Country Fire Authority Acts.

ALTERATION OF FIRE CONTROL REGIONS, URBAN
FIRE DISTRICTS AND RURAL FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in
Council issued on the sixteenth day of November,
1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the
seventeenth day of November, 1954, for the purposes of
the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, certain parts of the
country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control
regions; and certain parts of such fire control regions
were proclaimed to be urban fire districts; and the
remainder (if any) of each such fire control region (being
the area not included in any urban fire district) was
proclaimed to be a rural district:

And whereas by section sixteen of the *Country Fire
Authority Act 1944* it is (amongst other things) enacted
that the Governor in Council may from time to time,
after consideration of a report submitted by the Country
Fire Authority by Proclamation published in the *Govern-
ment Gazette*—

- (1) add any area to or excise any area from any
fire control region;
- (2) add any area to or excise any area from any
urban fire district;
- (3) amend or alter the boundaries of rural districts
within any region:

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has submitted
a report that it is necessary and desirable that certain
areas should be excised from and others added to the
Eighteenth, Nineteenth, Twentieth and Twenty-first fire
control regions and the urban and rural fire districts
contained in those regions:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria,
in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice
of the Executive Council of the said State, after con-
sideration of the said report of the Country Fire

Authority, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by
the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my
Proclamation—

1. Excise from—

- (a) the Eighteenth fire control region, the
municipal districts of the Shires of
Birchip and Wycheproof;
- (b) the Nineteenth fire control region, the
municipal districts of the Shires of
Charlton and Donald;
- (c) the Twentieth fire control region, the muni-
cipal districts of the Borough of Swan
Hill and the Shire of Swan Hill;
- (d) the Twenty-first fire control region, the
municipal districts of the Shires of Gordon
and Rochester;

2. Add to—

- (a) the Eighteenth fire control region, the
municipal districts of the Borough of
Swan Hill and the Shire of Swan Hill;
- (b) the Twentieth fire control region, the
municipal districts of the Shires of Bir-
chip, Charlton, Donald, Gordon, Rochester
and Wycheproof.

3. Excise from the urban fire district within—

- (a) the Eighteenth fire control region, the
areas described in the First Schedule
hereto;
- (b) the Nineteenth fire control region, the
areas described in the Second Schedule
hereto;
- (c) the Twentieth fire control region, the
areas described in the Third Schedule
hereto;
- (d) the Twenty-first fire control region, the
areas described in the Fourth Schedule
hereto;

4. Add to the urban fire district within—

- (a) the Eighteenth fire control region, the
areas described in the Third Schedule
hereto;
- (b) the Twentieth fire control region, the
areas described in the First, Second and
Fourth Schedules hereto.

5. Alter the boundaries of the rural fire districts within the Eighteenth, Nineteenth, Twentieth and Twenty-first fire control regions to the extent rendered necessary by the aforementioned excisions from and additions to urban fire districts, of those areas which are described in the First, Second, Third and Fourth Schedules hereto.

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SCHEDULE 1.

Shire of Birchip, Township of Birchip, and Parish of Wirmbirchip, County of Karkaroc; Narraport, County of Borung; and Karyrie, Counties of Karkaroc and Tatchera.—The boundaries of the Birchip Urban Waterworks District as proclaimed in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the 14th July, 1909, page 3243, and more particularly described hereunder, viz.: Commencing at the south-western angle of the Township of Birchip, Parish of Wirmbirchip, County of Karkaroc, as proclaimed by *Government Gazettes* of 23rd November, 1888, and 6th December, 1889; thence southerly 6 chains by a straight line in production of the western boundary of the said township; thence easterly by a straight line to a point 5 chains from Campbell-street on the eastern boundary of allotment 33; thence southerly by the last-named boundary 17 chains; thence easterly by a straight line to a point on the western side of Morton Plains-road 10 chains from McGrath-street; thence southerly 14 chains by the western side of the Morton Plains-road; thence easterly by a straight line to a point on the western side of the Narraport-road 8½ chains from the most easterly angle of lot 22, shown on plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles, and numbered 3860, Parish of Narraport; thence northerly by a straight line to the south-eastern angle of the most easterly projection of lot 65 shown on plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles, and numbered 3782, Parish of Karyrie; thence northerly by the most easterly boundary of the last-named lot, and by the production thereof to the northern boundary of allotment 1; thence westerly by the last-named boundary to the north-western angle of lot 1 on plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles, and numbered 3627; thence north-westerly by a straight line to a point 5 chains from Percy-street on the eastern boundary of allotment 32, Parish of Wirmbirchip; thence westerly by a straight line to a point on the western boundary of the last-named allotment 11 chains from the south-western angle thereof; thence southerly by the last-named boundary and the western boundary of the Township of Birchip to the point of commencement.

Shire of Wycheproof, Town of Wycheproof, and Parishes of Bunguluke and Wycheproof: Boundary comprising the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile, and having for its centre the south-eastern angle of the Reserve for Educational purposes in the Town of Wycheproof.

Township of Sea Lake and Parish of Burupga. Boundary comprising the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile, and having for its centre the south-western angle of allotment 11 of section 2, Township of Sea Lake.

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SCHEDULE 2.

