PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the fifth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, intitled the *Boilers Inspection (Amendment) Act 1956*, it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*:

Now, therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do, by this my Proclamation, fix Wednesday, the twelfth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-six, as the day on which the said Boilers Inspection (Amendment) Act shall come into operation.

DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOL PROCLAIMED.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 64 of the *Education Act 1928* it is provided that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, establish any

schools as district high schools: And whereas, by a Proclamation dated the 10th day of July, 1956, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the 18th day of July, 1956, the Thomastown High School was established as a district high school as from and inclusive of the 1st day of January, 1957: Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Education Act 1928* and all other powers thereunto enabling, do by this my Proclamation hereby revoke the aforesaid establishment of the Thomastown High School made on the 10th day of July, 1956, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the 18th day of July, 1956, and in lieu thereof establish the Merrilands High School as a district high school for the purposes of the *Education Act 1928*, from and inclusive of the 1st day of January, 1957.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that

nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: And whereas notice of the intention to diminish the Maldon Shire Common has been duly published in the *Government Gazette* for one month: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the Maldon Shire Common by deducting therefrom 19 acres 3 roods 14 perches, more or less, of land comprised within the boundaries as defined by description published in the *Government Gazette* of 8th August, 1956.

STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

RESTRICTIONS ON ELECTRICAL APPARATUS REGULATIONS.

Consent for Water Heating Systems Supplied by Named Persons.

PURSUANT to and for the purposes of the Restrictions on Electrical Apparatus Regulations, the State Electricity Commission of Victoria hereby consents to the installation, the connexion, and, subject as hereunder set out, the use in areas supplied with electricity by the Commission or obtained from it, of 4,705 electrical elements for the heating of water, each of a capacity not exceeding—

- 1,500 watts for a 30-gallon container
- 1,750 watts for a 40-gallon container
- 2,000 watts for a 50-gallon container
- 2,500 watts for a 60-gallon container
- 3,000 watts for a 70-gallon container
- 3,500 watts for an 80-gallon container
- 3,500 watts for an 85-gallon container
- 4,000 watts for a 100-gallon container
- and so in proportion at the rate of 40 watts per gallon for any container larger than 100 gallons

in which water is heated by the element and each forming part of each of a number of hot-water systems supplied by the person whose name is set out opposite to that number in a list which the Commission has deposited with the Chamber of Manufactures, 312 Flinders-street, Melbourne, provided that at the time when the element is installed and at the time when it is connected there is fixed to the outer casing of the apparatus containing the element and applied in such a manner as to be conspicuous when the system is installed, an allocation label provided by the Commission to the said named person for the purpose of being fixed.

(b) All time worked in excess of ten hours on any shift or period of duty shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter, except that on Sunday all such time shall be paid at the rate of double time for the first four hours and at the rate of two and a half times ordinary time thereafter, and provided that each shift or period of duty shall stand alone for the purpose of computing overtime under this sub-clause and that such overtime shall not be included for the purpose of sub-clause (a) hereof.

(c) For the purpose of computing overtime in excess of 40 hours in any week, all time on Sundays up to ten hours shall be included and all time worked on Saturdays or on holidays shall be excluded.

(3) That clause 6 shall be amended by inserting the words "Easter Saturday" after the words "Good Friday."

(4) That the Determination appealed against, as amended, shall come into operation from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1956.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BOUNDARY BEND RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Yungera temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 10th April, 1956, as a site for Public Recreation, and known as the "Boundary Bend Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a "Committee of Management," hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (d) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (e) Carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any game or birds therein.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.

7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game, or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building,

erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

12. No person shall, in the Reserve—

- (a) Light a fire without the consent of the Committee;
- (b) Deposit or leave any broken glass, garbage, or litter of any kind, except in a place set apart or in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee of Management.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games, or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

18. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

19. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

20. No persons shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.—(Rs.7435.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "FLORIDAN PARK" RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted:

Now therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (d) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have the power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission, thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.

7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sport, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or any other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games, or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor ride or drive amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

18. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

19. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

20. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.—(Rs.7053.)

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "TORQUAY PUBLIC RESERVES."

