Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 3, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF NUNAWADING.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Nunawading has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a road within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of

land reserved for a road, shown as Wood-street on lodged plans of subdivision, Nos. 9468, 12358 and 18676, being part of Crown allotment 117A, Parish of Nunawading, and being the land more particularly described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

WOOD-STREET.

Commencing at a point bearing north 77 deg. 42 min. east and distant 411 ft. 9 in. from the intersection of the southern alignment of Station-street and the eastern alignment of Springvale-road, bounded thence by lines bearing respectively south 7 deg. 48½ min. west 537 ft. 7 in., south 82 deg. 11½ min. east 14 ft. 11 in., south 7 deg. 57 min. west 496 feet, south 7 deg. 48½ min. west 162 feet, thence by the arc of a circle of radius 37 ft. 6 in., a distance of 58 ft. 11 in. to a point bearing south 37 deg. 11½ min. east, thence by the arc of a circle of radius 37 ft. 6 in. a distance of 58 ft. 11 in. to a point bearing north 52 deg. 48½ min. east, thence by the arc of a circle of radius 37 ft. 6 in. a distance of 32 ft. 6¼ in. to a point bearing north 17 deg. 2 min. west, thence by the arc of a circle whose centre lies easterly of radius 33 ft. 4 in. a distance of 28 ft. 10½ in. to a point bearing north 17 deg. 2 min. west, thence by lines bearing respectively north 7 deg. 48½ min. east 108 feet, north 7 deg. 57 min. east 496 feet, north 2 deg. 7 min. east 150 ft. 9 in., north 7 deg. 48½ min. east 395 ft. 10 in., north 42 deg. 45 min. east 16 ft. 5 in., and south 77 deg. 42 min. west 63 ft. 3 in. to the point of commencement.

Poisons Acts.

ADDITIONS TO THE SIXTH SCHEDULE TO THE POISONS ACT 1928 (No. 3748) AS AMENDED BY ACT No. 3918.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section thirty-eight of the *Poisons Act 1928* (No. 3748) as amended by section five of the *Poisons Act 1930* (No. 3918), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria do by this my Proclamation add to paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* as amended by the *Poisons Act 1930*, the names of the following substances or preparations, namely,

Antidiabetic substances which are sulphonamide derivatives of urea including BZ-55, Carbutamide, Invenal, Nadisan, Orinase, Rastinon, and Tolbutamide and declare that Division 2 of Part III. of the *Poisons Act 1928* as amended by the *Poisons Act 1930* shall apply to the substances or preparations named herein in the same manner as it applies to substances or preparations mentioned in the said paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule and the provisions of the said Division 2 shall apply accordingly.

PART I.

General.

1. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Cemetery" means the Lorne Public Cemetery and any further or other land managed, held, or acquired for the purpose of a cemetery by the Trustees.

"Memorial work" means any building, tomb, vault, tombstone, kerbing, memorial inscription, or other work erected or placed on any burial allotment.

"Officer in Charge" or "Authorized Officer" means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as the secretary or foreman.

"Trustees" means the Trustees for the time being of the Lorne Public Cemetery.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid to the Trustees or Authorized Officer when applications are made or orders given, and the fees payable for the time being shall be those set out in Schedule "A," provided that the fees set out in Schedule "A" may be changed from time to time without notice to any person, subject only to the consent of the Governor in Council and publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Any person desiring ground in the cemetery for a private grave, vault, tomb, or monument, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the Trustees therefor. If approved the Trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form set out in Schedule "B" hereof.

4. Except with permission of the Officer in Charge first had and obtained, no vehicle except hearses and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter or stand opposite the entrance gates of the cemetery save for the purpose of loading or unloading, which shall be carried out with all due despatch. No horse-drawn vehicle shall be permitted to enter the cemetery, nor shall visitors, workmen, or other persons be permitted to ride bicycles within the area of the cemetery.

5. No dogs shall be admitted to the cemetery, unless on a leash and in the charge of some person over the age of sixteen years.