Shire of Charlton, Parishes of Charlton East, Charlton West, and Wooronook, Counties of Gladstone and Kara Kara: Boundary comprising the circumference of a circle having a radius of two miles and having for its centre the south-eastern angle of allotment 6 of section 7, Township of Charlton.

Shire of Donald, Parishes of Banyenong, Donald, and Witchipool, Counties of Kara-Kara and Borung: All that land contained within the circumference of a circle having a radius of two miles, and having as its centre the northern corner of allotment 1a, section 5, in the Town of Donald.

Shire of Donald, Parishes of Watchem, Corack, and Warmur, County of Borung. All that land contained within the circumference of a circle having a radius of two miles, and having as its centre a point on the southern boundary of Crown allotment 20, Parish of Watchem, distant twelve chains east from the south-western corner of the said allotment.

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SCHEDULE 3.

The municipal district of the Borough of Swan Hill.

Shire of Swan Hill, Parish of Tyntynder West, County of Tatchera: Those portions of Crown allotment 11 recorded upon lodged plans Nos. 6415 and 8556; that portion of Crown allotment 1, section 1, recorded on lodged plan No. 12782; the Government Township of Nyah West as proclaimed in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of 18th August, 1915, page 2981; Crown allotments 1A, 1C, 2A, 3A, 4A; the northern part of Crown

allotment 4 extending to a depth of 600 links on the east side and 750 links on the west side, all in section 1; and Crown allotments 5A, 6 and 7 of section 1.

Within section 2, Parish of Tyntynder North, County of Tatchera; those portions of Crown allotment 34 recorded on lodged plan No. 6460; those portions of Crown allotment 35 recorded on lodged plan No. 9516; lots 1 and 2 of Crown allotment 35 (immediately north of lodged plan 9516); Crown allotments 33c, 32c, 31c, 30c, 30c, 29d, 28c, 27b; the southern portions of Crown allotments 25A and 25C to a depth of 500 links; Crown allotments 24, 24A, 24A, 21, 22, 23, 13, and 12; the Government Township of Nyah as proclaimed in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of 16th February, 1894, page 869, 23rd November, 1894, page 4340, and 8th August, 1917, page 2505; and the township extension as proclaimed in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of 2nd November, 1921, page 3882.

Shire of Swan Hill, Parish of Bumbang, County of Karkaroc: Commencing on the left bank of the River Murray at Euston Weir and Lock No. 15 and proceeding in an easterly direction along the southern boundary of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission road and an extension of this line to the railway; thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the boundaries of allotments 1A, 2, 3, 4, 20, 21, and 22 to the most northerly angle of allotment 29, all in section B of the Parish of Bumbang as shown on the Soldier Settlement Subdivision plan of the Robinvale Irrigation District; thence on a line bearing north 57 deg. 5 min. east across the road and along the north-western boundaries of allotments 25 and 24 in section B of the Parish of Bumbang as shown on the afore-mentioned plan; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of allotment 24 to a point in line with the boundary of the Parish of Bumbang; thence in a north-easterly direction across the road and along the last-mentioned boundary to the left bank of the River Murray; thence by the left bank of the River Murray and the New Cut to the point of commencement.

Shire of Swan Hill, Parish of Kunat Kunat, County of Tatchera: Commencing at a point being the most westerly angle of lot 13, no section, on lodged plan No. 3507; thence by a line bearing N. 51 deg. 58 min. E. to the foreshore of Lake Boga; thence generally in a south-easterly direction along the foreshore of Lake Boga to the point of intersection of this foreshore with a line being the production of the south-eastern boundary of Crown allotment 16 of the township allotments, Lake Boga; thence in a south-westerly direction by this line bearing S. 47 deg. 54 min. W. to the most southerly angle of allotment 16 of the township allotments, Lake Boga; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundaries of Crown allotments 16, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, 10, 9, and 8 of the township allotments, Lake Boga, to the point of intersection with a line being the production of the north-western boundary of Crown allotment 1, section 3A, Parish of Kunat Kunat; thence south-westerly by a road forming the north-western boundaries of Crown allotments 1 and 6, section 3A, to an angle of Crown allotment 6, section 3A; thence north-westerly along the boundaries of allotments 6, 6B, and 6A, section 3A, and a production thereof, to the point of intersection of this line with the south-eastern boundary of lot 28, no section, on lodged plan No. 3507; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundaries of lots 28, 27, and 26, no section, on lodged plan No. 3507, to the most southerly angle of allotment 26, no section, on lodged plan No. 3507; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundaries of allotments 26, 15, and 13, no section, on lodged plan No. 3507, to the point of commencement.

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SCHEDULE 4.

Shire of Gordon, Township and Parish of Boort: Boundary comprising the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile and having for its centre the south-eastern angle of allotment 1 of section 7, Township of Boort.

Shire of Gordon, Parishes of Terrick Terrick West, Mologa, Mincha West, and Mincha, County of Gunbower: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 11 of section A, Parish of Terrick Terrick West; bounded thence by a road bearing southerly and south-westerly to the most westerly angle of allotment 1; thence south-easterly and southerly by the boundary of allotment 3 to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-westerly by a direct line to the north-east angle of allotment 26 of section B, Parish of Mologa; thence north-westerly by the northern boundaries of allotments 26 and 27 to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 30A; thence westerly and northerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment

34; thence westerly by the road forming the south boundaries of the last-mentioned allotment and allotment 34a to a 3-chain road; thence north-westerly by that road to the west boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 42, Parish of Mincha West; thence easterly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 24a; thence northerly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 24; thence easterly by the north boundaries of that allotment and allotment 24a to the north-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence southerly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 4; thence easterly by the north boundary of that allotment and a line to Bullock or Pyramid Creek; thence north-easterly by a line across Bullock Creek to the south-western angle of allotment 59a, Parish of Mincha; thence easterly by the south boundaries of allotments 59a and 59 to a point in line with the west boundary of allotment 60; thence southerly by a line and the west boundaries of allotments 60, 61, and 61a to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence easterly by a line to the point of commencement.

