Clauses, other than clauses 2 and 17 of the said Determination, shall remain in force, provided that, to the weekly earnings of each pieceworker shall be added the sum of twenty six shillings. Where less than 40 hours is worked in any week by any pieceworker, a proportionate amount of such sum of twenty six shillings shall be added in lieu thereof.
