## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Road Traffic Act 1956* it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act shall apply only in respect of infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of such Part by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* and occurring after the date of such Proclamation:

And whereas it is further enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such Part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular area or circumstance:

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Proclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Councils of the Cities of Box Hill and Fitzroy and the Shire of Mulgrave have requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part in respect only to parking infringements to the municipal districts of the said Cities and Shire:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation specify the municipal district of the City of Box Hill, of the City of Fitzroy and of the Shire of Mulgrave as areas in which Part II. of the *Road Traffic Act 1956* shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

## ALTERATION OF DAY APPOINTED FOR PUBLIC HOLIDAY THROUGHOUT THE SHIRES OF BERWICK, CRANBOURNE AND MORNINGTON.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued on the twenty-fourth day of January, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of January, 1956, Thursday, the twenty-second day of November, 1956, has been appointed to be kept as a public holiday in connexion with the forthcoming Olympic Games throughout the municipalities mentioned in the Sixth Schedule to the *Public Service Act 1946*, including the Shires of Berwick, Cranbourne and Mornington:

And whereas it is made to appear to me expedient that such day should not be a public holiday throughout the said Shires:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Public Service Acts*, do by this my Proclamation declare that Thursday, the twenty-second day of November, 1956, shall not be a holiday throughout the Shires of Berwick, Cranbourne and Mornington and appoint as public holidays throughout the said Shires the day specified opposite the name of each Shire in the Schedule hereunder.

## BY-LAW No. 95.

A By-law of the City of Bendigo, made under the Health Acts and all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, and numbered 95, for the provision, use, and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish (whether temporary or otherwise), and prescribing the size, shape of, and the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1928 and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the City of Bendigo, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. By-law No. 30, made by the Council of the City of Bendigo under the Health Act 1890, is hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipality of Bendigo or such portions of the said municipality as may be determined from time to time by the Council, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, or premises therein.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"Household refuse or garbage" shall mean all waste matter which is ordinarily produced in connexion with the preparation of food, but does not include trade waste from food manufacturing or processing plants.

"Wet refuse" shall mean any fluid matter, and water shall have the same meaning.

"Ashes" shall mean the residue of any combustible material after burning.

"Inspector" means the Health Inspector of the City of Bendigo, and shall include any assistant or acting inspector.

5. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24-gauge or other approved material in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

8. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops, wet refuse, or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle, unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in paper.

11. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any hot ashes in the rubbish receptacle.

12. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and inoffensive, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

13. The proprietor (at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse) shall cause such receptacle to be deposited close to the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as the Council directs, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered, except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

17. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered water-tight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

18. The person in charge of such vehicle shall cause it to be taken when full by the shortest practicable route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor.

19. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

20. No person shall either directly or indirectly in any manner whatsoever deposit or leave, or cause to be deposited or left, any rubbish or refuse on any street, road, lane, or on any land within the City of Bendigo, except upon an authorized tip site.

21. The owner or occupier of any land on which any refuse or rubbish (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council of the City of Bendigo has undertaken or contracted for under the *Health Act 1928*) is deposited or left, on receiving written notice from such Council under the hand of its Town Clerk or of such officer of the municipality who may for the time being be acting on behalf of the Town Clerk, requiring such owner or occupier to remove or effectively destroy any such refuse or rubbish, shall comply with such notice within seven days after the receipt thereof.

22. If default shall be made in compliance with any notice in respect of refuse or rubbish referred to in the last preceding clause, then notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council by its inspector or any other of its officers, or by any authorized agent or agents, with a sufficient number of workmen, to enter upon any land upon which such refuse or rubbish is deposited or left, and if necessary for that purpose to open forcibly or break down any gate on such land, or to break down any part of any fence surrounding the said land, and to remove or destroy such refuse or rubbish, and any expense incurred thereby shall be made good, and paid by the owner or occupier of the said land to the Council on demand, and in default of such payment the same may be recovered by the Council from such owner or occupier in any court of competent jurisdiction.

23. Where refuse is authorized to be disposed of at a tip, the proprietor thereof shall cause it to be deposited and covered in accordance with Schedule 4 of the General Sanitary Regulations 1950, or any amendment thereof.

24. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.

25. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

(1) The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 5 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole or (as the case may be) that portion (or those portions) of the municipal district known as the Township of Bulla as defined by the Lands Department of Victoria plan of the Township of Bulla.

(2) (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building from the frontage of any land is hereby specified as 15 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building closer to the frontage of any land than 15 feet.

(3) In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.