Shire of Rochester, Township of Rochester, Parish of Rochester, County of Rodney, and Parish of Rochester West, County of Bendigo: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of the Township of Rochester, Parish of Rochester; thence south and west by the township boundary to the Campaspe River; thence westerly and southerly by that river to the south-eastern angle of Crown allotment 92, Parish of Rochester West; thence west by the southern boundaries of allotments 92 and 91 to the Country Roads Board main road; thence south-westerly by a direct line across that road and across the railway reserve to the south-eastern angle of allotment 87; thence west by the south boundary and north by the west boundary of allotment 87, north by the west boundary of allotment 84, and west by the north boundary of allotment 83 to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north by a line and the west boundary of allotment 69, east by the north boundaries of allotments 69 and 68, north by the west boundaries of allotments 65 and 64, and east by the north boundary of the last-mentioned allotment and a line to the west boundary of the Township of Rochester; thence north and east by the township boundary, Parishes of Rochester West and Rochester, to the point of commencement.

Shire of Rochester, Parish of Bamawm, County of Bendigo: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 112, Parish of Bamawm; thence southerly by a road to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 113a; thence easterly by the last-mentioned boundary and southerly by the eastern boundary of allotment 113a, a line, and the eastern boundary of allotment 174 to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by allotment 174, a line, and allotment 175a to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by the western boundary of allotment 175a, a line, and the western boundary of allotment 112 to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence easterly by a road to the point of commencement.

HOME FINANCE ACT 1956 (No. 5967).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the fifth year of Her present Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., intitled the *Home Finance Act 1956*, it is amongst other things enacted that certain sections of the said Act shall come into operation upon the passing thereof and that the remainder of the said Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor

of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof do by this my Proclamation fix Wednesday the eighth day of August One thousand nine hundred and fifty-six as the day upon which the remainder of the said Act, namely, sections 1, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8, shall come into operation.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 3, sub-section (2) of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1949* (No. 5431), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the plants named in the Schedule hereto to be noxious weeds for the purposes of the said Act and extend such declaration in the case of each plant to the municipality or municipalities shown in the third column of such Schedule in respect of such plant, viz.:—

TRUGANINA EXPLOSIVES MAGAZINE RESERVE.—
BY-LAWS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Powder Magazines Act 1896* and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following By-laws for fixing the rents which may be charged for the use of sites of magazines for the storage of explosives at the Truganina Explosives Magazine Reserve at Altona, and for other purposes referred to in the Act first aforementioned, that is to say:—

By-laws.

- In the following By-laws the terms—
 "Lessee" shall include person, corporation, or firm, and the successors, executors, administrators, or assigns (as the case may be) of the same.
 "Explosives Anchorages" shall mean such areas as may be defined as Explosives Anchorages or Powder Anchorages from time to time under the Rules and Regulations for the ports in Victoria.
 "Reserve" shall mean the Truganina Explosives Magazine Reserve at Altona.
 "Jetty" shall mean the Explosives Pier and any extension thereof belonging to the Truganina Explosives Magazine Reserve at Altona, and shall include the mess room and any other building on or used in connexion with the jetty.
- Sites for private magazines may be let or leased from time to time by the Board of Land and Works upon such conditions as are prescribed by the Regulations for the time being in force, made under the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1928*.
- The right of any person to become the lessee of a site of a magazine for the storage of explosives shall be conditional on his satisfying the Chief Inspector of Explosives that he is a fit and proper person to become such lessee.
- The rent to be charged for each site shall be Twenty shillings per annum, and shall be payable in advance, on the first day of each year, to the Collector of Imposts, at the office of the Chief Inspector of Explosives, Melbourne.
- Charges to include the cost of necessary handling and transport between the Explosives Anchorages and the Reserve, but not to include the cost of any unusual or

special service in handling, transporting, marking, or otherwise dealing with such explosives, shall be paid on all explosives received upon the jetty or tramway at the following rates:—

