## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria intituled the *Justices (Service of Process) Act 1949* it is provided in sub-section (2) of section 2 thereof that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* specify municipal districts for the purpose of section 2 of the said Act: And whereas it is considered desirable that the municipal districts named in the Schedule hereto be so specified: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the said State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation hereby specify for the purpose of the said section 2 of the said Act the several municipal districts whose names appear in the said Schedule—to take effect as on and from the 2nd September, 1957.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Road Traffic Act 1956* it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act shall apply only in respect of infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of such Part by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* and occurring after the date of such Proclamation:

And whereas it is also enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such Part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular area or circumstance:

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Proclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Springvale and Noble Park has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part in respect only of parking infringements to the Shire of Springvale and Noble Park:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation specify the Shire of Springvale and Noble Park as an area in which Part II. of the *Road Traffic Act 1956* shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

## HEALTH AREAS DECLARED, CONSTITUTED, AND DEFINED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**BY** virtue of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1956 (No. 6024)*, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation repeal the Proclamation dated the twenty-first day of February, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-ninth day of February of the year aforesaid, and declare, constitute and define as Health Areas the areas following, namely:—

Metropolitan Health Area, comprising the Cities of Box Hill, Brighton, Brunswick, Camberwell, Caulfield, Chelsea, Coburg, Collingwood, Essendon, Fitzroy, Footscray, Hawthorn, Heidelberg, Kew, Malvern, Melbourne, Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Northcote, Nunawading, Oakleigh, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Preston, Richmond, Sandringham, South Melbourne, St. Kilda, Sunshine, Williamstown; Borough of Ringwood; Shires of Altona, Broadmeadows, Dandenong, Doncaster and Templestowe, Keilor, Mulgrave, Springvale and Noble Park.

Northern Health Area, comprising Cities of Bendigo, Mildura; Town of St. Arnaud; Boroughs of Eaglehawk, Inglewood, Swan Hill; Shires of Bet Bet, Birchip, Charlton, Cohuna, East Loddon, Gordon, Huntly, Kara Kara, Karkaroc, Kerang, Korong, Marong, Mildura, McIvor, Strathfieldsaye, Swan Hill, Walpeup, Wycheproof.

North-Western Health Area, comprising Cities of Bal-larat, Horsham; Town of Castlemaine; Boroughs of Clunes, Daylesford, Maryborough, Sebastopol, Stawell; Shires of Arapiles, Avoca, Bacchus Marsh, Ballan, Bal-larat, Bulia, Bungaree, Buninyong, Creswick, Dimboola, Donald, Dunmunkle, Gisborne, Glenlyon, Grenville, Kaniva, Kyneton, Lexton, Lowan, Maldon, Melton, Metcalfe, Newham and Woodend, Newstead, Ripon, Romsey, Stawell, Talbot, Tullaroop, Warracknabeal, Wimmera.

Western Health Area, comprising Cities of Ararat, Geelong, Geelong West, Hamilton, Newtown and Chilwell, Warrnambool; Towns of Colac, Portland; Boroughs of Camperdown, Korait, Port Fairy, Queenscliffe; Shires of Ararat, Bannockburn, Barrabool, Belfast, Bellarine, Colac, Corio, Dundas, Glenelg, Hampden, Heytesbury, Koorree, Leigh, Minhamite, Mortlake, Mount Rouse, Otway, Portland, South Barwon, Wannon, Warrnambool, Werribee, Winchelsea.

North-Eastern Health Area, comprising City of Shep-parton; Boroughs of Benalla, Echuca, Kyabram, Wangaratta; Shires of Alexandra, Beechworth, Benalla, Bright, Broadford, Chiltern, Cobram, Deakin, Eltham, Euroa, Goulburn, Healesville, Kilmore, Lillydale, Mansfield, Nathalia, Numurkah, Oxley, Pyalong, Rochester, Rodney, Rutherglen, Seymour, Shepparton, Towong, Tungamah, Upper Murray, Upper Yarra, Violet Town, Wangaratta, Waranga, Whittlesea, Wodonga, Yackandandah, Yarra-wonga, Yea.

