I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 5991. "An Act to make Provision with respect to a Joint Subordinate Legislation Committee of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly."

No. 5992. "An Act to amend the *Local Authorities Superannuation Act 1947*, and for other purposes."

No. 5993. "An Act to provide for the Crown Grant to the Lord Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Melbourne of certain Land at West Melbourne to be used as a Site for a Market and for other Municipal Purposes."

No. 5994. "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Seventeen million seven hundred and sixteen thousand nine hundred and ninety-five pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and fifty-six and One thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven."

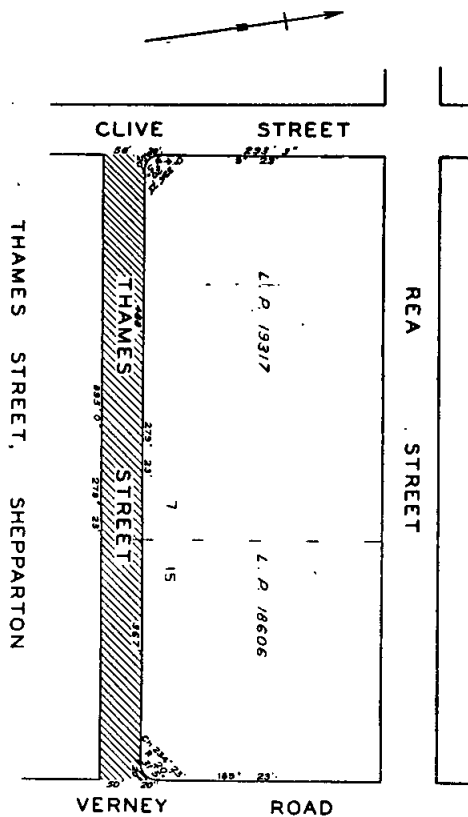
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And, whereas the Council of the City of Shepparton has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned which has been reserved for a road within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land reserved for a road known as Thames-street, being part of Crown allotment 15, Parish of Shepparton, and being the land indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act:—

Marine Act 1928.
PORTS OF VICTORIA, ADDITIONS TO PORT RULES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and Regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs: And that any such Regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, by this Proclamation do hereby make the following addition to the Port Rules, that is to say:—

62a. In that portion of the area within the port of Port Phillip defined hereunder the Master or person in charge of any vessel shall not, unless compelled by emergency, permit the vessel to moor or be at anchor.

Sandringham Anchorage.

From a point of commencement on the high water line bearing 294 degrees distant 765 feet from the south-eastern root of the Sandringham jetty, thence 17 deg. 30 min. for 116 feet, thence 98 degrees for 342 feet, thence 159 deg. 20 min. for 190 feet to the rubble breakwater, thence by the high water line to the point of commencement.

62c. In those areas within the port of Port Phillip defined hereunder the Master or person in charge of any vessel shall not, without written permission of the Port Officer or unless compelled by emergency, permit the vessel to moor or be at anchor between the 15th October and 9th of December, 1956.

Sandringham Anchorage.

From a point of commencement on the high water line 294 degrees distant 765 feet from the south-eastern root of the Sandringham jetty, thence 17 deg. 30 min. for 116 feet, thence 98 degrees for 342 feet, thence 50 degrees for 130 feet to the Sandringham jetty, thence 63 deg. 40 min. for 60 feet, thence 333 deg. 36 min. for 230 feet, thence 304 deg. 20 min. for 638 feet to the south-western corner of the wooden breakwater, thence 336 deg. 30 min. for 680 feet, thence 243 deg. 20 min. for 220 feet, thence 146 deg. 40 min. for 980 feet to the bow of the partially submerged submarine, thence 78 deg. 40 min. for 55 feet, thence 173 deg. 20 min. for 126 feet, thence 203 deg. 30 min. for 112 feet, thence 216 degrees for 217 feet to a point on the main breakwater, thence by high water line to the point of commencement.

St. Kilda Anchorage.

All waters enclosed by the stone breakwater and wooden piers to southward of a line from the northern extremity of the stone breakwater to the white flashing light at the northern extremity of the pier.

- (d) generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the Municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Springvale and Noble Park order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless consistent with the context or subject-matter—

“The Council” means the Council of the Shire of Springvale and Noble Park.

“Dog” means and includes a dog of either sex over the age of six months.

“Person” includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of any property.

“Property” includes any tenement in separate occupation or ownership.

2. By-law No. 108 of the Shire of Springvale and Noble Park (formerly the Shire of Dandenong) is hereby repealed.

3. (1) No person shall keep more than two dogs on any property situate within an area prescribed or zoned under the By-laws of the Council or any Town Planning Scheme or Development Order as residential business or commercial except with the written permission of the Council.

(2) No person shall keep more than three dogs on any property situate within any other area not being an area prescribed or zoned under the By-laws of the Council or any Town Planning Scheme or Development Order as residential, business, or commercial except with the written permission of the Council.

(3) Any person applying for such permission shall—

(a) in the case of a first application, advertise his intention so to do at least one month before applying for such permission in the *Dandenong Journal* and the *Dandenong Advertiser* newspapers published at Dandenong; and

(b) make application in writing to the Council and, if a permit is sought to keep greyhounds, whippets, or other types of racing dogs, such application must also be accompanied by the approval in writing of the Dog Racing Control Board of Victoria.

(4) Any person interested in or affected by any application for a permit may object to the Council, such objection to be made in writing to the Municipal Clerk within one calendar month of the publication of the notice of intention as aforesaid.

(5) The Council shall, before issuing a permit, consider all objections made thereto as aforesaid.

(6) Every notice of intention to apply for a permit shall be in the form of the First Schedule, and every application for a permit shall be in the form of the Second Schedule, and every permit to be issued by the Council shall be in the form of the Third Schedule hereto.

(7) All applications for renewal of permits shall be lodged with the Council during the month of August and dealt with by the Council during the month of September in each year.

(8) Every permit shall be current for a period of twelve months only but may be renewed from time to time by the Council on the written application of the holder to do so.

(9) Any permit may be revoked or cancelled by the Council at any time if in its opinion the property by reason of the keeping of the number of dogs permitted becomes offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

(10) Every person giving false or misleading information in a notice of intention to apply for a permit or in any application for a permit shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

4. The occupier of any property on which a dog is kept shall cause the place of keeping of such dog to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.

5. Any person guilty of a wilful breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds or more than Twenty pounds and to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole municipal district of the Shire of Springvale and Noble Park.

1946 are hereby adopted in and shall operate throughout the Shire of Winchelsea:—

(9) *Obstructions, &c., to Streets, &c., by Cattle, &c.*

41. If any cattle are found without any person having charge of them—

(a) in any street, or

(b) upon any land (not being a common) which is not enclosed or fenced with some sufficient fence within the meaning of the *Fences Act 1928*, or any amendment thereof, and the openings (if any) in which fence are not secured and barred with gates or other fastenings of equivalent closeness and strength with the fence—

the proper officer of the Council may seize such cattle and impound them, or place them at some neighbouring place of safe custody, and any person rescuing or attempting to rescue or interfering with cattle placed at any such place of safe custody or seized for the purpose of being placed at any such place shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds or to imprisonment for a term of not more than six months.

42. The owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, or if such cattle are so found in any area declared by the Council to be a populous or residential area (which declaration the Council is hereby authorized to make) such owner shall forfeit a sum of not less than Five or more than Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may after the expiration of 24 hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases, and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

43. If such cattle by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the Council the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle are not sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.