THE Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it, doth hereby amend the Regulations made on the 29th January, 1954, for the care, protection, and management of the reserved lands in the Parishes of Puebla and Jan Juc indicated by red colour on plan marked PJ/31.5.49 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.1644, and known as "Torquay Public Reserves," by rescinding Regulations Nos. 9, 13, and 26 of such Regulations, and by making the following Regulations in lieu thereby:—

REGULATIONS.

The person to whom permission is issued by the Committee of Management or its authorized officer, to use a site in a camping area shall be deemed to be the person who erected on such site any structure, tent, or shelter, or who parked a caravan pursuant to such permission, and shall be responsible for the conduct of all persons in such tent and caravan, and such person shall keep the site thus occupied in such camping area in a clean, sanitary, and tidy condition, and before vacating such site shall collect and place in the receptacle provided for the purpose all refuse, litter, or garbage from the site.—(Rs.1644.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACECOURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION, PARISH OF GLENBURNIE, COUNTY OF DALHOUSIE, KNOWN AS "THE KILMORE RACECOURSE."

WE, Edward Joseph Butler, of Bylands, farmer, Francis Patrick Butler, of Bylands, grazier, Thomas George Chapman, of Kilmore, farmer, George Lonie Hudson, of Kilmore, auctioneer, Charles George Meier, of Kilmore, farmer, Reginald Gerard Hoban of Kilmore, solicitor, Frederick John Wallder, of Kilmore, butcher, John Kelly, of Kilmore East, grazier, and Charles Joseph Vincent Dillon, of Kilmore, grazier, being the duly appointed trustees of the land reserved for a Racecourse and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Parish of Glenburnie, known as the "Kilmore Racecourse," and being the land comprised in Crown grant volume 1989, folio 307650, have in the exercise of the powers conferred on us by the said Crown grant thereof, and by the *Land Act 1928*, and of any and every other power us enabling so to do, and with the approval of the said Governor in Council make the following Regulations:—

REGULATION I.

REGULATION II.

(Divisions of Land.)

The divisions into which the said land with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon, is parcelled out, are as follow:—

- (1) Car park.
- (2) Grandstand enclosure.
- (3) Birdcage and mounting yard.
- (4) Members' enclosure.
- (5) Saddling paddock, owners' and trainers' stand.

- (9) Betting enclosure.
- (10) The remainder of the course.

REGULATION III.

(Bringing Horses, &c., on land.)

Except when a race meeting or agricultural show is being held thereon no person shall bring any horse or other animal on any part of the said land without the consent, in writing, of the trustees or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by such trustees. When a race meeting or agricultural show is being held thereon, no person shall bring any horse or other animal on any part of the said land without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club or the Kilmore Agricultural Society, whichever is appropriate, or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by such Committees.

REGULATION IV.

(Training Horses.)

The fee for permission to train or exercise horses on the said land shall be, for each horse for each half-year, £1. Horses shall be trained and exercised on such part or parts of the said land as the trustees, or some person duly authorized, in writing, by the trustees, may from time to time direct. No person shall train or exercise a horse upon any other part of the said land.

REGULATION V.

(Application of Training Fees.)

The moneys received as fees for permission to train horses shall be applied in maintaining the training grounds and course proper in a fit and proper condition, and in otherwise rendering the said land convenient and suitable for racing purposes.

REGULATION VI.

(Damaging Buildings, Plantations, &c.)

No person shall—

- (a) In any way damage or deface any fence, building, or erection on the said land.

- (c) Trample any flower-beds upon the said land, or pull up, break down, or destroy any plant or flower growing therein.

No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the trustees, or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by the trustees, distribute, or assist in distributing, any bill, placard, or notice within the limits of the said land, or post or stick, or assist in posting or sticking, any bill, placard, or notice upon any fence, wall, building, property, or premises on the said land.

On any day set apart for the holding of a race meeting thereon, no person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by the said Committee, distribute, or assist in distributing, any bill, placard, or notice within the limits of the said land, or post or stick, or assist in posting or sticking, any bill, placard, or notice upon any fence, wall, building, property, or premises on the said land.

REGULATION VIII.

(Entering upon Certain Parts of the Land.)

