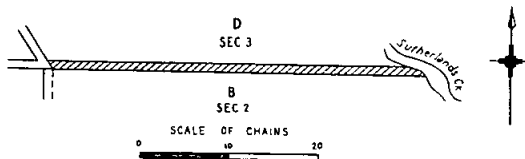

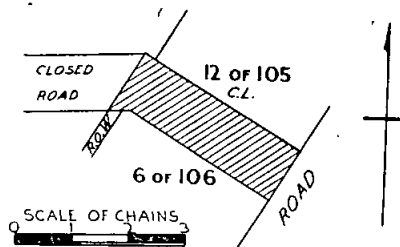

#### ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF "DAVIS PARK" AT NHILL.

A By-law of the City of Brighton, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and every other power thereunto it enabling, and numbered 141, for suppressing nuisances, prohibiting spitting or expectorating on footpaths, regulating traffic and processions, prohibiting the throwing, placing or leaving upon any public highway of orange peel, banana peel or other vegetable matter, prohibiting or regulating the drawing or trailing of any sledge, timber or other heavy material upon any footway or carriageway, prohibiting or minimizing noises in any public highway, including the prohibition or the regulation of the use on vehicles of brakes which are calculated to cause noises and generally for maintaining good rule and government of the municipality, and for repealing By-law No. 106 of the City of Brighton (a By-law for suppressing nuisances, regulating traffic, prohibiting noises).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every other power thereunto it enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brighton order as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"City" means the City of Brighton.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Brighton.

"Driver" means the person in charge of a vehicle or horse.

"Footway" includes every footpath, lane or other place, habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicles.

"Horse" includes mule and donkey, and any draught animal or beast of burden.

"Street" includes any highway, road, lane or thoroughfare other than a footway.

"Vehicle" includes any conveyance propelled or drawn by human, animal, mechanical, electrical or other power, including a tram motor and tram-car, but does not include railway locomotive or other railway rolling stock.

2. Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural and the plural the singular, unless the contrary as to gender or number is expressly provided.

3. No person shall—

- (a) cause, permit or authorize any machinery apparatus, lift or tackle to project over any street, footway or public place; or

- (b) use, permit or authorize the use of any such machinery apparatus, lift or tackle.

4. (1) No person in any street, footway or public place shall obstruct or hinder the free passage of members of the public lawfully using such street, footway or public place whether by selling or offering for sale goods therein or otherwise.

(2) Any person obstructing or hindering such passage as aforesaid shall, upon being required by a member of the Police Force or by an officer of the Council to cease to cause such obstruction or hindrance, forthwith cease to cause it accordingly.

5. No person shall in any street, footway or public place—

- (a) offer or distribute to persons lawfully using such street, footway or public place any handbill, notice, book, pamphlet, advertisement, paper or other document; or

- (b) cast down upon such street, footway or public place any handbill, notice, book, pamphlet, advertisement, paper, document or other object in such a manner as to obstruct, litter or render untidy such street, footway or public place.

6. No person shall cause substantial obstruction, annoyance or inconvenience to persons lawfully using any street, footway or public place by discharging or causing or permitting to be discharged in, on to or over any such street, footway or public place any gas, smoke, fumes, dust, sand or any solid or liquid matter whether from buildings in process of demolition or from excavating works or from vehicles or otherwise.

7. No person shall obstruct or hinder the free passage of persons or vehicles lawfully using any street, footway or public place by—

- (a) placing thereon; or

- (b) affixing to any vehicle or other mode of conveyance any board, placard, advertising device or material.

8. (1) No owner or occupier of land upon which there is growing any tree, shrub, hedge, creeper or other plant of any kind whatsoever shall—

- (a) permit any branch or any portion thereof to overhang any street, footway or public place; or

- (b) permit any sucker offset or seedling therefrom to grow through or upon any street, footway or public place—

in such a manner as to cause or be likely to cause obstruction, danger, hindrance or inconvenience to persons lawfully using such street, footway or public place.

(2) Any owner or occupier of such land shall at once remove from any street, footway or public place upon which such land abuts any such branch or portion as aforesaid which overhangs such street, footway or public place, or any sucker offset or seedling therefrom which is growing through or upon such street, footway or public place.

(3) The Town Clerk may by writing under his hand give to any such owner or occupier as aforesaid notice to remove from such street, footway or public place within seven days after service of such notice any such overhanging branch or portion or any such sucker offset or seedling.