6. The Authorized Officer or Officer in Charge shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters connected with the cemetery, and subject to the provisions of the Cemeteries Act the direction of such person shall in all matters and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

7. Any workman or other employee, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times while in the cemetery be subject to the supervision and control of the Officer in Charge and shall obey all or any directions given to him by the said Officer in Charge, and upon any breach of these Regulations shall be subject to the penalty prescribed by section 10 of the *Cemeteries Act 1928*.

8. No person in the cemetery or in its approaches shall commit any nuisance or trespass or be guilty of any breach of decorum or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, nor cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the cemetery any grass plot, boarder, railing, fence, or any other erection or gate therein or move or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying-place. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the cemetery or at any gateway thereof or any approach thereto any trade, business, or calling either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

9. Touting for business within the area of the cemetery is strictly forbidden, and no employees of the Trustees shall act as agents for monumental masons either directly or indirectly, nor shall they accept or receive gratuities or commission of any kind. In the event of

a breach of this Regulation, the employee of the Trustee shall be dismissed forthwith and the monumental mason or other person involved in such breach of this Regulation shall thenceforth be refused admission to the cemetery of himself, his servants and agents and employees, or his employers or principals.

10. All exhumations must be in accordance with the *Cemeteries Act 1928* and shall only be made after the permission of the Trustees has been obtained.

11. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of the owner. When in the opinion of the Trustees any monument, tablet, gravestone, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection as aforesaid is likely to become dangerous, the Trustees may give notice to the owner or person responsible requiring such person to repair the same. If within reasonable time such repair is not effected after the Trustees have given notice to the owner requiring them to carry out such repairs as are necessary, the Trustees may take down, remove such monument, tombstone, gravestone, tablet, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection and sell or otherwise dispose of the materials of which the same was composed. The Trustees shall not be required to account for the proceeds of such sale or for such disposition of the materials, except on application made by the owner within twelve months of the notice of the Trustees as aforesaid. A notice signed by the Trustees and forwarded by pre-paid post to the address of such owner or person last known to the Officer in Charge shall be sufficient notice to comply with the requirements of this Regulation, and shall be deemed to have been received by the person to whom it is addressed.

12. All complaints and inquiries concerning these Regulations, their enforcement, and the conduct of the cemetery generally must be made in writing and shall be addressed to the Secretary, Lorne Cemetery Trust, Lorne.

PART II.

Memorial Work.

13. Any person desiring to construct, erect, add to, or alter any memorial work or any construction or erection in any part of the cemetery shall, at least seven days before it is proposed to commence the erection or construction thereof or to carry out any alterations or additions thereto, apply in writing to the Trustees for permission to do so and at the same time submit on the form issued by the Trustees a drawing of the proposed work with full particulars, including the position, size of foundation, and all other structural details, and shall not commence the work unless and until permission to do so has been given in writing by the Trustees and all fees payable in respect thereof as herein provided have been paid.

14. The position of all memorial work shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees as to general effect and order, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the cemetery in an appropriate manner.

15. No person shall place on any memorial in any part of the cemetery any inscription, epitaph writing, drawing, or design without first furnishing a copy of the same to the Trustees and receiving their written permission for such inscription, epitaph writing, drawing, or design to be so placed and upon payment of such fee as is hereinafter provided.

16. A deposit of Two pounds on every memorial or on every separate item of memorial work shall be paid by all masons or other persons carrying out memorial work prior to commencing work in the cemetery, and the deposit shall be held by the Trustees until the work is completed and shall thereupon be refunded to the person making such payment upon completion of the work if such person has cleared away all surplus soil and has removed out of the cemetery all refuse and surplus materials left over at the completion of the work and has made good the site of the work to the satisfaction of the Officer in Charge, provided that if any person carrying out any work makes default in any of the foregoing provisions the deposit of Two pounds shall be applied by the Trustees towards the cost of removing any refuse or soil and/or making good the site of the work, and in the event of the cost of such work exceeding the sum of Two pounds the mason or other person responsible for complying with these provisions shall be liable to pay to the Trustees the additional cost of the work.