Except on a day when a race meeting is being held on the said land, no person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the trustees or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by the trustees, enter upon any part of the division of the said land numbered 6.

No person shall at any time take or drive any motor vehicle, or other vehicle of any description, on to or across the fifth division of the said land without the permission of the trustees in writing.

REGULATION IX.

(Lighting Fires.)

Except on a day when a race meeting or agricultural show is being held thereon, no person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the trustees, or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by the trustees, light any fire on any part of the said land, or in any building, shed, or premises thereon.

On a day when a race meeting or agricultural show is being held thereon, no person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, or the Committee of the Kilmore Agricultural Society, or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by one of the said Committees, light any fire on any part of the said land, or in any building, shed, or premises thereon.

REGULATION X.

(Remaining in Buildings at Night.)

No person shall enter, loiter, or remain within any building, shed, or other premises on the said land after Seven o'clock in the evening.

REGULATION XI.

(Games and Sports.)

No person shall—

- (a) Play or practice, or engage in any game or sport, on any part of the said land other than such parts as may be set apart by the trustees for the purposes of such game or sport.
- (b) Play or practice, or engage in any game or sport, on any part of the said land set apart by the trustees for that purpose, except upon and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the trustees, or any committee of the trustees, or any sub-committee having control of such game or sport may from time to time prescribe.

The trustees may from time to time appoint a sub-committee or sub-committees, and delegate to such sub-committee or sub-committees the control of such parts of the said land as are set apart for particular games and sports, and such sub-committee or sub-committees may prescribe the conditions upon which any such games or sports may be played or practised, or engaged in upon the parts of the said land so set apart.

REGULATION XII.

(Hawkers and Pedlars.)

REGULATION XIII.

(Misconduct, &c., on the Land).

No person shall, on the said land—

- (1) Assault any other person.
- (2) Use any profane, indecent, obscene language, or any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (3) Be drunk and disorderly.
- (4) Solicit alms.
- (5) Behave riotously or indecently, or otherwise misbehave or misconduct himself.

REGULATION XIV.

(Dogs).

No person shall take any dog on any part of the said land when a race meeting is being held thereon, and no person shall at any time take or keep any dog on any part of the said land unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord, or other similar means.

REGULATION XV.

(Restriction to Race Days).

The following Regulations XVI. to XXX., both inclusive, shall apply only to days on which race meetings are held on the said land.

REGULATION XVI.

Unless otherwise authorized under these Regulations, no person shall enter upon any part of the said land unless he shall have a badge or ticket duly authorizing him so to do. (Tolls and Charges).

The following tolls, entrance fees, and charges for admission may be levied upon, taken from, and made to persons other than members of the Kilmore Turf Club and ladies holding members ladies' tickets of the said club:—

production of the same. Every person who has received a ticket under the last preceding Regulation shall, in addition, if required, surrender any such ticket to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from such Committee to demand the surrender of the same.

REGULATION XIX.

(Judge's Box, Stewards' Stand, &c.)

No person except the judge and timekeeper appointed by the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, and any person the judge may call to his assistance, or the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club may direct, shall enter the judge's box. No person shall enter the stewards' stand or the stewards' room except the stewards acting at a race meeting, and such persons as they may invite to do so.

REGULATION XX.

(Weighing-room and Yard).

No person shall enter or remain in the weighing-room or the mounting-yard, or the approaches thereto, except the stewards acting at a race meeting and the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, and those authorized by such Committee, the jockeys requiring to be weighed and the owners and trainers of horses whose jockeys are being or are about to be weighed.

REGULATION XXI.

(Committee Stand and Rooms, &c.)

No person, on race days, shall enter the Committee stand or the Committee rooms and offices, or the approaches thereto respectively, except the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, and those authorized by such Committee.

REGULATION XXII.

(Thieves, Pickpockets, &c.)

No person who has been convicted in a court of law of robbery or larceny, or of an attempt to commit robbery or larceny, or of obtaining money by false pretences, or of an attempt to obtain money by false pretences, or who is a reputed thief or pickpocket, or suspected person, or an associate of thieves or pickpockets, balancer, welscher, ticktacker, urger, tout, or prostitute, or who plays, or attempts to play, any unlawful game, shall enter or remain on any part of the said land, and may be removed by any member of the Police Force, or by any person acting under the authority of the trustees or of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club.