(4) If such owner or occupier fails within seven days after service of such notice to comply with the requirements thereof the Council may cause the work specified in such notice to be carried out, and the cost thereof may be recovered from each owner or occupier in any court of competent jurisdiction as a civil debt.

(5) If personal service of any notice under this clause cannot with reasonable diligence be effected, service of such notice may be effected by posting the same on a conspicuous portion of the said property.

9. No person shall in any street or footway—

- (a) by means of any loud-speaker, amplifier, wireless set, gramophone, musical or other instrument whether carried on or in any vehicle or otherwise make or cause or permit or allow to be made or caused any loud or objectionable sound or noise; or

- (b) drive or use any vehicle, the brakes of which cause or are calculated to cause an unreasonably loud or discordant noise; or

- (c) drive or use any vehicle, the load on which is so packed or arranged that it emits or is calculated to emit any unreasonably loud or discordant noise; or



- (d) make without justifiable cause any loud or objectionable noise.

10. No person on or in any street or footway after having been required by—

- (a) any member of the Police Force; or  
(b) any officer of the Council; or  
(c) any inmate of any house within 50 yards of such person—

to cease to make or reproduce any loud or objectionable noise or sound (whether musical or otherwise) shall fail to comply with such requirement.

11. (1) No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the City shall upon such land or premises within the hearing of any person being upon any street or footway or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto—

- (a) make any loud outcry or noise or sound or play upon any musical instrument or cause or permit or suffer any persons so to do; or  
(b) cause or permit or suffer any sound or noise to be emitted from any electrical wireless set, amplifying equipment, gramophone, piano player or other instrument—

so as to cause annoyance to or as to be calculated to cause annoyance to any such other person as aforesaid.

(2) Any person other than such owner or occupier operating such wireless set, amplifying equipment, gramophone, piano player or other instrument as aforesaid or otherwise concerned in the making of such outcry, noise, disturbance or sound as aforesaid shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

12. No person shall spit or expectorate on any footpath, safety zone or on any street crossing habitually used by pedestrians.

13. (1) No person shall—

- (a) feed any horse in any street except by means and out of a nosebag containing the forage, and attached to the head of the horse; or  
(b) remove the blinkers or bridle of any horse in any street.

(2) The driver of any vehicle to which a vicious horse is attached shall keep the horse efficiently muzzled when it is standing upon any stand in the City or standing in any street therein.

14. No person shall, without the consent of the Council,

- (a) carry or cause to be carried in any street (except between the hours of Eight o'clock in the evening and Eight o'clock in the morning) upon any vehicle or otherwise any load or structure exceeding 10 feet in height or 8 feet in width; or  
(b) carry or cause to be carried in any street upon a vehicle having fewer than four wheels any material, article or thing exceeding 25 feet in length; or  
(c) carry or cause to be carried in any street upon a vehicle any material, article or thing which projects more than 2 feet outside the line of the wheels of the vehicle; or  
(d) carry or cause to be carried in any street upon a vehicle any material, article or thing in such a manner that any part thereof touches or comes into contact with the surface of such street.

15. No person shall except between the hours of Twelve o'clock midnight and Eight o'clock in the morning—

- (a) drive or cause to be driven through any street or public highway in the City cattle intended for sale, slaughter or shipment, or cattle passing through the City from one part of the State to another; or  
(b) drive or cause to be driven or taken or carried through any street or public highway in the City any large animal except horses, cattle, pigs, sheep or other domestic animals.

16. (a) Processions on streets are permitted subject to the provisions of this clause.

(b) Any person (whether corporate or unincorporate) or body organizing any procession shall give to the Council not less than 21 days' notice in writing of intention to hold such procession.

(c) Such notice shall state—

- (i) the date of the proposed procession and the object thereof;  
(ii) the hour of commencing and the hour of concluding such procession;  
(iii) the proposed starting and finishing points thereof;

(iv) the proposed route between the said points;

(v) the composition and order of such procession setting out whether it is intended to consist solely of pedestrians or how it is to be otherwise constituted;

(vi) what advertisements, emblems, standards or other devices it is intended to display;

(vii) what number of pedestrians, horses or vehicles is estimated to take part in such procession;

(viii) the names and addresses of the persons or bodies organizing such procession;

(ix) an address at which notices may be left for such persons or bodies.

(d) If a majority of the Council is of opinion that there are objections to such procession on the ground that it is likely—

(i) to cause undue interference with traffic; or

(ii) to lead to a breach of the peace; or

(iii) to be prejudicial to public morals or decency;

it may either prohibit the procession absolutely or require such variation of the route, composition or other matters specified in the notice aforesaid as are reasonably necessary to remove such objections as aforesaid.