17. In estimating the value of memorial work, the total cost of the work is to be taken into account by the Trustees, and shall include all foundations and work under and/or above the ground and the inscriptions

thereon, and the Trustees or the Officer in Charge on their behalf shall have the power to make inquiries as to the costs of any memorial work.

18. In any case where the Trustees are not satisfied with the amount submitted to them as the cost for any memorial work, they may assess the value of the work and impose a charge calculated at the rate herein provided on the value of the memorial work as assessed by them. The value so assessed shall in the absence of proof by the applicant that it is incorrect be deemed to be the value of any such memorial work.

19. The costs of alteration of or of addition to or of amendment of any memorial work already erected shall be deemed to be part of the cost of erection of the said memorial work for the purpose of making any such charge or charges.

20. A charge of 2½ per cent. of the cost of memorial work, subject to the minimum charge of One pound, will be made for all memorial work carried out in the cemetery. Any additional work carried out on existing memorials shall be subject to an additional charge at the rate of 2½ per cent. of the cost of such additional work or alterations, provided that in the case of additional work the minimum charge of £1 shall not apply.

21. Where any memorial work is erected upon foundations of reinforced concrete or brick such foundations shall have a pier at each corner of the full depth of the grave or to the full depth of the adjoining graves, or as directed. The excavations for foundations shall have square sides or sides wider at the bottom, and the excavations must be inspected by the Officer in Charge before any concrete is poured. All of concrete in any one foundation shall be poured at the one time, and such concrete shall be composed of the following substances, that is to say:—Screenings, sand, and cement in the proportions of four, two and one respectively. All screenings used must be 3-in. blue metal or granite.

22. When any memorial work is carried out, the whole space between the kerbing thereof and any of the adjoining kerbings and pathways shall be filled with concrete to the satisfaction of the Officer in Charge. Such concrete must be laid in the form of paving and shall not be less than 3 inches in thickness, and shall comply with the specification for concrete for foundations as herein provided.

23. In any case where stones are laid for kerbing they shall be not less than 6 inches wide, and when the kerbing consists of a single course of stone such stone shall be not less than 12 inches high, and when the kerbing consists of more than one course the bottom course thereof shall be not less than 12 inches high. Any kerbing not exceeding 8 inches in length shall be done on the one level and in the one length. The outer face of all kerbing shall be accurately placed on the proper boundary line of the allotment.

24. The Trustees may in such portions of the cemetery as they see fit disallow the construction of concrete and granolite kerbs and head pieces, and no wooden kerbs are to be constructed and no buffalo grass is to be planted on or around any grave without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first had and obtained.

25. No headstone shall be less than 1 inch thick, provided that—

- (a) where the height of any headstone exceeds 1 ft. 6 in. such headstone shall be not less than 1½ inch in thickness; and
- (b) where the height of any headstone exceeds 2 ft. 6 in. such headstone shall be not less than 2½ inches in thickness; and
- (c) where the height of any headstone exceeds 3 ft. 6 in. such headstone shall be not less than 3 inches in thickness.

26. No memorial work shall be erected on any common grave in the cemetery.

27. The erection or carrying out of any memorial work shall be commenced not later than on the day following the delivery of the necessary materials to the cemetery, and save and except for delay due to bad weather any such work having been commenced shall be proceeded with from day to day until completed.

28. No material of any kind for memorial work shall be brought into the cemetery on a Saturday, except where special permission is given by the Officer in Charge, and such permission shall only be given in a case where materials are required to finish work already commenced and which work can in the opinion of the Officer in Charge be completed by noon on that day.

29. No bricks, screenings, sand, stone, or any other materials used in or in connexion with memorial work shall be stored in the cemetery.

30. All materials, including sand, must be provided by the person carrying on the work in the cemetery, and any surplus materials must be removed as soon as the work is completed.

31. No mortar or cement shall be mixed in the cemetery, except upon a proper mortar or mixing board or in a concrete mixing machine.

