Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Sebastopol has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality:

And whereas the operation of the said Regulations was extended to part of the municipal district of the Shire of Winchelsea by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th July, 1955; and the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to a further part of the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby

extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946*, to the municipal district of the Borough of Sebastopol, and to that part of the municipal district of the Shire of Winchelsea described hereunder:—

Crown allotments 29c, 29d, 29e, 29f, 29g, 29h, 29j, 29k, 29l, and 29m, Parish of Kaanglang.

And doth order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned municipal district of the Borough of Sebastopol and in the above-described part of the municipal district of the Shire of Winchelsea on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 11th November, 1957, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Councils of the said municipalities to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided further that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 11th November, 1957.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF SUNSHINE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or there-
after in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Sunshine has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (6) of section 10 of the *Juries Act 1956* that if pursuant to the powers contained in The Constitution Act Amendment Acts a redivision of the electoral districts for the Legislative Assembly is adopted or is deemed to be adopted and such electoral districts are divided into subdivisions the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* determine which of such new electoral districts or subdivisions thereof shall comprise the jury district for every assize town sessions town and county court town and the Third and Fourth

Schedules to the said Act shall be deemed to be amended accordingly as from the date specified in such Proclamation:

And whereas, pursuant to The Constitution Act Amendment Acts, a recent redivision of the electoral districts for the Legislative Assembly has been deemed to be adopted and the new electoral districts provided for under such redivision will come into operation at the termination of the present Legislative Assembly:

And whereas, in further pursuance of The Constitution Act Amendment Acts aforesaid, Proclamations have been issued declaring the names and boundaries of the said new electoral districts; dividing such new electoral districts into subdivisions; and providing for the preparation of new electoral rolls on the basis of such new electoral districts and subdivisions:

And whereas as a consequence of the issuing of the Proclamations aforesaid, it is necessary to determine which of such new electoral districts or subdivisions thereof shall comprise the jury district for every such town aforesaid:

THE EGG AND EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Camberwell (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Acts, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, during the operation of this Order.

4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section (3), of the Acts.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

8. In the event of stripping being permitted on any area regarded as a tourist resort all tops must be lopped, stacked, and burned under the direction of and in accordance with the written conditions specified by the officer in charge.
9. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course or to obstruct any road or track.
10. Except with the permission of the officer in charge, no tree of less than 5 inches diameter shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated in the licence. Wherever a size limit is stated it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground.
11. All stripping must cease by 31st March following the date of issue of licence unless otherwise authorized, in writing, by the officer in charge.
12. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt. in clear places only, and the licensee must take such precautions as the officer in charge may direct to safeguard such bark from loss by fire.

17. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be determined by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of the officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire otherwise than in accordance with the Forests Acts and Regulations.

18. The licensee shall forthwith comply with any direction given to him by the officer in charge for the effective protection from fire of the forest within the boundaries of the area upon which he is licensed to operate, and he shall do everything that is reasonably within his power to prevent from spreading and to extinguish any fire which may break out on such area or which may spread to it.

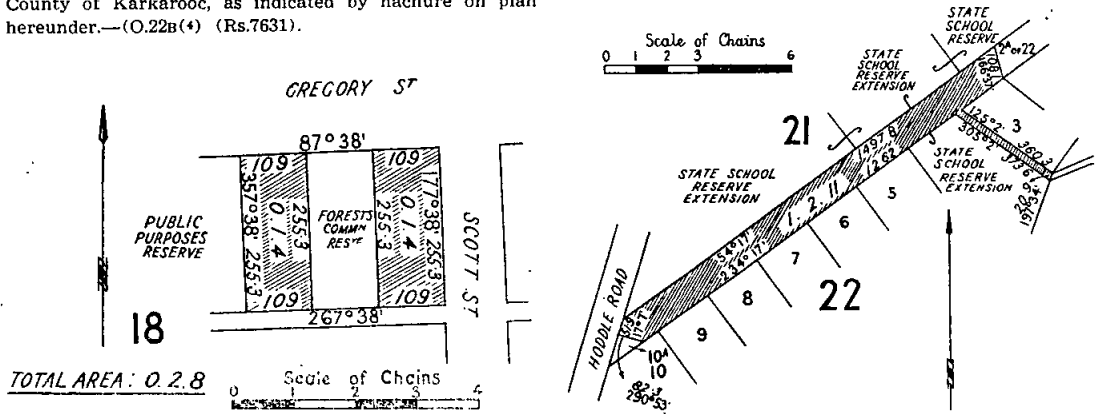

All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter, and the long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. If the firewood be obtained from a State Forest Timber Reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the Forests Commission.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly).

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement in such places as may be directed by the officer receiving the supply. The stacks are to be for 2 foot wood, 2 feet wide and 4 feet high, for 5 foot and 6 foot wood, 5 feet and 6 feet wide respectively and 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being caused, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, or failure to stack the wood in the places directed, the Department concerned will purchase elsewhere or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted, provided that the contractor shall be given 48 hours' notice before purchases are made or the wood re-stacked at his risk.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Tender Board, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense incurred thereby, if any, will be deducted from the contractor's account.

8. Accounts for firewood shall be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made through the Treasury, Melbourne.

TOWN OF CASTLEMAINE.

BY-LAW No. 109.

A By-law of the Town of Castlemaine made under the provisions of section 197 (XXXVII.) (c) and (d) of the Local Government Act 1946, for controlling the heights of fences, trees, shrubs and hedges on private property at the intersection of streets.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred thereby and of any other powers thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Town of Castlemaine order as follows:—

1. The owner of any private property at the intersection of two streets shall not be permitted to retain or erect any fence of a greater height than 3 ft. 6 in., or permit any trees, shrubs or hedge of any greater height to remain within 10 feet of the junction of such streets or roads.

2. The Council may at the expense of the owner (the amount of such expenses being recoverable by the Council in a court of petty sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily)—

(a) Remove or lop trees, shrubs, hedges growing or being on private property so situated which are not removed or lopped as required under section 1 of this By-law.

(b) Reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required under section 1 of this By-law.

Health Act 1928.

BOROUGH OF SEBASTOPOL.

BY-LAW No. 18.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1928*, and any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sebastopol, for the purposes of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 10 of the Borough of Sebastopol is hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Sebastopol.

4. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane, or passage within the Borough of Sebastopol.

5. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land within the said Borough not being a registered tip for the reception of such refuse or rubbish.

6. The Council may require the removal or destruction by the owner or the occupier of any land of any refuse or rubbish thereon other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the above Act.

7. Unless exempted by the Council the proprietor of every premises within the said Borough shall provide and keep thereon a proper and suitable receptacle or receptacles for the temporary storing of all refuse and rubbish (not including animal manure) produced or accumulated on such premises and which is offensive or likely to become offensive.

8. Such receptacle or receptacles shall be constructed of metal and have a capacity of 2 cubic feet with handles set on each side and fitted with a close-fitting metal lid and shall keep such receptacle or receptacles continuously covered save when refuse or rubbish is being deposited therein or removed therefrom and shall keep the receptacle or receptacles clean and in good order.

9. Unless exempted by the Council the proprietor of every premises within the said Borough shall cause all refuse and rubbish arising from his premises to be deposited in such receptacle or receptacles and shall between such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse and rubbish cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed immediately inside a gate or opening to the street road lane or passage on which such premises abut.

10. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle or receptacles in or upon any street road lane or passage.

11. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