Eastern Health Area, comprising City of Sale; Town of Yallourn; Boroughs of Moe, Wonthaggi; Shires of Alberton, Avon, Bairnsdale, Bass, Berwick, Buln Buln, Cran-bourne, Fern Tree Gully, Flinders, Frankston and Hastings, Korumburra, Maffra, Mirboo, Mornington, Morwell, Narracan, Omeo, Orbost, Phillip Island, Rosedale, South Gippsland, Tambo, Traralgon, Warragul, Woorayl.

## MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1949.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by section 3 of the *Milk Pasteurization Act 1949 (No. 5444)* it is provided that a day be fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* in relation to a prescribed district: And whereas the Municipal Districts of the City of Nunawading, the Borough of Ringwood, the Shire of Mulgrave, all that portion of the Shire of Keilor within the boundary formed by commencing at a point being the intersection of the Albion-Broadmeadows railway line with the shire boundary at the Maribyrnong River, then proceeding north-easterly along that railway line to its intersection with the shire boundary at Bulla-road, thence south-easterly, westerly, southerly and westerly along the shire boundary until the commencement point is reached, and all that portion of the City of Broadmeadows within the boundary formed by commencing at a point being the intersection of the Albion-Broadmeadows railway line with the city boundary at Bulla-road, then proceeding north-easterly along that railway line to its junction with the Melbourne-Sydney railway line, thence northerly along that railway line to its intersection with Camp-road, thence easterly by Camp-road, Broadmeadows and Campbellfield-road until the city boundary is reached at Merri Creek, thence southerly, westerly, southerly, westerly and north-westerly along the city boundary until the commencement point is reached, have been prescribed as Districts for the purposes of the said Act:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Thursday the first day of August, 1957, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed districts set out above—

- (a) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises and bottled and sealed as prescribed; or
- (b) (in the case where the milk is sold and delivered at a shop for immediate consumption by a customer at the shop) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND  
MANAGEMENT OF THE BALLAARAT CIVIC HALL.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Ballaarat, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 11th May, 1954, as a site for a Public Hall, known as the "Ballaarat Civic Hall," hereinafter referred to as the Reserve.

REGULATIONS.

(1) The Reserve shall be parcelled out in the following divisions:—

- First.—The Civic Hall Building.  
Second.—The remainder of the Reserve.

And the following Regulations are hereby made for the control of each division:—

*First Division.*

(1) The Reserve shall be open to the public at such times and subject to such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees and charges as the Committee of Management may determine.

*Second Division.*

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times, free of charge, except on such days not exceeding 36 in any one year as portions of it may be set aside for special occasions, and under such conditions as may be approved by the Committee of Management.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.

3. No person shall interfere with, damage or destroy any trees, shrubs, grass, lawns, flowers or any other property in the Reserve, throw stones or other missiles or light fires therein or deposit litter or refuse of any kind.

4. No person shall climb on any building, seats or structures or embellishments, including statues, within the Reserve or in any manner deface, damage or interfere with any buildings, seats, culverts, or other structures or embellishments, electrical fittings and equipment, water pipes, water taps, drains, drainage pipes, erections, flag poles, enclosures, posts, trees, shrubs, flowers or fittings within the Reserve.

5. No person shall enter upon plots or other enclosures set aside for plantations for trees, flowers, plots, shrubs or lawns, nor shall any person trespass or walk or drive upon or over any flower bed or shrubbery or climb or damage any trees or shrubs within the Reserve.

6. No person shall damage or unlawfully remove or interfere with or cut away any embellishment, driveway, or earthwork in any part of the Reserve.

7. No person shall bring into or use or carry in the Reserve any firearm, catapult, or other weapon or device of any description capable of causing any damage to any person or property within the area.

