Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

 \mathbf{B}^{Y} virtue of the powers conferred by section four of the *Poisons Act* 1928, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and of victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation add the under-mentioned articles to the Parts of the Second Schedule to the said Act set forth, that is to say:—

PART II.—Convulsant substances such as Leptazol,
Nikethamide, Picrotoxin; their salts and
derivatives and preparations and admixtures thereof, by whatever name such
substances, salts, derivatives, preparations
or admixtures are described.

PART III.—Depressor substances such as metallic nitrites, amyl nitrite, ammonium nitrite, metallic thiocyanates, ammonium thiocyanate, the nitrites of gylcerol, erythrytol, sorbitol, triethanolamine and inositol, intended for internal use by human beings, derivatives of such substances intended for internal use by human beings; preparations and admixtures of any such substance or derivative intended for internal use by human beings, by whatever name such substance, derivative, preparation or admixture is described.

Pressor substances such as Adrenaline, Noradrenaline, Isoprenaline, Phenylephrine, Naphazoline, Pholedrine, Ephedrine, Phenylpropanolamine, Tuaminoheptane, Methoxyphenamine, Methoxamphetamine

Phenylpropanolamine, Tuaminoheptane, Methoxyphenamine, Methoxamine, Cyclopentamine, Amphetamine, Dexamphetamine, Methylamphetamine; derivatives of such substances; preparations and admixtures of such substances and of their derivatives.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section four of the Poisons Act 1928, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation remove the names of the following articles from those parts of the Second Schedule to the Poisons Act 1928 set forth against the name of each article: each article:-

PART I .- Picrotoxin.

PART II .-- Nitro-glycerine (medicinal) and medicinal preparations or admixtures thereof.

PART II.—Beta-aminopropylbenzene, its salts, its N-alkyl derivatives, their salts; beta-aminoisopropylbenzene, its salts, its N-alkyl derivatives, their salts, and preparations thereof, whether known as amphetamine, benzedrine, dexedrine, desoxyephedrine, or by any other name.

PART II .-- Ephedrine (including synthetic ephedrine) and its salts in all preparations and admixtures containing 1 per centum or more of ephedrine or synthetic ephedrine.

PART III.-Amyl nitrite.

2-phenyl-3-methyl-tetra-hydro-l, 4 oxazine-hydrochloride, whether known as Preludin or by any other name, and all preparations thereof.

And declare that Division 2 of Part III. of the Poisons Act 1928 shall apply to the substances or preparations so added in the same manner as the said Division applies to the substances or preparations included in the said paragraph (2).

Lithium compounds and their preparations, admixtures, solutions or other substances containing more than 0.1 per centum of Lithium (Li) when intended for

therapeutic use: and declare that Division 2 of Part III. of the *Poisons Act* 1928 shall apply to the substances or preparations so added as the said Division applies to the substances or preparations included in the said paragraph (2).

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS RESPECTING NETTING IN CERTAIN INLAND WATERS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation provide as follows:

- 1. Revoke the Proclamations made the tenth day of June, 1925, and the first day of September, 1937, and published in the Government Gazette of the seventeenth day of June, 1925, and the eighth day of September, 1937, respectively, regarding the use of nets and fixed engines in Lindsay River, &c., in the north-west of Victoria.
- 2. Permit the use of drum or hoop nets from the first day of December in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following for the purpose of taking fish in
 - (a) Lindsay River and its effluents and affluents on Lindsay Island.

 (b) Wallpola Creek and its effluents and affluents on Wallpola Island.

 (c) Potterwalkagee Creek and its effluents and

affluents on Potterwalkagee Island.

The use of such nets shall be subject to the following restrictions:-

- (1) The number of drum or hoop nets that may be used at any one time by a licensed fisherman in the above-mentioned waters shall not exceed twenty.
 (2) A drum or hoop net shall consist of not
- more than three hoops covered with net; such net and the attached wings shall be made of twine; the mesh of net on the hoops shall be not less than s inches and the mesh of the net in each wing shall be not less than 5 inches; the diameter of each hoop shall not exceed 4 feet and the outer hoops shall be not more than 5 feet apart when the net is set; the length of each wing shall not exceed 10 feet.

3. Vary the Proclamation made the twenty-first day of December, 1922, and published in the Government Gazette of the twenty-ninth day of December, 1922, respecting netting in certain portions of Waranga Reservoir by deleting therefrom all reference to the use of long lines or cross lines.