- Explosives, other than detonators:—For each case not exceeding 50 lb. net weight—Eight shillings. For each case exceeding 50 lb. net weight—Eight shillings for each 50 lb. and any part of 50 lb. contained therein.
- Detonators, other than electric—Five shillings for every case containing not more than 5,000 in number; Ten shillings for every case containing more than 5,000 in number.
- Detonators, electric:—
 With wire leads not exceeding 96 inches in length—Five shillings for every case containing 1,000 in number or fractional part thereof.
 With wire leads exceeding 96 inches in length—Seven shillings and six pence for every case containing 1,000 in number or fractional part thereof.
- 6. No ship or vessel of any kind or description whatsoever shall go alongside the jetty without the consent of the Chief Inspector of Explosives or an officer or employee authorized by him.
- 7. No person shall be upon or under any portion of the jetty, or shall enter or be upon any building on or connected with such jetty without the consent of the Chief Inspector of Explosives or an officer or employee authorized by him.
- 8. No goods of any description other than explosives authorized by Order in Council under section 53 of the *Explosives Act 1928*, shall be landed on or delivered from the jetty, or conveyed over the tramway, without the consent of the Chief Inspector of Explosives or an officer authorized by him.
- 9. The maximum quantity of explosives at or on the jetty, including explosives in any lighter at the jetty, shall not exceed at any one time a total of 80,000 lb.
- 10. Explosives shall not be allowed to remain on the jetty, but must forthwith be placed in trucks or in the jetty receiving magazine, or loaded into explosives lighters. Explosives shall not be allowed to remain overnight on the jetty or in the jetty receiving magazine.
- 11. Any explosives lighter having explosive on board shall not, without reasonable excuse, approach within 600 yards of the jetty, except for the purpose of the immediate loading or unloading of explosive.
- 12. Any explosives lighter, after completing the loading or unloading of explosive cargo or having ceased loading or unloading of explosive cargo for the day, shall leave the jetty without unnecessary delay.
- 13. The loading or unloading of explosives on or from the jetty shall be carried out in accordance with the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1928*, or any amendment thereof and Regulations thereunder, and the Rules and Regulations for the ports in Victoria for the time being in force.
- 14. No person shall smoke on any lighter or other vessel in the vicinity of the jetty or on any part of the jetty other than the mess room.
- 15. No person shall bring on to, consume on or have in his possession upon the jetty, any intoxicating liquor.
- 16. All persons engaged in loading, unloading, handling, storage and transport of explosives within the Reserve and on the jetty and on a lighter or any vessel at or in the vicinity of the jetty shall strictly observe all rules and working instructions which may be issued from time to time by the Chief Inspector of Explosives.
- 17. The Government accepts no responsibility for loss by accident, fire or explosion, but will take all reasonable precautions for the protection of life and property.
- 18. Any person committing or causing any breach of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
- 19. These By-laws shall come into force one week after publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, and on the commencement of these By-laws the By-laws of the Truganina Explosives Reserve made on the sixteenth day of November, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventeenth day of November, 1954, shall be and are hereby revoked.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this Order consent to the cancellation of the form prescribed as aforesaid and the prescription in lieu thereof of the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

CONTRACT OF SALE.

An agreement made the _____ day of _____ One thousand nine hundred and _____ between Housing Commission incorporated by the provisions of the *Housing Act 1937* of the State of Victoria (hereinafter called "the Commission") of the one part and _____ of _____ in the said State (hereinafter called "the purchaser") of the other part: Whereby it is agreed as follows:—

1. The Commission pursuant to its statutory powers in that behalf will sell and the purchaser will purchase at the price and upon the terms and conditions hereinafter contained all those premises known as _____ (hereinafter called "the premises") shown in the records of the Commission as being identical with all that piece of land being _____ (hereinafter called "the said land") subject to:—

- (a) the reservations exceptions conditions and limitations as to depth (if any) contained in the Crown grant;
- (b) the reservation of all drainage and other easements (if any) shown on any plan of subdivision affecting the premises; and
- (c) the restrictive covenants and any other easements (if any) affecting the premises.

2. The purchaser shall be deemed to have entered into possession of the premises as purchaser on the _____ day of _____ 19 _____ (hereinafter called the "date of sale") and if immediately prior to the date of sale the purchaser held the premises as tenant of the Commission the tenancy shall be deemed to have terminated on the day last preceding the date of sale.

3. The purchase price shall be the sum of _____ consisting of—

- (a) the sum of _____ (hereinafter called "the deposit") of which—
 - (i) the sum of _____ has been paid in cash by the purchaser; and
 - (ii) the sum of _____ (being the sum (if any) with which the purchaser is entitled to be credited under the provisions of sub-section (5) or sub-section (6) of section 10 of the *Housing Act 1948*) shall be deemed to have been paid by the purchaser;
- (b) the sum of _____ (hereinafter called "the said balance") which shall be paid in manner hereinafter provided.

4. (1) The purchaser shall pay to the Commission on or before the last day of _____ (hereinafter called "the quarter day") interest on the said balance at the rate of _____ per centum per annum computed from the date of sale to the quarter day.

(2) The purchaser shall pay to the Commission the said balance together with interest thereon at the rate aforesaid computed from the quarter day by monthly instalments of principal and interest combined of _____ each on the first day of each calendar month until the whole of the said balance together with interest thereon as aforesaid shall have been paid the first of which instalments shall be paid on the expiration of one calendar month from the quarter day.

(3) The table contained in the Schedule annexed hereto sets forth—

- (a) as to every One hundred pounds of the said balance how much of each instalment is on account of principal and how much is on account of interest; and
- (b) what amount of each One hundred pounds of the said balance is outstanding upon payment in full of each instalment.

5. (1) On any date hereinbefore appointed for the payment of monthly instalments the purchaser may (if he is not then in arrear with any payment hereunder) pay to the Commission that part of the said balance then owing according to the said table or any portion thereof being Five pounds or a multiple of Five pounds.

