WHEREAS by the *Road Traffic Act 1956* it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act shall apply only in respect of infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of such part by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* and occurring after the date of such Proclamation:

And whereas it is also enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular areas or circumstance:

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Proclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the City of Port Melbourne has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such part in respect only of parking infringements to the City of Port Melbourne:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation specify the City of Port Melbourne as an area in which Part II. of the *Road Traffic Act 1956* shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

REDUCTION OF LIMITS OF THE CORANGAMITE MEAT AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1956 (No. 6024)*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation reduce the limits of the Corangamite Meat Area by excising therefrom that part of the East Riding of the Shire of Warrnambool commencing on the shire boundary at the N.W. corner of Crown allotment 32, Parish of Garvoc, and thence bounded on the west by the Occupation road running south, east, south and south-easterly to the Princes Highway at the S.W. corner of Crown allotment 38, Parish of Garvoc, thence by the Princes Highway south-westerly to Vickers'-road at the N.W. corner of Crown allotment 39A, Parish of Garvoc, thence by Vickers'-road to the Mt. Emu Creek, thence by a line bearing S. 33 deg. 50 min. E., being a continuation of Vickers'-road to the Heath Marsh-road in the Parish of Laang, thence east by the Heath Marsh-road to Hovard's-road at the N.W. corner of Crown allotment 60, Parish of Laang, thence south by Hovard's and Coulahan's roads to the Cobden-Warrnambool road at the S.W. corner of Crown allotment 65, Parish of Laang, thence bounded on the south by the Cobden-Warrnambool road running easterly to the shire boundary on the Ayresford-road at the S.E. corner of Crown allotment 56A, Parish of Laang, thence bounded on the east by the shire boundary on the Ayresford-road running north to the Mt. Emu Creek, thence bounded on the north by the Mt. Emu Creek and shire boundary running westerly to the Garvoc-Laang road at the N.W. corner of Crown allotment 13, Parish of Laang, thence again bounded on the east by the shire boundary on the Garvoc-Laang road running northerly to the Princes Highway, thence again bounded on the south and east by the shire boundary on the Princes Highway running north-easterly to the N.E. corner of Crown allotment 1, Parish of Garvoc, and thence bounded on the north by the shire boundary running west to the point of commencement.

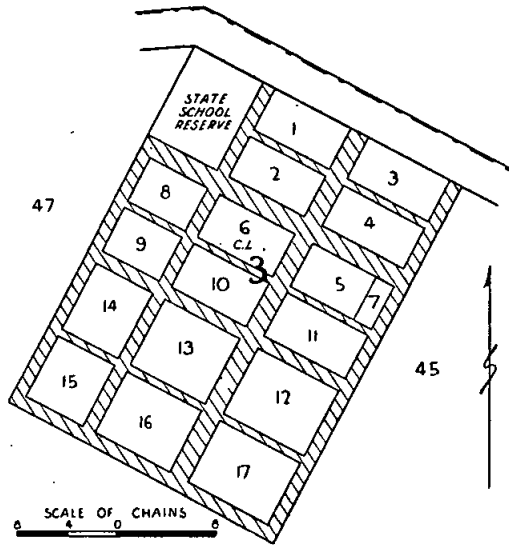

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers conferred by the *River Improvement Act 1948* and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, doth by this Order repeal the provisions of the said Order made on the twenty-first day of March 1956, and doth hereby determine that the properties within the Tambo River Improvement District shall be arranged in twelve divisions in the manner hereinafter provided:—

- (1) That the said divisions shall be known as the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, Eleventh and Twelfth Divisions.
- (2) That the First Division shall comprise those lands coloured dark-green on the plan titled "Tambo River Improvement District Rating Divisions 1957" signed and sealed by the Tambo River Improvement Trust and approved by the Governor in Council and deposited in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, at Melbourne.—(Corres. 57/6024).
- (3) That the Second Division shall comprise all those lands coloured brown on the said plan.
- (4) That the Third Division shall comprise all those lands coloured yellow on the said plan.
- (5) That the Fourth Division shall comprise all those lands coloured grey on the said plan.
- (6) That the Fifth Division shall comprise all those lands coloured purple on the said plan.
- (7) That the Sixth Division shall comprise all those lands coloured red on the said plan.
- (8) That the Seventh Division shall comprise all those lands coloured blue on the said plan.
- (9) That the Eighth Division shall comprise all those lands coloured orange on the said plan.
- (10) That the Ninth Division shall comprise all those lands coloured light-green on the said plan.