32. Cement or concrete tops taken from graves must not be used in or in connexion with any memorial work or other work in the cemetery.

33. Material of any kind brought into the cemetery in connexion with any memorial or other work and not removed within ten days after the completion of such work may without notice be disposed of by the Trustees in such manner as they may direct.

34. The Trustees shall have the right to remove any memorial work which in their opinion does not comply with these Regulations, or in their discretion they may order such work to be altered to comply with these Regulations, and where any memorial work is in the opinion of the Trustees out of repair, the Trustees may order such work to be renovated if in their opinion it is in the interests of the cemetery for such renovation or repairs to be carried out.

35. The designer's or mason's name or names, or both, if the owner of such work agrees, may be placed upon any memorial work, provided that no address or other particulars are added and the lettering of the name does not exceed ½ inch, and provided further that where the designer or mason has a trade plate of approved design and the area of the plate does not exceed 10 square inches such name plate may be affixed to the memorial work.

36. Monumental masons when carrying out memorial work shall cut into such memorial work the number of the grave in a position and in figuring of a size to be indicated by the Officer in Charge.

37. No monumental mason who carries on any work in the cemetery shall enter the cemetery during a Saturday afternoon or a Sunday, save and except by appointments which shall have been notified to the Cemetery Office not later than Eleven a.m. on the Saturday immediately preceding the appointments. Failure by monumental masons to observe this Regulation shall be treated by the Trustees as canvassing for business by such monumental masons and shall be dealt with accordingly.

38. All grave labels shall remain the property of the Trustees, and any grave label replaced by any monumental mason must be returned by the monumental mason carrying out such work to the Officer in Charge.

PART III.

Interments.

39. All applications for interment shall be made at the Cemetery Office at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for burial.

40. The name, age, late place of residence, cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars set out in Schedule "C" shall be furnished at the time of making the application.

41. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave, or vault shall be permitted to construct such grave or vault, provided the construction thereof is approved by the Trustees and the construction thereof is carried out under the supervision of the Officer in Charge and upon payment of the required fees. Every coffin placed in a brick grave or vault shall be bricked in or covered by a slab of stone or slate and properly cemented.

42. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead, copper, or other suitable plate with the name of the deceased stamped or engraved thereon.

43. No interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which during life the person had no claim the written consent of the owner shall be produced with the application.

44. The regular hours fixed for burial shall be as follows, unless and until otherwise notified by the Trustees:—

On week days from 9 a.m. to 12 noon and from 1.30 p.m. to 4.30 p.m.

On Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 11.30 a.m.

On Sundays or holidays (when permitted) from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m.

45. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery and such time shall be punctually observed. In the event of the funeral arriving at the cemetery more than twenty minutes after the time appointed the Trustees may charge a late fee for every half-hour or part thereof by which the time of arrival of the funeral is later than the appointed time.

46. No interment shall be allowed on Sundays, except when it is certified, in writing, by a duly qualified medical practitioner or a stipendiary magistrate or a justice of the peace that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial takes place on that day. For the purpose of this Regulation Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Anzac Day shall be regarded as being a Sunday.

Third.—That the said grave or vault, and the said wall, building, fence, monument, or tombstone shall be maintained and kept by the said _____ and _____ representatives in proper repair to the satisfaction of the said Trustees.

Fourth.—That the said _____ and _____ heirs and near relations shall, in the use of the said piece of ground and access thereto, be subject in every respect to such rules and Regulations as the Trustees of the said cemetery may from time to time make, and shall not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or inter therein except on payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by the said Trustees.

Cemeteries Acts.

