examine it and record the condition of the firearm at that time, together with particulars of the ammunition expended (if any)."

5. In clause 3 of Chapter 19 of the said Regulations before the word "Sub-officers" there shall be inserted the words "When applicable".

And the Honorable Murray Victor Porter, for and on behalf of Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

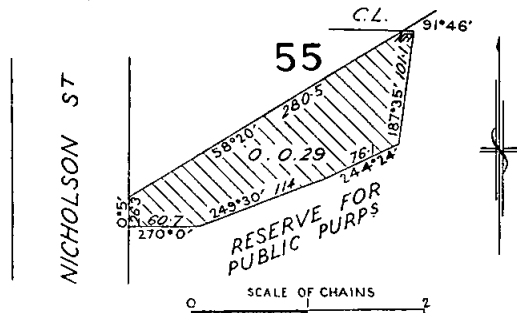

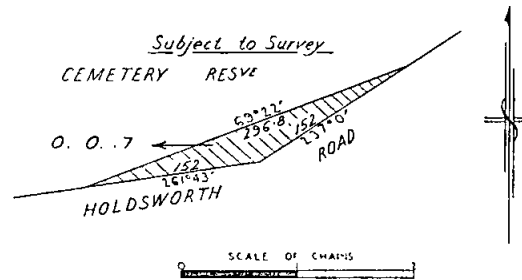

Should the tenderer be in a position to supply a suitable substitute of Commonwealth production or manufacture in place of any sample exhibited that may be of imported origin, he may tender for such substitute, but must submit with his tender a sample of the article offered.

In all cases the country of origin of the articles tendered must be stated, and the total cost of each item extended in the columns provided.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of one year, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition the tender will be declared informal.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ————" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Offices, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, or if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedules the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. *The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.* In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country or origin of the goods supplied.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne District will include a radius of 10 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary, Education Department, or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in clause 7.

9. The official order issued by the Education Department shall be forwarded by the contractor to the officer authorized to accept delivery, who shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach same to his claim for payment.

10. All orders, duly receipted, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account in the prescribed form for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time to be allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to have been made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in clause 7.

13. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.

14. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, *the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein.* He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with clause 15, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 17 of these conditions. Such mulct may be deducted as in clause 7.

15. *Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted as in clause 7.*

16. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions,

the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

17. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of clauses 14 and 15 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the said Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in clause 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of one year from the date of such disqualification.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the said Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

19. The contracts entered into under these conditions are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for supplies to Technical Schools, or by any article being made at any Government establishment and supplied for the use of the Education Department, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

20. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the *Customs Act 1901-36*, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

21. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in clause 20, will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

22. Should the Minister of Education for the time being decide to discontinue the use of any book, map, or any other article in the schedule, or to direct that any book, map, or any other article other than those enumerated therein be taken into use, he shall at any time give six months' notice of such intention or decision to the contractor, and after the expiration of the period of such notice the Education Department shall not be bound to take any further supply of such book, map, or any other article, nor shall the contractor be bound to supply the same, and all books or maps not in the schedule, but which it may be decided to introduce, shall be supplied by the contractor after expiration of such notice at a price to be agreed on between the Minister of Education for the time being and the contractor.

OFFERS, endorsed "Offer for Wattle Bark, lot———," and addressed to the Secretary, Forests Commission, Melbourne, will be received at this office up to Twelve noon on Friday, 7th September, 1956, for the right to strip and remove wattle bark on and from the following areas. The general conditions hereunder will apply in every case where not expressly stated to the contrary, and special conditions will also apply where provided. Full particulars may be obtained from the officer in charge in each case, or on application to the Commission.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.
2. The deposit specified in Schedule must accompany each offer.
3. The licensee shall do everything within his power to strip and remove all bark available on the area upon which he is licensed to operate.
4. Stripping shall be commenced within six weeks from date of acceptance of offer unless otherwise authorized by the Commission.
5. No stripping shall be commenced until the applicant has lodged the deposit specified and is in possession of the requisite licence.
6. Notification, in writing, that stripping operations have been commenced must be forwarded to the officer in charge within 48 hours from date thereof.
7. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any area which the officer in charge directs is not to be operated upon, and no particular tree specially marked by him to remain standing shall be felled or stripped.

8. In the event of stripping being permitted on any area regarded as a tourist resort all tops must be lopped, stacked, and burned under the direction of and in accordance with the written conditions specified by the officer in charge.

9. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course or to obstruct any road or track.

10. Except with the permission of the officer in charge, no tree of less than 5 inches diameter shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated in the licence. Wherever a size limit is stated it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground.

11. All stripping must cease by 31st March following the date of issue of licence unless otherwise authorized, in writing, by the officer in charge.

12. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt. in clear places only, and the licensee must take such precautions as the officer in charge may direct to safeguard such bark from loss by fire.

13. No bark shall be removed without the permission of the officer in charge, and it must be carted from the forest and weighed not later than one month from the date of stripping the bark unless otherwise authorized by the officer in charge.

14. The whole of the work shall be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the officer in charge and at a rate satisfactory to the Commission.

15. All bark must be weighed at the weighbridge stipulated in the licence, or at such other weighbridge as may be approved by the officer in charge, and in all cases at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.

16. Prior to removal of the bark satisfactory arrangements must be made with the Commission for payment of royalty. The licensee shall pay such royalty at the rate tendered on weights as disclosed by the weighbridge dockets.

17. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be determined by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of the officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire otherwise than in accordance with the Forests Acts and Regulations.

18. The licensee shall forthwith comply with any direction given to him by the officer in charge for the effective protection from fire of the forest within the boundaries of the area upon which he is licensed to operate, and he shall do everything that is reasonably within his power to prevent from spreading and to extinguish any fire which may break out on such area or which may spread to it.

19. The violation of any of the above conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Forests Commission shall have absolute power to forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown and to seize all bark stripped to date of voidance. CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

BY-LAW No. 202.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, numbered 202, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Acts*, for prescribing areas within the municipal district as business areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of such business areas the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building or vacant land for the purposes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and of every power it thereunder enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. From and after the coming into operation of this By-law, the following shall be added to Schedule "B" of By-law No. 74:—

Paisley-street, north side, from Nicholson-street to Albert-street, subject to the provision that buildings shall not be erected within 20 feet of the building line of Paisley-street.

2. From and after the coming into operation of this By-law professional chambers, office accommodation, or banks, on which no advertisement or sign is displayed indicating the nature of the business carried on therein, other than a plate approved by the Council and affixed to the front of such building, may be erected on land fronting the portion of Paisley-street between Albert and Victoria streets, subject to the provision that any such buildings shall not be erected within 20 feet of the building line of Paisley-street.

3. From and after the coming into operation of this By-law professional chambers, office accommodation, banks, shops, storerooms, warehouses, service stations, and parking stations for motor vehicles may be erected on land fronting the portion of the eastern side of Albert-street

between Barkly and Buckley streets, subject to the provision that such buildings shall not be erected within 20 feet of the building line of Albert-street.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the City of Footscray on the 12th day of December, 1955, and confirmed on the 6th day of February, 1956.