8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless held by chain or cord. Should any dog held by a chain or cord annoy any person or disturb any bird, the person in charge of such dog shall, at the request of any member of the Police Force or authorized officer of the Committee of Management, immediately remove such dog from the Reserve, and shall not permit such dog to again enter the Reserve unless with the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person except workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be set aside for plantation for any other purpose.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals or permit the same to enter without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained, otherwise the same will be impounded.

11. No person shall erect in the Reserve any tent, booth, or other temporary structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. No person shall use or cause to be used in the Reserve any structure, tent, caravan or any vehicle of any description for camping or living therein. No assemblies for fêtes or concerts or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind or meetings of a like character shall take place in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No person shall publicly address any assembly or assemble with any other person or persons for the purpose of hearing any public address within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any kind in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. No person shall play, practise or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

16. No person shall offer for sale any article in the Reserve, unless with the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.

17. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or within any part of the Reserve.

18. No person shall bet in any part of the Reserve.

19. Any person found removing or taking from any plots flowers, seeds or other property from the Reserve or injuring or damaging any property therein shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve and be prosecuted in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acts.

20. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.

21. No person shall ride any horse or cycle within the Reserve or bring into the Reserve any motor cycle or vehicle, horse, carriage, cart or other vehicle except in such parts as may be set apart by the Committee of Management or leave any vehicle, cart, horse, &c., within the area except under conditions as are determined by the Committee of Management.

22. No person shall paint, repair or dismantle any motor or other vehicles while the same is standing in any part of the Reserve.

23. No motor or other vehicle is permitted to park in the circular or semi-circular drive-ways leading in to or away from the two main entrances to the building.

24. No delivery cart, tradesman's cart, dray, lorry, wagon, van, truck or barrow shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

25. Any person committing in any part of the Reserve any of the following offences shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations:—

- (a) Assaulting any other person.
- (b) Being under the influence of intoxicating liquor.
- (c) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (d) Using any threatening or abusive or insulting language.
- (e) Behaving improperly or riotously.

(f) Improperly interfering with or interrupting any authorized amusement or entertainment within the Reserve.

(g) Obtaining admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

26. Any person, society or organization having obtained permission of the Committee of Management to use any part of the Reserve will maintain and leave the same in a clean and tidy condition to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management.

27. No person shall interfere with the surface of the Reserve by digging, or excavating or otherwise disturbing the soil, or removing any soil or other material therefrom.

28. No person shall throw, distribute, or deposit or cause to be thrown, distributed, or deposited in or upon the Reserve any handbill, pamphlet, or other printed matter.

29. No person upon the Reserve shall—

- (a) Sing or play upon any musical or noisy instrument.
- (b) Sing or harangue so as to cause annoyance or obstruction or so as to be calculated to cause such annoyance or obstruction to any person within the Reserve.

30. The Committee of Management may set apart the whole or any part of the Reserve as a place for the parking of vehicles.

31. No person shall park a vehicle within the Reserve except in places set apart by the Committee of Management for the parking of vehicles.

32. The Committee may fix such fee, not exceeding 2s. per day, as they think fit as the fee for the parking of vehicles in any place set apart within the Reserve for the parking of vehicles.

33. Every person who parks a vehicle in a place set apart for the parking of vehicles shall pay to the Committee of Management or its authorized representatives, on demand, such fee as has been fixed by the Committee of Management, pursuant to these Regulations, as the fee for parking in such place.

34. Every person bringing a vehicle into the Reserve shall obey the reasonable direction of the Committee of Management or its authorized representatives in relation to the driving or parking of such vehicles within the Reserve.—(Rs.2593.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff or member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "ALEXANDRA SHOW-GROUNDS AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Alexandra temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 20th February, 1957, as a site for Showgrounds and

Public Recreation, known as the "Alexandra Showgrounds and Public Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve":—

# REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public for cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday or other amusements, on any of which occasions a charge not exceeding Ten shillings may be made for the admission of each adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in the fireplaces provided for the purpose.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, in writing.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, except in the part or parts thereof which are set apart for such purposes by the Committee of Management, and then only on the payment of such fee and subject to such conditions as are determined by such Committee.