BROADFORD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Cemeteries Acts, the trustees of the Broadford Public Cemetery hereby make the following Rules and Regulations, which shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication every Rule and Regulation heretofore made by the said trustees shall be and is hereby rescinded:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars in form Schedule B supplied, an order obtained, and a certificate from the Registrar of Deaths, the Coroner, or Justice of the Peace, has been delivered to the secretary or sexton.
2. Before any interment shall be permitted all charges must be paid when the order for the sexton will be given authorizing the grave to be dug and the interment to take place.
3. The order for interment must be given to the sexton before 12 o'clock noon on the day previous to the interment where a morning interment is required, and before 2 p.m. on the day previous to the interment where an afternoon interment is required.
4. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time of arrival at the cemetery and such time shall be punctually observed.
5. The usual hours of interment shall be between 10 a.m. and to 4.30 p.m. from Monday to Friday, and 9.30 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturday, but burials may be permitted outside of these hours on payment of the prescribed fees with the consent of the Chairman or Secretary.
6. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required or any alteration made thereto, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person appointed by them. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person the burial right must accompany the application.
7. Every coffin placed in a vault or brick grave shall be bricked in, cemented, and made airtight.
8. No adult shall be buried within 4 feet nor child under the age of twelve years within 3 feet of the ordinary surface level, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
9. A certificate of ground for a burial place within the cemetery may be granted by the Secretary in the form and to the effect set out in Schedule C on payment of fees prescribed.
10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Registrar of Deaths, the Coroner, or Justice of the Peace, and of the licence for disinterment from the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
11. Before any person commences the erection of any tablet, headstone, monument, tomb, vault, fence, railing, or enclosure the permission of the trustees must be obtained, also payment made of fees set out in the scale of charges. Persons desiring to make such erection are required to submit designs, drawings, or descriptions, proposed location, also a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph, and such information as the trustees may require. The trustees may withhold permission and prevent the proposed erection of anything which may appear to them as unappropriate, unbecoming, or not sufficiently durable.
12. Every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection shall be maintained in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner or owners. Where any monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection is allowed to fall into a state of disrepair and the owners fail to carry out repairs to the satisfaction of the trustees within seven days after the serving of

written notice so to do by the trustees to the last registered address of the owners, the trustees may remove such monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection.

13. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and the trustees may refuse to allow any vehicle conveying such material to enter the cemetery during wet or unfavourable weather. Stones, refuse, and rubbish or other materials remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the persons employed on the work, and in the event of any such refuse or other material not being removed within seven days after completion of the work the trustees may have same removed at the expense of the persons or firm carrying out such work.

14. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying or causing to be done any damage to any monument, tombstone or vault, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanour, and on being convicted thereof is liable to the penalties provided by the Cemeteries Act.

15. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

16. These Rules and Regulations may be altered or amended and additions made thereto from time to time by the trustees with the consent of the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the Cemeteries Acts.

17. No person being the owner of the exclusive right of burial of a grave shall transfer such right without the consent of the trustees, and no transfer shall be consented to by the trustees except a transfer to a near relative of the owner, or a transfer to the trustees.

18. No dogs will be allowed in the cemetery.

THE KILMORE RACECOURSE—REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACECOURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION, PARISH OF GLENBURNIE, COUNTY OF DALHOUSIE, KNOWN AS "THE KILMORE RACECOURSE."

WE, Edward Joseph Butler, of Bylands, farmer, Francis Patrick Butler, of Bylands, grazier, Thomas George Chapman, of Kilmore, farmer, George Lonie Hudson, of Kilmore, auctioneer, Charles George Meier, of Kilmore, farmer, Reginald Gerard Hoban, of Kilmore, solicitor, Frederick John Wallder, of Kilmore, butcher, John Kelly, of Kilmore East, grazier, and Charles Joseph Vincent Dillon, of Kilmore, grazier, being the duly appointed Trustees of the land reserved for a Racecourse and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Parish of Glenburnie, known as the "Kilmore Racecourse," and being the land comprised in Crown grant, volume 1989, folio 307650, have in the exercise of the powers conferred on us by the said Crown grant thereof, and by the *Land Act 1928*, the *Police Offences Act 1928*, and of any and every other power us enabling so to do and with the approval of the said Governor in Council, make the following Regulations:—

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

REGULATION I.

(Repeal of Former Regulations.)