(e) The Council by writing under the hand of the Town Clerk shall communicate its decision by leaving a notice thereof at the address referred to in sub-clause (c) (ix) hereof.

(f) Such decision may be—

(i) to approve of the procession as proposed; or

(ii) to prohibit such procession absolutely by reason of any of the objections thereto referred to in sub-clause (d) of this clause; or

(iii) to approve of the procession subject to such variations thereof as are specified in the notice as required for the removal of such objections.

(g) No person shall organize or take part in any procession which has been prohibited or in which any variation required by the Council, pursuant to this clause, has not been observed or given effect to.

17. No person shall drive any vehicle in a southerly direction along any part of that portion of the western half of Nepean Highway between Cochrane-street and Glenhuntly-road, which lies within 33 feet of the kerb alignment of the footpath on the south-western side of the said Nepean Highway. Provided, however, that this clause shall not apply to any vehicle whilst being driven directly across Nepean Highway from or into any street which intersects or runs into Nepean Highway.

18. No person shall throw, drop, place or leave upon any footway, street or public place any orange peel, banana peel or other vegetable matter.

19. No person shall draw or cause to be drawn over any street or footway any sledge, timber or other heavy material in such a manner as is likely to cause damage to such street or footway.

20. (1) Any person who commits any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

(2) Any person, who, after his conviction by any court for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law, continues to commit such wilful act or default shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day on which he continues to commit such wilful act or default.

(3) Any person who wilfully authorizes, aids, abets, counsels or procures the commission of any offence against this By-law shall thereby be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

21. (1) By-law numbered 106 is hereby repealed.

(2) Such repeal shall not prejudice or affect any liability incurred or any proceedings taken or commenced or any matter or thing done under the said repealed By-law before the coming into operation of this By-law.

22. Except as herein expressly otherwise provided, the provisions of this By-law shall apply to and have operation and effect throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Brighton.

4. No person shall in any public place cause or permit or suffer to be caused any noise:—

(a) by shouting, calling out, haranguing or singing or

(b) by using, operating, controlling, sounding or playing any instrument.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Richmond.

## BY-LAW No. 27.

*Amended Notice.*

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and any other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Morwell, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within their jurisdiction, makes the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply and have operation in the Town of Morwell and the Townships of Hernes Oak, Morwell Bridge, Morwell West, Derhams Hill, Yinnar, and Boolarra, within the municipal district of the Shire of Morwell, except to premises registered as a poultry killing premises and poultry safeyards when so exempt in writing by the Council.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter, "poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks, and geese; "person" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of such premises; "approved materials" means materials approved by the Council of the municipality.

5. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept any live poultry, except in a fowlhouse or similar structure to which may be attached an enclosed fowl run.

6. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept in any fowlhouse or similar structure a number of poultry greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such fowlhouse or similar structure by six.

7. Every fowlhouse or similar structure or any enclosed fowl run on any premises shall be:—

- Distant at least 75 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage.
- Distant at least 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet.
- Distant at least 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet.
- Distant at least 5 feet from any boundary of any adjoining allotment of land.
- Distant at least 40 feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land.

(f) Of a height not exceeding 8 feet and a total overall superficial area not exceeding 100 square feet.

8. The Council may grant a dispensation from the requirements of the clauses relating to distances in any case where it is satisfied that such dispensation will not unreasonably affect living conditions in any building or dwelling.

9. Every fowlhouse or similar structure in which poultry is kept shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved impervious material of not less than 2 inches thick and the surface level of the floor shall be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground, and shall be graded outwards so that any water flowing thereupon shall flow into a properly constructed and graded outfall drain.

10. Every fowlhouse or similar structure shall be rendered ratproof by placing galvanized iron, jointed brickwork or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least 18 inches below ground level, unless the floor pavement is ratproof to the satisfaction of the building surveyor, and all the walls shall be constructed of approved ratproof material.

11. All poultry food shall be stored in ratproof containers.

12. The occupier of any premises on which poultry is kept shall cause the fowlhouse and attached run to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.

13. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

## AMENDING DETERMINATION OF THE FIRE-FIGHTERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Labour and Industry Acts, the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than Fire Brigade Officers, Special Service Firemen, and other than persons subject to the Determination of any Wages Board heretofore appointed) employed as Permanent Firemen, or (within the Metropolitan Fire District constituted by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*) as partially-paid firemen engaged in—

- (a) the prevention or suppression of fires;
- (b) the protection or salvage of persons, property, or goods,"

has made the following Determination, viz.:—

That as from the 29th March, 1957, the Determination published in *Government Gazette* No. 72 of the 8th March, 1955, shall be further amended as follows:—

1. By deleting sub-clause (b) of clause 1 and inserting in lieu the following:—

(b) Partially-paid Firemen within the Metropolitan Fire District constituted by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*.