8. (a) No person shall erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

(b) No person or organization shall erect any building therein for any purpose whatsoever without first obtaining, in writing, the permission of the Committee of Management.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday or other amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

13. No person shall bring into the Reserve or use or carry therein any firearm or offensive weapon.

14. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, litter, or rubbish in the Reserve, except in a place provided for the purpose and indicated by notice-board.

15. Any person committing on any part of the Reserve or in any of the rooms, buildings, structures, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be guilty of breach of these Regulations:—

- (a) Assaulting or threatening any person or persons.
- (b) Being under the influence of liquor.
- (c) Entering, crossing, being on, or trespassing on any playing-ground area, enclosure, or course, or building, room, or structure, or any part thereof, whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment, or amusement is being played, conducted, or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee of Management.

(d) Using profane, indecent, obscene, or unseemly language.

(e) Using threatening, abusive, offensive, or insulting words.

(f) Behaving improperly, offensively, or riotously.

(g) Interfering with or interrupting any game, sports, competition, entertainment, or amusement or practice thereof.

(h) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.

16. No person shall—

(a) remain in the Reserve who behaves in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or creates or takes part in any disturbance;

(b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;

(c) bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.

17. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound, or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system, or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee of Management, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions, and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee of Management.

18. No person shall carry on the business or calling of a bookmaker, except in and upon such portions of the Reserve as may be set aside for that purpose, and then only when he shall—

(a) have obtained the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management on payment of a fee not to exceed Five pounds (£5) for any meeting or sporting event held in the Reserve; and

(b) that during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on the business or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket or have a bag, either of which shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.—(Rs.2593.)

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "CHELSEA FORESHORE RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: And whereas by sub-section 1 (e) of the said section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to apply all or any of the Regulations so made to any other land reserved aforesaid and not conveyed to or vested in trustees, in any case where the persons, council, or body comprising the Committee of Management of such first-mentioned land are or is also appointed to the Committee of Management of such other land: Now

therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

The Regulations made by the Board on 25th August, 1950, notified in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th August, 1950, for the care, protection, and management of such portion of the Reserve for Public purposes in the Parish of Lyndhurst, as is indicated by pink colour on plan marked "A" 17/11/20 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.5000 are hereby applied to the land in the Parish of Lyndhurst temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 25th June, 1957, as a site for Public purposes, both areas together known as the "Chelsea Foreshore Reserve."—(Rs.5000.)

##### APPOINTMENTS.

**WHEREAS** by section 184 of the *Land Act* 1928 it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council or the Board of Land and Works to appoint and remove any number of persons, not less than three, or any municipal council, or the governing body of any corporation, to be a Committee of Management of any specified

Crown land reserved either temporarily or permanently for any of the purposes set out in section 14 of the *Land Act* 1928, and not conveyed to or vested in trustees: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby appoint the under-mentioned persons to be members of the Committee of Management of the Reserves named:—

##### "BULGA NATIONAL PARK."

Peter Britton as a member of the Committee of Management of the lands temporarily reserved by Orders in Council dated 9th December, 1941, and 12th April, 1943, as a site for a National Park in the Parish of Bulga, and known as the "Bulga National Park," in place of Edward Keith Gidley, transferred.—(Corres. Rs.134.)

##### MANSFIELD INFANT WELFARE CENTRE.

The Council of the Shire of Mansfield as a Committee of Management of the land in the Township of Mansfield temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 25th June, 1957, as a site for Infant Welfare Centre.—(Corres. Rs.7572.)

##### "KORONG VALE RECREATION RESERVE (BOWLING GREEN)."
