PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF ROMSEY.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Romsey has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a road within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land, being the road shown on the plans of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles and numbered 4897 and 4901 in the Parish of Lancefield, and more particularly described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

Commencing at the south-eastern angle of lot 2 on plan of subdivision No. 4901, thence bearing 359 deg. 18 min. for 288.6 links, 337 deg. 51 min. for 1,904.7 links, and 353 deg. 54 min. for 2,396.5 links to the north-eastern angle of lot 5 on the said plan of subdivision, thence along a railway reserve bearing 248 deg. 18 min. for 104 links to the north-western angle of lot 6, thence 173 deg. 54 min. for 2,410.5 links, 157 deg. 51 min. for 1,909.5 links, 179 deg.

 $18\,$ min. for 308 links to the south-western angle of lot 9, thence 269 deg. 35 min. for 100 links to the point of commencement.

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT LAVERTON.

PROCLAMATION


By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c. &c.

I THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Froclamation revoke the Proclamations made the fourth day of July, 1939 and the twenty-sixth day of October, 1948 and published in the Government Gazettes of the fifth day of July, 1939 and the twenty-seventh day of October, 1948 respectively, respecting sanctuary for native game at Laverton and sanctuary for native game at the Explosive Reserve near Altona respectively, and in lieu thereof direct that the part of Victoria within the area

hereinafter described shall be a locality in which from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the Game Act 1928.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1956.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Road Traffic Act 1956 it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act shall apply only in respect of infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of such Part by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette and occurring after the date of such Proclamation:

And whereas it is also enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such Part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular area or circumstance:

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Proclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the City of Warrnambool has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part in respect only of parking infringements to the City of Warrnambool:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation specify the City of Warrnambool as an area in which Part II. of the Road Traffic Act 1956 shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Acts and of all other powers hereunto enabling, the following amendments to Chapter I. of the Rules of the Supreme Court are made and shall take effect from the first day of May, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven:—

- 1. To Order XVIA add new Rule 10A:-
 - (1) Where, in any action in which damages are claimed against an alleged tortfeasor, a defendant takes proceedings (in this rule referred to as "Contribution Proceedings") to recover contribution or indemnity pursuant to section 2 of the Wrongs (Tortfeasors) Act 1949, against any person, whether a defendant to the action or not, any party to the contribution proceedings may at any time serve upon the other party or all of the other parties (if more than one) to the contribution proceedings a notice in writing stating his willingness—
 - (a) that liability to the plaintiff shall be admitted by all
 parties to the contribution proceedings who are
 defendants in the action; and
 - (b) himself to pay a proportion, specified in the notice, of whatever damages and costs the plaintiff may recover in the action.

In such notice he may in addition, if he so desires, state his willingness to contribute in the said proportion towards a specified total sum to be paid into Court with an admission of liability by a defendant to be named in such notice.

- (2) (a) Subject to paragraphs (b), (c) and (d) of this sub-rule, any such notice, whether or not it is expressed to be without prejudice, shall stand in the same position as regards admissibility in evidence in any proceedings as if it were an offer of settlement expressed to be without prejudice;
- (b) No communication or disclosure of the contents of any such notice or of the fact that a notice has been served under this Rule shall be made either to the Judge or to the Jury at the trial of the action or the contribution proceedings until all issues in the action and in such proceedings have been determined:
- (c) After all such issues have been determined any party may prove the service of any such notice and the Judge may thereupon, in exercising his discretion as to costs as between the party serving the notice and the party or parties served, take into account the service of the notice provided that he is satisfied that the party serving it was in fact at all material times willing and able to carry out his part of what was proposed therein;
- (d) The costs referred to in paragraph (c) shall include costs recoverable by the plaintiff against any party to the contribution proceedings, as well as costs incurred in defending the action and in the contribution proceedings but shall not include the costs incurred by any party in relation to the issue of damages in the action unless the party serving the notice shall have signified in the manner aforesaid his willingness to contribute towards the payment into Court of a total sum not less than the damages adjudged to be paid and the contribution by him as so proposed is not less than the amount which he is bound by order or agreement to contribute towards those damages;
- (3) (a) Where any sum is paid into Court by one of two or more defendants either in conformity with or under an agreement or arrangement arising out of a notice given pursuant to this rule the notice of payment given under Order XXII. shall state this fact and the name and address for service of each party to the contribution proceedings (not being a defendant to the action) who is a party to the agreement or arrangement under which such payment into Court is made and except by leave of the Court or a Judge the sum paid in shall not be paid out to the party claiming the damages in respect of which the payment in has been made until he files and serves upon all the defendants in the action notice that he accepts the sum paid in in satisfaction of his claim to such damages against every defendant in the action against whom

such damages were claimed and executes in favour of each such party to the contribution proceedings a binding release from any claim to such damages which he may have against him:

- (b) Any sum contributed by a party and paid into Court by any other party either in conformity with, or under an agreement or arrangement arising out of, a notice given pursuant to this Rule and which is not taken out of Court by, or ordered to be paid out of Court to, the party claiming the damages in respect of which such payment in was made, shall be dealt with as between the party who contributed such sum and the party who paid the same into Court as the Judge at the trial, if any, shall order or if no such order is made as may be ordered by a Judge in Chambers.
- 2. Order XXII. Rule 2 (1) is amended by inserting after the words "in Appendix B" the words "and complying with sub-rule (3) (a) of Rule 10A of Order XVIA in cases to which it applies."