- (12) That the Eleventh Division shall comprise all those lands coloured violet on the said plan.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO FOODS, DRUGS, SUBSTANCES,
AND METHODS OF ANALYSIS.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1956* (No. 6024) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1957 (No. 1) shall be read and construed as one with the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 and any Regulations amending the same and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Paragraph (c) of sub-regulation (2) of Regulation No. 6 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed.

3. Sub-regulations (2) and (3) of Regulation No. 9 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 are hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

“(2) (a) Where an alternative preservative is specifically permitted by the Regulations to be added to a particular food, such food may contain both preservatives provided that the quantity of preservative added shall not exceed the total of the proportionate amounts of each preservative permitted under the Regulations.

(e.g., if one-quarter of the permitted maximum of one preservative is present, then the quantity of the other shall not exceed three-quarters of its permitted maximum.)

(b) A mixed food prepared from two or more foods in any of which a preservative is permitted shall not contain a greater amount of any one preservative than is specifically allowed in the quantity of that food or foods containing the preservative or preservatives used in the preparation of the mixed food.

(3) Every person who sells any food containing any preservative shall attach to the package containing such food a label in which shall be written in letters of not less than six points a statement in the following form:—

PRESERVATIVE ADDED (here insert the name or names of the
preservative or preservatives).”

4. Sub-regulation (3) (b) of Regulation No. 10 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by substituting for the name “Brilliant Blue FCF” the name “Brilliant Blue FCF (Disodium Salt)”.

5. Sub-regulation (1) of Regulation No. 11 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

“(1) No person shall add any colouring flavouring preservative extender antioxidant stabilizing or other modifying agent (other than any food in its natural form) to any food or sell any food containing any such substance unless the addition or presence of any such substance is specifically permitted by the Regulations.”

6. Regulations Nos. 14, 15, 16, and 17 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 are hereby repealed.

7. Regulation No. 20 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by—

(a) inserting the words “or acid phosphate” immediately following the words “phosphate aerator” in the heading.

- (b) inserting the words "or acid phosphate" immediately following the words "phosphate aerator" in the first line of sub-regulation (1).
- (c) inserting the words "or acid phosphate" immediately following the words "phosphate aerator" wherever they appear in sub-regulation (3).
- (d) inserting the words "or acid phosphate" immediately following the words "phosphate aerator" in the first line of sub-regulation (4).

8. Regulation No. 27 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by the insertion of the following heading and paragraph immediately following paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (4).

"LOBSTER AND OTHER CRUSTACEANS IN TINNED CONTAINERS.

(aa) Lobster and other crustaceans packed in tinned containers may contain sodium hexametaphosphate in proportion not exceeding 0.5 parts per centum."

9. Regulation No. 32 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"32. MARGARINE.

(1) Margarine, Table Margarine and Cooking Margarine are margarine, table margarine and cooking margarine respectively as defined by the *Margarine Act* 1940 (No. 4741).

(2) Margarine shall—

- (a) conform with the general standard for edible fats and oils;
- (b) not contain more than sixteen parts per centum of water;
- (c) not contain any foreign substance except the non-fatty solids of milk and salt;
- (d) not contain more than three parts per centum of salt;
- (e) contain not less than eighty parts per centum of fat.

(3) The fat contained in margarine shall not have a Kirschner value greater than that obtained by using the formula—

$$\frac{\text{Polenske value of fat}}{8} + 0.5$$

(4) In addition to the provision of (2) (c) above, table margarine may contain prescribed colouring without declaration and added vitamins; when Vitamin A and/or D are added, table margarine shall contain not less than 1,120 international units of Vitamin A per ounce and/or 56 international units of Vitamin D per ounce.

Prohibition.

(5) No person shall sell any margarine contrary to, nor do any act contrary to, nor fail to do any act required by any provision of this Regulation."

10. Sub-regulations (1), (2), and (3) (including the headings thereto) of Regulation No. 35 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 are hereby repealed and the following headings and sub-regulations substituted therefor:—

"SWEETENED CONDENSED MILK.

(1) Sweetened condensed milk is milk condensed by evaporation of a portion of its water content, and to which cane sugar has been added. It shall contain not less than 31 parts per centum of total milk solids of which parts not less than 9 shall be milk fat.