The Regulations and By-laws heretofore made with reference to the said land, or any part thereof, are hereby repealed and rescinded.

REGULATION II.

(Divisions of Land.)

The divisions into which the said land, with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon, is parcelled out are as follow:—

- (1) Car park.
- (2) Grandstand enclosure.
- (3) Birdcage and mounting yard.
- (4) Members' enclosure.
- (5) Saddling paddock, owners' and trainers' stand.
- (6) The course proper and training track.
- (7) Judge's box, stewards' room, weighing room, stewards' stand.
- (8) Secretary's office, jockeys' room, press room, and committee room.
- (9) Betting enclosure.
- (10) The remainder of the course.

REGULATION III.

(Bringing Horses, &c., on Land.)

Except when a race-meeting or agricultural show is being held thereon, no person shall bring any horse or other animal on any part of the said land without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees or of some person

duly authorized, in writing, by such Trustees. When a race-meeting or agricultural show is being held thereon, no person shall bring any horse or other animal on any part of the said land without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club or the Kilmore Agricultural Society, whichever is appropriate, or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by such Committees.

REGULATION IV.

(Training Horses.)

The fee for permission to train or exercise horses on the said land shall be, for each horse for each half-year, £1. Horses shall be trained and exercised on such part or parts of the said land as the Trustees, or some person duly authorized, in writing, by the Trustees, may from time to time direct. No person shall train or exercise a horse upon any other part of the said land.

REGULATION V.

(Application of Training Fees.)

The moneys received as fees for permission to train horses shall be applied in maintaining the training grounds and course proper in a fit and proper condition, and in otherwise rendering the said land convenient and suitable for racing purposes.

REGULATION VI.

(Damaging Buildings, Plantations, &c.)

No person shall—

- (a) In any way damage or deface any fence, building, or erection on the said land.
- (b) Damage, break down, destroy, or interfere with any trees or shrubs growing upon the said land.
- (c) Trample any flower-beds upon the said land, or pull up, break down, or destroy any plant or flower growing therein.
- (d) Pollute any artificial lake or pond on the said land, or throw or place any rubbish, debris, or other substance thereon.
- (e) Drive, ride, or propel any motor vehicle, motor bicycle, or bicycle on, along, or over any of the paths or lawns on the said land.

REGULATION VII.

(Distributing and Posting Bills, &c.)

No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees, or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by the Trustees, distribute, or assist in distributing, any bill, placard, or notice within the limits of the said land, or post or stick, or assist in posting or sticking, any bill, placard, or notice upon any fence, wall, building, property, or premises on the said land.

On any day set apart for the holding of a race-meeting thereon, no person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by the said Committee, distribute, or assist in distributing, any bill, placard, or notice within the limits of the said land, or post or stick, or assist in posting or sticking, any bill, placard, or notice upon any fence, wall, building, property, or premises on the said land.

REGULATION VIII.

(Entering upon Certain Parts of the Land.)

Except on a day when a race-meeting is being held on the said land, no person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by the Trustees, enter upon any part of the division of the said land numbered 6.

No person shall at any time take or drive any motor vehicle, or other vehicle of any description, on to or across the fifth division of the said land without the permission of the Trustees in writing.

REGULATION IX.

(Lighting Fires.)

Except on a day when a race-meeting or agricultural show is being held thereon, no person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees, or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by the Trustees, light any fire on any part of the said land, or in any building, shed, or premises thereon.

On a day when a race-meeting or agricultural show is being held thereon, no person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, or the Committee of the Kilmore Agricultural Society, or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by one of the said Committees, light any fire on any part of the said land, or in any building, shed, or premises thereon.

REGULATION X.

(Remaining in Buildings at Night.)

No person shall enter, loiter, or remain within any building, shed, or other premises on the said land after Seven o'clock in the evening.

REGULATION XI.

(Games and Sports.)