REGULATIONS.

TN pursuance of the powers conferred by Part I. of the Road Traffic Act 1956 and all other powers him thereunto enabling, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):-

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Parking Regulations 1957 and shall come into operation on the 1st March, 1957.
- 2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter-
 - "Carriageway" means that portion of a highway formed for the use of vehicles. If a highway includes two or more separate carriageways divided by a reservation or reservations the term carriageway as used herein shall refer to any such carriageway separately but not to all such carriageways collectively.
 - "Driver" means any person who drives or is in control of a
 - vehicle.
 "Highway" means the entire width between property lines of any street, road, lane, bridge, thoroughfare or place
 - open to or used by the public for passage with vehicles. "Highway Authority" means the statutory authority legally responsible for the care and management of the highway.
 - "Horse" means any draught animal or beast of burden.
 "Leave standing" means to permit a vehicle whether unattended or not to remain stationary except where necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or to comply with the directions of a member of the Police Force or
 - of a traffic control sign or signal.
 "No Parking sign" means a white rectangular sign bearing in red an arrow, the words "No Parking" and words or figures and words indicating periods of time with or without other words.
 - "No Standing sign" means a white rectangular sign bearing in red an arrow, the words "No Standing" and words or figures and words indicating periods of time with or without other words.
 - "Park" means to permit a vehicle whether unattended or not to remain stationary except where necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or to comply with the directions of a member of the Police Force or of a traffic control sign or signal or when actually engaged in taking up or setting down persons or goods.
 - "Parking sign" means a white rectangular sign bearing in green an arrow, the word "Parking" and a summary of the conditions under which the parking area to which the parking sign refers may be used.
 - "Person" means any natural person, firm, co-partnership, association, corporation, municipality or statutory
 - authority.
 "Reservation" means any physical provision made on a highway to divide it longitudinally and includes a nature strip adjoining a footway.
 - "Vehicle" means any conveyance (except a tram-car) propelled or drawn by any means and includes any horse either driven or ridden.
- 3. Obedience to Signs.-No person shall park or leave standing a vehicle contrary to the restriction displayed on a No Parking sign or a No Standing sign. The restriction displayed on a No Parking sign or a No Standing sign shall apply from such sign along the side of the carriageway nearer to such sign in the general direction

of an arrow on such sign until a similar sign is reached bearing an arrow pointing in the opposite direction or until a joining highway is reached whichever comes first. Penalty: £25.

- 4. Erection of Signs.—No person shall erect, establish, place or display upon or in view of any person on any highway any No Parking sign, No Standing sign or Parking sign without the written permission of the Highway Authority. Nothing in this Regulation shall apply to any such sign in situ at the commencement of these Regulations. Penalty: £50.
- 5. Signs to be Taken Down on Receipt of Order.—Any No Parking sign, No Standing sign or Parking sign erected on any highway before or after commencement of these Regulations shall be removed or altered by the Highway Authority within seven days of being directed to do so in writing by the Traffic Commission. Penalty: £50.
- 6. Display of Unauthorized Signs.—Subject to these Regulations no person shall erect, establish, place or display on or in view of any person on any highway any matter or thing which purports to be or is an imitation of or is similar to any No Parking sign, No Standing sign or Parking sign or which hides from view or interferes with the effectiveness of or prevents an approaching driver clearly distinguishing the whole or part of such sign. Penalty: £50.
- 7. By-laws not Valid unless Signs Erected.—(1) As from 1st September, 1957, any provision of any by-law or regulation under any Act, other than the Road Traffic Act 1956, restricting or prohibiting the parking or leaving standing of vehicles on any part of a highway (not being a parking area established by a municipal council or a licensed taxi-stand) shall have no force or effect except insofar as it prohibits or restricts such parking or leaving standing contrary to the restriction (as explained in Regulation 3 of these Regulations) displayed on a No Parking sign or No Standing sign within the meaning of these Regulations.
- (2) On and after 1st September, 1957, any by-law or regulation establishing a parking area on a highway which parking area is not on that part of a carriageway adjacent to the boundary of such carriageway shall not have any force or effect unless a white rectangular sign displaying in green a summary of the conditions under which such parking area may be used is erected at each end of every such continuous parking area. Any such parking area shall be deemed continuous throughout its length provided there is no passage through it wider than thirty-five feet.
- (3) On and after 1st September, 1957, any by-law or regulation establishing a parking area on a highway on that part of a carriageway adjacent to the boundary of such carriageway shall not have any force or effect unless a Parking sign is erected on or opposite each end of such parking area except that where such a parking area terminates, by virtue of the Road Traffic (Country) Regulations 1955 or the Road Traffic (Metropolitan) Regulations 1955, thirty feet from an intersection or at a No Standing sign or No Parking sign, a Parking sign need not be erected at any such termination but in every case there shall be at least one Parking sign erected on or opposite any one such continuous parking area. A parking area on a carriageway adjacent to a carriageway boundary shall be deemed to be one continuous parking area only if the whole of such area is available for the parking of vehicles except for breaks each not more than twelve feet wide.
- 8. Validity of Signs.—In any proceedings for an offence against these Regulations, evidence of the existence of a No Parking sign, No Standing sign or Parking sign shall be prima facie evidence that such No Parking sign, No Standing sign or Parking sign was lawfully erected.
- 9. Penalties.—Where a penalty is set out in any regulation of these Regulations it is the maximum penalty prescribed in respect of any person committing a breach of such regulation.