2. By deleting sub-clause (a) (ii) of clause 2 and inserting in lieu the following:—

(ii) Partially-paid Firemen—

For all time spent attending to any call a fireman shall be paid as follows:—

Partially-paid fireman 8s. for the first hour or part thereof, and thereafter at the rate of 8s. per hour calculated to the nearest quarter of an hour;

Senior Partially-paid fireman 10s. for the first hour or part thereof, and thereafter at the rate of 10s. per hour calculated to the nearest quarter of an hour.

Theatre duty shall be paid for at 15s. per performance, plus fares if the theatre is situated more than one mile from the Fireman's home station.

For attendance at a weekly drill of one hour an allowance of 10s. per drill shall be paid to Partially-paid Firemen and 12s. 6d. to Senior Partially-paid Firemen.

A Partially-paid Fireman relieving a Permanent Fireman who is required to go on out duty shall receive an additional 2s. per hour whilst so required to relieve.

Watching duty after fires shall be paid for at the rate of 2s. per hour or part thereof, including travelling time.

## DETERMINATION OF THE WATERFRONT WATCHMEN'S BOARD.

NOTES.—(a) This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(b) On the 19th April, 1955, the Watchmen's Board was deprived of the power to determine any matter relating to Watchmen employed in connexion with overseas or interstate shipping—

(i) on ships;

(ii) on gangways used for connecting ships with wharfs; or

(iii) on wharfs or wharf sheds connected with the loading or unloading of ships or the storing of goods in relation thereto.

and such power was conferred exclusively on the Waterfront Watchmen's Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Labour and Industry Acts, the Wages Board appointed for "watchmen employed in connexion with overseas or interstate shipping—

(a) on ships;

(b) on gangways used for connecting ships with wharfs; or

(c) on wharfs or in wharf sheds connected with the loading or unloading of ships or the storing of goods in relation thereto."

has made the following Determination namely:—

1. That on the 19th February, 1957, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

### EXTRA RATES.

3. (a) Hold Watchmen—When waterside workers engaged in handling cargo in a vessel's hold are paid an extra rate because of the obnoxiousness of such cargo, either by Board of Reference decision or by agreement, any hold watchman employed in such hold shall be paid an extra rate of 6d. per hour, or such lesser amount as may be paid to the waterside workers concerned.

(b) Wharf Watchmen—When a cargo watchman is engaged elsewhere than in the hold of a vessel, and is obliged to work in close proximity to cargo, which, because of its obnoxiousness, is the subject of an extra rate paid to the waterside workers handling such cargo, he shall be paid an extra rate of 3d. per hour for such period as he may be affected.

(c) Dangerous Cargo—When waterside workers are paid an extra rate for handling Ammonium Nitrate and Sodium Chlorate, such extra rate shall be paid to any hold watchman who may be employed in the hold where such cargo is being handled for such period as may be applicable.

(d) Watchmen commencing duty at 5 p.m. for the evening shift or at midnight for the midnight shift shall be paid 8 hours at the ordinary rate provided in each case the full shift is worked and provided further that he does not work a total of 8 hours by working on into the succeeding shift.

(e) Watchmen shall be required to diligently attend to their duties as watchmen and immediately report to the Superintendent or foreman in charge of the hatch or the Ship's Officer on duty any cases of pillage or suspected or attempted pillage and damage, and if required, make notes and furnish reports regarding same. It is also required that smoking and committing a nuisance in the hold should be stopped and, if persisted in, reported in the manner directed above.

## OVERTIME.

4. (a) All time worked in excess of 8 hours from the commencement of any shift, Monday to Friday inclusive, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

## SPECIAL RATES FOR SATURDAY AND SUNDAY.

5. Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Saturday and double time for all work done on Sunday.

## SPECIAL RATES FOR HOLIDAYS.

6. (a) Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Queen's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

## TRAVELLING TIME AND FARES.

7. Any watchman employed at Newport, Williamstown or Yarraville shall be paid travelling time at the ordinary rate together with all fares necessarily incurred by the most economical means of travel from and to the place of engagement to and from the place of employment.