(2) Where portion only of that part of the said balance then owing is so paid that payment shall not affect the payment of monthly instalments as aforesaid or the obligation of the purchaser in respect thereof and the Commission shall place the amount from time to time so paid to the credit of the purchaser in its books and shall credit the purchaser with interest on the amount so paid at the same rate and calculated in the same manner as that which is payable by him on the said balance: Provided that the Commission may in its discretion apply in manner provided by sub-clause (2) of clause 13 hereof any moneys standing to the credit of the purchaser pursuant to this sub-clause.

6. The purchaser shall be permitted to occupy the premises as a weekly tenant of the Commission from the date of sale at a rental equal to

- (a) From the date of sale to the quarter day the interest payable under this agreement in respect of such period; and
- (b) thereafter the instalments payable under the said agreement and

such interest and instalments if punctually paid shall be accepted in satisfaction of the rental.

7. If at any time after the purchaser has paid in reduction of the purchase price a sum amounting in the aggregate to not less than 20 per centum thereof and has paid to the Commission the amount due by him up to that time by way of instalments and has complied to the satisfaction of the Commission with the terms and conditions hereof on his part to be observed and fulfilled the purchaser may if he so desires upon giving to the Commission the prescribed notice in writing of his intention so to do execute in favour of the Commission a mortgage in the prescribed form for that part of the said balance then owing and he shall subject to the provisions of clause 18 hereof be entitled to obtain from the Commission a transfer of the said land and the costs and expenses of the transfer and mortgage and of any discharge of the mortgage shall be borne by the purchaser.

8. (1) So long as any money due to the Commission under this agreement remains unpaid the premises or any part thereof shall not be sold or contracted to be sold mortgaged transferred assigned let or sub-let by the purchaser without having first obtained the consent in writing of the Commission but the Commission shall not unreasonably withhold its consent in the case of a proposed purchaser transferee or tenant who is an eligible person within the meaning of the *Housing Act 1943*.

(2) If the purchaser sells or contracts to sell mortgages transfers assigns lets or sub-lets the premises or any part thereof in contravention of the provisions of this clause the Commission may rescind this agreement and in its discretion forfeit the deposit and the instalments paid by the purchaser or any part thereof and the purchaser and all persons claiming by through or under him shall forthwith yield up vacant possession of the premises to the Commission.

(3) If the purchaser obtains from the Commission a transfer of the said land pursuant to the provisions hereof and no money remains due by the purchaser to the Commission the following conditions as between the Commission and the purchaser shall be imposed:—

- (a) The premises or any part thereof shall not within five years after the date hereof be sold transferred or let or contracted to be sold transferred or let by the purchaser without the consent in writing of the Commission but the Commission shall not unreasonably withhold its consent in the case of a proposed purchaser transferee or tenant who is an eligible person as aforesaid;
- (b) Every sale contract of sale transfer or lease entered into or made in contravention of the provisions of this sub-clause shall be void and of no effect.

9. The purchaser shall assume liability for compliance with any notices or orders relating to the premises which are made or issued on or after the date of sale and from that date he shall bear and pay all rates charges taxes assessments and outgoings in respect of the premises and shall on demand produce the receipts therefor to the Commission. The said rates charges taxes assessments and outgoings and any rent paid or payable in respect of any tenancy mentioned in clause 2 hereof shall if necessary be apportioned between the Commission and the purchaser as at the date of sale.

10. (1) So long as any purchase or other moneys remain owing under this agreement by the purchaser to the Commission the purchaser shall—

(a) insure and keep insured in the names of the Commission and the purchaser either through the Commission if it so requires or an insurer approved by it all improvements for the time being erected on the premises to their full insurable value against fire and all other insurable risks or to such less sum and against such insurable risks as the Commission may approve and shall in the case of insurance not effected through the Commission forthwith deliver to it the policy and not later than five days before each renewal premium becomes payable deposit with it the receipt for the premium;

(b) keep the premises in good and substantial repair to the satisfaction of the Commission and shall at least once in each period of five years after the date hereof and at intervals of not more than five years paint in workmanlike manner with a number of coats approved by the Commission of suitable paint of good quality the whole of the exterior woodwork (including fences) and metalwork of the premises previously painted and shall so paint from time to time when required by the Commission (but not more often than as aforesaid) all stucco plaster asbestos cement and other covering (including metal roofs) of the premises;

(c) not without the prior written consent of the Commission erect any building on the premises or alter pull down or remove any part of the improvements on the premises;

(d) at all reasonable times permit any person so authorized by the Commission to enter upon and view the condition of the said improvements;

(e) pay to the Commission on the days hereinbefore appointed for payment of monthly instalments the monthly premiums (if any) required to be paid pursuant to any agreement between the Commission and the purchaser or one of the persons designated by the expression "the purchaser" for the admission of the purchaser or one of the persons so designated to benefits under the House Purchasers' Death Benefit Scheme operated under the Housing Acts.

(2) As to insurance as aforesaid effected through the Commission the purchaser shall as the Commission requires either—

(a) pay to it on the date hereof and on each anniversary of that date during the continuance of this agreement a sum equal to the annual insurance premium from time to time charged to the Commission (herein called "the said premium"); or

(b) pay to it—

(i) on the date hereof the proportion of the said premium attributable to the period commencing on the date hereof and ending on the first of the days hereinbefore appointed for payment of monthly instalments; and

(ii) on the days so appointed (except the last of them) a sum equal to one-twelfth of the said premium.