No person shall—

- (a) Play or practice, or engage in any game or sport, on any part of the said land other than such parts as may be set apart by the Trustees for the purposes of such game or sport.
- (b) Play or practice, or engage in any game or sport, on any part of the said land set apart by the Trustees for that purpose, except upon and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Trustees, or any Committee of the Trustees, or any sub-committee having control of such game or sport may from time to time prescribe.

The Trustees may from time to time appoint a sub-committee or sub-committees, and delegate to such sub-committee or sub-committees the control of such parts of the said land as are set apart for particular games and sports, and such sub-committee or sub-committees may prescribe the conditions upon which any such games or sports may be played or practised, or engaged in upon the parts of the said land so set apart.

REGULATION XII.

(Hawkers and Pedlars.)

No person shall carry on the business or vocation of a vendor of fruit, confectionery, soft drinks, or foodstuffs upon the said land without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees, except upon race days, when the permission, in writing, of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club must first be obtained.

No person shall hawk or peddle goods, wares, or merchandise, or attempt to hawk or peddle goods, wares, or merchandise, upon the said land without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees, except upon race days, when the permission, in writing, of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club must first be obtained.

REGULATION XIII.

(Misconduct, &c., on the Land.)

No person shall, on the said land—

- (1) Assault any other person.
- (2) Use any profane, indecent, obscene language, or any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (3) Be drunk and disorderly.
- (4) Solicit alms.
- (5) Behave riotously or indecently, or otherwise misbehave or misconduct himself.

REGULATION XIV.

(Dogs.)

No person shall take any dog on any part of the said land when a race-meeting is being held thereon, and no person shall at any time take or keep any dog on any part of the said land unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord, or other similar means.

REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO RACE DAYS ONLY.

REGULATION XV.

(Restriction to Race Days.)

The following Regulations XVI. to XXX., both inclusive, shall apply only to days on which race-meetings are held on the said land.

REGULATION XVI.

(Entering on Land Without a Ticket.)

Unless otherwise authorized under these Regulations, no person shall enter upon any part of the said land unless he shall have a badge or ticket duly authorizing him so to do. The Trustees, notwithstanding anything herein contained, shall at all times be admitted to all parts of the said land on production of a ticket or badge so authorizing them.

REGULATION XVII.

(Tolls and Charges.)

The following tolls, entrance fees, and charges for admission may be levied upon, taken from, and made to

persons other than member of the Kilmore Turf Club and ladies holding members ladies' tickets of the said club:—

For the admission to the first division:	s. d.
Of every horse with or without vehicle and of every motor car or motor bicycle with or without side-car	2 0
For the admission of each male person to the second division a sum not exceeding	15 0
For the admission of each person to the third division a sum not exceeding	3 0
For the admission of each female person to the second division a sum not exceeding	8 0
For the admission of each person to the fourth division enclosure a sum not exceeding	7 6

Every person paying the prescribed sum for admission shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, or (wherever a turnstile is installed) shall pay the prescribed sum to the clerk in charge of the turnstile:

Provided that all members of the Kilmore Turf Club, and ladies holding ladies' tickets, upon production thereof, shall be admitted to any part of the said divisions.

The above charges for admission do not include any entertainment or amusement tax that may from time to time be in operation. The Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, or any person duly authorized, in writing, by the said Committee, may exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any of such tolls, entrance fees, or charges, or may reduce, or within the limits aforesaid vary, the same from time to time.

REGULATION XVIII.

(Production and Surrender of Tickets.)

Every person to whom a badge or ticket has been issued authorizing him to enter upon any part of the said land shall, upon demand, produce such badge or ticket to any gatekeeper, or servant, or other person having authority from the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club to demand production of the same. Every person who has received a ticket under the last preceding Regulation shall, in addition, if required, surrender any such ticket to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from such Committee to demand the surrender of the same.

REGULATION XIX.

(Judge's Box, Stewards' Stand, &c.)

No person except the judge and timekeeper appointed by the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, and any person the judge may call to his assistance, or the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club may direct, shall enter the judge's box. No person shall enter the stewards' stand or the stewards' room except the stewards acting at a race-meeting, and such persons as they may invite to do so.