EVAPORATED MILK OR UNSWEETENED CONDENSED MILK.

(2) Evaporated milk or unsweetened condensed milk is milk condensed by evaporation of a portion of its water content. It shall contain not less than 28 parts per centum of total milk solids of which parts not less than 8 shall be milk fat."

11. The Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 are hereby amended by the insertion of the following Regulation immediately after Regulation No. 36:—

“36A. MALTED MILK POWDER.

(1) Malted milk powder is the product made either by combining whole milk with the liquid separated from a mash of ground malt and wheat or other cereal flour and reducing the mixture to dryness by desiccation under reduced pressure; or by mixing dried whole milk with dried malt extract.

(2) Malted milk powder shall contain not less than 7.5 parts per centum of milk fat, not more than 3.5 parts per centum of water and may contain salt (sodium chloride) not exceeding 1 part per centum. It shall be free from rancidity.

Prohibition.

(3) No person shall sell any malted milk powder contrary to any provision of this Regulation.”

12. Sub-regulation (8) of Regulation No. 44 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

“(8) Tomato sauce or chutney may contain not more than 7 grains of benzoic acid to the pound.”

13. Sub-regulation (1) of Regulation No. 49 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by the insertion of the words “chewing gum and bubble gum” immediately following the word “lollies” in the first line.

14. Sub-regulation (1) of Regulation No. 53 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by adding the following heading and paragraph:—

“ Labelling.

(b) Every person who sells any package of essence shall when the essence contains more than 50 parts per centum of ethylic alcohol attach thereto a label in which shall be written the words KEEP AWAY FROM NAKED FLAME in letters of not less than six points.”

15. Sub-Regulation (9) of Regulation No. 56 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed.

16. Paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (1) of Regulation No. 103 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by deleting the words “quality, measure, volume or weight” and substituting the words “or quality.”

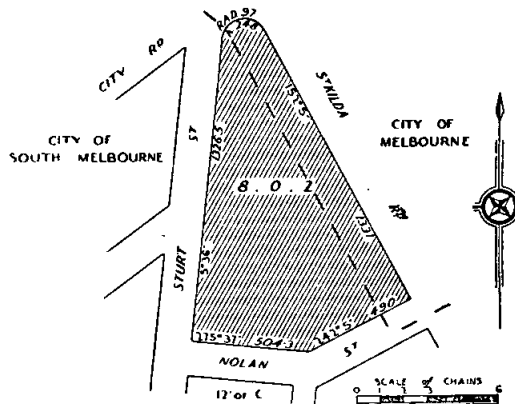

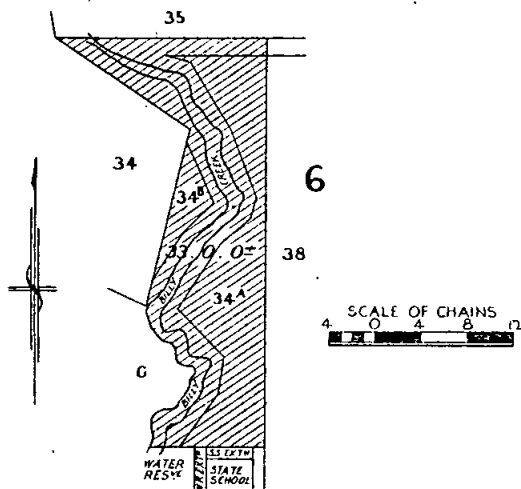

THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construed as one with By-law No. 231 intituled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928* (19 George V. No. 3720) and numbered 231 providing for the erection construction and maintenance of verandas and other matters in connexion therewith" and any By-laws amending the same.

2. By-law No. 231 is hereby amended as follows:—

(1) By deleting clause 4 and substituting the following new clause therefor—

"4. No veranda shall be erected or caused or permitted to be placed over any footway in Collins-street between Russell-street and Spring-street."

(2) By deleting clause 5 and substituting the following new clause therefor—

"5. No veranda shall be erected or caused or permitted to be placed over any footway in that part of Collins-street not mentioned in clause 4 of this By-law or in any other street or lane within the City without a permit from the Council as provided by clause 3601 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria."

(3) In paragraph (2) of clause 6 by deleting the words "on the South side."

CITY OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

BY-LAW No. 46.

