AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c.,
&c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

CLOSE SEASON FOR CERTAIN SPECIES OF FINCHES
AND PARROTS, AND THE AUSTRALIAN PELICAN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf do by this Proclamation remove the period of the close season set opposite the names of the under-mentioned birds in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928* by Proclamation made the twenty-first day of March, 1939, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-second day of March, 1939, and prescribe instead of such period the period specified hereunder which period shall be the close season in respect of the birds so mentioned and included in Third Schedule aforesaid.

STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION (YALLOURN
AREA) ACT 1947.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *State Electricity Commission (Yallourn Area) Act 1947* (No. 5219), section 13, it is amongst other things enacted that the Yallourn Works Area shall be the area occupied by the works of the Commission as defined by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*:

And whereas it is further enacted that the Yallourn Works Area shall upon such publication cease to form portion of any municipal district:

And whereas it was declared by Proclamation dated 30th September, 1947, that certain areas specified therein shall be known as the Yallourn Works Area within the meaning of the said Act:

And whereas it is further enacted that the Yallourn Works Area may be re-defined from time to time by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*:

And whereas it was declared by Proclamation dated 25th May, 1954, that the Yallourn Works Area be re-defined within the meaning of the said Act:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation again re-define the Yallourn Works Area and for this purpose do declare that instead of the areas specified in the aforesaid Proclamations dated 30th September, 1947, and 25th May, 1954, the area hereinafter specified shall be known as the Yallourn Works Area within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

YALLOURN WORKS AREA.

The Area hereinafter prescribed, that is to say:—

All that land in the Parishes of Narracan and Tanjil East in the Counties of Buln Buln and Tanjil, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the south side of the Government road which forms the southern boundary of Crown allotment 4f, Parish of Narracan, distant 100.02 links on a bearing of S. 10 deg. 21 min. E. from the north-east corner of Crown allotment 12, section C, Parish of Tanjil East; thence S. 67 deg. 31 min. E. for 437.32 links; thence S. 22 deg. 29 min. ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1956.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Road Traffic Act 1956* it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act shall apply only in respect of infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of such

Part by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* and occurring after the date of such Proclamation:

And whereas it is also enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such Part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular area or circumstance:

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Proclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Traralgon has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part in respect only of parking infringements to the Shire of Traralgon:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation specify the Shire of Traralgon as an area in which Part II. of the *Road Traffic Act 1956* shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PRESCRIBE A CLOSE SEASON FOR SCHOOL OR SNAPPER SHARK AND GUMMY SHARK.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation prescribing as follows in respect to all Victorian waters during the period from the first day of November to the thirtieth day of November (both days inclusive) in each year:—

1. Prescribing as a "close season" for school or snapper shark and gummy shark the period in each year from the first day of November to thirtieth day of November (both days inclusive) and providing that, as regards the species of fish aforementioned, any person who sells or exposes for sale any fish of such species during the close season for such species of fish or who has in his possession house or shop or under his control any fish of such species during the close season for such species of fish for the purpose of sale during or after the said close season shall be liable to the penalties set out in section 42 of the *Fisheries Act 1928*, whether such fish were taken in Victoria or elsewhere.

2. Prohibiting any person using or assisting in the use of mesh nets containing meshes measuring more than five (5) inches or a long line and the method of fishing known as "long lining" or doing any or all of the following things:—

- (a) Having in his possession any such mesh net or a long line or any part of a long line in or upon any Victorian waters;
- (b) taking or assisting in the taking of a boat with such mesh nets or a long line or any part of a long line on board or attached thereto on to any Victorian waters or permitting such mesh nets or a long line or any part of a long line to be on or attached to any boat on any such waters.

This prohibition shall not apply to flounder mesh nets consisting of 45-9 cotton, 50-9 cotton or 210 x 3-ply nylon.

3. Prescribing that all shark other than school or snapper shark and gummy shark shall be sold by or on behalf of any fisherman as a carcass.

MITCHELL RIVER IMPROVEMENT TRUST
CONSTITUTED.