11. (1) The Commission may do or perform or cause to be done or performed all or any of the acts matters and things mentioned in clause 9 and in paragraphs (a) and (b) of sub-clause (1) of clause 10 hereof and may pay or (as the case requires) debit the account of the purchaser with the Commission with all or any of the moneys payable under any of those provisions or under sub-clause (2) or paragraph (e) of sub-clause (1) of clause 10 hereof if the purchaser fails to do or perform any act matter or thing or pay any money as aforesaid.

(2) All sums which the Commission pays or with which it debits the account of the purchaser under the provisions of this clause shall from the date on which they were paid or debited bear interest at the rate aforesaid and shall together with that interest be due and payable by the

purchaser to the Commission (unless payment is demanded on some other day) on the days hereinbefore appointed for payment of monthly instalments.

12. In addition to the provisions for payment of interest hereinbefore contained if any money due hereunder shall at any time be unpaid for fourteen days after the due date for payment thereof or if the time for making payment thereof is extended pursuant to section 19 of the *Housing Act 1943* the purchaser shall when so required by the Commission pay to it interest on the amount so unpaid or the amount the time for payment of which is so extended at the rate aforesaid from the date on which that amount was due or would have been due if the time for payment had not been so extended.

13. (1) The statement from time to time in the books of the Commission of the amount which remains owing or unpaid under this agreement shall be prima facie evidence of the state of the account of the purchaser with the Commission.

(2) The moneys from time to time paid by the purchaser to the Commission under this agreement shall so far as they extend be applied by it in payment of the moneys mentioned hereunder and in the following order:—

First.—Sums (other than the premiums payable under sub-clause (2) and paragraph (e) of sub-clause (1) of clause 10 hereof) due and owing under the provisions of clause 11 hereof.

Secondly.—Premiums due and owing under the provisions of sub-clause (2) of clause 10 hereof.

Thirdly.—Premiums due and owing under the provisions of paragraph (e) of sub-clause (1) of clause 10 hereof.

Fourthly.—Interest due and owing under the provisions of clause 12 hereof.

Fifthly.—Other interest due and owing under the provisions hereof.

Sixthly.—The parts of the said balance due and owing under the provisions hereof.

14. All moneys payable to the Commission under this agreement shall be paid without any deduction at 179 Queen-street, Melbourne, or at such other place in the said State as the Commission may from time to time in writing direct.

15. If the purchaser makes default in payment of any instalment or other sum of money owing hereunder or in the performance or observance of any of the terms or conditions hereof and if after fourteen days' notice in writing has been given by the Commission to the purchaser to remedy the default still continues, the whole of the purchase price and other moneys owing or for the time being remaining unpaid hereunder shall without prejudice to any other rights of the Commission at the option of the Commission become immediately payable and recoverable.

16. (1) Time shall be the essence of this agreement in all respects provided however that if the purchaser makes default in the observance of any of the terms or conditions hereof the Commission shall not be entitled to exercise any of its rights or remedies arising out of the default (including its common law rights) other than its right to sue for the recovery of any moneys then owing unless and until it serves on the purchaser a notice in writing specifying the default and stating its intention to exercise its rights and remedies unless the default is remedied within a period to be specified therein not being less than fourteen days from the date of the service of the notice and the purchaser fails within that period to remedy the default.

(2) If the notice also states that unless the default is so remedied this agreement will be rescinded pursuant to this sub-clause then if the default is not remedied within the period so specified—

(a) this agreement shall thereupon become rescinded and the deposit shall be forfeited to the Commission;

(b) the Commission may proceed to take or recover possession of the premises; and

(c) the Commission may at its option either—

(i) retain the premises and sue the purchaser for damages for breach of contract and pending the determination of damages the Commission shall be entitled to retain all instalments paid hereunder; or

(ii) re-sell the premises as provided by sub-section (3) of section 20 of the *Housing Act 1943* and any deficiency in price upon re-sale and the expenses thereof shall be paid upon demand by the purchaser to the Commission as and by way of liquidated damages.

(3) If the Commission exercises the right of re-sale conferred by the last preceding sub-clause it shall be entitled to apply any instalments paid hereunder in satisfaction or partial satisfaction of any deficiency in price upon re-sale and in exercising the said right it shall not be necessary for the Commission to first tender a transfer to the purchaser.

17. The Commission shall not be entitled by reason of any default by the purchaser in payment of any money due hereunder to exercise the rights conferred by clauses 15 and 16 hereof if it has accepted or agreed to accept interest pursuant to clause 12 hereof and the purchaser has not made default in payment of that interest or if there are sufficient moneys standing to the credit of the purchaser pursuant to sub-clause (2) of clause 5 hereof to satisfy the obligation of the purchaser to pay the money so due.

18. (1) The area and measurements and position on the ground of the premises shall be accepted by the purchaser as being identical with the area measurements and position of the said land as they appear in—

- (a) the plan of subdivision (if any) specified in clause 1 hereof by its Titles Office reference number; or
- (b) if a plan of subdivision (hereinafter called "the unregistered plan") is so specified but at the date hereof has not been accepted by the Registrar of Titles as a lodged plan, the unregistered plan (whether or not amended after the date hereof) when so accepted; or
- (c) if no plan of subdivision is so specified the Crown grant or certificate of title to the said land—

and if any discrepancy is found no requisition or objection in respect thereof shall be made by the purchaser nor shall any claim for compensation be made by either party hereto in respect of any excess or deficiency in measurements or area or otherwise.