A By-law of the City of Newtown and Chilwell, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946* and numbered 46, for the purpose of suppressing nuisances hereinafter described.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Newtown and Chilwell do order as follows:—

1. No person shall, within the City of Newtown and Chilwell, convey or cause to be conveyed upon any road or street any coal, filings, turnings, trimmings, and other scraps or particles of iron, steel, tin, and other metals or minerals or other hard substances (hereinafter referred to as "such substances") unless—

(a) such substances are completely enclosed in an impervious container; or

- (b) the part of the vehicle in which such substances are so conveyed is completely enclosed so as to make it impossible for any of such substances to escape therefrom and fall upon any road or street within the municipality; or
- (c) where the part of the vehicle in which such substances are being so conveyed is not completely enclosed, the highest part of the load being conveyed is at least 3 inches below the level of the sides of such vehicle.

2. No person shall, within the City of Newtown and Chilwell, convey or cause to be conveyed in any vehicle any stone, dust, earth or other light substance (hereinafter referred to as "such substances") unless—

- (a) the part of the vehicle in which such substances are so conveyed is completely enclosed, so as to make it impossible for any of such substances to be blown from such vehicle; or
- (b) where the part of the vehicle in which such substances are so conveyed is not completely enclosed, such substances are damped, and kept damp, so as to make it impossible for any of such substances to be blown from such vehicles.

3. No person shall, within the City of Newtown and Chilwell, convey or cause to be conveyed upon any street, road, or right-of-way any offensive matter, unless such offensive matter is placed in a container sealed with an air-tight lid or door, or otherwise dealt with in such a manner as to prevent the escape of any offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia. For the purposes of this By-law "offensive matter" includes dust, sludge, mud, soil, ashes, rags, waste matter, filth, blood, offal, dung, manure or any other material which is offensive.

4. No person shall, within the City of Newtown and Chilwell, convey or cause to be conveyed in any vehicle, any garden rubbish, building waste, trade waste, or other similar substances (hereinafter referred to as "such substances") unless—

- (a) such substances are securely fixed to the vehicle so as to make it impossible for any such substances to fall or be blown from such vehicle; or
- (b) the vehicle is covered so as to make it impossible for any such substances to fall or be blown from such vehicle.

5. Any contravention of any of the foregoing sections by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

6. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not less than Five pounds or more than Fifty pounds.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the City of Newtown and Chilwell.

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CITY OF ST. KILDA.

BY-LAW No. 160.

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 160 for the care, protection, and management of the reserve at the corner of Inkerman-street and Orange-grove, St. Kilda, known as the J. H. Hewison Playground, and more particularly being all the land remaining untransferred in certificates of title, volume 2454, folio 490644, volume 4172, folio 834324, and volume 4277, folio 855316, as at the date of the passing of this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, orders as follows:—

1. In this By-law the expression "Improvement" shall be deemed to include any fence, gate, post, notice board, seat, building, appliance, equipment, or other property of the Council in the reserve.

2. No person shall, unless authorized by the Council—

- (a) pluck, cut, remove, interfere with, or damage, any flower, shrub, tree, plant, grass, or other thing growing in the reserve;

(b) remove, interfere with, or damage any improvement in the reserve;

(c) post, stick, affix, append, set up on, paint, stencil, print, write, carve, cut, delineate, or by any other means make visible, on any improvement or on any tree, or other thing growing in the reserve, or on any portion of the reserve, any advertisement, or any poster, bill, sign, placard or notice, or any mark or symbol, or any name, letter, or figure of any kind;

(d) light any fire in the reserve;

(e) bring any motor car, motor cycle, motor scooter, or other motor vehicle, or any caravan or trailer, in to the reserve;

(f) ride any bicycle in the reserve;

(g) leave or deposit in the reserve (other than in a basket, bin, or other receptacle provided by the Council for the purpose), any bottle, tin, can, container, paper, fruit skins, garbage, litter, or refuse of any kind;

(h) consume any intoxicating liquor in the reserve;

(i) bring any animal, other than a dog, into the reserve;

(j) cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or her, or in his or her charge, to enter upon or remain in the reserve for the purpose of being trained or exercised for coursing, or other purposes of sport;

(k) leave or deposit in the reserve any clothing or dead animals or birds;

(l) throw or shoot any stone or other missile in the reserve;

