### PROCLAMATION

I THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation vary the Proclamation made the fifth day of August, 1952, and published in the Government Gazette of the thirteenth day of August, 1952, respecting fishing licences and renewal of such licences by substituting for the words "one hoop or drop net" in the second and third lines of clause 12 of such Proclamation the words "two hoop or drop nets" and by deleting all reference to hoop or drop nets in paragraph (b) of clause 11 and wherever appearing thereafter in such Proclamation, and substituting in lieu of each deletion the following:—

Two hoop or drop nets of the following specifications:-

- Each net shall consist of not more than two hoops which shall not exceed two feet six inches (2' 6") in diameter and shall be spaced to allow a drop not exceeding twelve inches (12") between the hoops;
- (ii) the bottom of each net shall consist of standard one and a half inch (1½") wire netting fixed taut to one of the hoops without distorting the mesh;
- (iii) the meshes of the sides of each net shall be not less than four and one-quarter inches (41").

I THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamations made the fourteenth day of October, 1952, and published in the Government Gazette of the 15th October, 1952, respecting bag limits for Trout and Quinnat Salmon taken from Lake Bullen Merri and Lake Purrumbete and prescribe in lieu thereof that no person shall on any one day during the period from the first Saturday in September in each year to the thirtieth day of April next following (both days inclusive) take from the waters of either Lake Bullen Merri or Lake Purrumbete or from both of such waters combined more than a maximum number of five (5) fish being either Quinnat Salmon or Trout (Brown or Rainbow) or have in possession more than a maximum number of five (5) such fish taken from such waters.

# CO-OPERATIVE HOUSING SOCIETIES (GENERAL) REGULATIONS No. 10).

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Co-operative Housing Societies Acts and the Acts Interpretation Act 1928, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

# Citation.

 These Regulations may be cited as the Co-operative Housing Societies (General) Regulations No. 10.

Registration of Special Resolution—Not Being a Resolution Changing Name of Society.

- 2. (1) Every application for registration of any special resolution other than a resolution by which the name of a society is changed shall be made in duplicate in the form or to the effect of Form No. 37 in the Schedule to the Co-operative Housing Societies (General) Regulations No. 7.
- (2) Every such application shall be accompanied by a copy of the notice convening the meeting at which the special resolution was passed.
- (3) Where the special resolution is a resolution altering the rules of the society the application shall also be accompanied by a consent to the alteration of the rules given by every lender from whom the society has borrowed money.

Except that, where the Treasurer of Victoria is the lender, the consent of the said Treasurer to the alteration of the rules need not be furnished if the registrar has notified the society in writing that the Treasurer has consented to the making of the alteration.

- (4) Upon registration of the special resolution, the registrar shall return one copy of the application to the society with an acknowledgment of registration.
- (5) Every certificate of registration of any special resolution (other than an acknowledgment of registration) shall be in the form or to the effect of Form No. 17 in the Schedule to the Co-operative Housing Societies (General) Regulations.

# REGULATIONS-AMENDMENT No. 18.

- HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Police Regulation Acts, doth hereby further amend the Police Regulations 1951 as follows (that is to say):—
- 1. In sub-clause (1) of clause 3 of Chapter 1 for the definition of "Officer", there shall be substituted the following definition:—
  - "'Officer' includes the Chief Commissioner, the Inspecting Superintendent, and any Superintendent, Chief Inspector, Inspector or Station Officer."
- 2. Clause 1 of Chapter 2 is revoked and the following clause substituted therefor:---
  - "1. The Police Force is divided into the following ranks and grades:—

Officers.

- (i) Chief Commissioner
- (ii) Inspecting Superintendent
- (iii) Superintendents Grade I.(iv) Superintendents Grade II.
- (v) Chief Inspectors
- (vi) Inspectors
- (vii) Station Officers.

# Sub-Officers and Constables.

- (i) Sergeants
- (ii) Senior Constables
- (iii) First Constables
- (iv) Constables.

Other Ranks.

- (i) Junior Police Trainees."
- Clause 4 of Chapter 3 is revoked and the following clause substituted therefor:—
  - "4. Each District may be divided into sub-districts with a Station Officer, Sub-officer or Constable in charge according to—
    - (a) the responsibilities involved in administering the subdistrict; and
    - (b) the strength of the Force within the sub-district.

The offices and precincts of sub-districts shall be known as Police Stations."