(2) Upon acceptance of the unregistered plan as a lodged plan and (save as provided in clause 7 hereof) payment of all purchase and other moneys payable under this agreement the Commission shall execute and deliver to the purchaser a proper instrument of transfer to the purchaser of the said land (which transfer shall be prepared by or on behalf of the purchaser) and shall make the Crown grant or certificate of title available at the Office of Titles for registration of the transfer: Provided that if at the expiration of five years from the date hereof the unregistered plan has not been accepted as a lodged plan and the purchaser is otherwise entitled to a transfer of the premises the following provisions shall apply:—

- (a) If the said land is then vested in the Commission and it has lodged in the Office of Titles all transfers and applications necessary for it to obtain a title to the said land the purchaser shall accept a transfer thereof described by reference to the unregistered plan;
- (b) if the said land is not then vested in the Commission or it has not lodged all necessary transfers and applications as aforesaid the purchaser may at his option exerciseable by giving to the Commission 30 days' prior written notice of his intention to do so rescind this agreement as from the date on which the purchaser and all persons claiming by through or under the purchaser yield up vacant possession of the premises to the Commission which shall within 30 days after rescission—

- (i) if the purchaser has paid all purchase and other moneys payable under this agreement, pay to the purchaser the amount of the assessed value as defined by sub-clause (3) of this clause; or
- (ii) if the purchaser has become entitled to a transfer pursuant to clause 7 hereof, pay to the purchaser the amount of the assessed value as so defined less—

- (I) the amount of all moneys (other than those parts of the said monthly instalments representing principal) due under the provisions hereof and unpaid at the date of rescission; and
- (II) the amount of the said balance unpaid (whether or not due) on the date of rescission.

(3) For the purpose of this clause "the assessed value" means a sum calculated by adding to the purchase price specified in clause 3 hereof the value of such improvements effected with the consent in writing of the Commission by the purchaser upon the premises since the date hereof as would increase the value of the premises to an average

purchaser and deducting the amount of the depreciation of the improvements comprised in the premises calculated at the rate or rates applicable to those premises generally adopted by the Commission in valuing improvements. In the event of any dispute as to the value of improvements so effected the parties hereto shall accept as conclusive the valuation of a sworn valuator selected by the purchaser from four sworn valutors appointed under section 7 of the *Transfer of Land Act 1954* or some corresponding previous enactment who are nominated by the Commission.

19. Any notice or demand by the Commission under the provisions of this agreement may be signed by the Secretary to the Commission or by any person authorized in that behalf by the Commission and may be served upon the purchaser personally or by post in a prepaid registered letter addressed to the purchaser at the premises and in the latter event shall be deemed to have been duly served upon the purchaser on the seventh day after the day of posting.

20. In the construction of this agreement where the context and circumstances so admit or require:—

- (a) The expression "the purchaser" shall (except in sub-clause (3) of clause 8 hereof) be deemed to include the executors administrators and assigns of the person or persons hereinbefore designated by that expression;
- (b) Any agreement or obligation herein contained and either expressly or impliedly made or to be performed by more than one individual shall be deemed to be the joint and several agreement or obligation of those individuals and to impose joint and several liability accordingly;
- (c) Any reference to any Act or section thereof shall apply to any statutory amendment modification or re-enactment thereof for the time being in force.

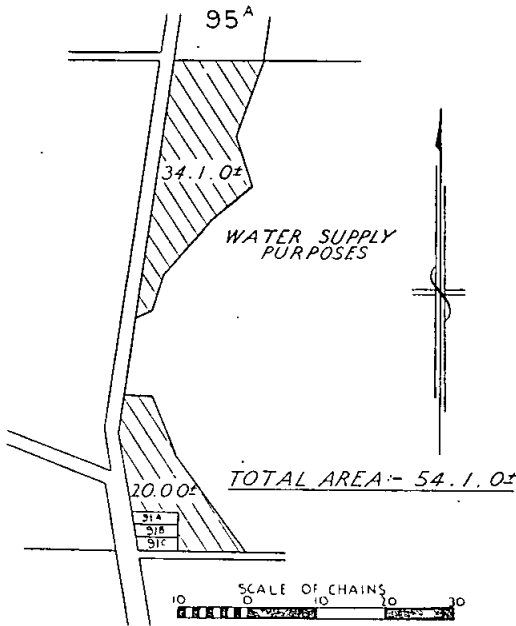

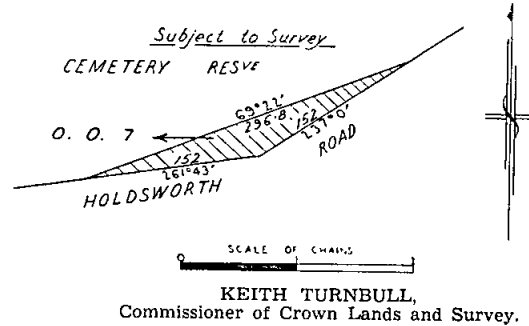

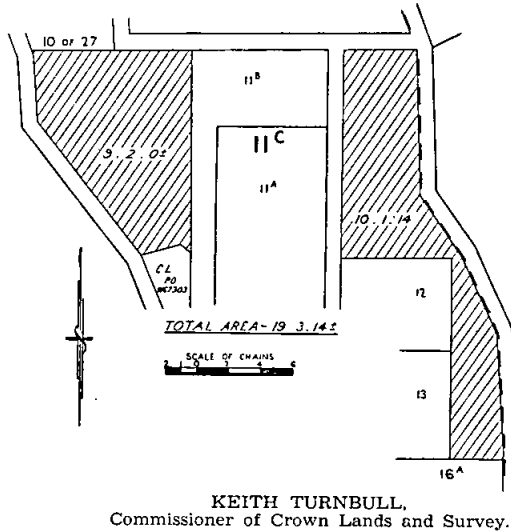

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE "DARLING GARDENS
RESERVE," COLLINGWOOD.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928* as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted:

