DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33 OF THE LABOUR AND INDUSTRY ACT 1953.

Apprentices.

One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 338s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

Improvers (Males).

Four improvers to each male worker receiving not less than 338s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

Females.

Two improvers to each female worker receiving not less than 252s, 3d. per week of 40 hours.

Definition of Juvenile Workers.

6428

Persons other than apprentices or improvers under 18 years of age doing general work, i.e., all work except—

(a) picking out or selecting;

(b) making in the raw state;

(c) twisting in the dry state.

PROPORTION (IN ANY PLACE).

Males

Six juvenile workers to each worker receiving not less than 338s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

Females.

Three juvenile workers to each worker receiving not less than 252s. 3d. per week of 40 hours.