REGULATION XXIII.

(Remaining on Land after Race Meeting).

No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, or of some person duly authorized by such Committee, remain on any part of the said land for a longer period than half an hour after the last race of the day has been run.

REGULATION XXIV.

(Refusing Entrance).

On any day on which a race meeting is held, any person who, in any divisions of the said land, as set out in Regulation II. of these Regulations—

- (a) Assaults any person;
- (b) Behaves in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening, or insulting manner, or is drunk and disorderly;
- (c) Uses any profane, indecent, obscene, threatening, abusive, or insulting words;
- (d) Solicits alms;
- (e) Acts as ticktacker, tout, urger, canvasser or runner for any bookmaker or other person;
- (f) Has been convicted in a court of competent jurisdiction of any of the offences set out in (a), (b), and (c) of this Regulation, on the said land,

may be refused admission to the said land, or having been admitted to the said land or having entered thereon, may be expelled therefrom after being warned off or directed to leave the said land by any person acting under the authority of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, or by any member of the Police Force, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission to the said land, and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the said land, or any part thereof.

No person who has been refused admission shall enter the said land, or having been warned off or requested to leave the said land, shall remain thereon, or on any part thereof.

REGULATION XXV.

(Undesirable Persons).

On any day on which a race meeting is held, any person who, in the opinion of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club is not a desirable person to be admitted, shall not be admitted to any part of the said land, and may be expelled therefrom after having been warned off or directed to leave the said land by any person acting under the authority of the Committee, or by any member of the Police Force, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission, and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the said land, or any part thereof.

REGULATION XXVI.

(Warning Off).

Any person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club to be a defaulter in payment of any bets, or to have been guilty of any malpractice or dishonourable conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been disqualified by virtue of any rules of racing under which the said club races, may be warned off the said land, or any part or division thereof, by the said Committee, or by any person acting under the authority of the said Committee in that behalf, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission, or is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the said land, or any part thereof.

REGULATION XXVII.

(Remaining on Land after Warning Off).

No person shall remain on the said land, or any part or division thereof, after having been warned off such land, part or division under the last preceding Regulation.

REGULATION XXVIII.

No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling, of a bookmaker, in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained and then only in and on such portions thereof as may be set apart for that purpose.

REGULATION XXIX.

The trustees shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, or person, for the purpose of holding fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows, sports, or for athletic training or other physical recreation, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions, including the right to charge members of the public for admission as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

ENFORCEMENT OF REGULATIONS.

REGULATION XXX.

(Removal of Offenders).

Any person offending any of these Regulations may be removed from the said land by any member of the Police Force, or by any person acting under the authority of the trustees, or of Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, or of the Kilmore Agricultural Society, and such removal shall not exempt him from any penalty to which he would otherwise be liable for such offence.

PENALTIES.

Every person offending against any of these Rules and Regulations shall in accordance with section 182 *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5); and every person who so offends, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

5. The fees payable to the Council of the Borough of Echuca in respect of the granting, transfer, or annual renewal of registration shall be as follows:—

- For the granting or renewal of a licence in respect of a double petrol pump—£4 4s.
- For the granting or renewal of a licence in respect of a single petrol pump—£2 2s.
- For the granting or renewal of a licence in respect of a portable petrol pump—£2 2s.
- For the transfer of any licence—10s., provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate reduction of the fee based on the number of months unexpired shall be made by the Council.

6. Every person licensed under the provision of this By-law shall, prior to the placing or fixing of any such pump or pumps on or upon any footway, insure himself and thereafter at all times keep himself insured during the currency of the licence, and any renewal thereof, against all damages and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control, or possession by him of such petrol pump. Insurance required shall be—

- Where the number of petrol pumps (counting a double petrol pump as two pumps) does not exceed four—a sum of £1,000; and
- Where the number of pumps (counting a double petrol pump as two pumps) exceeds four—£1,000, plus a sum of £250 in respect of each additional pump.