ORDER IN COUNCIL PROHIBITING THE KEEPING, GRAZING OR MILKING OF COWS WITHIN A CERTAIN SPECIFIED AREA OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF SUNSHINE.

WHEREAS by section 67 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928* (No. 3736), the Governor in Council is empowered on the application of the Council of any municipal district, whether wholly or partly within a milk area or not, if approved by the Minister, to prohibit any person keeping, grazing or milking cows on any part or parts, or in any part, of such area or district: And whereas the Council of the Municipal District of the City of Sunshine has applied to the Governor in Council to prohibit any person keeping, grazing or milking cows in the following specified areas of such municipality, that is to say:—

(a) All that area within a boundary formed by commencing at the point where Sunshine-road crosses the municipal boundary between Sunshine and Footscray; thence westerly by Sunshine-road to the Sunshine-Newport railway line; thence south-easterly by the railway line to a point in line with William-street; thence westerly by William-street and Fifth-avenue and a line in extension of Fifth-avenue to the Koroit Creek; thence upstream by the course of the Koroit Creek to a point in line with the rear of the residential allotments facing north-west to Mayne-street; thence generally south-westerly by this line to Oldfield-street; thence north-westerly by Oldfield-street to a point 150 feet south of Malley-street; thence westerly by a direct line to Fitzgerald's-road; thence northerly by Fitzgerald's-road to Tilburn-road; thence westerly by Tilburn-road and the railway line to a point in line with Hamilton-street; thence northerly by a line in extension of Hamilton-street and by Hamilton-street to Ballarat-road; thence generally easterly by Ballarat-road to the Sunshine-St. Albans railway; thence north-westerly and north-easterly by the Sunshine-St. Albans railway and the Albion-Broadmeadows railway to Barwon-avenue; thence westerly by Barwon-avenue and northerly by Camperdown-avenue to Furlong-road; thence easterly by Furlong-road and Berkshire-road and a line in extension of Berkshire-road to the Maribyrnong River; thence downstream by the Maribyrnong River to Mitchell-street; thence westerly, southerly, westerly and southerly by the municipal boundary to Sunshine-road and commencing point.

3. Every producer who wilfully registers with the Onion Marketing Board any particulars required by these Regulations which are false or misleading shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of Five pounds.

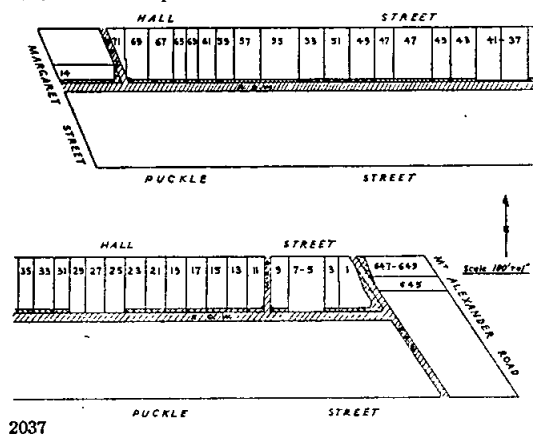

8. Every fowlhouse or similar structure in which poultry is kept shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved impervious material and the surface level of the floor shall be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

9. Every fowlhouse or similar structure shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanised iron, jointed brickwork or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least 18 inches below ground level, and all walls shall be constructed of approved rat-proof material.

10. The occupier of any premises on which poultry is kept shall cause the fowlhouse and attached enclosed run to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.

11. All poultry food shall be stored in rat-proof containers.

12. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction, to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

 - (h) Food Premises (as defined by Act No. 5823)—
 - Where five or less than five persons are employed, 10s.
 - Where six to twenty persons are employed, £1.
 - Where twenty-one to fifty persons are employed, £2.
 - Where more than fifty persons are employed, £5.
 - (i) Premises used for egg chilling, £1.
 - (j) Hairdresser's shop, Beauty parlour or other like establishment or Chiropodist's establishment, £1.
 - (k) For Transfer of Registration, 2s. 6d.
3. Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of this By-law, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20) and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5).

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Buln Buln.
