Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I. Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6, 7, of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1956.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Road Traffic Act 1956 it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act shall apply only in respect of infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of such Part by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette and occurring after the date of such Proclamation:

And whereas it is also enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such Part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular area or circumstance:

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Proclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Ringwood has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part in respect only to parking infringements to the Borough of Ringwood:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation specify the Borough of Ringwood as an area in which Part II. of the Road Traffic Act 1956 shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.





REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE WANGARATTA SHOW GROUNDS RESERVE.

Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Wangaratta, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 23rd October, 1956, as a site for Show Grounds and Public Recreation, together with the abutting permanent reservation along the Ovens River, the whole known as the Wangaratta Show Grounds. The Reserve has been placed under the control of a "Committee of Management" hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
 - 2. No person shall:-
 - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
 - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
 - (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
 - (d) Offer any article of food or drink, or any other commodity whatsoever for sale, or bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
 - (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed at the Reserve.

- (f) Climb, jump, get on or over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements, or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture, or fittings, gates, fences, seats. or other structures in the Reserve.
- (g) Interfere with, break, or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs, or plants, or pluck any of the flowers or walk on the beds or borders in the Reserve.
- (h) Leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse, or rubbish whatever therein, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything therein that might injure any person.
- (i) Light a fire in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee.
- (j) Carry or discharge any fire-arms or air guns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any game or birds therein without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (k) Bet publicly in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.
- (1) Spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- (m) Erect any building, tent, or structure, or camp on any portion of the Reserve without permission in writing of the Committee first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.
- (n) Bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission of the Committee.
- (o) Do anything whatever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent in writing of the Committee first obtained.

Every person infringing this Regulation in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable.

- For the purpose of maintaining good order, any person authorized by the Committee may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.
- 4. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee to leave the same.
- 5. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any society, club, association, or person for the purpose of holding agriculture and other shows, football, cricket, or other matches, fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows or sports, or for playing football, cricket, lacrosse, hockey, or other athletic games, or for athletic training or other physical recreation subject to payment of such fees, and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinafter provided.
- 6. No club, association, society, or person shall hold, or take part in any organized entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee first obtained.
- 7. No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, nor any other person shall play, practise, train, or engage in any game or sport, or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, unless any such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized by the said Committee to play in the Reserve at such time.
- 8. No person except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fees chargeable for admission.
- 9. No person shall park a motor car or motor cycle within the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose, and any person using any such place for parking a motor car or motor cycle shall, on demand by an authorized officer of the Committee, pay such fee as is from time to time determined by such Committee, not exceeding Two shillings, in respect of any such car or cycle for the use of such parking area on such days only as a charge for admission is being made, as hereinafter provided for.
- 10. All animals and all poultry entering the Reserve must be under proper control, and the owner of any animal or poultry that causes damage within the Reserve shall be responsible therefor.

- 11. No person shall take or drive any carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal into the Reserve without the permission of the Committee, and no horse or other animal drawing any such carriage, cart, or other vehicle shall, whilst in the Reserve, be detached or unharnessed therefrom, or left without a person in charge thereof.
- 12. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee, and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member of the Committee, or by any member of the Police Force, or by any bailiff of Crown lands.
- 13. No person except labourers and workmen employed on the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.
- 14. The maximum fee which may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding 156 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for the purpose of agricultural or other shows, cricket, football, or other matches, fétes, sports, carnivals, entertainments, or musical performances, shall not exceed the sum of twelve shillings and six pence
- 15. Every person to whom a ticket has been issued authorizing such person to enter upon the Reserve shall upon demand produce and, and if required, surrender such ticket to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand such production or surrender of tickets.
- 16. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any shows, cricket, or football matches, fetes, sports carnivals, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit with the Committee any sum not exceeding One hundred pounds Committee any sum not exceeding One hundred pounds (£100), which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may repair or make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.
- 17. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve, or refusing to obey those authorized by the Committee, or by the club, association, or persons renting or having been granted the use of the Reserve for the time being to keep order shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom, notwithstanding that such person may have purchased a tickly for admirision such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and shall also be liable to a prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.