Travelling time at the ordinary rate shall be paid to any watchman employed at 21 South Wharf and beyond on the south side of the river, and at 22 Victoria Dock and beyond.

The above provisions shall not apply in cases where the employer provides, or offers to provide, transport.

## MINIMUM PAYMENT.

8. (a) Except as provided in sub-clauses (b) and (c) hereof a watchman called up for duty shall receive a minimum payment as for 6 hours work at prevailing rates.

(b) On a shift commencing at 8 a.m. and finishing at or before noon on Saturday the minimum shall be 4 hours' work at prevailing rates.

(c) When work is interrupted by stop work meetings and the minimum engagement can only be 4 hours then the minimum shall be 4 hours' work at prevailing rates.

## PAYMENT FOR MEAL TIME.

9. No deduction shall be made in an employee's time for a meal period of 30 minutes unless he is permitted to leave his employer's premises for such meal.

## MEAL ALLOWANCE.

10. (a) Where an employee is directed by the employer to work for two hours or more into the next shift, he shall be supplied by the employer with a meal or be paid a meal allowance of 6s.

(b) Watchmen engaged to work Sunday day shift shall be provided with a mid-day meal or paid a meal allowance of 6s., provided the full shift is worked.

## ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

11. (a) The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the Labour and Industry Acts.

(b) In addition to the leave hereinbefore prescribed seven-day shift workers, that is shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed seven consecutive days' leave including non-working days. Provided always that this clause shall not apply to any employee whose normal working week is less than 35 hours.

(c) Where an employee with twelve months' continuous service is engaged for part of the twelve-monthly period as a seven-days' shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of fourteen consecutive days' annual leave prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof increased by half a day for each month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.

(d) If in any twelve-monthly qualifying period a shift worker as prescribed in sub-clause (b) hereof lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the employee, the employee shall be paid, in addition to all other amounts (including any payment in lieu of annual leave as prescribed by sub-clause (a) hereof) due to him, an amount equal to one-fiftieth of his ordinary pay for the period of employment as a shift worker.

## UNIFORMS.

12. Any employees required to wear a uniform whilst on duty shall be provided with such uniform by the employer free of cost to the employee. The uniform so provided shall remain the property of the employer.

## EXTRA RATES.

3. (a) Employees engaged in processing and/or repacking in bulk Gentian Violet, Methylene Blue, Acriflavine, or similar substances shall be paid 6d. per hour extra with a minimum payment of 1s. 6d. per day.

(b) Employees whilst engaged in manufacturing and/or processing, filling and/or sealing, and/or de-contaminating containers of organic phosphorus pesticides as covered by the first schedule of "Use of Pesticides Regulations, 1953" under the Health Acts, shall be paid an allowance of 9d. per hour or part thereof extra with a minimum payment of 2s. 3d. per day.

## OVERTIME.

5. (a) The following rates shall be paid for all work done :—

- (i) Outside the times of beginning and ending work in any one day .. .. . } Time and a half for the first three  
 (ii) Within the times of beginning and ending work in excess of 40 hours in any week } hours and double time thereafter.  
 (iii) On Saturday .. .. . }

(b) An employer may require any employee to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such employees shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

## MEAL MONEY.

6. An employee required to work overtime for any period in excess of two hours after the usual hour of ceasing duty or after 6 p.m., whichever is the earlier, shall be supplied with an adequate meal from the employer's canteen or paid a meal money allowance of 5s.

Provided that when any employee is notified the previous day of the intention to work overtime and overtime is not worked he shall be entitled to the appropriate meal allowance as herein provided.

## TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT.

7. (a) All employees shall be engaged by the week, and shall be paid weekly. A week's notice shall be given by the employer or employee to determine employment, or, in lieu of such notice, a week's wages shall be paid or forfeited, as the case may be. Such notice shall be given at the end of a working week, but an employee may be dismissed summarily for dishonesty, misconduct, neglect of duty, or for absence from work without reasonable cause, and in the event of such dismissal the employee shall be paid only for the time actually worked. All time of absence from work shall be deducted from the employee's wages, except absence on the holidays hereinafter mentioned and except absence without deduction of pay in accordance with clause 10.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (a) hereof the employer may deduct payment for any time during which the employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike, or any other cause for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible; but any such employee shall be entitled to payment for any of the holidays named in clause 8 which occur during such period.

(c) Where an employee is stood down under the provisions of sub-clause (b) hereof, the time lost to the employee shall not affect the continuity of employment.

