AMENDING DETERMINATION OF THE CEMENT ARTICLES BOARD.

Notes.-(1) This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(2) By Order in Council on the 14th July. 1953, the Brick Trade Board was deprived of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the making of cement bricks and such power was exclusively conferred on the Cement Articles Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Labour and Industry Acts, the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons (other than persons under the jurisdiction of the Fibrous Plasterers Board) employed in the trade of making portable articles of cement or concrete," has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That as from the 17th September, 1956, the Determination made on the 15th May, 1956, and in force as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 15th May, 1956, shall be amended by the addition thereto of the following clause:—

OLYMPIC DAY.

8a. In connexion with the holding of the Olympic Games in Victoria during the months of November, and December, 1956, where a holiday or half-holiday is proclaimed by Order in Council throughout any Municipality or part thereof, or within any defined area, such holiday or half-holiday shall, so far as such Municipality or part thereof, or such defined area is concerned be deemed to be included in the list of holidays prescribed in clause 8.

Provided that no employee shall be entitled to the conditions prescribed by this clause for more than the equivalent of one working day.

Provided further that an employee who fails to attend for work on the working day before and/or after such holiday or half-holiday without reasonable excuse shall not be entitled to be paid for such holiday or half-holiday.