(m) have in his or her possession, carry, use, or discharge any firearm in the reserve;

(n) offer for sale, or hire, or hawk, any goods or articles of any kind, in the reserve;

(o) camp in the reserve;

(p) set up or erect any tent, booth, building, or other structure, or by any other means, occupy any site in the reserve;

(q) play, engage in, or practice cricket, football, or any other athletic sport, or game of any kind in the reserve;

(r) preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind in the reserve;

(s) make, or cause to be made, by any means, any violent outcry or loud noise in the reserve;

(t) conduct, assist to conduct, or take part in any fête, carnival, concert, band or musical recital, or entertainment of any kind, or any assembly for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking or any activity or meeting of a like character in the reserve;

(u) cause to fly in, through or over, the reserve any model aeroplane, glider, or aircraft, or similar apparatus of any kind.

3. No person in the reserve shall commit any nuisance, or be in a state of intoxication, or under the influence of alcohol, or behave in an indecent, threatening, offensive, or disorderly manner, or use obscene, indecent, threatening, offensive, or insulting language, or create or take part in any disturbance, or interfere with the peaceable enjoyment of the reserve by any other person therein.

4. (a) The Council may, from time to time, by notice set up in the reserve, order that dogs shall not be permitted to enter upon, or remain in any portion of the reserve specified in the order.

(b) No person shall, unless authorized by the Council, cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or her, or in his or her charge, to enter upon or remain in—

(i) any portion of the reserve so specified;

(ii) any portion of the reserve not so specified, unless such dog be under his or her effective control by means of a chain, cord, or leash, and be effectively restrained from interfering with or causing annoyance to any other person, and from damaging or interfering with anything growing, or any property of the Council, in the reserve.

5. In respect of any portion of the reserve set apart by the Council as a children's playground, no person—

(a) shall bring any bicycle, tricycle, scooter, or box on wheels, into the children's playground;

(b) shall cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or her, or in his or her charge, to enter upon or remain in the children's playground;

- (c) shall enter upon or remain in the children's playground, except during such hours as the Council determines, the same shall be open for use;
- (d) shall use any improvement in the children's playground—
- (i) for a purpose other than that for which the improvement is provided;
 - (ii) to an extent or in a manner contrary to the extent or the manner determined or regulated by the Council;
- (e) who has attained the age of fourteen years, shall—
- (i) use any play appliance or play equipment in the children's playground;
 - (ii) enter upon or remain in the children's playground except for the purpose of watching over a child therein, who is then in his or her charge;
- (f) in a children's playground, shall fail to comply with any direction in respect of his or her conduct, or in respect of the use of any improvement therein, given to him or her by any officer, employee, servant, or authorized agent of the Council.

6. No person in the reserve shall molest, disturb, or obstruct any officer, employee, servant, or authorized agent of the Council in the execution of his work or duty.

7. No person shall enter upon, or remain in, the reserve except during such hours as the Council may from time to time determine that the Reserve shall be open for the use of the public.

8. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

BY-LAW No. 70.

A By-law of the Shire of Lillydale and numbered 70 made under the *Local Government Acts* and the *Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria*, for determining, applying, dispensing with or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied or dispensed with or regulated by the Council of the said Shire under the *Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and the *Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria*, and of any and every power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale order as follows:—

1. The whole of the By-law No. 52 and clauses 1, 2 and 3 of By-law No. 62 are hereby repealed.

Brick Areas.

2. The areas set out and described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas, and no person shall in any such area construct or cause to be constructed any building, the external walls of which are of materials other than masonry or concrete, provided that buildings of reinforced concrete or masonry veneer construction conforming to the requirements of chapter 26 of the *Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria* (hereinafter called the *Regulations*) shall be deemed to have external walls of masonry or concrete and also provided that this clause shall apply to outbuildings of laundries and garages and provided further that this clause shall apply to any addition to or extension of an existing building not having external walls of masonry or concrete with the exception of a building of Class I. occupancy.

Minimum Area, Depth and Width of Frontage.

3. The minimum area, depth and width of frontage specified in column 5 of Table No. 303 of the *Regulations* are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth and width of frontage of land on which a building of Class I. and II. occupancy shall be constructed throughout the whole of the Municipal district.

Distance from Street Frontage.

4. No person shall construct a building of Class I. and II. occupancy the outer walls of which are closer to the frontage of any land than 25 feet throughout the whole of the Municipal district.