#### HOLIDAYS.

8. All employees shall be entitled to the holidays hereinafter mentioned without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Union Picnic Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Queen's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays this provision shall apply only to the day so substituted. Provided that any employee absenting himself or herself from work without reasonable excuse or without permission of the employer for any portion of the working day proceeding or following a holiday provided for in this clause, shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

#### ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

9. (a) The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the Labour and Industry Acts.

(b) In addition to the annual holidays prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof, seven-day shift workers, that is shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed seven consecutive days' leave including non-working days.

Where an employee with twelve months' continuous service is engaged for part of the twelve-monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of annual holidays prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof increased by half a day for each month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.

#### SICK LEAVE.

10. (a) Any employee who, having had at least three months' service with the same employer, is absent from duty as a result of personal ill health or accident shall be entitled to sick pay as follows:—

(i) During the first year—3½ hours' ordinary pay for each complete month of service;

(ii) During any subsequent year of service—40 hours' ordinary pay.

Provided that in either case such employee produces or forwards within 48 hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill health or accident necessitating such absence.

(b) If the full period of sick leave, as prescribed above is not taken in any year such portion as is not taken shall, provided an employee remains in the service of the one employer, or any successor of such employer, be cumulative from year to year. For the purposes of this sub-clause, service prior to the 1st June, 1948, shall be disregarded.

#### DEFINITION OF FOREMAN.

11. Where three or more adults are employed in any department of a warehouse, one shall be deemed to be a foreman and entitled to the rate prescribed for such a foreman.

#### MEAL INTERVAL.

12. No employees shall be required to work for a longer period than five hours without an interval of at least half an hour for a meal.

#### SPECIAL RATES.

13. All work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Easter Monday, Good Friday, Labour Day, Queen's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above holidays, the special rates shall be payable only for the days so substituted.

#### SHIFT WORK.

14. By mutual agreement between an employer and his employees shifts may be worked subject to the following conditions:—

(a) The rates of pay for shift workers shall be:—

(i) On afternoon shift, 7½ per cent. in excess of ordinary rates.

(ii) On night shift, 10 per cent. in excess of ordinary rates.

(b) Overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for all time worked in excess of 8 hours per shift in any week in which six or more shifts are worked and in excess of 8 hours 48 minutes per shift in any week in which less than six shifts are worked.

(c) Shift workers who work on any afternoon or night shift which does not continue for at least five successive afternoon or nights in a five-day workshop or for at least six successive afternoons or nights in a six-day workshop shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(d) For the purposes of this clause "afternoon shift" means any shift finishing after 6 p.m. and at or before midnight and "night shift" means any shift worked wholly or partly between midnight and 7.30 a.m.

#### PROTECTIVE CLOTHING.

15. (a) Waterproof boots and protective clothing shall be provided by the employer when employees are required to work in wet places, and when employees are employed in a room where powders are being mixed or employed in the handling of acids or other materials injurious to clothing they shall be provided with overalls or dust coats, whichever is the most suitable.

(b) Not more than two sets of overalls or other protective clothing per year shall be supplied by the employer, when necessary, free of cost to the employee.

(c) Persons employed in sterile areas shall be supplied with overalls which shall be laundered by the employer, free of cost to the employee.

(d) Waterproof boots, protective clothing and overalls as provided in this clause shall remain the property of the employer.

#### REST PERIOD.

16. A rest period of ten minutes shall be allowed all employees in the forenoon, such period to count as time worked.

#### PAYMENT OF WAGES.

17. Wages shall be paid, in the employer's time, not later than Thursday in each week.

#### RIGHT OF ENTRY OF UNION OFFICIAL.

18. A duly accredited representative of the Federated Storemen and Packers' Union of Australia shall have the right to enter employers' establishments during the midday meal hour for the purposes of interviewing employees on legitimate Union business on the following conditions:—

(a) That he produces his authority to the employer or his representative.

(b) That he interviews employees only at the place where they are taking their meal.

(c) That not more than one representative in all be in any establishment at any one time.

(d) That no one representative visit an establishment more than once a fortnight.

(e) That if an employer alleges that a representative is unduly interfering with his establishment or is creating disaffection amongst his employees or is offensive in his methods or is committing a breach of any of the previous conditions, such employer may refuse right of entry.

## FIRST-AID OUTFITS.

19. In each place where employees are regularly employed, the employer shall provide and continuously maintain, at a place or places reasonably accessible to all employees, an efficient first-aid outfit, consisting of the following articles:—

## WASHING FACILITIES AND HOT WATER.

20. Suitable washing facilities, together with hot water at meal times shall be supplied for the use of employees.