4. After clause 33 of Chapter 4, there shall be inserted the following heading and clause:—

# "STATION OFFICERS.

- 33A. The duties of a Station Officer shall be-
  - (a) where he is appointed as assistant to an Inspector in charge of a division—
    - (i) to co-ordinate the work of stations within the division;
    - (ii) to control and administer such station or stations within the division as are assigned to him by the Inspector in charge of the division; or
  - (b) where he is appointed to administer-
    - (i) a station; or

(ii) a section of a branch-

(which has been rated by the Chief Commissioner as involving greater responsibilities than other stations or sections which are administered by Subofficers)—

to control and administer such station or section and to carry out all the duties normally performed by a Subofficer in charge of a station or section of a branch—

and in every case to perform all tasks associated with leadership and training as may be specially delegated to him by a superior officer."

- 5. In clause 2 of Chapter 9 after the words "Chief Inspectors, Inspectors", there shall be inserted the words "Station Officers".
  - 6. Chapter 19 is amended as follows:-
    - (a) In clause 1 for the word "Sub-Officers", there shall be substituted the word "Officers".
    - (b) In clause 3 for the word "Sub-Officers", there shall be substituted the word "Officers".
  - 7. Chapter 20 is amended as follows:---
    - (a) In clause 1 for the definition of "Officer", there shall be substituted the following definition:—
      - "'Officer' means the Inspecting Superintendent, or any Superintendent, Chief Inspector, or Inspector but does not include Station Officer."
    - (b) In clause 10 after the words "rank of", there shall be inserted the words "station officer or".
    - (c) In clause 14 for the word "Superintendent", there shall be substituted the words "Chief Inspector".
    - (d) In clause 16 after the word "Superintendent" insert the words "or Chief Inspector".
    - (e) Clause 17 is revoked.
    - (f) Clause 34 is revoked and the following clause substituted therefor:—
      - "34. (1) In the promotion of any member of the Force, consideration shall be given first to relative efficiency and, in the event of equality of efficiency of two or more members, then to relative seniority. In this clause 'efficiency' means special qualifications, fitness (including physical fitness), aptitude and potential ability to discharge the responsibilities of the higher rank, together with merit, diligence and good conduct.
      - (2) In the case of promotion to the rank of Chief Inspector or Superintendent, special qualifications and fitness in relation to efficiency shall in particular include the possession of executive ability and those traits and aptitudes essential for leadership and management in a senior executive position."
    - (g) In clause 35 sub-clauses (3) and (4) shall be renumbered (4) and (5) respectively, and a new sub-clause (3), as follows, shall be inserted:—
      - "(3) Notwithstanding anything in clause 33, in selections for promotion to the rank of Superintendent Grade II. the Chief Commissioner shall consider the claims of all eligible Chief Inspectors and Inspectors; and for the rank of Inspector all duly qualified Station Officers and Sergeants."
    - (h) Clause 36 is revoked and the following clause substituted therefor:—
      - "36. Notwithstanding anything in this Chapter, where in the opinion of the Chief Commissioner any member of the Force—
        - (a) has rendered specially meritorious service; or
        - (b) is appointed to a position requiring special qualifications—

the Chief Commissioner may promote such member to the rank of first constable or senior constable or may recommend such member to the Governor in

Council for promotion to the rank of sergeant station officer or inspector notwithstanding that such member has not previously passed the prescribed qualifying examinations:

Provided that, where any member so promoted has not previously passed the prescribed qualifying examinations he shall hold brevet rank only, and notwithstanding that subsequently he passes such examinations he shall not by reason thereof be promoted to substantive rank but he may be promoted to substantive rank in compliance in all respects with the provisions of this Chapter other than this clause:

Provided further that, where any member is so promoted to brevet rank by reason of the fact that he is appointed to a position requiring special qualifications he shall immediately he ceases to occupy such position revert to his substantive rank.'

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "SANDY CREEK" PUBLIC HALL AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Tangambalanga, at Sandy Creek, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 20th November, 1956, as a site for Public Recreation and Public Hall, and known as the "Sandy Creek Public Hall and Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

# REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sun-1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sun-rise to sunset free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding twenty (20) in any one year, as the Reserve or any portion thereof may be set apart for races, cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, entertainments, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 10s. may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve. On such days as the Reserve is set apart for racing a maximum charge of 10s. 6d. may be made for the admission of each adult to the Reserve.

- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purposes of any lawful games, amusements, or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs the use of the grounds so set apart upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
- 6. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve, or any portion thereof, for any use whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay the Committee a fee for the use thereof, such fee to be fixed by the Committee.
- 7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

- 11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve except on occasions when the Reserve is let for the purpose of conducting racing and sports meetings. Any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve on the order of the Committee.
- 12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized-game or sport within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or other amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand building, erection, or enclosure; and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee. 13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erec-
- 14. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- 15. The Committee reserves the right to allow any person or persons with or without horses and vehicles to enter upon the Reserve irrespective of any grazing rights which have been let to any tenant.
- 16. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl or gravel from the Reserve.—(Rs.3121.)