REGULATION XX.

(Weighing-room and Yard.)

No person shall enter or remain in the weighing-room or the mounting-yard, or the approaches thereto, except the stewards acting at a race-meeting and the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, and those authorized by such Committee, the jockeys requiring to be weighed and the owners and trainers of horses whose jockeys are being or are about to be weighed.

REGULATION XXI.

(Committee Stand and Rooms, &c.)

No person, on race days, shall enter the Committee stand or the Committee rooms and offices, or the approaches thereto respectively, except the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, and those authorized by such Committee.

REGULATION XXII.

(Thieves, Pickpockets, &c.)

No person who has been convicted in a court of law of robbery or larceny, or of an attempt to commit robbery or larceny, or of obtaining money by false pretences, or of an attempt to obtain money by false pretences, or who is a reputed thief or pickpocket, or suspected person, or an associate of thieves or pickpockets, balancer, welsher, ticktacker, urger, tout, or prostitute, or who plays, or attempts to play, any unlawful game, shall enter or remain on any part of the said land, and may be removed by any member of the Police Force, or by any person acting under the authority of the Trustees or of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club.

REGULATION XXIII.

(Remaining on Land After Race-Meeting.)

No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, or of some person duly authorized by such Committee, remain on any part of the said land for a longer period than half an hour after the last race of the day has been run.

REGULATION XXIV.

(Refusing Entrance.)

On any day on which a race-meeting is held, any person who, in any divisions of the said land, as set out in Regulation II. of these Regulations—

- (a) assaults any person;
- (b) behaves in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening, or insulting manner, or is drunk and disorderly;
- (c) uses any profane, indecent, obscene, threatening, abusive, or insulting words;
- (d) solicits alms;
- (e) acts as ticktacker, tout, urger, canvasser or runner for any bookmaker or other person;
- (f) has been convicted in a court of competent jurisdiction of any of the offences set out in (a), (b), and (c) of this Regulation, on the said land,

may be refused admission to the said land, or having been admitted to the said land or having entered thereon, may be expelled therefrom after being warned off or directed to leave the said land by any person acting under the authority of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, or by any member of the Police Force, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission to the said land, and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the said land, or any part thereof.

No person who has been refused admission shall enter the said land, or having been warned off or requested to leave the said land, shall remain thereon, or on any part thereof.

REGULATION XXV.

(Undesirable Persons.)

On any day on which a race-meeting is held, any person who, in the opinion of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club is not a desirable person to be admitted, shall not be admitted to any part of the said land, and may be expelled therefrom after having been warned off or directed to leave the said land by any person acting under the authority of the Committee, or by any member of the Police Force, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission, and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the said land, or any part thereof.

REGULATION XXVI.

(Warning Off.)

Any person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club to be a defaulter in payment of any bets, or to have been guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been disqualified by virtue of any rules of racing under which the said club races, may be warned off the said land, or any part or division thereof, by the said Committee, or by any person acting under the authority of the said Committee in that behalf, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission, or is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the said land, or any part thereof.

REGULATION XXVII.

(Remaining on Land after Warning Off.)

No person shall remain on the said land, or any part or division thereof, after having been warned off such land, part or division under the last preceding Regulation.

REGULATION XXVIII.

No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained and then only in and on such portions thereof as may be set apart for that purpose.

REGULATION XXIX.

The Trustees shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows, sports, or for athletic training or other physical recreation, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions, including the right to charge members of the public for admission as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

ENFORCEMENT OF REGULATIONS.

REGULATION XXX.

(Removal of Offenders.)

Any person offending against any of these Regulations may be removed from the said land by any member of the Police Force, or by any person acting under the authority of the Trustees, or of Committee of the Kilmore Turf Club, or of the Kilmore Agricultural Society, and such removal shall not exempt him from any penalty to which he would otherwise be liable for such offence.

PENALTIES.

Every person offending against any of these rules and Regulations shall in accordance with section 182, *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5); and every person who so offends, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
