ORDER EXTENDING APPLICATION OF THE LANDLORD AND TENANT ACT 1948 TO CERTAIN PREMISES.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Landlord and Tenant Act 1948, the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the Government Gazette, declare that the application of that Act shall extend to any particular premises specified in the Order: And whereas such an Order may be made and shall have full force and effect in respect of specified premises to which it relates, notwithstanding that those premises prior to the making of the Order have become by or pursuant to the operation of some other provision of the Landlord and Tenant Acts exempt from the operation of Parts II., III., IV. and V. of the Landlord and Tenant Act 1948: And whereas it is expedient that those Parts shall extend to certain premises at Carlton hereinafter specified: Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare that the application of the Landlord and Tenant Act 1948 shall extend to each of the following premises:—

- 1. The premises known as No. 67 Barkly-street,
 ____ Carlton.
- Carlton.

 2. The premises known as No. 46 Faraday-street,
 Carlton.

And the Honorable Arthur Gordon Rylah, Her Majesty's Attorney-General in and for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