Minimum Areas of Buildings.

5. The minimum area to be covered by any building of Class I. and II. occupancy in any portion of the Municipal district which has already been declared a residential area in Shire By-laws numbered 53, 62 and 63 or which may hereafter be declared a residential area shall be 300 square feet and in any other portion of the Municipal district not declared a residential area the minimum area to be covered by any building of Class I., II., III. or IV. occupancy shall be 600 square feet.

In ascertaining the area of any building under this clause, the area of verandahs forming part of the main building but not exceeding 100 square feet in area and the thickness of the external walls shall be included as part of the area covered, but no detached outbuilding or any verandah area exceeding 100 square feet shall be included.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained in this clause the Council may in any particular case and on such conditions as it may think fit dispense with the requirements as regards the area to be covered by any building.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Brick Areas Covered by By-law 70.

All those portions of the Township of Lilydale on both sides of Main-street which is bounded by the railway line to Melbourne on the west and by Anderson-street on the east within a distance of 200 feet back from the building line.

“Vehicle” means any other vehicle not defined or classified within the definition of motor car.

“Street or Road” respectively means any street or road which is shown on any plan of subdivision of land or on any plan of transfer of land, lodged in the Office of Titles, or any street or road being a Public Highway, and include every Public Highway.

2. No person shall leave (whether unattended or not) any motor car or other vehicle standing in any street or road or part thereof specified in the schedule hereto.

3. Any person offending against the above provisions, who by the discharge of waters supplied for irrigation causes damage to any street or road shall, in addition to such penalties as may have been imposed, be liable to an action in a court of competent jurisdiction to recover the cost of such damage.
4. This By-law shall apply to the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Shepparton.

SHIRE OF STRATHFIELDSAYE.

BY-LAW No. 63.

A By-law of the Shire of Strathfieldsaye, made under the Health Acts, and numbered 63, for regulating the keeping of poultry.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of any other powers it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Strathfieldsaye order as follows:—

- (1) This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
- (2) This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the Parish of Sandhurst, except to premises registered as poultry killing premises and poultry saleyards when so exempt, in writing, by the Council.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Council may at any time on the application, in writing, of the owner or occupier of any premises upon which poultry is kept at the coming into operation of this By-law exempt such premises for such period and on such conditions as it thinks fit from any of the provisions hereinafter contained.

(4) In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—"poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks, geese, cage birds, and pigeons; "person" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of such premises; "approved materials" means materials approved by the Council of the Shire of Strathfieldsaye; "adult poultry" shall mean poultry four and a half months old or older; "Californian" cages or any similar named cages include all such cages used for the purpose of keeping birds. Such cages shall be constructed of wire mesh or similar material and not enclosed on sides or rear. Cages shall not be a permanent fixture to the ground or floor of any building and shall be used specifically for the purpose of laying and breeding, and in which each bird is solely confined to a separate section of the cage.

(5) With the exception of clauses 7, 9, and 10 this By-law shall apply to structures of Californian cage type construction.

(6) No person shall keep or suffer to be kept any live poultry, except in a fowlhouse or similar structure to which may be attached an enclosed fowl run.

(7) No person shall keep or suffer to be kept in any fowlhouse or similar structure a number of adult poultry greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such fowlhouse or similar structure by four in cases where less than 100 birds are kept and by three in cases where 100 or more birds are kept.

(8) Every fowlhouse or similar structure or any enclosed fowl run on any premises shall be—

- (a) Distant at least 40 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage, except in special cases which are exempted by resolution of the Council.
- (b) Distant at least 10 feet from any other street or road of a width of 25 feet or more.
- (c) Distant at least 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet.
- (d) Distant at least 5 feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land.
- (e) Distant at least 40 feet from any dwelling, whether on the same or adjoining land.

(9) Every fowl-house or similar structure in which poultry is kept shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved material, and the surface level of the floor shall be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

(10) Every fowl-house or similar structure shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanized iron, jointed brick work or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least 18 inches below ground level or to solid rock, and all walls shall be constructed of approved rat-proof material.

(11) The occupier of any premises on which poultry is kept shall cause the fowl-house or cage and attached enclosed run to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector or an authorized officer.

(12) All poultry food shall be stored in rat-proof containers, sheds or silos.

(13) Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the totals of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.