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the City of Collingwood temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 24th April, 1956, as a site for Public Gardens and known as the "Darling Gardens Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Gardens."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly, or is not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the Gardens, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.

2. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage, or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in the Gardens, or throw stones or other missiles or light fires therein, or leave in the Gardens any bottles, fruit peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter or refuse, of any kind.

3. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the Gardens, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, trees, posts, or other structures, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or other structures, or otherwise deface the same, or write thereon.

4. No person shall bring into the Gardens any dog, unless held by a chain or cord.

5. No person, except workmen employed in the Gardens, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.

6. No assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the Gardens without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management thereof first obtained.

7. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management, in writing, shall offer or expose for sale in the Gardens any article, fruit, or merchandise.

8. No person shall bring or allow to remain in the Gardens, any cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, fowls, or other animals, and any such found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

9. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing in the Gardens, nor shall any person preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to the members of the public in the Gardens without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management thereof first obtained.

10. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Gardens, or shall litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

11. No person shall play at or engage in any game, athletic sport, or gymnastic exercises in the Gardens without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

12. No person shall in any part of the Gardens wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Gardens, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any keeper or other servant of the Committee of Management thereof.

13. No booth, tent, or other structure shall be erected within the Gardens without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management thereof.

14. No person shall interfere with or remove any plants, flowers, seeds or other property from the Gardens, or injure any property therein, and any person offending shall be liable to be removed from the Gardens.

15. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Committee of Management thereof, shall ride or drive any horse, or any bicycle, tricycle, motor car, or other vehicle in the Gardens.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BASSETT RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, or for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Cut Paw Paw temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 15th May, 1956, as a site for Public Recreation, and known as the "Bassett Recreation Reserve," corner of Roberts-street and Geelong-road, West Footscray, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a "Committee of Management," hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday

amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

(a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.

(b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.

(c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

(d) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.

7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game, or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games, or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

18. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve.

19. No person, club, or other body shall without the consent of the Committee first obtained grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

20. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.—(Rs.7456.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BEARS LAGOON RECREATION RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Janiember East temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 6th March, 1956, as a site for Public Recreation and known as the "Bears Lagoon Recreation Reserve", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve". The Reserve has been placed under the control of a "Committee of Management", hereinafter referred to as the "Committee".

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 days in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fetes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) bring any intoxicating liquor on the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (d) exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have the power to hold entertainments, shows or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as herein before provided.

4. The Committee shall have the power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as herein before provided in these regulations.

5. No person except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall park a motor-car, vehicle, or motorcycle in the Reserve, except at such places as set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.

7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game, or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day without the permission in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized sport or game within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sport, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care may be taken on such stand, building, erection, or any enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

11. No person shall in the Reserve interfere with, break, or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or any other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

12. No persons shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.

13. No persons shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No persons shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No persons shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any games, or foot-racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.

16. No persons shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor ride or drive amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

17. No persons shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

18. No persons, club, or any other body shall without the consent of the Committee first obtained grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

19. No persons shall remove any earth, sand, stones, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.—(Rs.7430.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

COMMITTEES OF MANAGEMENT OF RESERVES.

WHEREAS by section 184 of the *Land Act* 1928 it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council or the Board of Land and Works to appoint and remove any number of persons, not less than three, or any municipal council, or the governing body of any corporation, to be a Committee of Management of any specified Crown land reserved either temporarily or permanently for any of the purposes set out in section 14 of the *Land Act* 1928, and not conveyed to or vested in trustees: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby appoint the under-mentioned persons to be members of the Committee of Management of the Reserves named:—

“WILLOW GROVE RECREATION RESERVE.”

Cyril Harcourt Williams, Robert Allan Holmes, Sydney Peter Marslen, James Thomas Davy, Arthur Joseph Erbs, Leo Joseph Marslen, Les Williams, Ian Needham, Thomas Henry Brown, and Jack Eric Needham as a Committee of Management for a period of three (3) years of the land temporarily reserved by Orders in Council dated the 2nd May, 1906, and 16th March, 1951, as sites for Public Recreation in the Parish of Tanjil, and known as the “Willow Grove Recreation Reserve.”—(Corres. ATTENTION is invited to the following procedure in relation to the publication of official matter in the *Government Gazette*:—

1. Matter submitted to the Executive Council.

Matter submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the *Gazette* Officer.

Publication will be facilitated by the submission of carbon copies for the use of the *Gazette* Officer.

2. Other matter.

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the *Gazette* Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the *Gazette* Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.

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