By-Law No. 172.

- A By-law of the City of Sandringham, made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1946, and numbered 172 for the purpose of preventing and extinguishing fires on commercial premises.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other power thereunto it enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham order as follows:—
- 1. No person or corporation shall carry on the business of a timber or woodyard of any kind or description on any land in that part of the municipality bounded—
 - (i) On the north by that part of Abbott-street, which is situate between Harston-street and Trentham-street; and
 - (ii) on the south by that part of Bay-road, which is situate between Trentham-street and the boundary of certain land vested in the Victorian Railways Commissioners; and
 - (iii) on the east by Trentham-street situate between Abbott-street and Bay-road; and
 - (iv) on the west by the boundary of the said Railway land unless such land complies in all respect not only with the general requirements of this By-law, but also with the following specific requirements.
- (a) Any such land must be enclosed on the south-east and west sides by a brick wall of not less than 6 feet in height.
- (b) All buildings on any such land shall be protected by a system of automatic sprinklers to be approved by the Chief Fire Officer.
- (c) An independent 3-in. Fire service fitted with two (2) 2½-in. millcocks shall be installed, each millcock to be equipped with a 100-ft. length of 2½-in. canvas hose branch and ½-in. nozzle housed in a standard Metropolitan Fire Brigade style of Hose Box.
- (d) A number of hand chemical extinguishers that would not be less than that required by the Uniform Building Regulations, and of a type and placed in such positions as may be determined by the Chief Fire Officer shall be provided on such land.
- (e) All sawdust shavings and all other combustible rubbish must be removed from the premises daily.
- (f) No timber stored in the open yard opposite any part of the premises must be stacked nearer than 4 feet of a boundary fence and must not exceed a height of 8 feet.
- Every person carrying on sawmilling, joinery, or similar operations, or dealing in timber, or firewood in any premises on any other part of the municipality shall—
 - (a) stack or cause to be stacked all timber or firewood thereon in such manner that the stack

- shall be at a distance of at least 4 feet from any brick dwelling-house or other brick building, or dividing fence, and 10 feet from any wooden house or other wooden building or dividing fence, and the vertical height of such stack shall be no more than 8 feet above the level of the ground-upon which such timber or firewood is so stacked;
- (b) forthwith destroy all sawdust produced in the course of any such operations, and forthwith remove from the premises all waste material of an inflammable nature.
- 3. Every person who destroys sawdust by burning shall—
 - (a) burn such sawdust in an incinerator so designed or constructed to prevent the escape of fire sparks or burning material therefrom;
 - (b) place or construct such incinerator in a position where there will be no risk of fire spreading therefrom;
 - (c) keep a space of 12 feet wide around such incinerator clear of all sawdust and other inflammable material, and take such other reasonable precautions as may in the circumstances be necessary so as to minimize the risk of fire spreading from such incinerator;
 - (d) provide and keep in a fit state for immediate use such fire buckets and chemical extinguishers and other appliances for preventing and extinguishing fires and in such positions as may be determined from time to time by the Council of the City of Sandringham, or the Chief Fire Officer.
- 4. No timber or firewood shall be so stacked as to prevent or impede in case of fire, access to or exit from the place or premises where it is stacked, or access to or exit from any adjoining place or premises.
- 5. No timber or firewood shall be stacked upon the roof of any building of whatsoever description or construction.
- 6. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:—
 - "Timber" means all that sort or kind of wood which is proper for buildings, or the manufacture of tools, utensils, furniture, carriages, fences, and the like, and includes logs, posts, felled trees, and the body, stem or trunk of any tree, weatherboard palings, plaster board, timber frames and wood used for any purpose whatsoever, other than firewood.
 - "Timber or Storage Yard" means any premises on which any timber or goods of any kind or description of an inflammable nature, are kept for sale or storage, or used in connexion with or incidental to any business purposes.
 - "Commercial Premises" includes land whether built upon or not which is used in any manner for business purposes.
 - "Firewood" means wood of every description suitable for use as fuel and includes saplings, re-shoots, and refuse wood generally.
 - "Stack" shall include pile, stand, store or heap.
 - "Chief Fire Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade, and includes any officer acting in that capacity or any deputy authorized by the Chief Officer to act in his stead whether appointed generally, or to act in a particular case.

Subject to the provisions of clause 1 hereof, this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law, shall be liable on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty of not more than Two pounds for each day on which such offence is continued after conviction or order by any court.
