Labour and Industry Acts.

DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33 OF THE LABOUR AND INDUSTRY ACT 1953.

I, Henry Norman Jones, Secretary for Labour and Industry, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Labour and Industry Acts, hereby make and issue the following adjusted Determination of the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1956.

An employee who is under 21 years of age on the expiration of his apprenticeship, or has completed his term as an improver and thereafter works as a minor shall be paid at not less than the adult rate prescribed for the classification on which he is employed.

(ii) PROPORTION.

Apprentices.

One apprentice to every three or fraction of three persons receiving not less than £14 2s. 0d. per week

Improvers.

One improver to one person receiving not less than £14 2s. 0d. per week, two improvers to two or three such persons, thereafter two additional improvers to every three additional such persons.
