#### PROPORTION.

#### Females Improvers.

Two female improvers to every six or fraction of six female workers receiving not less than 195s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

#### JUVENILE WORKERS.

Two juvenile workers to every six or fraction of six female workers receiving not less than 195s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

Note.—A juvenile worker is a female person under 21 years of age (other than an apprentice or an improver) employed in bagmaking at machining, cutting, turning, folding, breaking-off, or flying.
