## PETITION TO INCORPORATE THE MORWELL AND DISTRICT COMMUNITY HOSPITAL.

IT is hereby notified, in accordance with the provisions of section 46 (2) of Act No. 5300, that the Hospitals and Charities Commission of Victoria has received a petition signed by not less than 25 contributors to the Morwell and District Community Hospital praying that that hospital be incorporated under the said Act.

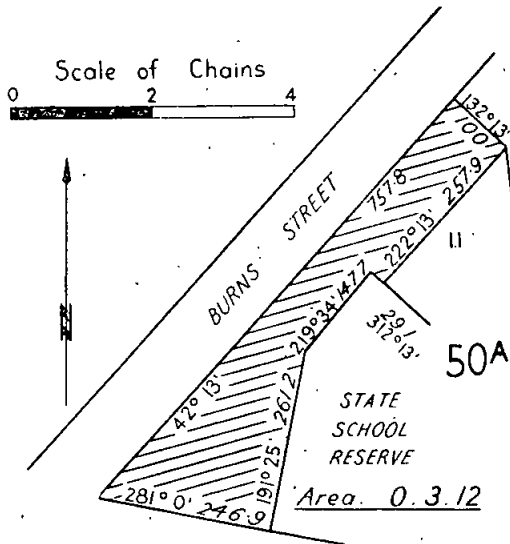

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE WINIAM RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Winiam temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 30th April, 1957, as a site for Public Recreation known as the "Winiam Recreation Reserve", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall:—

- Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- Carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any game or birds therein.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.

7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game, or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any

sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of the making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones, or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

12. No person shall, in the Reserve:—

- (a) Light a fire without the consent of the Committee;
- (b) Deposit or leave any broken glass, garbage, or litter of any kind, except in a place set apart or in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee of Management.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall bring in to the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games, or foot racing except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

18. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

19. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

20. No persons shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.—(Corres. Rs.7534.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff or member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BASS VALLEY" CAMPING GROUND.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the

Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Jeetho temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 25th June, 1957, as a site for Public purposes, together with the abutting permanent reservation along the Bass River the whole together known as the "Bass Valley Camping Ground," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

#### REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall remain in the Reserve.

2. No person shall climb or jump over any fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure or destroy the said fences, seats, or other improvements, or remove any soil therefrom.

3. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.

4. No person shall erect any structure on the Reserve other than a tent or booth and then only as hereinafter provided.

5. No person shall camp, or erect any tent, in or upon the Reserve, except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only by obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees, as the Committee of Management shall determine.

6. No person shall erect a booth in the Reserve for the purpose of offering for sale any articles, nor shall any person offer for sale in the Reserve any articles without the permission, in writing, and subject to such conditions and payment of such fees fixed by the Committee of Management.

7. All the persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee of Management on the Reserve shall pay such charges (if any) for the use of same as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall light fires, except in places set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management and no refuse material shall be burned in the Reserve, except by a representative of the Committee of Management, and then only in places set apart for the purpose.

9. No person shall break glass of any kind in the Reserve, or leave thereon anything which shall or may injure any person.

10. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, airgun or any firearm in or upon the Reserve.

11. No person shall put in or on the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals, or any vehicles, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or a cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. Permission of the Committee of Management must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized sports, picnics, or functions of any kind in the Reserve.—(Corres. Rs.7585.)

BY-LAW No. 167.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act and of every other power thereunto it enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction with the approval of the Governor in Council, make the following By-law numbered 167 (that is to say):—

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks and geese.  
"Council" means the Council of the City of Sandringham.

"Person" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of any premises.

"Approved Materials" means materials approved by the Council.

2. By-laws Nos. 62 and 143 are hereby repealed.

3. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept any live poultry in any part of the City of Sandringham, except in a fowl house or similar structure to which may be attached an enclosed fowl-run which fowlhouse or similar structure or fowl-run shall in all respects comply with the provisions of clauses 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 of this By-law.

4. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept in any fowlhouse or similar structure a number of poultry greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such fowlhouse or similar structure by six.

5. Every fowlhouse or similar structure or any enclosed fowl-runs on any premises shall be distant at least—

- (a) 75 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage.
- (b) 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet.
- (c) 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet.
- (d) 5 feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land.
- (e) 40 feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land.

6. Every fowlhouse or similar structure in which poultry is kept shall be—

- (a) roofed with approved material and paved with approved impervious material, and the surface level of the floor shall be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground and
- (b) rendered ratproof by placing galvanized iron, jointed brickwork or concrete around the foundations, to a depth of at least 18 inches below ground level, and all walls shall be constructed of approved ratproof material.

7. The occupier of any premises on which poultry is kept shall cause the fowlhouse and attached enclosed run to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.

8. All poultry food shall be stored in ratproof containers.

9. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of Sandringham, excepting only premises registered as poultry killing premises and poultry sale-yards when so exempted in writing by the Council, and shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

10. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence after such conviction, to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.
